Episcopal Vespers and the Ordination to the Sub-diaconate

His Grace Bishop Khajag Barsamian, Primate Presiding Ordinand will ordain Daniel Yeghia Korakian

(The Bishop, after making a solemn entry into the church led by the choristers and clergy ,shall say Psalm 122 in antiphon with a senior Priest)

I was glad when they said to me: let us go to the house of the Lord.

Our feet have arrived and stood at thy gates; O Jerusalem.

Jerusalem is built as a city; and around it are the abodes thereof.

There nations go up, the nations of the Lord in testimony for Israel; to acknowledge the name of the Lord.

There thrones for judgement are set; thrones are set in the house of David.

(Now the Bishop shall offer the following prayer before the holy altar)

COLLECT

In the midst of this temple, O Lord, and before the holy signs and the holy table that hold God up to us and thus are made bright, we bow down in fear and worship; we bless and glorify thine holy, wondrous and triumphant resurrection (or dominion) and we offer unto thee praise and glory with the Father and with the Holy Spirit, now and always and unto the ages of ages. Amen.

All: The Lord's Prayer

Hayr Mer, vor herginus yes. Soorp yeghitzi anoon koh. Yegestseh arkayootiun koh, yeghitsin gamk koh, vorbes hergins yev hergri. Uzhatz mer hanabazort door mez aysor. Yev togh mez bardis mer vorbes yev mek toghoomk merotz bardabanatz yev mee danir uz mez ee portsootiun, ayl purgia uzmez ee chareh. (The psalmists shall read Psalm 86 and 140 completely)

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Psalmists:

Incline thine ear O Lord and hear me, for I am poor and needy.....

Rescue me O Lord, from the evil man, deliverme from the man of iniquity.....

(The Choir shall now sing the principal hymn of Vespers on Saturday night)

O gladdening light of lthe holy immortal glory of the heavenly Father, of the Holy Giver of Life, Jesus Christ.

We, who have come at the setting of the sun, have seen the evening light. We praise the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit of God.

And, we all say Amen.

Make us worthy at all times to praise with singing voices, the glorious name of the all Holy Trinity that gives life, wherefor also the world glorifies Thee.

(The Great Litany of lthe evening hour is intoned by the Deacon as the the faithful answer by singing Lord Have Mercy/Der Voghormia)

For Sunday Eves and all Dominical Days

LITANY OF PEACE

Let us all say with one accord: Lord, have mercy.

-Lord, have mercy.

For the peace of the whole world and for the stability of the holy Church, let us beseech the Lord.

-Lord, have mercy.

For all holy and orthodox bishops, let us beseech the Lord. —Lord, have mercy.

For the life of our Catholicos-Patriarch, lord (N.N.) and for the salvation of his soul, let us be seech the Lord.

-Lord, have mercy.

For doctors, priests, deacons, clerics and for the whole league of the children of the Church, let us beseech the Lord.

-Lord, have mercy.

For the President and Government and the people of these United States of America, for all pious public servants and wise statesmen, let us beseech the Lord.

-Lord, have mercy.

For the Armenian nation and for all the public servants of the Armenian people, let us beseech the Lord.

-Lord, have mercy.

For our fathers and brethren that are in captivity and in evil servitude, let us beseech the Lord.

-Lord, have mercy.

For all travellers on land, at sea and in the air, that they may arrive in peace at their several good destinations, let us beseech the Lord.

-Lord, have mercy.

(Following the major prayer offered by the Bishop the faithful shall sing the Trisagion Hymn)

Holy God, Holy and might, Holy and Immortal, Who rose forom the dead, have mercy upon us. Glorified and blessed ever Holy Virgin, Bearer of God, Mary-Mother of Christ, offer supplications to thy Son and Our God.

> (The Choir shall now sing the hymn of Ordination) OORAKH LER

REJOICE O HOLY CHURCH...for today Christ the Heavenly King has adorned you with His Cross and has ornamented your sanctuary with His mighty power.

Then one of the deacons reads the prophecy of Isaiah, Chap. VI, 1-10. Epistle of St. Paul to the Ildrenes, Chapt. II, 14-18; at the end of which:

THE GOSPEL ACCORDING TO

MARK

People were bringing little children to him in order that he might touch them; and the disciples spoke sternly to them. ¹⁴But when Jesus saw this, he was indignant and said to them, "Let the little children come to me; do not stop them; for it is to such as these that the kingdom of God belongs. ¹⁵Truly I tell you, whoever does not receive the kingdom of God as a little child will never enter it." ¹⁶And he took them up in his arms, laid his hands on them, and blessed them.

DEACON. — Beloved brethren, let us make our supplications unto God, to grant to these his servants (N. N.) his blessing, in order to strengthen them in the office of the Subdiaconate; that they may serve with faith before him, and may attain the reward that He has promised to his Saints. May our Lord Jesus Christ, through His grace, save them and have mercy upon them.

The Bishop now places his hands upon their heads, and repeats this prayer:



O Lord, lover of man, who art glorified in all; Thou giver of all good things and accepter of prayers. Accept these our supplications and bless Thy servant (N.N.), whom Thou hast chosen for the service of Thy Church. Fill him with all spiritual wisdom, and fortify him to live according to the order of Thy true martyr! Preserve him from all the snares of the Evil One, that with holiness and purity of heart he may be worthy to attain to the order of the Diaconate according to Thy Will, and to the hope of everlasting life, with all Thy saints, who from the beginning have pleased Thee. And we all receiving these Thy servants with the divine, spiritual and holy kiss, may, as in everything, so now give praises and glorify Thee, together with the Almighty Father and the lifegiving and deliverer Holy Ghost, for ever and ever. Amen.

The Bishop now places the maniple on the left arm and says.

BISHOP: Accept the maniple for the preservation of Thy soul, that thou mayest serve with pure hands in the house of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Then the Bishop delivers an empty chalice with the Paten, and says:

BISHOP: Take this holy chalice and be authorized to carry it to the holy altar of the Lord, for the great and precious mystery of Christ our God, to whom belong glory, power and honour, now and ever and for all ages. Amen.

In the same way he delivers the Books of Lections of the Holy Liturgy, and says:

BISHOP: I present you with the Books of the Lections, and authorize You to read them in the Church of God, for the living and for the dead, in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost. Amen.

Then he delivers the drapery necessary to the celebration of Liturgy, together with the sacerdotal vestments, and says:

BISHOP: Take these holy vestments of the Liturgy, and be henceforth authorized to serve and to cloth the Priests in the administration of the mystery of Christ our God; in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost. Amen. The Bishop then admonishes the new sub-deacon as follows:

BISHOP: See to what a sacrament you have been called: for you have been promoted from a lower office. Henceforward be watchful in this ministry; be aware of sloth. And the shewbread which Christ has given to the Church as the bread of life, take heed to prepare as much as is required for the communion of the people, neither more or less. In the vessel in which you shall wash the corporal linen take care not to soak any other thing, and the water you shall wash it in, shall be poured in the Baptismal Font; and in the basin in which you wash the napkin of the holy altar, there in you shall wash all the linen of the church. I tell you now all this that you may fulfil your office with care, so that you may find favour before God our Lord Jesus Christ; to whom belong glory, power and honour, now and ever. Amen.
