

CHOIR NEWS

The Annual Cheir Meeting was held on Hovember 8, 1979 and a new Executive Committee was elected. Indeed it was a time to feel proud to be an Armenian! We thank Miss Maggie Prodromidis and Mrs Shakeh Bebabshanian, and all others who helped make the post-Recital reception such a success.

Unfortunately, this fall brougt us its share of sad days as well. We have lost our beloved Choir Director, Mr. Edward Scardan. We miss him dearly, both as our Director and as our friend. His death has left a big wold in our hearts.

But we have to go on, and we have to continue his work! The Parish Council and Father Kalayjian are in the midst of a search for a new Choir Director. In the mean time Mrs. Kebar Andonian and Dr. Hratch Semerjian will be conducting the Choir on alternate Sundays.

The search for a new Choir Director and strongthening of our Choir at this particular time are especially critical. Our community will be hosting the Annual Diocesan Assembly during May 27-31, 1980. The week's activities will include a Sunday Service on June 1st, when His Holiness Vasken I, Gatholicos of All Armenians, will be celebrating Hass. It is imperative that our Choir prepare for this special day properly and premptly. We are calling on all parishioners, young and old, who would like to sing to come and join the Choir. We are holding rehearsals on Sundays at 9:30 a.m. before Church Services. Sectionals are hald once a month (for each section) with complete choir rebearsels again once a month. It is important to realize that, if you prefer, you can perticipate in the rehearsals without singing during the Services, until you decide to do so. One of the highlights of the evening was cutting of the 25th anniversary cake by Neshan Hintliian, godfather of the Church, a long-time supporter and active member of St. Mary's.

His Eminence addressed the audience, reminiscing about the early days of the parish. He commended the efforts of the first generation Aremanians in the U.S. for building the Church with devotion and sacrifice and offered a challenge to the present generation to continue and expand the mission of the Church. His Eminence further urged the community to show more organized concern towards our newly arrived brothers and sisters from the Middle Eastern countries.

The evening continued with a gala dance. Middle Eastern entertainment was provided by the Middle East Ensemble and Armenian-American disco music by Edick and Zareh from the Hye Club of St. Mary's Church.

Sunday morning, His Eminence celebrated Divine Liturgy and delivered an inspiring sermon. At the end of the service, he conferred the ecclesiastical degree of Tbroutune (scribe) to the following: Dr. Hratch Semerjian, John Krikorian, Thomas Magarian, Jr., Simon Kumkumian, Kegham Kumkumian, Levon Andonian and Vache Tahmazian. Of these, the last four received the special privilege of wearing the stole (ouraragir). The following members of the choir received special blessings to wear the veil as Choristers: Yeretzgin Anahid, Anna Derderian and Maggie Prodromidis.

The Women's Guild had prepared an elaborate table of Armenian delicacies and the congregation enjoyed the fellowship hour where many met His Eminence personally.
