RULES AND REGULATIONS GOVERNING CHURCH MEMBERS IN GOOD STANDING

RULES AND REGULATIONS CONCERNING CHURCH MEMBERSHIP

"All persons who have been baptized and confirmed in the Armenian Church, who accept its doctrine, canons and rites, and who fulfill their obligations to the church and community, shall be members in good standing of the Parish Church and shall constitute the Parish Assembly".

"Every Member of the Parish, 21 years of age or over, shall pay the church an annual due".

"Members in good standing of a Parish Church, who are twenty-one years of age or over, may participate in the assemblies of the same parish and may vote, provided that at least six months have elapsed since the date of their registration as members of the Parish and their dues have been paid. They may be eligible for office one year after becoming members".

"Members who fail to pay their dues for one or more years, automatically forfeit their right to vote at Parish Assemblies, or to hold elective office within the Parish. Such members may reinstate these rights by payment of their dues in arrears for at least the previous two years".

Articles 5, 6, 7 and 8 respectively
BY-LAWS OF THE ARMENIAN CHURCH OF AMERICA

RULES AND REGULATIONS GOVERNING PARISH ASSEMBLY

"The agenda of the Parish Assembly shall be prepared by the Parish Priest and the Parish Council. Other matters of new business may be added by majority vote of the Parish Assembly".

"At Parish Assemblies the presence of a minimum of one-third of the eligible voting membership or fifty members shall constitute a quorum. Decisions shall be rendered by majority vote of members present and voting".

"In a Parish Assembly each member shall be entitled to one vote which is not transferable and must be cast in person."

MINUTES OF ANNUAL PARISH ASSEMBLY
ST. GREGORY OF NAREK ARMENIAN CHURCH
CLEVELAND, OHIO

Sunday, February 26, 1984

The Annual Parish Assembly of St. Gregory of Narek Armenian Church of Cleveland was called to order at 1:30 p.m., Sunday, February 26, 1984, at the Armenian Cultural Hall, presided by Rev. Fr. Diran Papazian, Pastor of the Church. Following the Invocation by Fr. Diran; the Chairman of the Parish Council, Dick Aurslanian, welcomed the parishioners. He complimented the Parish Council members and presented each with a gift.

A roll call of dues-paying members was taken by Florence Karoghlanian, Treasurer of the Parish Council. Thirty-three (33) members were present out of a total membership of 101 eligible voting members. A motion was made, seconded and passed by a majority that the number in attendance would constitute a quorum; two voted against.

The meeting was turned over to the Nominating Committee. Mary Arslanian took charge with the help of Sandy Aurslanian and Eileen Hacherian. Ballots were passed out for election of Assembly Chairman and Secretary with the following results:

Appreciation was extended to Jean Sakian and Sandy Aurslanian for the lunch they had prepared for the assembly members.

A motion was made by James Nazarian and seconded by John Borazanian to accept the minutes of the 1983 Parish Assembly as printed in the Annual Report.

Next on the agenda was the election of members to the Parish Council. The four outgoing Parish Council members were Florence Karoghlanian, Robert Bagdasarian, Dick Aurslanian and Armen Asadourian. Following are the results of the election by secret ballot:

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Dick Aurslanian, the Chairman of the Parish Council, thanked Florence Goekjian for her fine job as Diocesan Delegate.

Dick Aurslanian welcomed the new members of Parish Council and announced that they are welcome to attend the meetings to acquaint themselves with the proceedings until they are confirmed and recognized officially by the Primate.

The Pastor's Annual Report, the Parish Council Report and the Parish Council's Financial Report were unanimously accepted as printed in the Annual Report.

Jennie Kapoudjian made a motion that the proposed budget be accepted as in the Annual Report but that next year the disbursements include particular disbursements. James Nazarian seconded the motion and it passed unanimously. A point of interest was explained by the Treasurer, that the Certificates of Deposit were mainly from special donations, such as in lieu of flowers.

The Diocesan Delegate, Florence Goekjian, asked for guidance in reference to the consideration being given to the creation of sub-dioceses as mentioned in her report. Fr. Diran was asked to give his opinion about this matter. He said he felt that it was only a concept as yet and that it was financially not practical at this time. Armen Asadourian made a motion, seconded by Lucine Mirakian, that in the case that our diocesan delegate is asked to vote on supporting the sub-diocese concept, she should not support it unless new facts are presented in favor of the concept. Thirteen (13) voted for; seven (7) voted against; and thirteen (13) abstained.

David Andonian made a motion that the following reports be accepted as printed in the Annual Report: (1) Diocesan Delegate, (2) Ladies Auxiliary, (3) Armenian Women's Guild, (4) ACYOA Seniors, (5) ACYOA Juniors, (6) Armenian Church Choir, and (7) Armenian Church Sunday School. This motion was seconded by John Borazanian and passed unanimously.

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Under old business Jack Hacherian made a motion, which was seconded by John Borazanian that the church members hold a meeting in mid-year to take care of some of the business crowding the agenda of the Annual Meeting. Dick Aruslanian explained that the extensive planning of Fr. Diran's 25th anniversary banquet prohibited Parish Council's ability to hold a mid-year meeting in 1983. Ann Karayan suggested the mid-year meeting be held on the day of the Annual Picnic and Martha Hacherian suggested August. The Chairman requested the actual date remain open for Parish Council's discretion. The majority vote passed the motion, with one opposing.

The state of the Parish House was discussed. Dick Aruslanian explained the Parish House was found to be unsound based on professional opinion. Parish Council will appoint a committee to study the feasibility of having it torn down and the future plans for the property. A status report will be presented at the mid-year meeting.

Under new business George Sakian asked where we stand on a diocesan level concerning endowment funds and their benefiting St. Gregory. Florence Goekjian, Diocesan Delegate, explained there are formulated diocesan endowment funds at the present time. If we were to make our own, it would have to be approved by the Diocese. Sam Mirakian interjected that through the local benefactor's fund St. Gregory benefits more directly.

Kevork Arslanian made a motion that for the 20th anniversary of St. Gregory, at which time the Primate would be present, that the Parish Council nominate a group of volunteers to clean up and beautify the exterior of the church. Sue Mirakian suggested all church organizations be approached to help in the beautification and seconded the motion. It passed unanimously.

James Nazarian questioned Fr. Diran's disposition in reference to his transfer. Members of the special committee to search for a new priest explained that they were not active at this time because the Primate would not consider a new priest for St. Gregory until Fr. Diran's position is open. Fr. Diran explained that he does not know when his transfer might be. James Nazarian suggested that the special committee to search for a new priest be reactivated with proper procedures. Wanda Vendetti added Fr. Diran should be active in the search committee. Fr. Diran said the diocesan delegate should also be included. Alan Borazanian stated proper procedures had been adhered to in their search and candidates considered but the Primate's directive had stopped them until the Priest's position is open. Robert Bagdasarian added it was a sensitive matter and the Primate would not approve their negotiations until Fr. Diran's position was definite. Until then there will not be a commitment.

Fr. Diran added, only the Primate could answer these questions. He is ready to go on to new grounds and his wife's status in a transfer is unknown, but he feels he will need 3 months notice prior to transfer. Jack Hacherian suggested that when the Primate visits Cleveland, the Parish Council meet and discuss this matter with him.


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
Lucille Andonian made a motion, seconded by Wanda Vendetti that a bulletin board be purchased from the capital improvement fund for the lobby of the Cultural Hall. It should be a well-made, enclosed case with a plexiglass front. Seventeen (17) voted for; three (3) against.

At the conclusion of the business meeting the Pastor gave a short message. He thanked and complimented those present as well as the committees who had discharged their responsibilities so well. He expressed his special thanks to the retiring members of Parish Council and welcomed the new members mentioning the challenge of doing God's work together. He was unhappy last year with the church attendance and lack of volunteers. His conclusion is that the community has lost the worshipping aspect of their religion. He asked that each person reflect on if they are doing their part. We should also all explore who is available to attend church and ask why they're not coming. The ceremonies of marriage, baptism and funeral are also all functioning but the worshipping aspect of the church is missing. The church should offer comfort and uplift to us. We were asked to look beyond the easy answer of using the Pastor as a scape goat and consider the many reasons why the attendance is down. Not to take a position for or against the Pastor but to consider the church first in our minds. The Church can function properly when all committees work together as one body in the same way that our bodies function.


The Parish Assembly was adjourned at 5:00 p.m. following the Benediction by Fr. Diran.

PASTOR'S ANNUAL REPORT

-1984-

This is that time again when we are required to give the account of our activities on a yearly basis at our Annual Parish Meeting for review and evaluation, which is set forth this year on Sunday, February 24, 1985, according to our practice of convening it on the last Sunday of February in order to give enough time for the preparation of the Annual Reports Book.

This will be my 12th Annual Report and the last one as the circumstances indicate quite clearly. Last year's Annual Assembly met on Sunday, February 26, 1984, at which time annual elections were conducted for Parish Council (partial), as well as other standing committees, namely Auditing and Nominating.

The new Parish Council was ratified by the Diocesan Primate Archbishop Torkom Manoogian and parish council elected its new Tivan (officers) on its regular meeting night on April 23rd. The new parish administration assumed its work under the presidency of the parish priest, Fr. Diran and under the chairmanship of the new parish council chairman, Mr. George Sakian.

The following is a brief account of my parish activities embracing the year of 1984: I will closely follow to the format of my other annual reports which gives a clear view of our parish life.

WORSHIP AND CELEBRATIONS OF FEAST DAYS

Divine Liturgy was celebrated almost every Sunday throughout the year and sermons were delivered at every Divine Liturgy celebration, except during the period of pastor's vacation encompassing four Sundays at different times, as well during Diocesan Assembly when the distance made it impossible for the pastor to be back in time for his parish duty. However, thank God, we weren't forced to cancel any Church services at any other Sunday for either natural causes or for reasons of sickness on the part of the pastor.

Major Holy days and other feast days, national-ecclesiastical in character, were celebrated with great solemnity and with special traditional ceremonies. Particularly Armenian Christmas and Easter proved to be, as usual, the most popular days in our parish, judging from the increased Church attendance. Also other annual observances and liturgical ceremonies of particular importance to be mentioned are: Holy Week Ceremonies (Maundy Thursday Feet Washing Ceremony, Good Friday Services), Christmas Eve celebration in English, vigil on Meechink Day with Commemoration of Armenian Womens Saints Day.

REQUIEM SERVICES (HOKEHANKIST)

Memorial masses with special requiem service were conducted on Merelotz days (Armenian Memorial Day) following each five major feast day; also Hokehankist services were conducted on special occasions according to the directives received from the Diocese; and also individual Hokehankist services were conducted in compliance with requests made by families on different occasions in memory of their deceased loved ones.

COMMEMORATIVE PROGRAMS

Pastor was personally involved in the annual commemorative programs on our national-ecclesiastical holidays of which the most popular ones are Vartanantz (March), Armenian Martyrs' Day (April) and Armenian Cultural Day (October). Always quality programs were presented to our parishioners on these public observances. We had a unique program this year on Vartanantz Day since we commemorated the 1,500th Anniversary of the Treaty of Nuvarsag, sponsored by the Women's Guild.

Coffee hours on different occasions, sponsored by various church organizations, as well as by particular families on memorial occasions, continued to be popular, which gave the parishioners ample opportunity for good christian fellowship.

SPECIAL COMMEMORATIVE EVENTS

In the course of the year, two anniversary celebrations proved to be very successful and memorable:

The 20th Anniversary of the Consecration of our Church presided by our Diocesan Primate was a combined affair with the Armenian Martyrs' Day commemoration to which was attached also a third celebration which was the Jubilee Celebration of the 20th Anniversary of the Episcopacy of His Grace Archbishop Torkom Manoogian. The large committee was under the co-chairmanship of Mr. Robert Bagdasarian (parish council) and Mr. Jack Hatchadorian (AGBU). An outstanding program was presented with Jack Hacherian as Master of Ceremonies (Palm Sunday, April 15th).

The 30th Anniversary of Sunday School and Church Choir was another milestone in our parish history which replaced the observance of the Cultural Day. The large committee was co-chaired by Mrs. Margaret Ohanessian (Sunday School) and Mrs. Anita Arpajian (Choir); the food committee was headed by Mrs. Grace Arslanian (Women's Guild); the mistress of ceremonies was Mrs. Karyl Aghajanian. The program turned to be a recognition salute to all those who labored in the Sunday School as Church School staff members and joined the choir during the 30-year period in the life of our parish, long before our church was built. The outstanding success of this unique observance was largely due to the very efficient work of Margaret Ohanessian, in the absence of her co-chairperson, Anita Arpajian who was expecting her first child. *

YOUTH EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMS

Five ACYOA members attended St. Nersess summer education program. This was largely possible because of the generosity of the Women's Guild, Sunday School and Mrs. Florence Goekjian who contributed towards the travelling expenses of the participants.

-- Our parish youth director of ACYOA Juniors, Ray Yoel participated in March in the first Youth Ministry Workshop in Grotonwoods, Massachusetts; he was sponsored by the parish council.

☞ A young adult member of our parish, Mr. Ed Kazanjian, together with the pastor attended a Youth Leaders Weekend in November in Akron; their participation was possible through the memorial donation of Mrs. Mary Diehl of California, niece of church godfather, Dr. Kegham Goekjian.

- A one-day Sunday School workshop was conducted in March by Elise Antreasian and Nancy Basmajian, representing the Diocesan Department of Religious Education; this proved to be most helpful and informative.
- First Annual ACYOA Banquet was held in May with Deacon Michael Chevia as our main speaker, from St. Nersess Seminary, N.Y. Deacon Michael's visit was profitable for our ACYOA members with his Bible discussion separately with the group.
- Our Juniors participated successfully in the 5th Annual Sports Weekend in Greenfield, Wisconsin during the Memorial Day weekend. The Juniors won in their bid for the 6th Annual Sports Weekend to be held in Cleveland on Memorial weekend 1985.
- Our youth inaugurated their first coffee hour on Father's Day in honor of our fathers.
- The ever-popular 6th Annual Pancake of ACYOA (Seniors & Juniors) was held this year on Easter (instead of the traditional day of Palm Sunday, since that day was reserved for the 20th Anniversary celebration of our church.)

EARLY SCHEDULE FOR CHURCH SERVICE

On five Sundays of September, Badarak began at 9:00 a.m. ending at 10:30 a.m. Thereafter the schedule for regular Sundays was changed from 10:30 to 10:00, ending at 11:30 a.m. Hereafter the summer schedule of Badarak and the schedule of regular Sundays for the remainder of the year will follow this early schedule.

NEW PAROS

Beginning with September, pastor was relieved from the responsibility of Paros with the arrangement of the parish council. A new editorial staff assumed the responsibility of the publication of the monthly newsletter on a more simplified manner which is adequate for our parish size.

PASTORAL ACTIVITIES

Aside from regular and routine parish work, the pastor was involved in varied activities with different objectives. The following list (which is not exhaustive) can give some idea of the nature of these activities which are mostly for self-improvement:

- Attending a Seminar on Holy Land
- Participating in Economic Conference for Clergy
- Participating in Conference on Pastoral Counseling
- Participating in Ecumenical Workshop on Pastoral Care
- Attending a Seminar on Pastoral Care
- Seminar on "Planning Ahead"

GUEST CLERGYMEN & DEACONS

The following clergymen and deacons visited our parish on official or unofficial capacity and officiated or participated at our church services:

--His Grace Archbishop Torkom Manoogian, our Diocesan Primate who celebrated Divine Liturgy, delivered the sermon, and presided at our 20th Anniversary (Palm Sunday, April 15).

--Deacon Michael Chevian, Director of Recruitment and Vocational Studies at St. Nersess Seminary, New Rochelle, N. Y. served as deacon, delivered the sermon and was main speaker at our First ACYOA Day Banquet (May 20).

--Deacons from New York area on different occasions visited our parish and served as deacons at Divine Liturgy celebrations: they are: Serop Demirjian, Hagop Demirjian, John Balian and Krikor Manuelian.

CHURCH GIFTS

Mrs. Florence Goekjian presented an Armenian style golden chalice with paten made in Holy Etchmiadzin, valued at \$1,200.

Mrs. Goekjian presented a gift of \$5,000 on the occasion of the 20th Anniversary celebration of our church.

A new vestment was presented to the church as a memorial gift by Mr. & Mrs. Elias Meketarian and by Jack Hacherian's family. The vestment is valued at \$1,200 (excluding the crown and slippers).

Mr. & Mrs. James Nazarian presented to the church a public address system valued at \$800. They also presented a Leica camera to be raffled, valued at \$2,000.




Parish Council is very sincere in extending its gratitude to those individuals throughout our community and its organizations who responded with their support when needed.

1984 DIOCESAN ASSEMBLY REPORT

The 82nd Annual Assembly of the Diocese of the Armenian Church in America was held on May 3, 4 and 5 at St. Leon Church in Fair Lawn, New Jersey.

Proposals of interest which were approved were:

1. For a Unified Commemorative Celebration of Martyrs' Day in Washington, D. C. on April 24, 1985.
2. The Diocesan budget approved each year at the Assembly should be for the following year rather than the current one, as at present.
3. A Diocesan Commission of clergy and lay members selected by the Primate and Diocesan Council be appointed to examine areas of church liturgical life that are in need of urgent reforms.
4. A Department of Continuing Pastoral Education and Renewal with a full-time paid Director be established.

The High Rise Committee was directed to continue investigation and planning of the Cathedral High Rise project.

The Ad Hoc Committee on Regionalization gave a long, detailed report on structure and funding of the Archdiocesan Concept and was given a directive to begin its organization in the New England area.

The Diocesan Unity Bylaws Committee received a vote of
