Winner of the first prize in a concerto competition with the North Shore Philharmonic Orchestra in Illinois, she also won the New Jersey State Award at age 12. Recently, she won first prize with the Greater Trenton Symphony Orchestra. Miss Khatchadurian has also performed with the New Jersey Symphony Orchestra and the Collegian Musician Orchestra in Princeton.
