ACYOA Dues to the National Treasury

Membership dues to the ACYOA on the national level have been increased this year from \$5.00 to \$7.00 for renewing members. This was decided at the 1982 ACYOA General Assembly in Hartford, CT. The iniation fee (minimum of one dollar) for new members remains in effect. Therefore, please be advised of the following regarding payment of dues:

- (1) Renewal dues (previous members) is \$7.00 and covers July 1st, 1982 to June 30th, 1983. THESE ARE DUE JANUARY 1ST. Note that late dues are suject to a \$25.00 delinquency fee, to be paid by the Chapter.
- (2) Dues from new members (including the initiation fee) is \$8.00 and covers the same period as above. New membership dues collected from July to December are DUE JANUARY 1ST, along with the renewal dues.
- (3) After January 1st, all dues collected should reflect the additional initiation fee, and are DUE <u>JUNE 30TH</u>. [Renewal period ends Jan.1st]
- (4) The 'Membership Renewal Form' should be used for previous members who have a Membership Application Form on file with the ACYOA Central Council. Please fill it out completely follow directions on form!
- (5) All new members to the Organization must fill out the Application Form.
- (6) Official ACYOA Membership Cards shall be mailed directly to all dues paid members of the ACYOA. The Cards will again be used for discounts and special considerations for all ACYOA Regional and National Events.
