A.C.Y.O.A. JUNIORS

SHORT-TERM GOALS:

- 1. To conduct one-day Leadership Training Seminars for Juniors in:
 - --New Jersey/New York
 - --Mid-west
 - --New England
- 2. To conduct a program for Juniors at the Annual Diocesan Assembly this May in Palos Heights, Illinois.
- 3. To organize a Juniors Regional Committee in the New York/New Jersey area with youth representatives from each parish. (To be modeled after the Northeæst and Mid-west Committees.)
- 4. To coordinate an Inter-regional Sports Weekend Competition between the Northeast and Mid-west regions. (There is interest on both sides for this summer, but the logistics have to be worked out.)
- 5. To maintain close ties with the Northeast and Mid-west Junior Committees and their Coordinators by receiving the agenda and minutes of each meeting and by attending at least one meeting a year.
- 6. To attend as many Junior regional events as possible: Sports Week-ends, retreats, etc.
- 7. To publish a Juniors Directory.
- 8. To publish the "Junior Connection" quarterly, this year with a new logo.
- 9. To draw up a tentative set of By-laws for the Juniors.
- 10. To participate in the St. Nersess Summer Conferences for High School students in order to maintain ties with Junior-aged youth.
- 11. To make regular parish visitations, giving priority to those parishes with no Junior group.
- 12. To arrange for more publicity for the Juniors.
- 13. To improve my level of professionalism by keeping current on new developments in the field of youth ministry through periodicals and other materials and, if possible, attending seminars and workshops.
- 14. To keep my Diocesan Council liason well-informed of my progress, problems and needs.

LONG-TERM GOALS:

- 1. To have a Juniors group in every parish of the Diocese along with an adult advisor and involved pastor.
- 2. To have strong regional committees for Juniors in every area of the Diocese made up of youth representatives, advisors and a clergy Coordinator.
- 3. To conduct an annual program for Juniors at every Diocesan Assembly.
- 4. To conduct an annual weekend Leadership Training Institute for Juniors in every region of the Diocese.
- To expand the "Junior Connection" to 20 pages or more, add color, more educational articles, etc.
- 6. To organize regular Diocesan-wide youth gatherings at appropriate camp sites.
- 7. To organize an educational trip to Armenia for Juniors or arrange for them to participate in the ACYOA Seniors' trip.
- 8. To publish a handbook for pastors and adult advisors on "Youth Ministry in the [Afmenian Church."
- 9. To issue official By-laws for the Juniors (and approved by them) by which the organization can function uniformly throughout the Diocese.
- 10. To publish a Juniors Directory on a regular basis.

OTHER GOALS:

- 1. To conduct regular teacher-training workshops for the D.R.E.
- 2. To submit monthly articles to the D.R.E. Bulletin.
- 3. To act as Consultant for the five primary-grade textbook writers as part of the D.R.E. Curriculum Project.
- 4. To complete an 11th grade student textbook and teacher's guide as part of the D.R.E. Curriculum Project.
- 5. To serve on the St. Vartan Camp Committee.

Long Range

- 1. The development of an original curriculum for grades pre-school through twelve for use in all our Sunday Schools.
- 2. The continuation of the DRE Bulletin as a regular 8-16 page publication of the Department designed specifically for religious educators or those interested in religious education.
- 3. The development of other regular publications of the Department, i.e. specifically for adults and specifically for children (perhaps by subscription as in other churches...)
- 4. An on-going program for the adults of our community, which will include adult group-study courses to encourage coming together to learn in the church environment, as well as books, manuals, etc.
- 5. The continuation of a regular series of teacher training workshops which takes the DRE to parish schools for teaching and learning.
- 6. The development of a required training program for all prospective teachers and superintendents (something for the distant future).
- 7. The continuing development of curriculum supplements, i.e. flash, cards, puzzles, games, teacher aids for use in a specifically Armenian Christian environment.
- 8. A vigorous program to introduce the idea of religious education to parishes where it does not exist or to offer aid and support to ailing schools.
- 9. Continued attention to quality publications of a lasting value, i.e. translations of works currently available only in Armenian; new books on saints, prayers, sacraments, etc.
- 10. The development of original filmstrips on Armenian subjects.

Short Range (1983)

- 1. Concerning the curriculum project: manuscript versions of the curriculum will be completed by summer 1983; half of them will be piloted in selected schools of the Diocese in fall 1983, the rest in spring 1984. Art director will simultaneously begin work on the textbook design.
- 2. Although this was a short range goal of last year which was not achieved, the DRE still needs more regular help from the Diocesan office in its routine work.
- 3. The completion of the filmstrip overhaul and the release of a new catalogue in 1983. (These filmstrips are borrowed free by the parish schools and organizations.)
- 4. Visits to small parishes and predominantly Armenian-speaking parishes to promote and encourage religious education planned this year: Canada, Houston, and all small parish communities will be personally visited. (This is in addition to workshops.)
- 5. The release of new items planned for 1983: Sacraments: The Symbols of Our Faith; Saints for

Children (its Armenian version as well); God, I Know You're There All the Time; a new cross pin and pendant made of the Armenian letters for faith, hope, and love.

- 6. Preliminary work on a catechism of the Armenian faith for adults and on a general teacher manual will begin.
- 7. A translation from the Krapar into English (for the first time) of the Lives of Shooshanig and Vahan Koghtantzi will be produced.
