On February 27, 1987 a meeting/social was held at the home of Melanie Mekelian in Margate, FL. The group consisted of ACYOA members from the newly-formed South Florida ACYOA and AGBU Youth members from Miami. In all their were twenty Armenian youth, Mrs. Janet Papelian (AGBU Youth Coordinator), and Anthony Barsamian (Acting Executive Secretary to the ACYOA).

After everyone had arrived, a group discussion was held. The discussion, lead by Anthony Barsamian, centered around the purpose of the ACYOA, and how it could benefit the youth in South Florida. We discussed the "New ACYOA National Committees." New programs that will bring Religious, Cultural, and Education programs to Armenian youth in their regions.
