RULES AND REGULATIONS CONCERNING CHURCH MEMBERSHIP

"All persons who have been baptized and confirmed in the Armenian Church, who accept its doctrines, canons and rites, and whi fulfill their obligations to the church and community, shall be members in good standing of the Parish Church and shall constitute the Parish Assembly."

"Every member of the Parish, 21 years of age or over, shall pay the church an annual dues."

"Members in good standing of a Parish Church, who are twenty-one years of age or older, may participate in the assemblies of the same parish and may vote, provided that at least six months have elapsed since the date of their registration as members of the Parish and their dues have been paid. They may be eligible for office one year after becoming members."

"Members who fail to pay their dues for one or more years, automatically forfeit their right to vote at Parish Assemblies, or to hold elective office within the Parish. Such members may reinstate these rights by payment of their dues in arrears for at least the previous two years."

RULES AND REGULATIONS GOVERNING PARISH ASSEMBLY

"The agenda of the Parish Assembly shall be prepared by the Parish Priest and the Parish Council. Other matters of new business may be added by majority vote of the Parish Assembly."

"At Parish Assemblies the presence of a minimum of one-third of the eligible voting membership or fifty members shall constitue a quorum. Decisions shall be rendered by majority vote of members present and voting."

"In a Parish Assembly each member shall be entitled to one vote which is not transferable and must cast in person."

MINUTES OF THE ANNUAL PARISH ASSEMBLY

CLEVELAND, OHIO - FEBRUARY 23, 1992

The annual parish assembly of St. Gregory of Narek Armenian Church was called to order at 1:32 p.m. by Parish Council Chairman Florence Karoghlanian. The acting president of the meeting, Rev. Father Garen Gdanian, opened the meeting with a prayer.

Florence Karoghlanian addressed the assembly with words of appreciation and encouragement for our future as a parish. She highlighted on key points and accomplishments of the year and closed by requesting our continued faith, love, and devotion to our Mother Church.

Jack Hacherian proceeded to read the roll call of dues paying members. There were 48 members present which did not constitute a quorum. A motion was made by David Andonian and seconded by Louise Demirjian to carry on with the meeting despite the lack of a quorum. The motion was accepted. The meeting was turned over to Leslie Bagdasarian who conducted the election of officers for the day. The nominations and results follow.

The following corrections to the minutes of the 1991 annual parish assembly were made.

 <u>Page 3, Para. 2, Line 4</u> - The year should read 1990 instead of 1991.

 <u>Page 4</u> - Adjacent lot details should read: The asking price is \$300,000 instead of \$300.

A motion was made to accept the minutes with the above mentioned corrections. Motion carried.

At this point, the Chairman of the day, Dick Aurslanian, presided over the meeting. The Nominating Committee continued with the election of $\underline{4}$ Parish Council members who will serve a two-year term. Results were as follows:

The Chairman called for any comments or questions concerning the Diocesan Delegate's Report. Since there were none, he moved on to the Parish Auxiliary Organization Reports. David Andonian questioned the exclusion of the Social Club Report and was directed -3- Mold

to page 24 where the complete financial report was located. Florence Goekjian made a motion to accept the organization reports as presented which was seconded by John Benneian. Motion carried.

Fr. Garen was called upon to offer his Pastoral Message. He noted that he has now served our community as a visiting clergyman for 14 Badaraks, 4 funerals, 2 cemetery visits, 4 hospital visits, 1 nursing home visit, 2 baptisms, 1 wedding, and 1 engagement. He thanked the community for the hospitalities directed toward him and acknowledged Florence Karoghlanian, Mourad Demirjian, Greg Yessaian, and the Parish Council members for their extra courtesies. He closed his message with a prayer that we would soon have a permanent parish priest.

The Chairman called upon the Nominating Committee to report the election results for the 1993 Auditing and Nominating Committees. Three members were to be elected for each committee with the following results:

Under New Business, Archie Andonian was called upon to give a presentation on the activities of the Social Services Committee which was formed in November of 1991. Archie gave a brief overview involving the initial formation of the committee touching upon the expectations and basic requirements as a refugee sponsor, and the cost of a family sponsorship. This was followed with a summary of the activities and events of the committee from its coordination meeting on November 17, 1991 through February 3, 1992. He noted that this was a joint venture with members from the Holy Cross Armenian Church. He concluded by recognizing the list of donors and volunteers who worked with the committee.

Dick Aurslanian thanked Archie for his presentation and called upon the membership for comments or questions. Thelma Bagdasarian asked Archie for an update on the occupations of our refugee family. Fr. Garan thanked Archie for his excellent presentation. Anne Karayan commented that the committee need not limit itself to serving refugees, but could expand as an organization to serve issues and problems in our own community. Florence Karoghlanian concluded the discussion by expounding further on how we came to accept and help our refugee family.

The Chairman called upon Serop Demirjian to explain the agenda

item concerning morning service hours. Serop stated that the suggestion was made for Sunday services to begin at 11:00 a.m. when there is no visiting clergy, and 10:00 a.m. when there is. Helen Atkian questioned if this meant that church would be over at 1:00 p.m. instead of 12:00 p.m.. Thelma Bagdasarian voiced her opposition to the change citing that it would change the Sunday School schedule, would cause confusion when we did have a priest, and probably wouldn't change the time people attend services. She added that with the arrival of summer, many people would want to get out earlier rather than an hour later. Sam Mirakian made a motion to retain our present service hours with no changes. Helen Atkian seconded the motion. Following further discussion, a vote was held on the motion which was accepted.

Serop Demirjian was called upon to review the pastoral situation for our community. He noted that a Pastoral Search Committee has been formed consisting of Russ Arslanian, Ara Bagdasarian, Leslie Bagdasarian, Serop Demirjian, and Mona Karoghlanian. He explained that if the committee finds a possible candidate, a special parish meeting will be called for all members to discuss and vote on accepting the candidate. Serop acknowledged that one candidate was interviewed last year, but consideration was not pursued any further.

Thelma Bagdasarian asked about the status of holding Bingo on the church property and the Spring Festival. Florence Karoghlanian noted that the lack of volunteers to oversee Bingo activities prevented it from taking place, however, we did renew our license. She also noted that festival plans have been dropped because of other pending business.

Next on the agenda was a review of the Financial Report. John Benneian asked about the accounts receivable concerning Pasquale Catering. It was noted that Pasquale currently owes \$6,360 which will be paid by the end of March. Fr. Garen questioned the amount for priest expenses should a new priest be assigned to our Jack Hacherian pointed out that a pastor stipend is community. included, should we get a priest. Fr. Garen also commented on the income from membership dues. For the size of our parish, he felt this amount was small (\$14,095) and stressed personal giving rather than depending on fund raising activities. David Andonian questioned the lumping of funds under membership dues. He felt that after the \$104 dues, monies collected should be included under pledges. Jack Hacherian responded that it will be included next year. David also asked why the hall rental was lower last year. The amount was lower due to less bookings, however, Jack noted that Exquisite Catering, which is run by Jenna's brother, will also share in the use of the facilities on a trial one year basis. At the end of one year, a contract agreement will be determined. With no further discussion, a motion to approve the 1992 budget was made by Sam Mirakian and seconded by David Andonian. The motion was accepted.

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The Chairman recognized Alice Hacherian who asked about the status of our copy machine. She was told that it used for flyers, preparation of the annual reports, and miscellaneous notices, but was not capable of producing our Paros due to the slowness of copying multiple pages. Jack Hacherian commented that the service contract for the copier was dropped since it was no longer feasible at this time. Helen Atkian questioned why we don't sell the copier and raise funds to purchase a new one. Discussion followed, but no resolution was reached.

Thelma Bagdasarian thanked the Parish Council for the work they have put in this past year. Serop Demirjian thanked Florence Karoghlanian for her dedication, time, and effort which was put toward our church.

Prior to adjournment, David Andonian questioned why the balances of the organizations' treasuries exceeded \$600. Florence Karoghlanian explained that the monies over this amount came in after the end of 1991 and will, therefore, be reflected in the next report.

Dick Aurslanian thanked the Nominating Committee, Secretary of the Day, and Serop Demirjian for serving as Deacon of our church. Fr. Garan offered thanks to Dick Aurslanian for serving as Chairman of the day and offered a closing prayer to conclude the meeting.

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Report of the Deacon in Charge June 1992- December 1992

I would like to begin my report with a special word of gratitude to those who made my welcome to Cleveland such a memorable event. The presence of His Eminence the Primate to introduce me to the community was especially meaningful for me as Cleveland is the first parish that I have been granted the authority to serve. My thanks to the Parish Council and to the Committe who made that day some six months ago such a special event.

During the first six months of my ministry in Cleveland I have attempted as much as possible to operate within the parameters of my understanding of the role of the Armenian Church. The Armenian Church is the national and official church of the Armenian people. She was begun under Divine inspiration and she continues and is sustained by the grace of God and by the cooperation of those who faithfully participate in her life. I am convinced that the Armenian Orthodox and Apostolic Church stands on equal footing with the other Christian churches around us. She contains a unique spiritual tradition which in some aspects surpasses other churches because of her venerable history. Thus I find as my greatest challenge to make the faith real, meaningful and attractive to people of our time, young and old alike. The Armenian Church is not a social club, but is a community of Christians bonded together by a unique and beautiful tradition.

In order to work on this goal I have placed a lot of emphasis on the Sunday experience. Most of our parishioners live far from the church. Therefore, I have been cautious about over scheduling. Sunday is the one day most can and should gather together as it is the day of worship. I am happy that attendence is increasing, though tardiness has become the norm for the majority, I have labored to make the worship meaningful and sermons informative, instructive as well as challenging. Growth is all essential and thus the sermon must encourage this.

The deacons and choir have been a great source of joy for me. Special thanks go to Serop Demirjian, Haig Arpajian, Thelma Bagdasarian and Anita Arpajian as well as to the entire choir for their unselfish, disciplined and consistent devotion. I am especially glad that the choir is so enthusiastic about the quality of our liturgical music that it has instituted a fund drive which will result in the purchase of a new organ for our sanctuary.

The Sunday School staff, under the very able and devoted leadership of Anna Karayan has been a major factor in making the Sunday morning experience truly positive, in particularly for our children. Promptness and regular attendence are essential and I am certain that once parents become convinced of the importance of learning the Christian faith, the Sunday School will grow. On the occasions when we have been blessed by the presence of a guest clergyman I have visited the children's assembly and presented a pertinent message.

Along these lines a major priority in the upcoming months will be the re-organization of an ACYOA juniors group. Though the numbers are limited, nevertheless the children need to be bonded in a positive and meaningful way through activities and reponsibilities. After all they are our future. Our acolyte program is slowly taking shape. Though we have not yet reached the stage of meeting regularly, this will soon fall together as I realize that Sunday after services is the most realistic time to bring our young boys together. I am quite happy at the zeal that they demonstrate at the Altar. Two of our young girls have begun singing in the choir on a regular basis.

From July 2-8 I was on the staff of the Hye Camp in Wisconsin, which three of our children attended.

Fellowships following Sunday Service have become a very positive aspect of our community life. They serve as excellent opportunities for bringing people together in a warm and hospitible atmosphere. A negative aspect is that not enough people are volunteering to host the fellowships. Despite countless notices in the Paros, the response remains negative.

Our first Family Night held Friday evening, November 27 was a great success. Our New Years Eve Gala was also a major success. Those who organized these events are to be commended and I am thankful to the many parishioners, young and old who took part.

The auxiliary organizations continued to function according to their charters and by-laws although overall attendence and enthusiasm does not always seem constant. I have attempted to be present at all organizational meetings and activities. The organizations have as their ultimate goal the edification of their membership in the context of the faith community. During this year I plan to work more closely with each group to increase membership with the goal of instituting more meaningful, edifying and fulfilling activities. Special thanks are due to the following chairpersons for unselfishly giving of their leadership abilities: Mary Arslanian, Women's Guild; Sarkis Hamamjian, Social Club; Louise Demirjian, Church Choir; Russ Kashian, A.C.Y.O.A.

A word of thanks must go to all the organizations which raised funds for the operation of our Church, especially to the Women's Guild, under Mary Arslanian's lead, in making the Ramage Sale a success. Also thanks to John Davidian for running this year's Rug Sale and Haig Arpajian for chairing the Picnic. Those who volunteered demonstrated well their love for our Church.

My hope is that within the near future a new organization will be formed for our younger women. My hope is that they will relieve the Senior group of some of their responsibilities. Like the other organizations they will be asked to work on fund raising and will because of their makeup bring about new and creative programs. I would also emphasis the spiritual needs of this group, which will be developed through specially geared speakers and retreats.

Seniors Day. I am also considering setting aside one day a month for our seniors to come and enjoy the Cultural Hall. The hall could be set up so that they could play games and have refreshments. Maybe we could organize a warm meal or sandwiches. As the weather warms this may also include outings, etc.

One of the more positive aspects of my ministry has been the once a month Adult Christian Educaton Programs. The average attendance has been 10 and I believe it will go up as we continue. During Lent these sessions will take place weekly and in a different format, in the context of Lenten Services.

During the week, besides time spent preparing the Sunday bulletin, Paros and keeping up with office work, i.e. correspondence..., I have been making visitations to the homes and work places of our parishioners. Priority is always given to those who are hospitialized and in nursing homes. Up until now I have visited the homes of the majority of our members, but a number still remain.

A good deal of my time during the last few months has been spent helping our refugee brothers and sisters. In this context a special word of thanks must be given to Archie Andonian for his genuine Christian zeal in responding to the need to help Armenian refugees from Baku. I also appreciate the willingness of our volunteers who came forward to lend a helping hand. Dikran Auslanian, esq. and Ara Bagdasarian have been especially helpful to the cause. My thanks to the members of our community for always making the refugees feel welcome.

As part of my responsibilities I have organized the visiting clergy schedule and in the cases of baptisms or funerals I have made sure that a visiting priest was present. Though our situation is less than ideal, nevertheless the Diocese has been most cooperative in making clergy available to us.

DIOCESAN DELEGATE REPORT

The 90th Annual Diocesan Assembly was held April 30th through May 2nd, 1992, at Boca Raton, Florida, hosted by St. David Armenian Church. The Assembly was presided over by His Grace, Bishop Khajag Barsamian, Primate. Martin Cholakian, (St. John Church, Southfield, MI), was elected Diocesan Assembly Chairman.

70 registered clergymen and delegates were represented, out of a total of 119. The Chairman declared a quorum was present.

Col. Victor Arzoomanian presented the ACEF report. The 1991 year was the best year since the inception of ACEF. The Bank of New York Management Fund was retained to manage a portion of its portfolio.

The Rector for St. Nersess Seminary, Deacon Hratch Tchilingirian presented a report on St. Neresess Seminary. Currently there are 22 parishes without priests. A program in process stresses the need for students. Recruitment through the parishes and parish priests will be a valuable tool in keeping our Diocese supplied with priests and qualified lay workers.

Zarvin Kasparian presented the Unity Committee report. The National Representative Assembly (NRA) reviewed the comments on the proposed draft By-Laws and is continuing negotiations with the Diocese for the preparation of the proposed Bylaws. It was reported there has not been a Joint Unity Committee Meeting since the 89th Annual Assembly because the Prelacy has failed to request a meeting pending implementation and cooperation. The interpretation of the NRA Executive Council is that cooperation activities must come first , then further meetings on the draft By-laws will be considered. The Assembly reconfirmed its faith in the recommendation that unity is within the best efforts and effect to do what is best for this Assembly.

Council Member Dean Shahinian introduced a presentation entitled "Young Adult Involvement in the Parishes," with Rev. Fr. Mardiros Chevian, Diocesan Director of Youth Ministry. Various speakers expressed their views on young adults views, parents' views, and positive directions for the parishes.

The Diocesan Assembly has recognized the needs of our youth and young adults over the past several Assemblies, devoting greater time each Assembly for the purpose of strenthening our parishes. At this Assembly a proposal was presented to include a period of 60 - 90 minutes at the 1993 Diocesan Assembly, beginning on Friday afternoon for report and analysis on the involvement of the youth and young adults in the parish. This proposal was passed by the Assembly.
