Minutes of the Annual Parish Assembly

St. Gregory of Narek Armenian Church Cleveland, Ohio

Sunday, February 11, 1979

The Annual Parish Assembly of St. Gregory of Narek Armenian Church was called to order at 1:20 p.m. on Sunday, February 11, 1979. Following the invocation by Father Diran, Jack Hacherian, Chairman of the Parish Council, welcomed the parishioners. In his welcoming message, the Chairman expressed deep appreciation to the Parish Council members for their services the past year.

The roll call of dues paying members was taken by Krikor Ghazarian, Secretary of the Parish Council. The total number of eligible voting members present was 56 (subsequently increased to 57 by a late arrival). A quorum was established since over one-third of the total membership of 123 was present.

Mickey Bagdasarian of the Nominating Committee presented the names for election of the Assembly Chairman and Secretary. The results of the secret ballot were as follows:

Chairman - Ralph Chakerian (31) Richard Aurslanian (25)

Secretary - Martha Hacherian (33) Anita Aurslanian (23)

The Secretary, Martha Hacherian, read the minutes of the 1978 Parish Assembly which were approved as read. The Chairman, Ralph Chakerian, then suggested that the order of business be changed so that the election of Parish Council, Auditing and Nominating Committee members be next on the agenda. In this way, we could proceed with the other business while the Nominating Committee was counting votes. The suggestion was agreed to by the assembly.

The meeting was then turned over to Mickey Bagdasarian of the Nominating Committee. This year there are six outgoing members of the Parish Council: John Borazanian, Florence Goekjian, Dr. K. K. Goekjian, Jack Hacherian, Florence Karoghlanian and Margaret Yeranian. The members remaining on the Council are David Andonian, Krikor Ghazarian and Sam Mirakian. The Nominating Committee submitted the names of six candidates for Parish Council membership. Several nominations were made from the floor, but all declined. A vote was taken by secret ballot with the following results:

Alan Borazanian (56) George Sakian (51) Meshac Aurslanian (49) Armand Kazaros (46) Nat Arslanian (45) Margaret Yeranian (41) Three candidates were submitted for the Auditing Committee, vote taken by secret ballot, with the following results:

Richard Aurslanian (56) Ralph Chakerian (56) Jennie Kapoudjian (56)

Three candidates were submitted for the Nominating Committee, vote taken by secret ballot, with the following results:

Kevork Arslanian (56) Martha Hacherian (56) Jack Hatchadorian (54)

A motion was made by Thelma Bagdasarian and seconded by Nat Arslanian that the Diocesan Office be contacted to determine whether the person elected with the least number of votes could serve on the Council for one year rather than two, so as to balance out the election of Council members in future years. The motion was passed by majority vote and referred to the Parish Council for necessary action.

The next item on the agenda was the Parish Council's Annual Report and Financial Report. In response to Robert Bagdasarian's question regarding payments from Pasquale Caterers, Sam Mirakian, Treasurer of the Parish Council, responded that payments have been made through November 1978. The assembly then discussed the costs for building and property maintenance. The discussion also concerned needs for improvement in the maintenance and cleaning of the cultural hall. Upon recommendation of the assembly Chairman, the membership agreed that the entire matter of cultural hall maintenance and cleaning, including the kitchen, should be referred to the Parish Council for review, necessary action, and a report at the next parish assembly.

Sam Mirakian took this opportunity to express thanks to Ralph Chakerian, past Parish Council treasurer, for his cooperation and assistance whenever needed throughout the past year.

Reports of the church auxiliary organizations then followed.

- (a) Ladies Auxiliary no discussion on the report.
- (b) Armenian Women's Guild Eileen Hacherian, Chairman, stated that the Women's Guild would not undertake the New Year's Eve celebration next year. Further, that the Guild will be sponsoring the Khunjook in September and is now looking for a chairman.
- (c) ACYOA Good progress was made by the ACYOA during the past year and parents were encouraged to support their children in the organization's activities. It was the general consensus that programs and projects for the ACYOA members are necessary to maintain membership interest. Volunteers from the community are needed to work with the youth as the Parish Council, with its many responsibilities, does not always have the time or resources to assist the ACYOA. The need for additional adult education programs to acquaint parents with Armenian Church teachings was also encouraged. The Parish Council was requested to look into the areas of adult education and youth programs.

- (d) Armenian Church Choir no discussion on the report.
- (e) Armenian Church Sunday School Arrangements have been made by the Parish Council to double lock the Superintendent's office because of complaints of missing items. Janet Ariyan, Superintendent, brought to our attention that a three-hole punch is currently missing.

The Building Committee Report was next on the agenda. This past year the cultural hall mortgage was burned and \$10,000 was transferred to the Parish Council. Approximately \$500 remains in the Building Committee treasury to be transferred to the Council to close out their records. A motion was made by Kevork Arslanian and seconded by Armand Kazaros that \$500 to be transferred to the Parish Council be donated to the Aid for Lebanon fund raising. The motion was passed by a vote of 25 to 21.

The two Diocesan delegates, Kevork Arslanian and Robert Bagdasarian, attended the 76th Diocesan Assembly in Detroit on May 4-6, 1978. Mr. Arslanian reported on the following significant items from the Assembly: (1) the re-election for a four-year term of Archbishop Torkom Manoogian; (2) the proposed 1978 budget of 3782,000; and (3) the shortage of clergy within the diocese. Mr. Bagdasarian commented on the assessments to the Diocese by the local parishes. He referred to the assessment formula appearing on page 31 of the annual report. Only two of 54 parishes in the Diocese, Cleveland and Detroit, have consistently paid their dues on time.

A motion was made by Florence Karoghlanian that the Diocesan delegates and Parish Council chairman be allowed up to 50% of their transportation expenses only to the Diocesan Assembly. The motion was seconded by Harry Atkian. After some discussion, the motion was passed by majority vote for Parish Council consideration.

The proposed budget for 1979 was next on the agenda. Sam Mirakian corrected the following figures in the budget projection -- the pastor's stipend from \$11,500 to \$12,500; the draw savings account interest from \$2,400 to \$3,400; and the budget total from \$48,400 to \$49,400.

At this point, there was considerable discussion regarding the proposed pastor's stipend of \$12,500, and whether Father Diran was serving in a full time or part time capacity. In support of the \$12,500 stipend proposal, Jack Hacherian brought the following matters to the attention of the assembly. At the Parish Council meeting on December 4, 1978 a motion was passed to continue the services of Father Diran during 1979. The Diocese recently established a new minimum stipend. So as to resolve the question of the stipend for 1979 and Father Diran's status, a letter was written on December 15, 1978 to the Diocese requesting clarification. In a letter dated January 26, 1979 to Father Diran, the Primate directed that Father Diran be recognized as full time Pastor of St. Gregory of Narek Armenian Church of Cleveland. Therefore, based on this letter and the fact that Father Diran serves 10 of 14 days in the Cleveland parish, the Parish Council decided to establish the new stipend at \$12,500. order to resolve this matter, a vote was taken on the stipend of

\$12,500 for the proposed 1979 budget. The proposal was passed by a vote of 26 to 15.

A motion was made by Thelma Bagdasarian that the parish dues be increased from \$35 to \$45, but that persons age 65 and over, if they so desired, be considered as dues paying members providing the minimum required by the Diocese is paid. The motion was seconded by Jack Hacherian and passed by majority vote.

Discussion was then had regarding the \$3,000 proposed for parish house improvement. Several members suggested improvement priorities for Parish Council consideration. A motion was made by Thelma Bagdasarian and seconded by Mona Karoghlanian that the \$3,000 be first used for improvements in the house and second, for the pastor's office. The motion was defeated by a vote of 25 to 16.

Nat Arslanian moved that the proposed budget for 1979 be accepted. Eileen Hacherian seconded the motion which was passed by majority vote.

Mona Karoghlanian asked why the pastor's annual report was not in Armenian. Jack Hacherian replied that the Council approved the English only because of the length of the report, but that future reports would appear in both English and Armenian.

Due to the length of the meeting, Father Diran delivered a short, but very meaningful pastor's message. He expressed thanks and appreciation to the dues paying members, the officers of the day, and the Parish Council members. Further, that although there may be divided opinion, we had a productive annual meeting and no person should leave here feeling victorious or defeated, that we are here for God's business. In closing, Father Diran said that our lives would be enriched by our volunteer service to the church.

Kevork Arslanian requested the assembly to support the pastor and the new Parish Council members. Dr. Goekjian complimented Jack Hacherian for the wonderful job this year as Council chairman. The assembly sang "Happy Birthday" to Father Diran.

Following the benediction by Father Diran, the meeting was adjourned at 6:20 p.m.

PASTORAL REPORT

AND MESSAGE

- 1979 -

Dear Parishioners,

By the Grace of God, we completed another calendar year in our Church and Community life, with some noteworthy accomplishments in a relatively peaceful atmosphere.

With the close of 1979, I have completed my seventh year as Pastor of St. Gregory of Narek Armenian Church of Cleveland, Ohio.

The Annual Parish Assembly gives us the opportunity to review the past year's endeavors in retrospect and to welcome the challenges of the year ahead of us.

Herewith, I submit to our Parish Assembly a brief resume of my pastoral activities and my involement in the church life in the course of 1979.

The Annual Parish Assembly was convened on February 11, 1979, and the new Parish Council, headed by the new chairman, Mr. Nat Arslanian, took office officially after the ratification of the election results by the Primate and after the Installation ceremony of the new Parish Council on April 1, 1979.

The Parish work continued uninterruptedly with a smooth transition and the Church undoubtedly benefited from the harmonious relations that existed between the Pastor and the Parish Council.

WORSHIP & RELIGIOUS CELEBRATIONS

HOLY BADARAK was celebrated by the Pastor every Sunday throughout the year with the exception of three Sundays: on May 6th, when the Pastor attended the 77th Diocesan Assembly in Chelmesford, Mass. (Boston area), and two Sundays in December, the 16th and 23rd respectively, when the Pastor took his annual vacation. For the remaining 49 Sundays, nothing could interrupt the Sunday worship, neither the blizzard nor sickness. Fortunately, having a guest celebrant in our Church for December 23rd, FR. PAPKEN ANOUSHIAN, our parishioners had Holy Badarak for 50 Sundays in the year of 1979.

THE FIVE MAJOR FEASTS of the Armenian Church (known as Tabernacle - Da-ghavar) were celebrated with all the solemnity of our Church ritual. Traditional special ceremonies and rituals as instructed by our Ritual Book and Calendar of Feasts' Book were performed with careful planning and special care. We may list below these special ceremonies:

- Blessing of Water (Tchur-orhnek)
- Litany For Pontiff (Hay-ra-bed-a-gan Maghtank)
- Lenten Services (Vigil, Michink, Sunrise Office, closed liturgy, etc.)
- Holy Week Services (Opening of gates ceremony Turnpatzek -, Feet washing ceremony Vodnaluva -, The Office of Entombment Taghoum -

Easter Eve celebration - Jurokalouytz, etc.)

- Antasdam (The ceremony of blessing of four corners of the earth.)
- Blessing of Grapes (Kha-ghog-orhnek)
- <u>Processional Antasdan</u> (during the Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross)

HOKEHANKIST SERVICE (Requiem Service for the repose of soul) were conducted through the year whenever the occasion called for; such as, in response to individual requests, special Hokehankist on commemorative occasions, General Hokehankist on memorial occasions (Me-re-lotz) connected with Five Tabernacle Feasts.

Our Choir is to be commended for its high quality performance with its inspiring rendition of the Armenian Badarak. Our Choir is very small in quantity but is great in quality, providing us the musical portion of the Badarak every Sunday. Mr. Armen Kazaros is a dedicated Choir leader and his heart attack, which he experienced during the year, did not prevent him from his moral obligation, and he continues his work with dedication. Equally dedicated is our organist, Miss Anita Aurslanian, along with his sister Louise and mother, Jeanette and some other members of the Choir and Altar Servers who don't miss any Sunday throughout the year. Our deep gratitude to each one of them along with our blessings and prayers for their well-being.

<u>VISITING DEACON</u>- During 1979, we were fortunate to have in our parish, as guest deacon, <u>Hagop Demirjian</u>, newly arrived from Jerusalem and a student at Bethany College, West Virginia. Deacon Hagop, who has the full rank of Deacon (Avak Sargavak) participates in our Church Services as frequently as possible, whenever his schedule allows him to come to Cleveland.

From the beginning of the new Church season, September 1979, the Parish Council approved to reimburse Deacon Hagop to cover his traveling expenses on the basis as often as twice a month.

CHURCH PULPIT- Closely attached to the religious performance are, of course, the sermons. Sermons were preached every Sunday in conjunction with Divine Liturgy celebrations. In order to reach everyone in the congregation, the Sermons were almost in their entirety delivered in English. At times, the Armenian language was employed, but this was done seldom. The announcements (Dza-nou-tzoum) were made always in both languages. Sermons were deleloped on special Themes according to the nature of the Church seasons and feast days. Contemporary issues also were touched. The usual length of the sermons were about 15 minutes, this being regarded as a comfortable length for our congregation.

SACRAMENTS & RITES- The sacraments and the church rites consist mainly of Christening (Baptism & Confirmation), Wedding and Funeral.

In our small Armenian community of Cleveland, occasions seldom occur to perform such services; however, at every occasion, quality services were rendered.

In 1979, in our Parish Registry, there were altogether 14 (fourteen) Sacraments & Rites were registered according to the following accounts.

CHRISTENING- Altogether 7 (seven) Baptism & Confirmations were performed by Fr. Diran Papazian, and they were classified as follows:

- 3 (Three) Christenings (Baptism & Confirmation)
- 1 (One) Confirmation only
- 2 (two) Adult Confirmations
- 1 (One) Adult Baptism

WEDDINGS- 4 (Four) weddings were performed, one of which was performed jointly by Fr. Diran Papazian and Fr. Nerses Jebejian of Springfield, Mass.

<u>FUNERAL-</u> 3 (Three) Funerals were performed, one of which was in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania.

SACRAMENTS & RITES (Outside Parish) - Beside the above Parish Registry, Fr. Diran performed and participated by the expressed wishes of families involved and by the official invitation of the host church in the following 4 (Four) Sacraments & rites.

- 1 Christening in Ortonville, Michigan
- 1 Wedding in Detroit, Michigan
- 2 Funerals in Detroit, Michigan

Beside the above actual performances, the Pastor has always attended and even in some instances, participated in marriage and funeral services that occured in our community, but in different churches.

SICK CALLS

The Pastor made hospital calls whenever he heard about the hospitalization of any Armenian in any hospital in our vast area. If anyone has not been visited, it is not a disregard but rather unawareness on the part of the Pastor. Most of the time, the Pastor is being informed simply accidently and through indirect sources. Our people obviously need some education in this area to inform the Pastor directly about anyone who is stricken ill and is hospitalized. Please notify the Pastor whenever you know of anyone who is sick, whether at home or in the hospital.

PARISH VISITATIONS

Contact with parishioners through home visits or through different means, such as telephone contacts, social gatherings, etc. is one of the critical and sensitive areas of the Pastor's work which comes up over the surface over and over again in the relationship of Pastor and Parish Council.

The Pastor never declined and always visited, without failure, those families who invited him.

Moreover, the Pastor has visited homes or halls on happy or sad occasions connected with performances of Sacraments and Rites. Also, the Pastor intermingled in social gatherings on various occasions, such as Anniversary celebrations, entertaining guests from abroad, etc.

Beside the above, the Pastor tried to keep contacts in any way that he could with parishioners or Cleveland Armenian community members on different occasions.

During the year, the Parish Council tried to initiate the novel way of telephone contacts with parishioners to be carried out by the Pastor on a regular basis. This was done for awhile with the understanding that the Parish Council was going to prepare fresh lists at every meeting. After awhile, the plan was discontinued because of failure of preparation of lists.

What the Parish needs is a planned visitation (membership canvass, membership campaign, membership drive, etc), but this is not one man's job, it needs a great deal of planning and participation of many volunteer workers. In order to be able to carry an effective membership drive, the participation of many people in planning and executing the drive is imperative, otherwise, any premature attempt is doomed to die.

PARISH ORGANIZATIONS

The Pastor, as head and president of the Church and Parish organizations, presided on the Annual Parish Assembly convened on February 11, 1979, to review the activities of 1978, to approve the proposed budget for 1979, to conduct the new partial election of Parish Council and of other Standing Committees.

The Pastor presided over all the meetings of the Parish Council which met fortnightly on Mondays.

The Pastor gave his guidance and closely worked with Church Auxiliary Organizations and attended their meetings and affairs when informed and invited.

We are fortunate for having dedicated leaders at the helm of our Parish organizations. We welcome, this year particularly, Mr. & Mrs. Jack Hacherian as Parish Youth Advisors; Mrs. Anna Karayan as Superintendent of Sunday Church School; and Miss Martha Hacherian as Chairperson of the Armenian Women's Guild. We are confident that under their leadership the organizations entrusted to them will make great strides in the course of the year.

PARISH ADMINISTRATION

The Pastor attended the day to day operations and affairs of the Parish, maintained the church office work, Parish Registry Records (Certificates of Baptisms and Weddings), conducted the official contacts with the Diocese, maintained the correspondence, implemented Diocesan directives, prepared all the Parish circulars and prepared all the fliers and announcements for Church activities and programs, compiled and published the Annual Report Books, prepared two special Bulletins (Christmas and Easter) as well as the Parish newsletter of Paros, which deserves a separate heading in this Pastoral Report.

PAROS

The monthly official newsletter of St. Gregory of Narek Armenian Church of Cleveland is called Paros (lighthouse).

The sole responsibility of the publication of Paros has been assumed by the Pastor. He spends a great deal of time on this important facet of Parish

work, as the Editor of Paros. He prepares on professional basis, 10 (ten) issues per year, excluding the summer months of July and August. It is mailed to approximately 350 addresses including some out-of-town former Clevelanders, and all the Churches of the Diocese as well as several Armenian Educational centers abroad.

The Pastor believes that Paros is a very important facet of Church work. It is the voice of the Church to the parishioners and also it is the record of the community. It is an effective link between the Church and the community. For this reason, every effort is made to present topics of interest in addition to current and timely news to our Parish. With the reflection of all the news items pertaining to our community, Paros is indeed the true mirror of the entire Church and community life. The future historian will be able to completely reconstruct the Armenian life in Cleveland only through the pages of Paros. In this sense, Paros has great historical value for Cleveland Armenian Community.

Because of the Pastor's conviction for the importance of Paros, the format of all Paros has undergone complete transformation, and many interesting features and columns have been added in it; also, Armenian language is not disregarded at all. Without hesitation, it can be said about Paros it is the finest Parish publication both in content and in its artistic layout, and we can be proud of it, for every Parish publication is the image of that particular Parish and our image is quite attractive.

We are greatful to all those people who make donation to Paros Fund. We appreciate their generosity which enables us to continue our work without financial worry. We hope all those who receive Paros will contribute to its fund regularly to defray its cost of printing and mailing.

In Paros work we appreciate the invaluable services rendered by Mary Arslanian, our Church secretary as coordinator of Paros reporters, and Alice Hacherian as the typist of finalized pages of Paros before it is sent to offset printing. We appreciate also, Jet Printing for the professional handling of our printing needs.

We have a handful of dedicated people who form the nucleas of our Church community; were they not around, we would have been in bad shape; however, they need help. We need additional volunteers for Church work.

Our community is not a growing community, for obvious reasons beyond our control; this fact along puts on us an additional burden to make our Church a living and vital organ in every respect.

The year 1980 is a year which promises to be challenging as it ushers in a new decade of the 80's.

We will be looking for additional support from Church members (through stewardship, membership dues and participation).

Membership drives should be planned. We should welcome additional families on our Church membership list.

Stewardship programs should be implemented effectively.

Every Church organization should be strengthend.

Educational programs should be organized for our youth and adults.

We should make the Church self-supporting instead of operating in deficit budget.

Everyone should be working towards a better Christian way of life.

We should continue doing God's work in this world. Everytime that we deny our wholehearted support to our Church, we obstruct God's channels of blessings into our lives.

The next decade should mark a continuous growth for our Church community; if we don't grow, we are condemned to stagnation and to slow death.

May God help us in doing His work while we have time to live in this world.

We ask God's blessings upon our undertakings.

Dear Parish Council Members:

The Long-Range Planning Committee, a sub-committee of the Parish Council, was formed and held its first meeting on June 6, 1979. Members of the committee are David and Lucille Andonian, Richard Aurslanian, Robert and Thelma Bagdasarian and Ralph Chakerian.

Many meetings were held to insure that this final report would be all encompassing. We addressed ourselves to all aspects of the church community and held a joint meeting with the representatives of each church organization, including the priest, seeking their help and recommendations. This also included 36 responses to the questionnaire that was sent to the church community. With this input and after many agonizing hours, we recommend the suggestions on the attached report be acted upon.

Although we feel that everything in this report is very important, we have identified, with an asterisk, those items we feel to be of highest priority. These items should be acted upon immediately and included in the proposed budget for 1980.

It is also our recommendation that a financial committee be formed to study the means to implement our high priority items. This should be done at the earliest possible time.

Inasmuch as members of the parish have asked as, as individuals, for progress reports, we feel it is proper to include the attached report in the annual parish report for 1979.

LONG-RANGE PLANNING COMMITTEE REPORT

- * 1. Survey of undeveloped land behind property.

We recommend that a committee such as the Long-Range Planning Committee be designated a standing committee in order to get into problems as they arise and to do such things as the parish council does not have the time to do. This to be an appointed committee consisting of representatives from each church organization.

The Ladies' Auxiliary would like very much to give a new look to the present doors, decorating it with Armenian motifs, for which the organization is willing to contribute the total sum left in their treasury of \$2,000.00; even if necessary to raise additional funds for the realization of of this project, which they would like to do as a memorial gift to the Church in the name of Ladies' Auxiliary. Mr. David Andonian, our Church architect is commissioned to present work samples for necessary approval.

Annual Gift of a Pair of Bema Candles

2. The Ladies' Auxiliary presented the Church with a pair of decorated Bema Candles for Armenian Christmas beginning in 1980. This gift will be on an annual basis.

As in our last year's Report, we have indicated that the Ladies' Auxiliary will not hold any more monthly meetings on a regular basis because of undue handships of transportation. Consequently, our meetings were at a minimum, only for important decisions, which were made concerning two projects; namely, the new church doors and the annual gift of a pair of Bema Candles.

The Ladies' Auxiliary will continue to help support the affairs of the church mostly in the preparation of Hokejash, Annual Parish Assembly Luncheon, Lenten Michink Supper, the Annual Picnic and the Annual Khunjook.



DIOCESAN DELEGATES

DIOCESAN DELEGATES' REPORT

77TH ANNUAL DIOCESAN ASSEMBLY

The 77th Annual Diocesan Assembly of the Eastern Diocese of the Armenian Church of America, hosted by the Merrimach Valley Tri-City Conference of Armenian Church (St. Vartanantz - Chelmsford, formerly Lovel, Holy Cross of Lawrence and St. Gregory of the Illuminator of Haverhill), was convened at the center of Little Ani of St. Vartanantz Armenian Church, Chelmsford, Mass., May 3, 4 and 5, 1979, presided by the Primate, The Most Rev. Archbishop Torkom Manoogian.

One hundred delegates, both clergy and lay, representing 43 parishes attended the meeting.

As a recently developed beautiful tradition, as in the past several years, this year too His Holiness Vazken Vehapar sent two representatives from the Mother Church of Holy Etchmiadzin; they were Very Rev. Vartan Apegha Dilanian and Rev. Fr. Egishe Kahana Baghramian. They attended both the Clergy Conference and the Diocesan Assembly and participated with lectures delivered at the Clergy Conference and they conveyed Vehapar's greetings and blessings to the delegates at the Assembly.

The 77th Diocesan Assembly heard, standing on their feet, as a sign of respect, the Message of Blessings of His Holiness Vazken I, the Catholicos of All Armenians. The Assembly received also the lengthy Annual Report of His Grace the Primate. Also the Assembly received the Diocesan Council's Annual Report.

Other important issues also were discussed such as church unity, the situation of the Armenian Church community in Toronto, in particular, and the situation of Armenian churches in general in Canada.

DIOCESAN BUDGET

The Assembly spent a great deal of time in financial matters pertaining to the Diocesan Budget. A total estimated budget of \$844,000.00 was approved for the current year of 1979 and a sum of \$916,000.00 was projected for 1980.

PARISH ASSESSMENTS

The parishes throughout the Diocese are assessed, according to a special formula devised by the Diocesan Council according to their means. This formula constantly undergoes changes for improvement. Parish assessments cover about half of the Diocesan Budget. The Diocesan Council have always expressed their appreciation to our parish for the prompt payments of our monthly assessments. Unfortunately this is not the case for all the parishes. The unpaid parish assessments outstanding by the delinquent parishes totals almost \$120,000.00.

The Diocesan Council have taken special measures, we were told, in dealing with the delinquent parishes. The Diocesan Council will not approve decisions of Parish Assemblies including new elections until the Parish forwards to the Diocese its Diocesan assessment.

77TH ANNUAL DIOCESAN ASSEMBLY (CONT.)

FUND-RAISING PROJECTS

In meeting the ever-increasing expenses, the Diocesan Budget is supplemented through the collossal efforts of a special fund-raising committee headed by the son and the daughter of the great philantropist, Mr. Alex Manoogian; namely, Richard Manoogian and Louise Simone. Several new fund-raising projects are being planned for 1980, that will, hopefully, raise money for general operations. These projects, with the ongoing Pace-setter contributions and Cathedral Raffle, cover the deficit in the Diocesan Budget.

WORKSHOPS

In conjunction with the Assembly, a number of other meetings and workshops were held. These were a two-day Clergy Conference prior to the Diocesan Assembly, a Conference of Women's Guilds of the parishes, workshops for Church Schools, Armenian Language Schools and a Round Table Talk of Diocesan Youth Organizations, A.C.Y.O.A.

OUR PARISH'S REPRESENTATION

Our Parish was represented by Fr. Diran Papazian, our pastor, Mr. Kevork Arslanian, our Church Delegate and Mr. Nat Arslanian, our Parish Council Chairman, who were accompanied by their wives. Fr. Diran was elected as Secretary of the Assembly and Yeretzgin Rosalie Papazian delivered a lecture at the Council of Religious Education Workshop on the uses of audio-visual devises in teaching for a greater aesthetic effectiveness.

ASSEMBLY BANQUETS

The Assembly Weekend included the usual round of social events, highlighted by two banquets, one on Friday, May 4th, at the Sheraton Boxborough Hotel, with the observance of the 40th Ordination Anniversary of the Primate, Archbishop Torkom, and the Assembly Banquet on Saturday, May5th, at the Little Ani Center of St. Vartanantz Church in Chelmsford, Mass.

Two persons were honored at the Diocesan Banquet on Saturday evening. Mr. Dickran Missirlian of Long Island, N. Y., was awarded with the distinction of "Man of the Year" in recognition of his many years of devoted service to the Armenian Church as a benefactor and lay leader in his community of Holy Martyrs' Church in Long Island, N. Y. and at St. Vartan Cathedral. He is the Godfather of the Ordination of our Pastor Fr. Diran. The award for "Friend of the Armenians" was given post-humously to the world renouned anthropologist, Margaret Mead, who championed for the cause of the Armenian language, extolling its virtues, suggesting it as an International language. She has an Armenian "pessa"; her daughter is married to an Armenian man.

The 77th Annual Assembly was concluded with the celebration of Divine Liturgy at St. Vartanantz Armenian Church on Sunday, May 6, 1979.

NEXT YEAR'S SITE

Next year's 78th Diocesan Assembly will convene in Washington, D. C. in May, 1980 during the Memorial weekend, under the presidency of His Holiness Vazken I, Catholicos of All Armenians, during his third historic visit to U.S.A.




ARTICLE 6 OF DIOCESAN BY-LAWS

Every member of the Parish, 18 years of age or over, shall pay to his or her church an annual due, the amount of which shall be determined by the Diocesan Assembly. Such amount may be increased, but not decreased, by the Parish Assembly. Dues are payable in advance on January 1 of each year.

ARTICLE 7 OF DIOCESAN BY-LAWS

Members in good standing of a Parish Church, who are 18 years of age or over, may participate in the assemblies of the same Parish and may vote, provided that at least six months have elapsed since the date of their registration as members of the parish and their dues have been paid. They may be eligible for office one year after becoming members provided they have attained the age of 21.
