

The biggest and best of the country's Bicentennial Celebration will be happening right here! New York City, the country's first capital, will be the focal point of Bicentennial Week, July 3 to 8. It will begin with a sunrise service in Battery Park, and continue throughout July 4th in historic lower Manhattan with free ethnic festivals, concerts, theater exhibits. AND MORE! There will be performances and parades for children. Historic walking tours. Re-enactments of colonial events. Dramatic readings. The Newport Jazz Festival, American Symphony Orchestra. Pageants. 
"New York to 1765," "New York in the American Revolution," "John Pintard and His Society," and "Manhattan Now" — four Bicentennial exhibits will be featured at the
