THE SAM NERSESSIAN AWARD

GUIDELINE FOR SELECTION OF RECIPIENTS

Initiated as a result of the 1979 ACYOA General Assembly, the "Sam Nersesian Award" is named after Sam Nersesian of the St. Louis ACYOA Chapter of Holy Shoghagat Armenian Church following his tragic death in May of 1979. The Award is annually presented to an ACYOA member who demonstrates Christian virtues of love, humility, patience and understanding.

- 1. Nomination forms shall be sent in the Spring of each year to all parishes and ACYOA Chapters of the Diocese of the Armenian Church.
- Nominations shall be made by the parish priest (or parish council chairman in parishes without a permanent priest) and/or ACYOA Chapter Executive Committee from the given parish of the nominee.
- Nominations shall be received by the ACYOA Central Council by the prescibed deadline - June 15th Those received after the deadline shall not be considered.
- 4. The ACYOA Central Council shall review all eligible nominations and base the selection on the following:
 - a) Keeping in mind the Christian virtues of love, patience, understanding and humility, the nomination form and its information should be carefully reviewed.
 - Selection is not based on intelligence, physical appearences or popularity.
 - c) The nominee should reflect Christ in actions and words.
 - d) The nominee should mend controversy, have a peaceful and conciliatory effect on others, and understand the needs of others.
 - c) The nominee should serve the Church in as many of the following as possible:

d) The nominee should participate in some of the following:

- 5. The ACYOA Central Council shall select from the eligible nominees during the July ACYOA Central Council meeting (or the meeting preceeding the ACYOA National Sports Weekend).
- 6. Presentation of the Sam Nersesian Award and certificate shall take place during the Awards Banquet of the ACYOA National Sports Weekend. The ACYOA Central Council Chairman shall make the official announcement and read the prescribed certificate. The Primate shall make the formal presentation to the recipient.

Article 11, Section 1

From among the members of the ACYOA, the General Assembly shall elect <u>seven</u> members to constitute the ACYOA Central Council. Only one person from any Chapter may be elected to the ACYOA Central Council in any given year. The ACYOA Central Council term of ofice shall commence following the confirmation of the election by the Primate and Diocesan Council.

Article 11, Section 2

As the ACYOA Central Council terms of office expire, the vacancies shall be filled by members elected for two-year terms. If the total number of members of Central Council is changed by amendment, the General Assembly at which the amendment is adopted shall decide how best to accommodate the change so as to keep alternate year elections as even in number as possible. No member shall hold office in excess of two consecutive terms.

Article 11, Section 4

In case of a vacancy in the ACYOA Central Council created by resignation or otherwise, the ACYOA Central Council shall invite the individual who received the next highest number of votes short of election at the last General Assembly to fill the vacancy to complete the term of office. In the event that the first alternate is unable to fill the vacancy, the second alternate shall be invited to fill the position. Should no alternates be available, the ACYOA Central Council shall select an ACYOA member in good standing to fill the vacancy with the same rights, privileges, and responsibilities as the elected National Committee members.

Dear ACYOA Member:

At the invitation of His Holiness Vasken I, Supreme Patriarch and Catholicos of All Armenians, the ACYOA will send an ACYOA Earthquake Relief Team to Armenia. As part of the reconstruction and rehabilitation plan outlined by His Holiness during his "Rising in Recovery" mission to the United States in February, the ACYOA will select twenty-five members to live and work as a team in the stricken city of Stepanavan. First preference will be given to dues-paid members who must be 18 years of age or over.

The ACYOA Earthquake Relief Team will set up a camp in Stepanavan and erect a pre-fabricated 4-family home. The team will be completely self-sufficient, since we do not want to use the limited resources available to the residents of Stepanavan. We will also spend time with the many people who are in need of the comfort and hope we can give to them through our deeds and our love.

The mission's duration will be 4 weeks, beginning in late June and ending in late July. Exact dates will be determined shortly. The team will go to Etchmiadzin to receive the blessings of His Holiness and spend some time in Yerevan.

Members of the ACYOA Earthquake Relief Team will be selected by His Eminence Archbishop Torkom Manoogian, Primate, Diocese of the Armenian Church of America and the ACYOA Central Council. In order to be selected, please complete and agree to the following steps:

- (1) Complete the enclosed application and accompanying forms. Return them to: Douglas Tashjian, ACYOA Executive Secretary, 630 Second Avenue, New York, New York 10016.

 Deadline: Saturday, April 29, 1989 Acceptance notification: Wednesday, May 3, if chosen:
- (2) Provide U.S. passport and four (4) 1 1/16 x 1 1/2 inch black and white photographs of yourself for Soviet Visa application. Deadline for receipt of passports and photos: Monday, May 8. Since this process is time-consuming, we advise that you apply immediately. Those who do not comply with this deadline will forfeit their place.
 - Attend an Orientation Meeting at the Diocesan Center, Saturday, May 13, 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Participants are responsible for travel expenses, and the Diocese will provide room and board.
 - Participants are responsible for travel expenses between their homes and New York City.
 - Participants are responsible for round-trip airfare between New York and Yerevan (approximately \$1,200). This requirement may be waived at a later date should the ACYOA receive these seats at a reduced rate.

The ACYOA is currently making attempts to obtain donations and contributions to cover the costs of this mission and is coordinating all other aspects of this project. If you are selected to be a member of the ACYOA Earthquake Relief Team, we will ask that you accept some of the responsibilities involved in its planning.

This is probably the greatest undertaking the ACYOA has organized. If you feel you can contribute your talents, hard work, leadership, and Christian love, you will be of invaluable service to Armenia. Thank you for your concern, and we look forward to receiving your application.

The Diocese of the Armenian Church of America invites you to consider participating in a 4-week program entitled: "Summer Internship" at the Diocesan Center in New York City-July 9 through August 5, 1989.

The program offers an opportunity for Armenian young adults to work at the Diocesan Center in its various departments and offices. A stipend is provided at \$100.00 per week, as well as most meals, lodging, transportation, supervision and training. Lodging for interns will be at a dormitory of New York University; interns will use public transportation in travelling to and from the Diocesan Center. First preference will be given to applicants who are current dues paid members of the ACYOA, on a first come, first served basis.

The 40-hour work week format will be used, possibly including some weekend days. Possible assignments may include, among others: Primate's Office, Department of Armenian Language Lab and Resource Center, Religious Education, ACYOA, "The Armenian Church" Newspaper, Public Relations, Cathedral Operations, Museum, Library, Accounting, Data Processing, Reception, Tour Guides, etc. (see list on application).

This program is an opportunity to serve the Church at the Diocese; to see and be part of Diocesan operations; to spend some time in New York City; and to understand more about the Church from a very practical perspective. Selective participants will be screened and consulted before assignments are made.




