REGIONAL MEETING OF THE DIOCESE AT ST. MESROB ARMENIAN CHURCH MARCH 17, 1972

PRESENT: His Grace Archbishop Torkom Manoogian, Jack Antreassian-Executive Director of the Diocese, Rev. D. Davidian, Member of Diocesan Council

Racine Parish Council with Rev. Guregh Yetenegian, South Milwaukee Parish Council with Vy. Rev. Vazken Kechichian, Greenfield ParishC ouncil with Rev. Paree Metjian, and Diocecan delegates from the three parishes.

Meeting opened with a prayer from Arachnort Surpazan Hayr. Jack Antreassian chaired the meeting, and Grace Hadjinian took minutes. First item on the agenda with the budget of the Diocese. Jack passed out copies of the proposed budget for 1972 for comment. He explained the Diocese is showing a \$90,000 deficit, and he entertained any questions from the floor. Publication of the Armenian Church in English and Armenian was discussed, and he said there was some indication that it would be discontinued because of rising costs. They have allotted \$17,000 this year, but if the Assembly chooses to continue to print it, the cost could go to \$25,000. Rose Akgulian commented that the actual expenditure of Salaries was cut. Surpazan Hayr said this was due to the Vicar resigning in June. Question was asked why the Diocese was not operating in the red before this year. Jack explained when St. Gregory Church in New York was sold, there was a reserve fund of \$80,000 which was to be used if they would relocate. Inasmuch as they did not, the money was turned over to the Diocese, but there are no longer any reserves from this fund. Therefore, he said, we must find a way to raise the money to erase this deficit, or cut the budget.

Question was asked why salaries was listed in two places. His Grace explained the one expense went for administrative purposes, and the other for operating the complex.

Question by Sarkis Tchejeyan if the local churches are not carrying enough insurance, would the Diocese be held liable. Jack said it was up to each Parish to see that they are amply covered, but Surpazan Hayr said he would like to discuss the matter further at the end of the meeting. Jack said to study the budget, discuss it further during the month, and if there are any questions, they can be brought up at the hearings before the Assembly. Rose A. asked if they had reached the saturation point for resources from the Churches around the Cathedral who have access to it. Surpazan Hayr said he wishes that the Churches in the area would take extra advantage of the Cathedral, but they do not.

Father Dajad said in the \$208,000 anticipated income, everything but the parish dues comes from the local area, and 25% of the Diocesan assessments come from the local area. Question was asked if we could have a copy of the formula used to evaluate each church's assessment. Jack explained:

50% is based on the total income of the churchminus mortgage payments

25% is based on membership of the parish

15% is based on size of the community based on mailing list 10% is based on presence of clergyman-permanent or other

Father Paree said what about the parishes who have a great number of Armenians, but they are not a working parish, it does not have all these people as members so then this scale is not accurate. But in the meantime, The Church is providing services to those persons. Jack answered if the membership is low, the Church will be paying less assessment.

Hayr Soorp Vasken corrected Jack and said he believed the formula was 50% on the entire income, 25% membership, 10% on the mailing list, and 15% on presence of a clergyman. Jack stood corrected.

Rose A. asked how they justified the assessments between Montreal and Racine Churches. Answer was that Monreal has a large mortgage. Jack said if anyone had a better suggestion for a new formula, they would welcome it. Grace H. asked if it would be possible to change the percentages, and Jack said it would. Question if at the Assembly meeting, a list would be published showing the number of members from each parish. Jack said they have asked for this information from each parish.

In electing delegates, there is one exception. This year if a church has 201 members and they have elected two delegates, and next year they have 250 members, they would be elegible for three delegates, but you cannot elect the third delegate until the term expires, or every four years. Jack said in 1973 they are planning to re-organize the 4 groups because some memberships have decreased and some have increased, and there will be some changes made.

Archie asked whether in determining the number of Armenians in the community the fact that South Milwaukee has many retirees was taken into consideration. Jack said they would not have any knowledge of how many retirees there are in each parish.

Surpazan Hayr added that all the items in the budget are existing items and always have existed. One area where a cut probably can be made is in the Christmas bonus. However, they offer no fringe benefits, and this compensates for it. Jack said it is a huge budget which started four years ago, and the only ways the budget can be cut is by changing the whole structure of our Church, and by cutting out the Armenian Church, but then there will not be a Diocese headquarters. In order to defray this deficit the Ciocese has come up with several alternatives. One is a big scale lottery. The plan is to print 1500 tickets to sell for \$100 each. Each ticket can be shared by two to three people. The total income would be \$150,000, and the cost about \$40,000. He said they would hold off distributing these tickets for three to four weeks until all parishes have had a chance to discuss what method they would like to use, and they might even wait for the Assembly. Someone suggested it might be illegal to have a lottery in Wisconsin, but since it was not organized in Wisconsin, and it was a donation, it would be okay. Question asked whether it would not be a better idea just to raise the assessments.

Jack said he would like to hear all views on the subject. The distribution of tickets would be Racine 25, Waukegan 10, So. Milwaukee 20, and West Allis 10. 200 tickets would remain at the Diocese for sale within the office. If we choose to increase our assessments, each parish will be paying 70% of their present dues. Jack said if it were left to the Assembly, they can choose any method. Sarkis T. suggested they raise the assessments. Nazar H. asked how they will take care of the deficit next year. Jack said there will be a \$1,000,000 campaign next year for the 75th anniversary of the Diocese. Father Dajad said the easy way for the Diocese is to assess each Church. Father Paree suggested leaving it up to each Parish, but it was explained this wasn't feasible.

Archie said it seemed not enough credit was given to the parishes when they meet their financial goals, such as the last deficit fund. Jack said a letter of thanks was written to each parish that met their goal, and it will be published in the annual report. Nazar H. was in favor of distributing the tickets, because they can be sold to the outsiders not only Armenians. Mike Garoukian was against the lottery. Vote was taken and West Allis Parish voted yes only (2 votes).

Surpazan Hayr made a suggestion that we carry out the project anyway and start this year working on the 1973 year at which time we will face another deficit. The \$1,000,000 project will not help us out for 1972. He is in favor of getting money from the non-Armenians. Jack said with this year's Assembly, they hope to have a rough draft of 1973 budget so the Assembly might possibly approve it.

Next item on the agenda was programs with relationship to finances.

- 1. Creat an Artist Committee in the hope of starting a fund for arts and music so it will not be a burden for the Diocese.
- 2. Book Store. It is very evident that this is a big source of income. Last year they netted \$17,000. They now have an inventory of \$36,000, and he invited parishes to involve themselves with the book store.

2. 75th ANNIVERSARY OF THE DIOCESE

This will occur next year. The Diocesan committee will make plans to celebrate this in fashion, and there will be formal announcement at the Assembly the Primate. They plan to celebrate in 4 ways:

- 1. publication of a book showing history of our Churches. He urged all chairmen to send this information to him.
- 2. documentary film of the Diocese
- 3. invitation to Vehapar to visit us.
- 4. Institute a drive for \$1,000,000. This meney is to be used by Diocese for programs and expenses.

Mike Garoukian said we have a Cathedral which is heavily in debt, we are trying to figure out how to raise \$90,000, and now we are talking about raising \$1,000,000. Surpazan Hayr said we have to teach our people that they can deduct these donations from their taxes. Rose A. complained that from top on down, we spend our time raising money. Surpazan Hayr repeated we have need for stewardship programs, and this should start from the parishes. This means teaching our people to give of their own freely according to their ability. Our people are not educated. If we do not have qualified persons amongst us, we should get outsiders to do this.

3. PROGRAMS

They are forming an educational council. They will concern themselves with Armenian schools, and they are preparing a first rate text. They are coordinating their work with the AGBU. They are preparing a series of tapes which will be distributed with the text books. There will be teacher conferences and personal visits from members of the committee to help whenever they can.

Museum in the Diocese. There are two exhibits, and they are trying to accumulate valuable objects. Annual dues from \$25 to \$100, and in this way they hope to attract money. This museum can be important to our parishes. The exhibits are available for local use, and the only cost is transportation of the items.

4. ASSEMBLY

- a. Ladies Conference. The Council is planning a ladies conference. Ladies play an important part in our lives and their by-laws state they should have an annual conference. They are leaving it up to the individual parishes. Father Dajad said they were trying to create an environment that will encourage the ladies and youth to attend the Assembly.
- b. Thursday evening and Friday morning of the Assembly they will have hearings on the budget and proposals in order to bring our activities closer to our parish council chairman. At these hearings everyone will have a voice, but no decisions will be made. Ladies will be welcome.

There is one other item on the agenda. Parish Questions.

S. Akgulian asked what was being done for the youth. He said the youth problem has been in a state of flux. Father Dajad said the Diocesan Council has recently created a youth committee. There are 2-3 people from the Northeast, 2-3 from the Midwest, and one from New York. They have had one meeting with Father Dajad present, and they have presented their recommendations to the Diocese Council. Tomorrow, in Detroit, the ACYO is

having a national conference, and on the agenda is the report of the youth committee. Our senior ACYO is inactive, and he is in the hopes that the committee will recommend separating the Juniors from the Seniors. Each parish will have their own youth committee, and they will basically be under the Parish Council and Parish Priest. They are trying to resurrect young adult groups. He said they are hoping to assemble the youth at the Assembly also, and come up with a resolution so that a decision can be made right away.

Surpazan Hayr said everyone going to the Assembly including the clergy should fill out the questionnaire which was sent to them and return it to Jack as soon as possible.

Sarkis T. commented that these regional meetings were very commendable. Father Dajad brought up the subject of the use of English in the Armenian Church Badarak, and he believed we should get more positive direction in this area, and also an appropriate translation. Surpazan Hayr said he could see the need. At the same time there is a definite difficulty in going one way or the other. If we change it to English it will not be fair to those who do not understand. Today we are concerned with the youth, and they do not understand. His conclusion is the need should come from the congregations, and it should be experienced. There should be a genuine need. He means by genuine need that different individuals should go to the Parish Priest and say they want to pray. There should be a spiritual need. His suggestion is to the priest to make preparation in the language the group understand, and at this stage, it should not be on Sundays. Mike G. said the purpose of changing the service to English is to get people to church on Sundays. Another day will not be effective. Rose A. said she would appreciate a stronger statement so they can ask these questions without feeling they are doing something wrong. She suggested a survey be made of the entire membership. Grace H. said she objected to the service being changed to English.

Father Paree said the Primate Jubilee Day will be in June for the Midwest. He suggested that rather than go to Chicago, the three Wisconsin churches work together. Jack said they can, but Surpazan Hayr cannot be here before Summer. If there is another appropriate day we should let him know.

Surpazan Hayr had one last comment. It had to do with Senior Citizens. Housing program. It was suggested that parishes with enough land to build an apartment house to help our senior citizens, they should do so. Singles or couples on social security can enjoy living and take care of themselves and yet be close to the church. The size of the unit should be according to the number of people in the parish. They will be close to the Church so they can attend all functions. There is an Armenian who is doing this work for others, and he has a suggested proposal with no cost to the Churches. He suggested each Parish think this over and if there is any interest he can have the man directly communicate with us.

Meeting ended with a prayer at 11:15 p.m.

Meeting called to order by Chairman Jack Antreassian. Opening prayer was offered by Surpazan Hayr.

A printed budget was offered to the body for study. The formula for determining the assessment was discussed by the body. The determining factors are as follows:

50% of the parishes total income, less mortgage payment.

25% for membership

15% for size of community

10% for available clergy

The difference in expenditures for the building service contracts from 1971 until 1972 should be rechecked.

Of the \$60,000 deficit assessment to the parishes, \$32,000 has been received/ an additional \$4,000 was received this week and an additional \$7,000 to \$8,000 is expected soon.

A lottery system was presented to the body in which 1500 certificates at \$100 each would be alloted to the various parishes. The Chairman was seeking the feelings of members present on raising funds by means of this lottery or increase assessments of the parishes. Ways and means of raising funds were discussed in full. After thoroughly discussing the deficit a general approval was granted on the lottery system Der Hayr of Holy Cross, Union City cannot guarantee sale of. 50 Certificates alloted to his parish.

There will be a \$100 a plate dinner to defray costs for the Pro-Musica programs.

It is hopeful that the rooms available will be rented in the near future for added income.

At the Annual Assembly a committee will be appointed to gather historical facts pertaining to the 75th anniversary of the Diocese. It was requested that any artifacts pertaining to this celebration which are available from any of the parishes would be greatly appreciated. During this celebration a \$1,000,000 dollar trust fund shall be established for the care of the Cathedral and cultural center. An endowment fund committee shall also be formed.

The Educational council has announced new text books on Armenian language with accompanying tapes.

The Council for Religious Education shall have one or two new books by the Fall on our religion for teacher training.

The diocese museum has developed to a degree where its services are available to all parishes on request.

It was recommended that area Clergy spend a few days at the Diocese to become more fully understanding of the workings of the Diocese.

An attempt will be made to make the Annual Assembly more interesting for the delegates.

A ladies conference will be held at the Assembly on Thurs. May 4th.

Budget and Proposal hearings will be held on Thurs. Evening May 4th and Friday Morming May 5th.

For the week following April 14th will be our Diocese Festival week.

May 21st we will celebrate our Primates Jubilee anniversary.

Meeting was adjourned at 10:25 P.M. Closing prayer was offered by Surpazan Hayr.

REGIONAL MEETING March 10, 1972 Springfield, Massachusetts

After prayers by Srpazan Hayr, Art Simonian, Chairman, called the meeting to order at 8:15 P.M. with representatives from Troy, N.Y., New Britain and Hartford, Connecticut, Springfield and Worcester present. Representatives from Providence, Rhode Island arrived later. A roster of those present is attached.

The Chair and Jack Antreassian briefly reviewed the emergency meetings called last Fall and it was reported that 25 parishes had responded for a total of \$35,000. This region collected \$5,445 as follows:

Troy, N.Y.	\$1,000.00
Hartford, Conn.	300.00
Providence, R.I.	3,000.00
Worcester, Mass.	1,000.00
Springfield, Mass.	145.00
	\$5,445.00

A full report will be given at the Diocesan Convention in Troy, New York.

The meeting then turned to the agenda, copy attached.

1. Finances

A. Budget: Copies of the budget were distributed to all. Mr. Antreassian pointed out the fact that it was proposed to print "The Armenian Church" and "Hayastanyatz Yeghesti" on a quarterly basis to reduce costs. Further, it was noted that a deficit budget was proposed and the shortage was \$90,000. After some discussion, John Maljanian of New Britain moved that the Diocese prepare a two year budget, the 1st year firm, the 2nd year planning; seconded by Guy Bedrosian of Hartford. Motion was approved unanimously.

After some discussion regarding the authority of the Regional Meeting, the previous motion was amended to read that this meeting forward this recommendation to the Diocesan Council. Approved unanimously.

B. Stewardship: Mr. Antreassian reported that a committee on Stewardship had been appointed and was actively at work. A recommendation from the committee to conduct a raffle as an interim measure to offset the deficit was in progress; 1500 tickets to be sold at \$100 each with prizes in excess of \$40,000 leaving over \$100,000 as a gain.

This lead to a lengthy discussion on Stewardship and Raffles and Srpazan Hayr commented that the raffle was only a temporary means of raising funds; the committee was working on a true stewardship plan and that we would hear from the Springfield Church later regarding their experience in this field. Further discussion followed and it was requested that the Secretary note that there were mixed feelings on this issue of raffles and stewardship. Tickets were allocated as follows:

Providence	70	Hartford	15
Worcester	80	Troy	20
Springfield	10	New Britain	15

Father nerses Jebejian then briefly commented on the Stewardship efforts of the Springfield Church and asked Harry Demirjian to present particulars. The objectives were to:

- 1. Improve communications
- 2. Improve participation
- 3. Get signed pledge and distribute envelopes

A team of 24 parishioners met and held training sessions under the leadership of Canon Crockett. Later in 12 teams of 2 eadh they visited the parishioners. Excellent rapport was established, 3 out of 5 visited increased contributions, and good communications are in effect. Dr. Vasken Parsegian moved that the meeting request the Springfield Parish Council summarize its activities and results and forward them to the Stewardship Committee at the Diocese, seconded by Harry Sogigian, unanimously approved.

- C. Programs: Events that are being planned include:
 - 1. Tours to Armenia
 - 2. Diocesan Book Store
 - 3. \$100 Plate Dinner of Art and Music Programs

It was noted that over \$17,000 had been realized from the book store in 1971. It was strongly recommended each parish set up facilities to sell books and other articles that are available through the Diocese.

Mr. Jacob Hagopian suggested the Diocese consider Choir Robe replacement as another means of raising funds.

2. 75th Anniversary of Diocese

1973 is the 75th Anniversary of the Diocese. Many events are planned for throughout the year in the Diocese. Hope to establish a one million dollar trust fund for the Diocese.

3. Programs

There are musical presentations, shows, plays and exhibits that may be arranged through the Diocese for presentation in the parishes. A bulletin was sent to the parishes about a month ago.

Educational Council is active and will visit parishes and publish books for Armenian Schools.

Council for Religious Education is also active, and has published three books in 1971, moreto follow as well as audio-visual aids for Sunday Schools.

Clergy Program - Primate to have Clergy visit Diocese for 2-3 days and see first hand its operation and so be better informed and carry this message back to the Parish.

St. Nerses - Crash program in August for Armenian.

Youth Programs - ACYOA to go to Armenia for a month.

4. Assembly

- A. Women's Auxiliary Organizations to have meetings at the Diocesan Convention.
- B. All proposals must be submitted on time.
- C. Hearings will be conducted by the Diocesan Council on the Budget and Proposals. They are open to all.

There follows a period of general discussion during which time Father Nerses Jebejian made a point regarding the lack of stated qualifications for persons to be elected to the Parish Council. He also asked the Parishes to support the ACYOA Regional Activities.

A suggestion was made to have the fiscal year of the church auxiliary organizations changed to facilitate year end preparations for the Annual Parish Assembly.

Finally, the Providence delegation proposed future meetings of the Regional Council be held in Worcester.

The meeting adjourned after prayers by Srpazan Hayr at 10:30 P.M.

Arbp. Torkom Manoogian opened the regional conference with a prayer at 2:00 PM in Niagara Balls, New York on Saturday March 25, 1972. The regions included were Niagara Falls, St. Catharines, Toronto and Syracuse.

Present at the meeting were:

BUDGET: Mr. Antreassian manded out to each member a copy of the proposed 1973 budget which will be presented to the Assembly in Watervliet, N. Y. It was noted that this was the firt time an advance presentation of the budget had ever been given to Parish Council members before an annual assembly. The following discussion was had on this budget:

- A. PARISH ASSESSMENTS: Much discussion was had on the new increased assessments. The Canadian members claimed that the standard of living in Canada was less than the American therefore special consideration should be given to this factor in assessing them.
- B. \$90,000.00 DEFICTT: Listed below are two plans in the offing to offset this deficit:
 - 1. A 70% increase in Assessments.
 - 2. Conduct a big lottery limiting tickets to 1,000 sales.

 Tickets would be called patron certificates costing \$100.00 each
 These tickets would be distributed as follows:

(5) to Niagara Falls

5) "St. Catharines

(5) "Syracuse (20) "Toronto

Much discussion followed pro & con by the various Parish members, saying that this wasn't an equitable solution....and the morality issue was brought up. Mr. Antreassian asked for a sample poll for this lottery. The result of this poll was 10 for and 10 against the lottery. Mr. Antreassian stated that the Diocese has taken a firm stand in favor of this lottery but the final decision will be by vote at the Diosesan Assembly in May.

75TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE ESTABLISHMENT IN 1898 OF THE DIOCESE IN NORTH AMERICA: The following are a few plans to be announced at the assembly to celebrate this auspicious occassion.

- 1. Publication of a book of the history of our Diocese including our various parishes.
- 2. A cultural exchange with groups from Armenia
- 3. An invitation to His Emminance Vaskin I to be present at the anniversary celebration.
- 4. A campaign to establish a trust fund for our budgetary means.
- 5. Preparation of a documentary film of the Armenian Diocese since its beginning.

A committee will be formed in June to establish dates as to when each Parish should be celebrating this happy occassion. This announcement will be made at the Diosesan Assembly too.

VARIOUS PROGRAMS:

- 1. An endowment fund whereby income can be secured to maintain religious, & educational programs from the Cathedral plus the maintenance of same.
- 2. The Educational Council and CRE are in the process of formulating new techniques in teaching Sunday Schools l.e. visual aids cassattes, publishing of new books just found for beginners and etc.
- 3. Bringing the operation of the Diocese to the local leadership by having the various parish priests visit the Diocese in two or three day intervals to make them aware of the activities of the Diocese.
- 4. Museum & library exhibits on request would be available to each parish without cost except for expenses.

DIOCESAN ASSEMBLY: Council members are welcome to attend meetings but only delegates can vote on issues. This year for the first time the Ladies Auxiliaries and the ACYOA from various Parishes will be convening at the same time as the Assembly in Waterveliet. These two organizations may also attend the Diocesan Meetings but cannot vote on issues.

In our Regional Meetings last fall at which our 1971 Diocesan deficit was the principal matter of concern, methods were discussed for raising sufficient sums in 1972 to prevent the sort of emergency that confronted us last year. A tentative plan was presented for a support program in the form of a drawing with 1500 tickets printed for sale at \$100 each.

Twenty prizes will be offered totaling more than \$40.000, drawings for which will be held in October 1972.

It is hoped that a substantial sum can be realized from this effort, for which a listing has been entered as anticipated income in our 1972 budget.

We feel confident it will succeed, but only if the full cooperation of our parishes is assured.

This plan is intended as a remedy for our immediate needs. For the future, we have in mind the establishment of a trust fund, on the occasion of the 75th anniversary of the Diocese in 1973, the income from which will serve to cover our growing operating costs; in addition we have in mind cultivating and developing the stewardship concept. Both of these are long-range propositions, and more immediate action will be necessary at the same time.

All these will again be discussed at our March Regional Meetings. Meanwhile, it is urgent for you to develop ways by which these certificates will be sold locally. The income anticipated from them is essential for the balancing of our budget in 1972. A group should be appointed to lead this undertaking in your parish, headed perhaps by your delegates who can spearhead the effort. Please let us know about your plans, as well as the names of the committee you appoint.

We will look forward to hearing from you.

Summary of Regional Meeting Deliberations

in March of 1972

Regional Meetings were held between March 10 and March 25, in nine areas. We have since received the minutes from five of those areas: Springfield, Cheltenham, Fair Lawn, Racine and Niagara Falls; no minutes have been submitted from Watertown, New York, Chicago and Detroit (these are the cities where the churches in the respective regional met).

Much of the discussion in all regions centered on finances with the Certificate Plan for raising \$90,000 the principal subject. This has become academic since the Diocesan Assembly discarded the Plan. Also discussed were the forthcoming Assembly and various programs of the Diocesan Headquarters. With respect to the latter, it was stressed that such programs as museum exhibits, films, plays and concert artists could be made available to parishes.

Other items and suggestions included:

- 1. That qualifications be specified for Parish Council members.
- That the fiscal year of parish organizations be changed to facilitate the preparation of parish annual reports for th is assemblies.
- That the Choir Association or the Diocese undertake the preparation of choir robes both as a service and as an income-producing project.

Other and more general observations concerned our youth groups, the Sunday Schools and the Armenian Schools.
