## PRIMATE'S MESSAGE ACYOA - GENERAL ASSEMBLY - SEPT. 1984

1985 is the 70th anniversary of the execution of a heinous plan to exterminate a whole nation, the Armenian people. This nation had a history of five thousand years, had kept pace with the progress and civilization of the human race; and after accepting Christ and His teachings as the foundation of her existence and the saving light for the creative spirit of her children, this nation had enriched the lives of her offsprings with a valuable and unique spiritual heritage.

However, another human race, as the dominating political and military power, at a moment of accumulated madness, decided to up-root, to destroy and to wipe out the subjugated Armenian people and her Christian spiritual heritage.

And the first premeditated and planned genocide was executed in 1915.

We thank God for the undying spirit and faithfulness of our forefathers.

They clung to their faith and their spiritual heritage, and carried them with them to all parts of the world wherever they took refuge.

In the United States and Canada you are the grand-children and the great-grand-children of the survivors of the genocide.

You are here today united as the representatives of our youth and that is magnificant. But it is absolutely essential that you as Armenians also unite in thought and action to make the progress and the contribution we so desperately need.

Our biggest cry is a universal cry - the need for better creativity and growth. But I do not worry so much about the needs of the rest of the world as I know there are unlimited resources for them to tap. How do we meet our demands? Where do  $\underline{\text{we}}$  find our resources?

The answer is just in front of me. I am looking at you. This united gathering here is what I consider our best resource and the only strength we can rely upon. You are the generation of advanced technology, well equipped to bridge the gap between you and your heritage.

Forward thinking and planning are essential for us to grow and survive. A professional approach to youth program is no longer a luxury.

Each year you assemble with all seriousness to plan, discuss, propose, and decide a course of action. Are you a step up from where you were last year or you are standing still? Are you better equipped to serve your church and your community today than a year ago?

A few years back, for example, we laid the ground work for a Youth Ministry program, with the objective of training youth workers and supervising the training of professionals for parishes. Its primary concern was to create an opportunity for young people to relate and participate in the Armenian Church and community.

I know that the program is still not off the ground, I also know that it will stay there unless you decide on a strategy today, even during these meetings, to canvass colleges, universities and other centers where potential candidates are available. Look at this matter as a challenge.

Another challenging assignment for you will be the Youth Festival in Erevan. The Government of Armenia has designated August 15-25, 1985 for a Youth Festival, inviting the participation of choruses, orchestras, song, and dance ensembles, dramatic groups, individual performers, dance, instrumental and vocal music, recitation, painting, etc.

Here is an opportunity for you to pull your resources together and participate with the best available talents. Details will be provided to you.

You all know the meaning of burned out. That could happen to all individuals, institutions, families, managers, professionals, if they lose sight of beliefs, ideals, spiritual strengths.

You cannot let that happen, you must be serious about our faith, about our tradition, about our mission as Christians. By keeping in touch with God you will be able to manage your problems better, God shall be an infinite source in solving your problems.

Let this assembly be a turning point for all. That should not be very difficult to do, since it can be done by following a few simple rules such as:

Reviewing your past - Who are you? Where did you come from? What's your philosophy in life? What are your values in life and religion?

Educating yourself - Training may be a grind, but it brings with it power. Knowledgeable person is the one who will impress the powerful.

Looking at all the options available - What are your goals? What do you need to achieve them? There are far more possibilities than you think.

Reorganizing - If you haven't yet succeeded try to reorganize yourself. You know who you were last year, the year before, but you are not the same today.

Electing the best possibility - Avoid mediocrity which can easily choke your enthusiasm. Choose to follow the best course.

Doing something daring - Take a risk. Make a commitment. Unless you dare to take a risk, you'll never get ahead. People who risk nothing, do nothing, have nothing, are nothing.

Much as I do not like to tell jokes or anectodes, I will end with the following adapted story.

A father once said "Son, you have to set a goal and never quit. Remember Katch Vartan?

The son said "yes".
"Aram Khatchadourian?"
"Yes"
"William Saroyan?"
"Yes"
You know what they all had in common?"
"What"?
"They didn't quit. Remember Harry Narikian"?
The kid said "No. Who was he"?
"See, you don't remember him. He quit."

Some people look upon any setback as the end. But my message to you is you cannot quit. We as a nation did not survive through all these centuries by being quitters.

I pray that we also, as the present generation, may live and work as the genuine inheritors of the valuable and unique spiritual heritage of our forefathers.

Somehow I was envious watching the final outcome of the Olympic games which I am sure most of you watched in awe and admiration. I was envious not because of all the glory, the gold medals, the grandeur, the roar and record breaking crowds, but the Olympiad gave Americans a renewed spirit of pride and patriotism, a sense of brotherhood and belief in themselves, which clearly echoed across the land and indeed around the world.

It is a similar spirit that I have come to witness during these few days as I followed your weekend activities. Your concerted effort to excell, your friendly, yet competitive performance, were commendable and reflective of true spirit of sportsmanship. In organizing the highly successful event of the year you have established a criteria that should serve a model for our youth everywhere.

Others are living in the city where they have unlimited opportunities. Us, we got nothing". After listening to the complaint a positive-thinking woman said "Nonsense! Opportunity? You want opportunity? You got opportunity. You live on the bayou. The bayou leads to the river. The river leads to the gulf. The gulf leads to the ocean. You can go anywhere from where you are".

What kind of Armenians do we expect you to be? Certainly better than we are, and I don't mean just materially. Not merely passive participants offering the minimum you can and that as a favor. But an active participant in the overall pursuit of being a better informed Armenian, involved and caring.

The time is here for you to be creative and imaginative, to think, devise and implement methods to bring the youth together, working to vitalize your presence as Armenians within your larger communities.

The coming year will provide several opportunities for you to demonstrate your strength as a group and as individuals.

Next year marks the 70th anniversary of the Genocide, the black days never to be forgotten, that should serve an occacion for us to celebrate the rebirth of a nation scheduled for annihilation. Your role can become an important factor in the success of the programs that will go on during the entire year.

Also, the Government of Armenia has set aside August 15-25 for a Youth Festival in Yerevan, open to individual performers of dance, instrumental, vocal music, painting, chorus, orchestras and dramatic group. The festival will have a competitive nature, enabling the best teams or individuals to receive special prizes. Application forms will be available for you here.

ESSENCE OF THEIR CHRISTIAN FAITH AND EMBRACE
JESUS CHRIST AS THEIR LORD. TODAY, OUR
YOUNG PEOPLE ARE PROUD OF THEIR IDENTITY
AS ARMENIANS AND THEY SEEK OUT INFORMATION
ABOUT THEIR LANGUAGE, HISTORY, LITERATURE,
MUSIC, ART AND ARCHITECTURE.

OF THE WAY THE WORLD FUNCTIONS TODAY. YOU MUST BE FAMILIAR WITH YOUR HERITAGE AND TAP ITS INFINITE POWER, KNOWING THAT THE STRENGTH OF CUSLTURAL WARFARE CAN BE AWESOME.

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THIS IS A TASK IN WHICH YOU MUST BE IN THE FOREFRONT. YOU MUST EDUCATE YOURSELVES, EDUCATE THOSE WHO DON'T KNOW, AND SHAKE UP THOSE WHO ARE INDIFFERENT.

BEYOND THIS, IT IS ALSO YOUR LEGACY, AS A SON OR DAUGHTER OF A SURVIVOR, TO STAND UP FOR JUSTICL FOR ALL PEOPLES - NOT JUST ARME-NIANS - AND DEFEND THOSE PEOPLES AND NATIONS WHICH ARE BEING WRONGED. WE MUST STAND NOT ONLY FOR OUR CAUSE, BUT FOR THE CAUSE OF THE VICTIMS OF HUMAN RIGHTS VIOLATIONS AROUND THE WORLD. WE MUST WORK TO PUT AN END TO MAN'S INHUMANITY TO HIS FELLOW MAN.

WE MUST ALSO REALIZE THAT THE UNDERRIDING CAUSE OF THE EVILS OF THE WORLD AND
THE PROBLEMS WE ALL FACE IS A BASIC LACK OF
CHRISTIAN VIRTUES. IN GRASPING THESE VIRTUES
IN FOLLOWING THE EXAMPLE SET FOR US BY JESUS
CHRIST, WE WILL FIND THE SOLUTIONS TO THOSE
OBSTACLES THAT STAND IN OUR WAY.
