



SETRAG BERBERIAN GODFATHER OF OUR CHURCH



O one loved his church more than he did, no one was loved more than he was.

His story reflects the adversities of most Armenians of his generation seeking a new life in America. Born in Palou, Armenia in 1892, his mother died when he was three. In 1910 after being wed to Miss Pambook Hovanessian, he was sent to America. The Turkish massacres decimated his family and for eight years he prayed alone without word of his family, sustained only by the strength of his heritage and religion. Finally after fourteen years separation he was reunited with his wife who bore him two children, Rose and Mariam.

Neither the loss of his family in Armenia, the untimely death of his wife, nor the depression and long hours of toil would conquer his spirit. He was known as Grandpa to all the children and friends of St. Mary's parish.

He remained a credit to his community, to his country and to all Armenians until his death in 1972.

In his memory, his grandson and namesake, Robert Setrag Dorian, will act on his behalf as godfather.

HISTORY OF ST. MARY'S ARMENIAN CHURCH

HE Armenian Community of Newark and vicinity was organized officially as a parish in 1926. The newly formed parish held its first religious service at the Grace Episcopal Church in Newark with the then Primate, Abp. Tirayre Hovhanessian officiating. A capacity crowd of over 1000 persons attended this historical service which marked the beginning of the movement for the establishment of an Armenian Church for the people of this area.

In 1941 a Building Committee was formed consisting of three persons; Missak Aslanian, Haig Chorbajian and Joe Boyajian. In 1942 the following persons were added to this Committee; Vosgan Aslanian, Thomas Barmakian, Mihran Hajatian, Haiganoosh Zotian and Pailadzou Mahmarian. The year 1947 was when a lot was purchased in Northern Newark for the construction of a church. In 1949 the Building Committee was reorganized under the leadership of V. Rev. Fr. Shnork Kaloustian and plans were drawn up to start construction of a hall. During this period the pastor was informed about a church in Irvington which was for sale. After visiting this church with several members of the Parish Council, a Parish Assembly was convened to decide upon this matter. The Parish Assembly unanimously decided to purchase this church, which consisted of a church building, hall, parish house and an open green area. A great deal of enthusiasm and zeal was instilled in all the members of the parish, now that the long years of yearning and dreaming of having their own church was finally becoming a reality.

Since 1949 the following clergymen have served our church and community; V. Rev. Fr. Shnork Kaloustian, presently Patriarch of Instanbul, was the first pastor under whose leadership and guidance our parish received its religious and national nourishment, V. Rev. Fr. Yeghishe Gizirian, V. Rev. Fr. Oshin Nicolian, Rev. Fr. Mampre Kouzouian, Rev. Fr. Ari Kehyaian, and since 1971, V. Rev. Fr. Houssig Bagdasian, our present pastor.

On January 2, 1950, the newly purchased church in Irvington was consecrated in the name of St. Mary's Armenian Church by the then Primate, Bp. Tiran Nersoyan and the sponsors were Mr. & Mrs. Khoren Shahbazian. The newly consecrated church of St. Mary's proved for over 20 years the firm and sincere faith of our people and their determination to worship God according to the rites and customs of the Armenian Church. Today's results are the materialization of this sincere faith and devotion.

In 1960 a new Building Committee was formed under the chairmanship of Joe Boyajian and entrusted with the task of exploring the possibility of enlarging the hall at the Irvington site or moving to new quarters to fill the ever growing needs of the parish. At a Special Parish Assembly in 1961 it was voted to move to new quarters. In 1965 property was purchased in West Orange which had an existing house and 3.2 acres of land. Plans were put into motion to construct our future church on this site. Fund raising committees were formed to raise necessary funds for this project. After many difficult years of planning and preparing for the eventual construction of our new church, hopes were raised in 1973 that construction could begin shortly. During this time the Building Committee was informed of a church for sale in Livingston. After weighing the problems of the ever increasing costs of construction and the cost of purchasing this existing church complex, a Special Parish Assembly was convened on August 7, 1973. After lengthy discussions and exploring all possible phases of the cost of building and or buying, it was voted that the Olivet Church should be purchased. In August, 1973, negotiations began between us and Olivet Church and the purchasing price of \$325,000 was agreed upon. In September, 1973, our church services were conducted in our newly purchased church and a renewed spirit of dedication and faith swept over our community. Finally after long years of hope and sacrifice we had a beautiful church, hall, classrooms, parish house, ample recreation area, and a large open wooded area situated on 3.9 acres of land in the town of Livingston.

As we stand at the threshold of a new chapter in the history of our church, once again we are called upon to renew our faith and devotion so that in the years to come the fruits of our endeavors and sacrifices will be seen and future generations will always look back with pride and satisfaction and be able to understand the true and inspired spirit of this steadfast faithful parish.

THE PARISH COUNCIL OF ST. MARY'S ARMENIAN CHURCH LIVINGSTON, NEW JERSEY

S it is with all other parish councils in the diocese, St. Mary's parish council members are elected by the church assembly of parishioners for a two year term and can be re-elected for two additional year terms. The parish council meets every other week in order to conduct the day to day operating matters of the church as well as to help the parish in its spiritual, cultural and social fulfillment in St. Mary's.

PRESENT PARISH COUNCIL

The parish council consists of ten members with elected officers and the pastor who attends every meeting as its president. The two elected diocesean delegates are also invited to attend parish council meetings from time to time so that they may better understand the affairs and problems of the parish and thereby become better able to represent St. Mary's at the diocese. Along with the usual elected officers of chairman, vice-chairman, secretary, and treasurer, the parish council also maintains certain standing committees. It is the responsibility of these standing committees to oversee the major functions necessary to operate the church, such as maintenance of buildings and grounds, or social events calendar.

However, the parish council also realizes that in order to successfully

serve the parish, it must keep close contact with the parish members. Therefore, there are also parish council members who act as liaison with every auxiliary in the parish including such groups as the Sunday School, Y.P.A., the women's auxiliary, and others. In this way, the parish council is seeking to maintain close communication with all groups within the church and thereby develop a better understanding of their needs and desires.

With the advent of the new church building in Livingston, the parish council realizes that it has even greater responsibilities than in the past. There is, of course, a significant increase in the daily operating expenses of the parish that naturally go along with any expansion such as this one. These increased expenses have developed into a budget that has grown by approximately fifty percent, and thereby presents a challenge to the parish council of creating activities and interests to maintain such a budget.

But there is also another challenge that goes beyond fiscal responsibility. The new church with its school and church has developed increased activity and interest in St. Mary's parish. It is in maintaining this interest and in fostering its growth that the parish council sees its further and even greater challenge, which is meeting the needs of a growing and interested parish community.

Even before St. Mary's had moved to Livingston, this need was realized and steps were taken then to meet it. As an example, the parish council began to sponsor an annual dinner dance for the entire parish, not so much to raise funds, as to bring the parish members together for an evening of enjoyment. Anyone who has attended the annual dinner dances of St. Mary's parish council will attest to the true feeling of family unity that this affair has created through an evening of entertainment together as a parish.

Therefore, the parish council sees itself responsible to a larger more active group of parish members who seek spiritual, cultural, and social fulfillment through St. Mary's, and it is this challenge that the parish council welcomes and works for with dedication.

ST. MARY'S WOMEN'S GUILD



HE Women's Guild of St. Mary's Armenian Apostolic Church is composed of a group of women dedicated and devoted to the benefit and progress of the Church.

The group came into existence forty-six years ago on March 24, 1928. The founders were Mesdames Takouhi Essayian, Haiganoush Gulezian, Meroubeh Haigazian, Perouz Morookian, Parounagian, Mary Tutunjian and Haiganoush Zotian. At that time, they called themselves the Ladies Auxiliary. These women through their indomitable faith and zeal have launched a membership drive which has been extremely successfull and has attracted increasing numbers of new members each year.

This organization recently changed its name to the Women's Guild at the request of the Diocese, so that it would encompass and appeal to a greater number of people.

The activities of the Women's Guild are varied. They prepare the Armenian delicacies for the Annual Bazaar which they originated, the Lenten Dinner; the Cultural Day Dinner and they assist unselfishly at the Annual Picnic in June. One has only to look in the kitchen, while a program is being presented to observe elderly women, side by side, with younger women, teaching and demonstrating the culinary skill which is familiar to the Armenian palate. Their dedication in terms of time and energy is unequaled.

In the minds of all, they are considered, as body, the mothers of the Church. In the past, they assumed the responsibility of the altar linens and the altar pieces, polishing and refurbishing when the need arises. At least once a year they visit the Old Age Home in Emerson to bring a bit of cheer to lonely men and women who at times must feel forgotten.

Through their endeavors, the Women's Guild has pledged a generous sum to our Building Fund to provide for the future needs of the Church.

We look to the Women's Guild as a guiding force in the activities of our Church. We are also inordinately proud of their patience, forbearance and stability at all times.


The Y.P.A. is a multifaceted organization. Its objectives can best be described by quoting directly from the bylaws.

N the Armenian Church, the choir is an essential part of the service. It sets the mood and provides the background music not only for the personal prayers, but also for the corporate prayers of our liturgy.

St. Mary's Armenian Church has a choir whose members now and always have been faithful to their responsibilities. The past history of the choir as narrated below is ample proof of this statement.

St. Mary's Armenian Church choir was officially organized in 1928 under the direction of Dickran Parounag, Towards the end of 1931 the choirmaster was Mr. Andon Cherazian and the following years Mr. Nerses Nersesian, Sisak Nalbandian and Mrs. Essovan. In 1941 Mr. Khosrof Hamamjian became the choirmaster until the end of 1949. Prior to 1950 the church met twice a month to celebrate the Divine Liturgy on Sunday afternoons at the "House of Prayer" in Newark and in 1950, after the purchase of the first church in Irvington, the choir was reorganized under the leadership of Mr. Harutune Shalian. Mr. Shalian's knowledge of the Divine Liturgy and experience as choir director was indeed an asset.

Following the retirement of Mr. Shalian in 1955, the church was very

fortunate in obtaining the services of the esteemed soloist and choirmaster, Mrs. Florence Tourian. Mrs. Tourian continues serving in this capacity with great zeal and devotion.

The organist is a particularly essential area of the choir. Mr. Louis Zotian has undertaken this position for over twenty years and presently continues to generously donate his services.

Presently assisting on the altar are Stolebearer Vartan Abdo, Mr. Jack Bozian and Mr. Robert Nicolian. Serving as altar boys are Vasken Shamamian, Richard Sirabian, Glen Dalakian, Jeffrey Tevanian, John Nersesian and Ronald Nersesian.

Throughout the years many people unselfishly donated their time, talent and abilities, all of which were essential in forming a strong foundation. The contribution of these people will always be remembered.

Since the purchase of our new church in Livingston, we have started a reorganization of the choir, in an effort to attract new members and to enhance our knowledge of the liturgy.

Very Reverend Father Houssig Bagdasian has successfully instilled in us a high level of enthusiasm so that the choir is currently holding weekly rehearsals to learn the hymns in four part harmony.

ST. MARY'S ARMENIAN SCHOOL

RMENIAN School is the primary bridge between the past and future of our incomparable

The importance of this fact was recognized by our community, and an attempt to perpetuate our

mother language was made prior to the purchase of the Irvington Church.

In 1929 the original Araratian Armenian School committee was formed, composed of members from all organizations. Classes were initially held in private homes and rented American halls. The first teacher was Haratune Karananian, followed by Kegham Keghag and Mrs. Moval. In 1933 as conditions changed, the school became inactive and classes were terminated. It was reinstated in 1936. The second attempt brought with it an era of success. Mrs. Nevart Hajian's tenure was succeeded by Mr. A. Hovasapian. Unfortunately, due to a lack of students the school was inevitably closed once

In 1950, the school was reopened and functioned to the best of its ability with the untiring efforts of Mrs. Hajian (Bakalian). Upon assuming duties as pastor, Rev. Mampre Kouzouian took an interest and active part in the language instruction. It is noteworthy to mention that throughout this period, as in previous times, many devoted people served on the school board and in various capacities.

During the capable chairmanship of Mrs. Jean Berberian, the school began to grow and in 1969 Mr. Berc Araz was appointed as school superintendent. He continues to serve in this capacity with great zeal and devotion.

In March 1973, a new Armenian School Board took office, under the direction of our pastor Very Reverend Father Houssig Bagdasian. The members are: Lillian Badishkanian - chairman, Lucy Dalakian - treasurer, Alice Sirabian - secretary, Sylvia Baboomian and Rose Akian as advisors.

Through the combined efforts of the newly appointed board, the dedicated leadership of our pastor and teachers, many innovations have been implimented. An extensive program is now being executed with the main objective directed toward the educational growth and social development in Armenianism.

Our enrollment for 1973-74 was outstanding with a 100% increase. Presently we have 60 students attending classes conducted on Saturday mornings from 10:00 A.M. to Noon. There are seven individual classes, beginning at the nursery level. We are instituting a comprehensive curriculum consisting of reading, writing, with a special emphasis on conversational skills. In conjunction with this, Armenian history and culture will be presented in the fall. We have also introduced new materials, Visual Aids, tapes and techniques which are conducive to promoting a higher level of

We are fortunate in being staffed with qualified teachers who have sacrificed their time and energy without reservation. The teaching staff consists of: Very Reverend Father Houssig Bagdasian, Mr. Berc Araz - superintendent, Mary Dorian, Armine Araz, Sylvia Baboomian, Rose Akian, Vartan Abdo and Ann Antab.

The students have been engaged in several functions. On May 20, 1973, the annual Hantes and Dinner was well received, achieving an unprecedented social and financial success. Other activities included a communion breakfast, a June picnic and swim outing, Halloween Party and Christmas Party, all of which were happy experiences for the children.

Early this year Ruby Morchian and Adrina Shamamian were added to the school board. This expanded effort was made to comply with our ever increasing needs and demands.

In February 1974, our pastor undertook the organization and teaching of evening language classes for adults and college students. The response was great and most satisfactory. Upon the request of his students, preparations for an intermediate class are now underway.

In the past year, we have progressed and excelled in many areas. However, we have only just begun in terms of our ambitious goals and objectives. Our accomplishments are supportive evidence that the future will be rewarding with immeasurable success.

It is imperative that the importance of Armenian School be recognized. It is instrumental in forming an essential foundation for our children's future, enabling them to achieve and maintain their Armenian identity and heritage.



ST. MARY'S ARMENIAN SUNDAY SCHOOL

T. MARY'S first Sunday School was begun in 1950, in the then newly purchased church in Irvington, N.J., with a teaching staff of two, Armine Chilingerian and Irene Mazujian. The enrollment at this time was eight. Within a year the number had grown to fifteen children. The first superintendent, Armine Chilingerian, worked hard to establish a meaningful curriculum. Classes were held in the church hall. During the following years the church school attendance grew with a corresponding increase in its teaching staff. As the Sunday School grew, added facilities were needed and classes were held in the parish house as well as in the church hall.

During its history, the Sunday School has been faithfully served by a number of dedicated superintendents: Armine Chilingerian, Levon Barmakian, Arthur Sarkisian, Victor Kevorkian, Alice Alldian, Kora Jannarone, Robert Milligan, and Barbara Minasian. In addition to their regular duties they taught, attended conferences, organized parties, programs, field trips, and published for a number of years the Sunday School magazine called "Wee Wisdom".

The 1973-1974 year has an enrollment of 90 students. Richard Kopp, the present superintendent, has continued the organization of each week's session into three parts: Church service, class, assembly, alternating the time periods so that the students will become familiar with the entire Badarak. An innovation this year is the explanation of the Soorp Badarak in English while the Sunday School classes are present in church. The detailed explanations are presented by Haig Dadourian and Barbara Minasian while Hayr Soorp is performing the Divine Liturgy. The aim of this program is to bring the students closer to the meaning of the Eucharist.

Another innovation of St. Mary's Armenian Church Sunday School is its post-graduate class, a discussion group led by Kora Jannarone, organized to concern itself with the problems of today's world and its relationship to God. St. Mary's is proud of its many graduates who have gone on to serve her in the choir, on the altar, and as Sunday School teachers and substitutes.

St. Mary's students are being guided in their Christian education by the dedicated and effective efforts of the following teachers: Sandie Boyajian, Mary Sarkissian, Astrid Dadourian, Ann Antab, Rosemarie Caterina, Nevart Marashlian, Mary Dorian, Barbara Minasian, Levon Barmakian, and Haig Dadourian.

The Sunday School follows the recommended curriculum of the Council for Religious Education of the Diocese, which includes an introduction to the life of Christ, history of the Armenian Church, its creed, sacraments, martyrs, saints, and understanding the Divine Liturgy.

The Sunday School staff recognizes its essential responsibility to the members of the Church and their children and works diligently to preserve their religious heritage.


ST. MARY'S ACYOA

A Central Council and special committee were formed to prepare a constitution of National Church Youth Organizations. On January 5, 1950, the Newark Chapter of the Armenian Youth Organization was formed under the direction of their pastor V. Rev. Fr. Shnork Kaloustian. Robert Dorian was the chairman of the original committee. Initiation ceremonies took place in the church and new members were cordially invited to join.

The ACYOA eagerly looked ahead to the years of work into which members put their hearts and souls in order to achieve and live up to the aims and purposes of their organization. Throughout this period many innovations were effective and began to grow.

In the early 1960's the Annual ACYOA Day was established and the program took a permanent place in the church's calendar of events. The initiation of serving coffee and cake after church services took place in the mid sixties. The project received a favorable reaction in terms of enjoyment and profit and presently continues. In the late sixties a senior basketball team was successfully started and remains successful to date. In 1970 the ACYOA became active in various church functions such as the sale of Easter candy, a booth at the Annual Church Bazaar, volunteering their services in the clean-



ing, painting, and various needs of the church. In conjunction with their physical and moral support, they have also pledged their financial support to the building fund.

The current executive committee members are: John Papazian - Chairman, Brenda Berberian - Vice Chairman, Holly Papazian - Recording Secretary, Debbie Berberian - Corresponding Secretary, and Kim Dorian - Treasurer. Assisting the organization in an advisory capacity are: Miss Ovsanna Arakelian and Mr. John Arakelian.

The ACYOA members look to the spiritual guidance of their president, our pastor Very Reverend Father Houssig Bagdasian, whose enthusiastic support is incentive to the youth of our church. Through their loyal efforts they do much to cement all the people of our church into one great family.

Todays generation of youths, with resolute devotion is pursuing their commitment and pledge to uphold the ethnic and spiritual heritage of their ancestors, which is to further the cause of the Armenian people and the Armenian Church.


