He was worried about losing money if they don't solicit enough participants, etc. I tried to assure him that it would be difficult to lose money unless something very unusual happens. He also mentioned that since his agent does such a high volume business, he would be more willing to cover additional expenses. While this may true, I see very little advantage to speculating.
- 2. A letter should be sent from the Primate's Office appointing the Group Leaders for the Trips. Father Arsem Barsamian called me and I said that Your Eminence will be speaking with him soon. I have not yet spoken with Father Vertanes or Yeretzgin Kalayjian. Should I?
- 3. I have been receiving several annoying telephone calls from various people throughout the Diocese regarding their children, grandchildren, nephatewarddewen "Tfrieds" participating in the ACYOA Trip. The problem is that they are mostly under age 18 and are not high school graduates, are therefore not eligible for ACYOA membership and not eligible for consideration in the ACYOA Armenian Studies Programs. This problem seems to be muchrooming, and, some very irate parents continue to try send their off-spring. I have said, and include this in all mailings, that those who are ineligible (as aforementioned) will be placed on a "waiting list", and if there is space, they will be considered.
- 4. Please forward "Invitation of the Catholicos" at the earliest.

Moreover, for the entire ACYOA across the Diocese to participate in one unified program in each Parish on the same day is perhaps the singularly most effective statement the young adults of the Church can make regarding their concern for those who perished in 1915.

The enclosed "Commemoration" outline is designed for your use in preparing your local program. This step-by-step resource provides the what, why and how of the four-part commemoration.

Perhaps the most significant part of the Program is Part 4 - the donation of Armenian books to local public libraries. In reference to two items the Council has concerned itself with, namely, (1)membership incentives, and (2) National Organizational restructuring, it is strongly suggested that they be addressed in terms of ACYOA Constitutional Amendments for the coming Assembly in Worcester.

While the Council itself could direct certain procedures for membership incentive(s), the procedures would have more impact and meaning if it was built into the Constitution. Properly presented, it should easily gain acceptance and pass.

The restructuring idea has surfaced from time to time, and such proposals have been presented to the Diocese over the past three years. Again, however, if the ACYOA Assembly were to vote on a proposal to restructure (at least on the national level) its impact would be greater, and the members and delegates would assume some "ownership". The Primate has the authority to take action and direct the Organizations of the Diocese according to their need and priority. However, His Eminence has made it clear on several occasions that, in the case of the ACYOA, there is a mechanism within which reasonable change can be initiated. As you know, any and all Constitutional Amendments and proposals, once passed by the ACYOA Assembly, are in need of approval by the Primate.

This should serve to clear up any questions on procedure and propriety. Regarding your request to meet with the Primate, I shall be in touch with you shortly on this.

#### Your Eminence:

Enclosed for reference purposes are materials related to the ACYOA Armenian Studies Programs - Educational Tour to Armenia. These have been mailed to the participants in anticipation of the June 19th departure.

Your Eminence should be advised on the following:

- 1. Father Arsen Barsamian has asked that the Armenian priest in Moscow be informed of the group's arrival in Moscow so that he may assist with customs, and other official interation with Intourist, et. al. The group will arrive in Moscow on Thursday, June 20th see blue sheet for complete itinerary.
- 2. The attached sheets were mailed to all participants, Fr. Arsen and Fr. Nersess along with a Handbook to Armenia. This year marks the depletion of the original printing of the Handbook. It should now be revised and prepared for next year.
- 3. Participants Kevin Giragosian (Palos Heights) and John Yaldezian (California) were originally planned to tour Europe together this summer. I contacted them and talked them into participating in the Armenia trip they were the 18th and 19th group members. However, they also desired to see Europe after the program, departing from the group at the stop over in Paris (see itinerary, July 19th). I told them that this is not encouraged due to past experiences. They insisted that they were "old enough" (both mid-to-late 20's). I said they would have to send a "waiver" letter, divesting the ACYOA and Church of any responsibility to their safety and well-being after they departed from the group. They agreed. A copy of Giragosian's letter is enclosed. Yaldezian will send his letter soon. A copy has also been sent to Fr. Arsen.
- 4. The group is to be received by the Primate at approximately 3 pm on Wednesday, June 19th following a luncheon, orientation session and a Tour of the Cathedral Complex. Group photos will be taken prior to departure at 3:45 pm.
- 5. As is the custom, upon arrival in Yerevan, the Group Leader will send a telegram to the Primate informing them of a safe arrival. Parents are instructed to call

the Diocese during regular business hours to learn of the group's safe arrival. (See yellow sheet, number 6.) However, in the past, when a parent would call, no one would have any idea of what to say, or, if any telegram had been received. It is suggested that the receptionist, or someone in particular, be informed and appointed to handle these few telephone calls.

6. It is suggested that in future years, the ACYOA and Choir Association programs not be mixed and take place during the same time. I was reviewing the applications of the Choir Association participants, and one (Vartabedian) is below the minimum age set by the ACYOA Program. Apparently, the Choir Association does not have a minimum age rule. Moreover, it appears that the Choir Association might be more successful if they tried their program once every 3 to 5 years and really promoted it as a major event. On the subject of "promotions", although we didn't publicize the ACYOA trip as much as in past years due to the uncertain status of the trip as a whole and the situation in Armenia, the various newsletters and monthly bullitins of the parishes hardly mentioned this program. All parishes received the information sheets, news releases, etc. of 22 newsletters reviewed, 4 had some mention, article, advertisement. This is hardly a way of promoting this worthwhile program to the youth.

If all goes well, the participants will arrive at the Cathedral on Wednesday, June 19th and begin orientation/luncheon at 12 noon. Perhaps Your Eminence would like to join the group for lunch this year?

This letter is to clarify that since the cash-flow of the ACYOA National Treasury is less than expected, reimbursements for the Archbishop's Tournament and the Leadership Seminar shall only apply to the Council Member assigned to those Programs. Specifically, Shake Ajamian and yourself respectively. (Since Shake's expenses should minimal, and the changed format for the Seminar will result in minimal costs, we should be well below the respective budgets of \$500 and \$300.)

You are urged to prepare a "budgeted" and "actual" balance sheet regarding our financial situation for the next Council meeting. This need not be precise, but reflect figures that will allow all Council members to know the situation.

A couple of Council members have indicated that they have not been reimbursed for their expenses of late. If they are following proper procedures, and, if their expenses are legitimate and within the guidelines, there should be no reason for any delay. (Unless of course there is no money!) If there is a question regarding reimbursements, you should immediately discuss with the Council Chairman the question. If this does not resolve it, you should then consult the Executive Secretary. As per our discussion at our last meeting, each Regional Representative was to receive from the Treasurer a list of dues paying members. This information was to be used in establishing which chapters were delinquent in dues payment. This is especially critical in light of the lack of cash-flow in the National Treasury.

Before our next meeting, you should be in touch with each of your parishes and chapters regarding their dues payments. Those who are up to date should be told accordingly, and reminded that they should send in their dues for the 1986-87 year as the new year begins July 1st. Those who are currently delinquent, should be informed of such, and, reminded of the penalty fee that will be attached to their "obligations" before their participation in the Assembly and Sports Weekend competition. High communications is necessary so that we may take in additional revenues, as well as keep everyone informed regarding procedures and penalty fees.

Your Eminence:

Recent developments within the Soviet Union with regard to the nuclear accident at Chernobyl has given cause to be concerned about the ACYOA Armenian Studies Program - "Educational Tour to Armenia" (June 16-July19).

While considerable concern persists with the threat of international terrorism for travelers abroad (this has been even more evident with the inquiries into our ASP, as well as the number of interested participants) the nuclear accident presents a completely different and possibly greater problem. One aspect is the "unknown" factors dealing with radiation in general. Another is the far greater unknowns in dealing with reliable information from the Soviet Union. It is only recently that the Soviet Government has begun to cooperate and release valuable information regarding the details at Chernobyl.

A number of participants and their parents have made their concerns known to me - ranging from mild concerns and questions, to begging for the trip to be cancelled (since they couldn't force their 24 year old daughter not to go).

As already mentioned to the Vicar General, any information that the State Department could provide would be helpful in arriving at an intelligent decision. We are compelled to decide very soon because of airline/Intourist restrictions.

This letter is to clarify that since the cash-flow of the ACYOA National Treasury is less than expected, reimbursements for the Archbishop's Tournament and the Leadership Seminar shall only apply to the Council Member assigned to those Programs. Specifically, Shake Ajamian and yourself respectively. (Since Shake's expenses should minimal, and the changed format for the Seminar will result in minimal costs, we should be well below the respective budgets of \$500 and \$300.)

You are urged to prepare a "budgeted" and "actual" balance sheet regarding our financial situation for the next Council meeting. This need not be precise, but reflect figures that will allow all Council members to know the situation.

A couple of Council members have indicated that they have not been reimbursed for their expenses of late. #### Your Eminence:

This is a report of our activities as the Acting Executive Secretary and National Fundraising Chairmen to the Armenian Church Youth Organization of America, Senior Division for June 16 through July 15, 1987.

#### National Fund Raiser

A list of 600 prospective donors was compiled from St. Thomas membership, St. James (Westchester) membership, ACEF donors, Camp Vartan donors, Mid-Atlantic Anniversary Ball attendees and Mid-West Anniversary Ball attendees.

Two letters were sent. The first was directed toward 25 people who have historically given large sums of money to the Armenian Church. The second was sent to approximately 575 ACYOA alumni and/or people who have historically supported youth programs.

As of July 14, we have received \$3,500 in donations from our mailing.

In addition, Gregory Saraydarian, Central Council Recording Secretary, sent an appeal letter to people who have donated to the Holy Martyrs Armenian School. Overall, the National Fund Raiser, through the sale of raffle tickets, has raised approximately \$18,000 before expenses and prizes.

#### ACYOA Endowment Fund

We are honored to have received an \$11,000 donation from Edward and Helen Mardigian. We have also transferred \$15,000 from Merrill Lynch mutual fund to the ACEF. We are beginning plans to develop an organized Endowment Fund Campaign which will be announced in September.

#### Diocesan Council Blue Ribbon Committee

A letter was sent to committee members, changing the meeting date from July 23 to August 1 and the meeting place from St. Nersess Seminary to the Diocesan Center. We are planning to direct our discussion toward identification of problems and recommendation of solutions, with the objective of presenting specific program and budget proposals at the 1988 Diocesan Assembly.

#### Report of Acting Executive Secretary's Tour to Armenia

On June 15, 1987, the ACYOA Armenian Studies Program sent its annual Education Tour to Armenia for a one month study. The director for this year's tour was the Rev. Dr. Krikor Maksoudian from Arlington, Mass. Dr. Maksoudian suspended his scholarly work to direct this tour.

The Councilor for women was Mrs. Martha Gurahian, chairperson of the St. James (Westchester) Parish Council. The tour coordinator was Antranig Barsamian, who suspended his position of Acting Executive Secretary to the ACYOA to assume this responsibility.

Other than the three staff members, the tour consisted of twenty ACYOA young adult participants. The tour itinerary consisted of twenty-one days in Armenia, two days in Moscow, four days in Leningrad, and one night lay over in Vienna, Austria.

The group visited some 48 Armenian vanks, churches and architectural monuments. A daily schedule of Armenian language, dance, and singing classes kept the group very busy during the week, and longer excursions were taken on weekends. The group also fully toured Moscow, Leningrad and Vienna, visiting churches, monuments and sights of interest.

Since the tour was the official guest of His Holiness Catholicos Vasken I., four audiences were arranged with His Holiness. The group officially attended Badarak at the Holy Church of Etchmiadzin, escorted by our beloved Catholicos. The tour was also the guests of the Committee for Cultural Relations Abroad. This "embassy" coordinated all of our arrangements in the Soviet Union. We stayed at Hotel Armenia for 21 days, and then were escorted to Leningrad and Moscow by a Committee representative.

A full financial report of the tour will be ready next month.

Greetings! Please find enclosed a plan for Doug to complete the Center's Certificate in Youth Ministry Studies in one year. I have outlined a recommended sequence of courses and listed the dates and sites for the courses. Since Doug is interested in pursuing a degree in Counseling, I did not include a Counseling course. I can add this if you and he desire that. I would like to recommend that Doug receive his 12 credits through Loyola University in Chicago. We have strong relationship with them and we could develop a special arrangement for Doug. It would cost approximately \$2400 for 12 credits. Books and materials would cost approximately \$150. The last item would be air travel to these sites. Using the plan I outlined, he would have to travel to 6 of the weekend courses (the seventh is held in New Jersey). Based on my travel experience, using weekend, super saver fares he should average approximately \$250 per site or a total of \$1500. It could be less because flights from Newark Airport are often less expensive than LaGuardia. I think the sites I have recommended would allow Doug to visit churches in the area.

In addition to course work, we will build in a supervision component. I will ask Fr. Ron Bagley from our staff to provide the supervision process. Ron is a specialist in young adult ministry and has extensive supervisory experience. He lives in Buffalo, but is in the NYC metropolitan area every six weeks for Center staff meetings. Meetings could take place in Buffalo or NYC. (There are inexpensive air fares from Newark Airport to Buffalo.) I would envision monthly supervisory meetings between Doug and Ron of approximately 2 - 2 1/2 hours per session. This would be scheduled between the two of them. All of Doug's course work and papers would be reviewed and evaluated by Ron. In addition, the Center can develop an evaluation process that would help you assess Doug's progress and job performance. I would propose a \$75/session fee for supervision. There would be 8 sessions (beginning in October), so the total fee for the year would be \$600.

This is a flexible plan, which needs to be tailored to Doug's work and schedule. I am quite open to revising it in consultation with the two of you. Please let me know what you think. I will be back in the office on Monday, August 31st.

On Tuesday, September 13, 1988, the Detroit ACYOA contacted Stephanie Masoian in Providence, Rhode Island to request a copy of the Midwest portion of the ACYOA mailing list for the distribution of flyers regarding our annual November Dance. On Sunday, October 2, 1988, Sara Andonian contacted Stephanie again to ascertain why we had not yet received the list. Sara was informed that the request was denied from your office.

Please be informed that this list has been in the possession of the Central Council Treasurer since July 1988. Perhaps better communication is in order.

Additionally and in the future, if you could provide us with the necessary requirements to receive the mailing list, we would appreciate the information. I assumed that since we were a recognized chapter of the ACYOA and were present at the General

In reference to your letter of October 5th, which surprised me, it is apparent that there is a need to review the requirements necessary for a Chapter to receive an ACYOA regional or national mailing list.

There is clearly, and without exception, an authorized way to make a request for any such list. Neither Scott nor I can understand why Sara Andonian did not follow it. Sara has just completed a two-year term on Central Council, and in her first year she was responsible for the ACYOA national mailing list which encompassed both regional and national mailings. It was understood, and indeed promoted by her, that these lists could only be obtained by requests made directly the Central Council or the ACYOA Executive Secretary.

It was also public knowledge that the national mailing list was being virtually recreated and then computerized with the assistance of the Sports Weekend Committee. However, a few Chapters did not comply with our repeated attempts to get their updated mailing lists, Detroit being one of them.

Tamara, letters were written to you on 11/02, 11/23, and 2/04

specifically requesting a copy of the updated Detroit list (copies enclosed). Neither the Sports Weekend Committee, Central Council, nor I received a response to any of them. We did not ask you to create a new mailing list; only to review, edit, and update the <u>old</u> one which consisted of names we had been contacting since well before June, 1987.

Consequently, the Sports Weekend Committee reported that we received many calls from young adults in Detroit who had not received information on the National Sports Weekend. We also received many returned envelopes during the past year with Detroit addresses. I think you will agree that this had a costly impact on the ACYOA, and it is an indication that the Detroit Chapter is not reaching many young adults who, despite lack of communication, called for information and participated in the National Sports Weekend. It also means that Detroit missed out on opportunities to recruit new members, and unfortunately, these young adults were not informed of other regional or national ACYOA programs. I believe that you will agree that it is our mission to reach out to all Armenian young adults in all parishes.

Nevertheless, even without the complete cooperation of all Chapters, we corrected and collected addresses and managed to produce a much more accurate national mailing list, including one for the Detroit Chapter. We included address changes from returned mail, requests from potential members, and the names of 15 young adults from Detroit who purchased National Sports Weekend package plans. These names had not previously appeared on the Detroit list.

At the General Assembly in Providence, we announced on two occasions, in the presence of the Detroit delegation, that the national mailing list was in need of final editing and until it was completed it would not be ready for distribution. This announcement applied equally to all ACYOA Chapters (Detroit copy enclosed). Again, all we were asking the Detroit delegation to do was to follow-up with a review and update of the amended Detroit

list, nothing more.

Following the General Assembly, during a conversation with Myles Couyoumjian, who had called me on other ACYOA business, I reminded him about the update of the Detroit Chapter list and its requirement before the ACYOA could release a regional mailing list. Myles, as you know, attended the General Assembly and serves as the Detroit Chapter Vice-Chairman. So, Tamara, I cannot understand how you were not apprised of the proper procedure regarding the distribution of the ACYOA mailing list, nor can I comprehend how you were under the impression that the Detroit Chapter's mailing list request was indiscriminately ignored. Truthfully, the Chapter's request was not denied. Stephanie Masoian, after discussing the matter with me, returned Sara's telephone call and reiterated the above facts.

Hopefully, to allay any future confusion and misunderstanding, I have spoken to Myles and he has assured me that he will work with you, your Pastor, and other members of the Detroit Chapter to complete the mailing list. This will obviously not take place in time to make all the changes and send you the completed labels for your November Dance. However, we want to assist you; therefore, Linda Minassian will send you the present Midwest mailing labels, including Philadelphia and Canada, by express mail as soon as she completes the most recent corrections generated by our September ACYOA national mailing.

I trust this clarifies the situation and that we can avoid any such misunderstandings in the future.

I was told that the 12.75 deduction for changes in the medical insurance would be adjusted over three salary periods, instead of all at once. An adjustment was made on the June 30th check for one previous deduction only. Since I was assured that all previous deductions would be reimbursed, I feel that the 25.50 that remains constitutes a descrepancy.



My position includes continuing the responsibilites of the General Secretary, and overseeing the 1986 Sportsweekend and General Assembly, which will be held from August 27, through September 1.

V. Rev. Father Khajag:

This letter is to bring to your attention what appears to be a growing problem regarding the mail received at the Diocese. There are two points I should like to make here:

- 1. Mail that is received at the Diocese under my name, or in the name of ACYOA (seniors) is sometimes opened by others. Why this happens is never explained. In addition, the established procedure is to forward my mail each Friday. The procedure simply calls for someone to place the mail of the week into a large envelope and send it before 5pm. With this accomplished, I should receive my mail before Wednesday of the following week. Many times this is not the case.
- 2. Financial statements received at the Diocese in my name or in the name of ACYOA are also opened, almost each and every time. Again no explanation is given. There are no secret funds that need to be checked by anyone at least that I am aware of. Naturally, with someone opening and reading the mail, it takes longer for it to be forwarded to me. Thank you for your letter and "fact sheet", you and your chapter appear very busy...keep it up!

Regarding your inquiry about a two-week trip to Armenia, we do offer a shorter trip during the summer for the same reason - either the people interested do not have 4 weeks of vacation, or, they are not interested in a highly structured "educational" program, is incorporated in the month-long "Educational Tour To Armenia".

However, what has happened in recent years is that we have not fully promoted the program, and thus, we usually do not have enough confirmed participated to form our own group. Those who do apply are connected to a commercial three-week tour, in which they are provided with the same service, and take advantage of group rates and travel agent experience. Keep in mind that to travel all the way to Armenia for only two weeks is not the best of itineraries.

If you are very interested, and wish to really promote the alternative trip, we might acheive the number needed(12-15) to form our own group, with a group leader whose ticket is paid for.

It is a pleasure to be able to meet and speak with you on a more regular basis since your appointment as Vicar General with its varied duties.

While an official letter or outline of any new procedures has yet to come regarding your position, I thought I might ask a few questions:

- 1. As has been mentioned by the Primate, you are to oversee the various departments. Does this mean that you are to receive copies of all materials and correspondence, previously sent to Mr. Kermian?
- 2. Almost 95% of my departmental budget is first paid by me directly, and then reimbursed by the Diocese. Presently, there are times when a considerable amount of time goes by before a reimbursement check arrives, during which time I must carry the amount spent. A week to ten days is fine, but more than this can be a problem. With your new position, shall the reimbursement/vouchers be sent directly to you? Or, shall they continue to be sent to Mr. Kermian. Will sending them to you add any additional time to the reimbursement procedure?
- 3. Presently, the monthly reports, along with copies of virtually everythingelse is sent to Mr. Kermian, and of course the Primate. Should I send the monthly reports, etc., to you now instead of Mr. Kermian?

Dear Council Members,

#### Rev. Father Nersess:

Your letter of July 12th with the enclosed check for \$157.00 has been received today. For some reason the continued strain between the combining of the Choir and ACYOA Armenia trips continues.

We had requested \$310.00 (see previously sent enclosure for breakdown) because these were expenses of the three participants from the Choir Association. The following might illuminate the specifics for you.

- 1. The <u>Handbooks</u> cost money regardless of their use. The fact that you are placing your copy "on file" does not make it free. We are not a big enough organization to give away free samples as you suggested.
- 2. You misunderstood regarding the bus and the covering of it be the travel agent. This was not indicated to my knowledge. Nevertheless, it was an expense that each participant covered. The ACYOA should not have to pay the way of Choir Association participants regardless of their number. Besides, \$8.00 per person to JFK is a bargain. Any travel agent will include such expenses, somewhere, in the total billing. Please don't quote past experiences or how things were done when you were coordinating times and people have shanged and something done in the past is not (thank God) a prerequisite for the future.
- 3. As for your figure of \$125.00 for postage and telephone calls....this is quite unbelievable. Given the number of mailings, the amount of materials, the number of potential and actual particiapants, and the small amount of publicity, this figure is much too high. Even if you had 5 participants, that's would be \$25.00 each worth of cost!? If the ACYOA spent this much, or even half this much, the cost of the trip would double. Perhaps you should re-check your figures.

In any case, Der Hayr, I have no intention of chasing you for the difference. I would suggest that you at least send \$28.00 to cover the bus and the extra Handbook, and, if it won't deplete your funds, half your expense money. By

By the way, any and all expenses should have been paid to you via the ACYOA ASP account - and - all Choir Association participants should have paid the same fee as the ACYOA participants, and they should have paid it to the ACYOA ASP. This would have saved alot of trouble and unnecessary aggravation.

I am reccomending that the two trips/programs not be combined in the future. It's certainly not worth my time.

In chapters without declared delegates, it is the responsibility of the Chapter Chairman to distribute the items.

You will also find a letter from the Wynnewood ACYOA Chapter informing of their intent to bid for the 1986 Nat. Sports. Weekend. As of this date, we have not received a bid from a New York City area chapter on a bid for the 1986 Archbishop's Basketball Tournament.

Also enclosed is the August Executive Update. The Council Chairman and Vice Chairman and I thought it favorable to include the restructuring proposal in the Update to allow for the general membership to realize its importance and details. Also, the Update promotes the upcoming Sports Weekend, which has not had timely publicity due to the unavailability of the national mailing list. Thus, the contents of this issue is relevant and important to the Assembly and Weekend, and we decided that it should be mailed first class instead of bulk rate. Therefore you are instructed to fold the Update in half, and place 22 cent postage stamps on each. In this way, it will arrive with a few days. You are encouraged to try and have your copies made immediately and mail this issue yesterday. (\*don't forget to fold the update in half, or it won't go at 22 cents each.)

If for some reason you are unable to fulfill your responsibilities, please inform. Further, if you are unable to be at the Assembly on Wednesday evening, please inform so that your duties will be covered.

+contact the chapters/parishes of your region and encourage their participation at the Assembly and to attend the Weekend. Especially mention the ACYOA restructuring proposal and ask for their support.

SUSAN: +contact the chapters/parishes of your region and encourage their participation in the Assembly and attendance at the Weekend. Especially mention the restructuring proposal and solicit their support.

ARDA: +prepare listing of chapters who have paid their dues, allowing for Assembly and Weekend participation.

+prepare Council report and send to Jimmie (accomplished).

+check on 70th anniversary of martyrs posters at Diocese - bring to

GEORGE: +orientate and assist recording secretary with related duties, names, chapters, etc. Use last year's Minutes as a reference and standard.
+solicit support for restructuring proposal.

SHAKE': +assist with delegate registration.

+assist Auditing Committee and see they are prepared to report as per agenda.

This is a report of my activaties as Interim Executive Secretary of the Armenian Church Youth Organization for September of 1990.

On the 27th of August, I assumed the postion of Acting Executive Secretary for an interim period. My responsibilities include coordination of activaties for the ACYDA Office, meeting with chapters that host national programs, and recruiting candidates for the position of Executive Secretary.

In September, the ACYDA General Assembly and Sports Weekend started off the Fall schedule. The weekend attracted approximately 700 hundred ACYDA members and friends from the Western Diocese, Canadian Diocese and our Diocese. Over 40 delegates were present at the Assembly meetings, including nine clergy delegates. Chapters represented were Hartford, CT; Boca Raton, FL; Cambridge, MA; Springfield, MA; Watertown, MA; Worcester, MA; Detroit, MI, Fair Lawn, NJ; Bayside, NY; Watervliet, NY; Westchester, NY; Wynnewood, PA Providence, RI; Richmond, VI; and the host chapter of Cleveland, OH.

This year's convention hosted Archbishop Vatche Hovsepian and Rt. Rev. Fr. Hovnan Derderian as guests to our Diocese. Also, Mr. Jerry Tarkanian was present during the weekend, and was the guest speaker at the awards banquet. Mr. and Mrs. Edward Mardigian were honarary co-chairman of the weekend, and presented a gift of 50,000.00 dollars in the name of the ACYDA Endowment Fund.

Much of my responsibilities during the weekend included working with the Central Council to assure that all meetings were in order, assisting the Primates with any concerns during the weekend, and working closely with the host chapter to assure that all the events ran smoothly. I was personally responsible for the entertainment.

While in Cleveland, I also meet with St. Gregory of Narek's Parish Council, by invitation of Mrs. Florence Karoghlanian, chairman. I listened to their concerns regarding resouces for the parish youth and young adults.

Much of this past month was spent re-organizing the ACYOA Office. All our files were updated and the ACYOA computer was finally activated. For the first time, the ACYOA Diocesan Office has its own computer, and as of October 14th, the ACYOA National mailing list has been loaded on our computer at headquarters. Over three thousand names and addresses have been imputed, and are updated weekly. Nicole Mazmanian has been working diligently on this project, and our mailing list is finally up-to-date. This was a major issue at this year's ACYOA Assembly, and I do not anticipate any more problems regarding the national mailing list.


On October 2nd, I visited St. George ACYOA in Hartford. Hartford will be hosting the 1991 Sports Weekend and General Assembly. I spoke to a general parish gathering concerning the effort of hosting the ACYOA Assembly and Sports Weekend. Later, I met with the host committee and outlined some concerns the ACYOA had with this year's Sports Weekend, including trophy distribution, public relations and photography, and publicity.

This month, I have held various meetings with Central Council members, persons conducting research studies examining the Diocese and the Diocesan structure, and with Mr. Douglas Tashjian, our former ACYOA Executive Secretary. All these meetings have held to build communication with all branches of our organization.

I anticipate working closely in the coming month with Steve Sarkisian to assist in the development of the future plans for our Diocesan youth and young adult programs. I hope to interest fresh qualified candidtes who are eager to work for the Armenian Church, and for the youth and young adult program.

I have also developed a good working relationship with Ms. Nicole Mazmanian, the ACYOA college coordinator. Nicole and I have been working together developing new programs targeted at attracting Armenian college students to Armenian church and cultural issues. Most of these programs are being planned to take place in the Winter and Spring months.

Dear Anthony:

First, let me congratulate you on your re-appointment as Interim Director of ACYOA Srs. I know you shall do your utmost to secure a more solid future for our youth.

In the spirit of true Christian love and concern, I am writing to you about the recent Sports Weekend, which the Seniors convened in Cleveland, Ohio. I recently learned that members from my own parish, as well as other Mid-Western Armenian parishes comprised a team(s) for sports competition, had won first place trophies, honors and the glory of the day. I cannot say I was happy. This disturbed me to find this out. Why?

The members from Racine, who participated, are not active in their own community here, nor is there really officially an ACYOA Seniors group of my parish. Many of them, neither pay dues to the National Organization, nor do they lend their hands in the service of the church. I question the Central Council and Sports Weekend Committee criteria for allowing them to compete; the screening of all participants by the "committee", and the eligibility of those who participate in ACYOA Sports. Also, I wonder about the "players" and their commitment to the Church. For this 'victorious' team from the Mid-West; are they truly worthy of the glory and honor given to them on the occasion, are they in compliance with the standards of the ACYOA Seniors -- upholding the integrity of our National Organization? In all honesty, is the Central Council 'proud' to honor these young people? Or, did the dark horse team, unknown of before the weekend, just capture the moment, steal the hour and walk away with an award that will mean nothing to them on October 1st or the days after that and after that, just for the fun of it all?

I thought the Central Council had a tighter grip and a more responsible monitoring of the games. I really think for the future, this issue must be addressed in the light of fairness, justice and fair play to all who compete. It is indeed a reflection of the integrity of our Church's efforts to be the just and fair Christians that we espouse to be or -- at least hope to become through ACYOA.

I am sorry and sad that I must unleash these feelings of dismay on to you at such a critical time, as the ACYOA Seniors journey toward becoming a more model and exemplary group for Armenian Christian Youth in America. But, I feel that unless something is said, this type of deception will eventually corrode and eat away the very fiber of what ACYOA was established for, stands for and hopes to become. To the memory of Abp. Tiran Nersoyan, this and other improprieties must be examined and scrutinized.

Are we that insecure about being honest that our fear tempts and even leads us astray from the path of truth? How will these occurences affect the quality of what ACYOA aspires to be for our youth? These and other questions surround this problem and I hope that in future years such 'mistakes' will not win first place. The truth and holiness of God can only shine from honest hearts and souls.

Let us not lament that "The Glory of God has departed from Israel (God's chosen), because the Ark of God has been captured." (1 Samuel 4:21)
