A BRIEF HISTORY OF THE ARMENIAN CHURCH YOUTH

ORGANIZATION OF AMERICA



When the Armenian Church took roots in America back in the early twentieth century there was little need of youth groups within the Church but as the number of young people increased in the various parishes a spontaneous formation of youth groups took place but with no organizational plan in mind. Some parishes had a youth group within the church and others did not feel the need of such a group since the work of the Church functioned merely about the celebration of the Divine Liturgy. However, as the scope of the work of the Church increased, the leaders within the Church saw the necessity of a youth organization within the Church in order to hold the young people to the Armenian Church and thus not allow them to drift to other churchs by default. The attraction of other church youth groups drew many of the Armenian youth away from their centuries-old Church and so in the early nineteen forties the need for a national Church Youth Organization became imperative and one of our great Church leaders, His Eminence Archbishop Garegin Hovsepian, the Primate in America, took the first steps for the formation of such an organization. However World War II interrupted this noble work and most of the local youth groups were dissolved and the young people went into the service of the United States and served heroically the cause of their beloved United States.


After the war a great religious revival swept over America and especially the Armenian Church. The Armenian youth flocked back into the Armenian Churches in America and providentially the Primate of the Armenian Church in North America was His Grace Bishop Tiran Nersoyan. Bishop Tiran, a religious and intellectual giant, stepped into the work of bringing cohesion and purpose to the youth, and with selfless devotion and inspiring leadership, he challenged the youth with spiritual and intellectual goals. The youth were quick to see the value of the man and the Church he represented and immediately set about establishing parish youth groups throughout the Diocese.

With Parish Youth Groups now active again within the Diocese, Bishop Tiran called together a group of interested youth and on January 12, 1946 the Armenian Church Youth Organization of America was formed at the Constitutional Assembly held in Providence, Rhode Island. For two days, young people from throughout the United States deliberated and formed the Constitution of the A.C.Y.O.A., established the objects of the organiza-tion, the activities, the administration and many other phases of the group which is now the largest and most active Armenian Youth group in America and possibly throughout the world. The Assembly elected a Central Council from its members and the reality of a Church Youth group under the supervision of the Primate and the Diocesan Council of the Armenian Church of North America was an accomplished fact. The guiding light and inspiration was His Grace Bishop Tiran Nersoyan.

From here the youth went back to their local parishes and within a few short years the phenomenal growth of this organization took place. Membership drives, social, cultural and educational programs took shape and the Armenian youth in America became active members within their beloved Church. With the guidance of the Holy Spirit the members became more Church-minded and more Armenian-Church conscious. Today the A.C.Y.O.A. numbers thirty-three chapters and over one thousand members. Annual Assemblies have been held in Providence, Rhode Island; Philadelphia, Pennsylvania; Detroit, Michigan; New Britain, Connecticut; Evanston, Illinois; Watertown, Massachusetts; Worcester, Massachusetts; Cleveland, Ohio; Troy, New York; Racine, Wisconsin; Washington, D. C.; and now this the 11th Annual Assembly in Boston.

The Organization has undertaken many projects on the local level to help the church and its mission in The Organization has undertaken many projects on the local level to help the church and its mission in the community. It is the only Armenian youth group in the United States which has its own monthly magazine, THE ARMENIAN GUARDIAN, devoted to news of the activities of the organization with an emphasis on religious and Armenian Church news. On the national level the organization sponsors the annual Birthday Ball throughout the nation, ACYOA Day, publication of religious pamphlets, A Catechism of Armenian Christian Instruction, A Pocket Devotional Manual, and at the present time all members are contributing weekly to the Armenian Seminary Scholarship Fund, and the Youth Camp Fund. June Festival week-ends are held throughout the regions for the benefit of the Youth Camp Fund and Church School Teacher Conferences are sponsored by the ACYOA so that our young people will be instructed in religious matters by competent personnel. From the local chapter to the national organization the work of the ACYOA is primarily concerned with the spiritual improvement of Armenian young people and to make them more aware of their Sonship to God the Father and their responsibilities to God through the Armenian Church.

That this goal is slowly being realized is evident in the number of those people throughout the Diocese of America who after serving in the ACYOA step into positions of responsibility in the administrative work of the Church and continue to work for the spiritual growth of the younger generation that follows them.





To the leaders and the members of the Armenian Church Youth Organization paternal greetings and pontifical blessings. Our Dearly Beloved Children,

Our Dearly Beloved Children.

This is the Catholicos of All Armenians, who speaks to you in this Epistle, responding gladly to the request made by your official organ, "The Armenian Guardian."

"For though I am absent in body, yet I am with you in spirit, rejoicing to see your good order and the firmness of your faith in Christ." (Colossians 2:5)

Our word comes to you from the heart of the country of Armenians, from Holy Etchmiadzin, where many centuries ago the Son of man-loving God, the Only-Begotten Himself descended and blessed it, and illuminated our people, by showing them the path of life everlasting.

"The Only-Begotten descended from the Father and the Light of Glory with Him."

Since that day, our land was sanctified and the offspring of our people became children of Light, children of God. Here is the great and wonderful mystery of our Holy Church, here is the moving power of the history of the Armenian people, here is the source of the creative graces of our children, here is the assurance of the luminous future of our nation. It is here that God has sealed His covenant with our people, and what God has joined no human hand can put asunder. And centuries told centuries about this sacred covenant, and generations one after the other remained faithful to it. The Armenian people were exhausted but did not rest, the Armenian people suffered constantly but did always create, the Armenian people became martyred but always revived and lived. You, beloved young people, are the genuine children of that God-loving faithful people. Know yourselves well, and with humble pride, with head high shout "I am Armenian."

Remain faithful to the sacred covenant of your forefathers, to the Christian luminous faith and to the God-built Holy Etchmiadzin, to our sweet mother tongue and to the culture of our people, to our just national cause, and to our reborn fatherland.

Remain faithful to the laws of your government, follow discipline, and be constructive citizens, always holding high the torch of the ideas of human freedom and brotherhood of nations,

Remain faithful to the objectives of your organization, and perform your works with honor for the flourishing of the Church and for the benefit of our nation.

Do not pay attention to the controversies and adversities, that are troubling the internal life of the Armenians in dispersion. They are transitory, superficial and often artificially created senseless phenomena. Do stay above all that, like the valiant pilot, who takes wing above the clouds toward the peaceful and bright heights of the firmament. The real Armenian person stands there, on that height with his triumphant Church, his heroic history, his glorious culture and with his present flight of re-birth.

Now, dearly beloved, do not be afraid, do not hesitate or do not weaken. All these are not befitting of youth. Do love your nation as you love your mother. Do love the Armenian Church, as you love your own home. Do love Holy Etchmiadzin as you love your parental heritage.

"So then, brethren, stand firm and hold to the traditions which you were taught by us, either by word of mouth or by letter." (II Thessalonians, 2:15)

You, youngsters and youth born and raised in America, though far from our mother land, yet have a great share of work and toil on the road of the historic mission of rebuilding and blossoming forth of our nation and fatherland. You have your share of work and toil also on the road of realizing the just wishes of our people.

Be proud with that generous work, be proud with that sacred toil. Do not remain on passive positions, come forth, take the rudder of the works of our religious-national life in youthful hands and combine with the wisdom and experience of the aged, the light of your mind, the fire of your heart, your constructive will and your vision.

And above everything, with all your might, preserve and protect the unity and the indivisibility of our Armenian Church with most Holy Etchmiadzin. "For what is our hope or joy or crown of boasting before our Lord Jesus at this coming? Is it not you?" (I Thessalonians 1:19)

Blessed are you for being young. The world is recreated for you. Before the Holy Altar, the Altar of Descent, we pray wholeheartedly that, the Lord keep and protect you — healthy and firm, may He abundantly grant His graces to your souls, and make your life fruitful, glorifying you and by you our Church and our wonderful people.

Do live, grow, blossom and work for the glory of God and the Armenian Holy Apostolic Church, now and always, amen.

THE EMBLEM OF THE ARMENIAN CHURCH YOUTH

ORGANIZATION OF AMERICA AND

The emblem of the Armenian Church Youth Organization of America adopted at its inception, is to be interpreted as follows:

The radiations from the center of the cross symbolize the truths of the Christian religion that shine forth through the centuries.

The symbols under the horizontal bar of the cross are:

- of democracy and freedom.

The chain that encircles the cross on the emblem represents solidarity among the members of the A. C. Y. O. A. in their service to God and to people.

These symbols are designed on a shield which stands for the determination with which the objects of the A. C. Y. O. A. are to be carried out. The shield also stands for defense against dangerous encroachments.

It will be noted that the dominating feature of the emblem is the cross. This indicates the fact that Christ is our Lord and that to Him we owe obedience above all.

ITS SYMBOLIC MEANING

a) (right hand side) The double peaks of Mount Ararat, representing the Armenian people and its destiny. Ararat has been the silent witness of the victories as well as the defeats of the Armenians through their existence as a people and a nation. Its representation on the A. C. Y. O. A. emblem means that the members of the Organization make the pledge of standing for the ideals for which the Armenian nation has stood always.

b) (left hand side) The United States eagle with its wings wide-spread and star above each wing. The cagle looks proudly into far distances and holds, as usual, a batch of arrows. The eagle represents the United States. Its presence on the A. C. Y. O. A. emblem symbolizes the loyalty of the members of the A. C. Y. O. A. to the Constitution of the United States and to its principles
