

Mr. Barry Zorthian

Barry Zorthian is a nationally known public relations counselor in Washington, D.C. A Graduate of Yale (1941) and New York University Law School (1953), Mr. Zorthian has had a distinguished record of public and private service.

After working in print journalism and radio, Mr. Zorthian joined the Voice of America in 1948, serving as Program Manager for five years. In 1961, he was named Deputy Public Affairs Officer of the USIS in New Delhi, India. He then served in Vietnam as the U.S. government's chief of press relations and psychological operations.

In 1968, Mr. Zorthian became a corporate executive at Time, Inc., later serving as President of Time-Life Broadcast, Inc. From 1975 until 1980, he was Time, Inc.'s Vice President for Government Affairs.

Within the Armenian community, Mr. Zorthian is a member of the AGBU Central Board of Directors, past chairman of the Board of Directors of the Armenian Assembly and a member of the Board of Directors of the Armenian Church Endowment Fund. Most recently, he was the Executive Chairman of the National Committee for the Visit of His Holiness Vasken I.

Fr. Paul Brant, S.J.

Father Paul Brant, S.J. is the director of the Rose Hill Campus Ministry at Fordham University. Father Paul has earned a Master of Science in Engineering from North Carolina State.

After a brief engineering career, Father Paul went on to earn a Master of Divinity degree from Loyola University of Chicago and a Master of Arts in philosophy at Fordham. He was ordained in 1977 and is currently working on his Ph.D. in philosophy.

Father Paul spent six years as pastor of an urban Chicago parish where he set up the Northside Chicago Catholic Young Adult Group. Since 1970, Father Paul has been at Fordham studying philosophy and ministering to young adults. He has specialized in organizing parishes and neighborhoods, molding them into Christian communities. He believes that "young adults have the capacity and mission to revitalize all Christian churches."
