1996 Pastor's Report

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

With the close of 1996 I have completed my second year of service to the Sts. Joachim and Anne Armenian Apostolic Church community. I assumed this pastorate upon the appointment of His Eminence Archbishop Khajag Barsamian effective January 1, 1995.

Following is my second pastoral report to you covering the period of January 1, 1996 through December 31, 1996. I will endeavor in the following pages to present a synopsis of my work during this last year.

Worship and Liturgy

Among the special blessing the Lord has showered upon us this year, we have been privileged to receive into the Lord's service four additional stole bearers to serve before the Holy Altar. On November 24th of this year His Eminence Archbishop Khajag Barsamian granted the right to bear ourars to Arakel Arakelian, Onnig Madanyan, Shunt Madanyan and Kevork Sultanian. In addition, three of our Sunday School students participated in a preparatory class I taught to the candidates for to the order of Tbir. My congratulations to Brian Mekjian, Sarkis Sultanian and Sevan Sultanian for studying hard and earning the right to serve before the Lord's Holy table as tbirs. Also Alina Rubenian, en exchange student with us this year from Armenia received the right to read the old testament and epistle readings.

The Lord directed the celebration of the Lord's Supper during the Thursday night dinner prior to His crucifixion. From the formative early Christian church until today the Badarak has been the central defining liturgical gathering of the Armenian Church. It is through the Badark that we receive God's sacramental gift of spiritual nourishment and healing. In accordance with the teaching of our Lord and the Holy Tradition of the Armenian Church it has been my pleasure to preside over regular Sunday Badarak services.

In addition to Badarak, other liturgical services were performed. These include special festal blessing services, hokeehankeests, the Holy Week services and Lenten Services.

At each liturgical gathering I have endeavored to present a message to our faithful explaining the meaning of the day's gospel reading and how it applies in our daily lives. During the past year I prepared and presented approximately ninety sermons. In addition, at the request of our Parish Council, I have continued to present instructional Badaraks approximately every 2 months.

My deep thanks to those altar servers who served regularly this year.

Also my thanks to choir director Susan Mardoian, organist Martha Auer, and to all our choir members for their dedicated service. On those occasions when I was unavailable to perform Badarak, I arranged for a visiting clergyman to preside over the liturgical services of the day.

By pastoral invitation I also performed a baptism on 5/5/96 for Raquel Fereshetian at St. Sahag and Mesrob Armenian Church in Wynnewood, PA.

Additional Pastoral Ministries

In addition to church services, the priestly functions include ongoing visitations of members and potential members, sick calls at hospitals or homes, visitations of shut-ins and those in nursing homes, grave blessings at cemeteries, and home blessings. To date I have visited or scheduled visitations with 101 of our 121 dues paid members. Many members have had repeated visitations. I have also visited or scheduled visitations with 35 of our 44 young couples. Members and young couple potential members receive periodic contact from myself in an attempt to schedule a visitation. All those who have not yet been visited have been, and continue to be, contacted regarding scheduling a visitation.

The sick have been visited as requested, and many house blessings have been performed. I thank all those who contacted me with news of someone in need of a visitation. Please feel

free to contact me to in order to schedule a house blessing/visitation, or to inform me of someone sick or in need of a visit.

This year I offered three pre-cana (pre-marital) counseling sessions. I have also responded to requests for personal/family counseling as needed.

Office hours have been kept four days and one evening a week. During which time I see to the many responsibilities of the office operation which include but are not limited to: Maintaining existing, and developing specified church mailing lists: reading. sorting, filing and responding to mail; visiting post office as needed; maintaining/acquiring office equipment and supplies; preparing Sunday Bulletins and flyers, running off copies, collating and stapling, advertising for and typesetting the Parish Greeting Card, and Ani preparation (including data entry, article writing, page layout, and coordination with mailer and printer). My thanks to Sona Diorio, Gladys Avakian, Sue Semerdjian, and Ann Raptzian for their help with mailings this year.

I attended the 1996 Diocesan Clergy Conference, Diocesan Assembly, area clergy meetings with Armenian and non-Armenian clergy, Midwest Regional Council Meetings, as well as a Midwest Women's Guild meeting and a Midwest Scripture Seminar. I enjoyed teaching classes at Hye Camp as well. Upon the Primate's request, I served as his proxy to the National Council of Churches Annual Assembly held in Chicago.

1996 also saw the formation of a regularly meeting Armenian Diocesan Clergy group for the Midwest. The group met seven times in 1996 to discuss regional planning. I serve as recording secretary for the meetings. A highlight of the year included our collective planning an ACYOA Junior retreat in Waukegan. We have plans for another such retreat in Racine in 1997 as well as other joint Midwest youth programs.

As Pastor and ex-officio president of the Parish Council I attended all Parish Council meetings during the course of 1995. I enjoyed working with each member of this Parish Council and wish to extend my appreciation to all those who dedicated their time for the maintenance and building up of God's holy church. As anyone knows who has served on Parish Council, the service required of Parish Council members is demanding as the needs of the church are on-going. Let us continue to encourage and pray for God to guide the decisions of the Parish Council in 1997.

Church Auxiliary Organizations

The Ani Newsletter

The church newsletter was published six times in 1996. My thanks to Sona Diorio, Virginia Bogosian, Maria Sawaye, and Lorene Skinner for all their help this year. The Ani takes a great deal of preparation and their hours of dedication are greatly appreciated. My position was that of editor/columnist/page layout for the Ani. The Ani staff would like to remind everyone that submissions to the Ani are always welcome and encouraged.

Bible Study

We had a number of Topical Bible Studies offered during the year, the subjects of which included: Astrology, Homosexuality; The Role of Women in the Church; Borrowing, Lending, and the use of Credit; Buddhism and the Bible; Angels; and A Christian Look at the Psychology of Advertising. During the coming year Bible Studies will become more

scriptually oriented. I welcome and encourage suggestions for Bible Study Topics from all parishioners.

Choir/Altar Servers

During the year I participating in the training of altar servers in preparing them for their receiving minor orders and to become stole bearers. In addition I assisted the Choir director at a number of choir rehearsals.

Sunday School

The Sunday School had another active year. I enjoyed working with director Alice Boyajian as well as all the Sunday School teachers in the many yearly Sunday School projects. We have had four staff meetings this year and I serve as recording secretary for the group. Two additional activities were planned for the Sunday School in 1996. One a bowling outing, and the other a return to Christmas Caroling, both programs were well attended. Attendance for the classes in general, however, is lower than desired. During visitations to the parents of the Sunday School children, I make it a point to discuss the issue of their children's attendance. I commend all those involved in the Sunday School for playing such a vital role in the spiritual education of our children. Their work is vital to our youth and they need our continued support.

Vacation Bible School

July 25-27 were the dates of this year's Vacation Bible School. A good response in 1995 prompts us to increase Vacation Bible School from two to three days. My thanks to the many teachers who donated their valuable time to making this program the success it was. The thirty children participating enjoyed themselves and we are looking forward to continuing this program in 97'.

Women's Guild

The Women's Guild continues to work hard to support our church. Their dedicated service is offered to the Lord as their participation in the on-going mission of His church. I enjoyed attending women's guild meetings and events throughout the year. Let us keep the Women's Guild in our prayers and as we continue to seek out potential new members for this vital organization. My special thanks to Elizabeth Sahagian for her help throughout this year in acquainting me with the various Women's Guild activities, and to Alice Boyajian for her dedicated service in organizing so much of the cooking.

Young Couple Group

In an attempt to establish a young couple group, three events were held in 1996. The first was a social, and the latter two were both social and religious. Religious discussion addressed the importance of family life and making Christmas special for the kids. While not yet an official church organization I believe this group displays a dedication to the church which will eventually result in its formalization into a cohesive group actively involved in the mission of Sts. Joachim and Anne Armenian Apostolic Church. My thanks to Gary Mazian for his support in organizing activities during 96'.

I ASK THAT WE AS A CHURCH REMEMBER OUR SICK, OUR SHUT-INS, OUR MEMBERS THAT HAVE LOST LOVED ONES, AND THOSE FAMILY MEMBERS THAT LABOR AS SINGLE PARENTS. IN OUR DAILY PURSUIT OF LIFE WE SOMETIMES FORGET THAT OTHERS MAY BE CARRYING A "GREATER BURDEN" THAN WE REALIZE. LET US "EACH" REACH OUT AND HELP THEM!

OF GREATEST IMPORTANCE, IS OUR SUNDAY SCHOOL PROGRAM. WHAT MEMBER COULD NOT COME INTO OUR CHURCH ON SUNDAY AND BE OVERJOYED AT THE SIZE AND QUALITY OF OUR SUNDAY SCHOOL PROGRAM. ALICE BOYAJIAN, ALONG WITH HER EAGER STAFF HAVE BROUGHT A LIGHT INTO EACH AND EVERYONE OF OUR FAMILIES. YOUR GREAT EFFORTS WITH THESE, OUR MOST FRAGILE AND IMPORTANT MEMBERS, ALWAYS CAUSE US TO STOP AND BE THANKFUL FOR YOUR TREMENDOUS DEDICATION TO "OUR" CHILDREN.

AS A PARISH, FATHER TAVIT BOYAJIAN, HIS WIFE, TIROUHIE, SON GREGORY, AND NEW SON PETER, CONTINUE THEIR JOURNEY WITH US. WE AGAIN, EXTEND TO THEM OUR WARM WISHES FOR THE COMING YEAR AND THANK THEM FOR ALL OF THEIR HELP OVER THE PAST YEAR. WE LOOK FORWARD TO HAVING THEM WITHIN OUR COMMUNITY FOR MANY YEARS TO COME. I KNOW THAT FR. TAVIT HAS MANY PLANS FOR US IN THE YEARS TO COME. THANK YOU FOR YOUR LOVE OF GOD AND STEP OF FAITH INTO OUR CHURCH AND COMMUNITY.

I WOULD BE REMISS IF I DID NOT BRING TO YOUR ATTENTION SOME MATTERS THAT WEIGH HEAVY UPON MY HEART. THEY ARE THINGS THAT WE ALL TALK AROUND BUT NEVER WANT TO DO SOMETHING ABOUT. WE WAIT FOR THE OTHER PERSON TO DO SOMETHING RATHER THEN ASKING WHAT YOU COULD DO.

- 1. OUR WOMEN'S GUILD IS SUCH A SMALL GROUP! WE NEED TO BRING OUR YOUNGER WOMEN INTO THE CHURCH. MOTHERS AND FATHERS YOU NEED TO ENCOURAGE YOUR GROWN-UP CHILDREN TO TAKE PART IN OUR CHURCH. WE MUST FIND A WAY. IF NOT WITH ONE OF OUR EXISTING GROUPS THEN WITH A NEW ONE. WE NEED TO BE MORE EFFICIENT WITH OUR RESOURCES!
- 2. OVERALL, AS A COMMUNITY, WE MUST CONTINUE TO COME CLOSER TOGETHER WITH THE FEELING THAT THE GOOD OF THE WHOLE IS BETTER THEN THE GOOD OF ONE. WE NEED TO MOVE ON. WE CANNOT DWELL ON THE

PAST. WE CANNOT DO ANYTHING ABOUT IT. WE NEED TO CHANGE OUR FUTURE FOR WE STILL HAVE CONTROL OVER THE OUTCOME. THOSE ARE THE THINGS I WAS TOLD WHEN I FIRST CAME TO THIS CHURCH. LETS DO IT!

3. WE NEED FUNDS ON AN ON-GOING BASIS TO KEEP OUR CHURCH STRONG. WHY DO WE NEED TO BEG FOR FUNDS TO GROW "OUR" CHURCH? AS A PARISH COUNCIL, WE HAVE BEEN ABLE TO GROW OUR FUNDS TO A LARGER AMOUNT BUT THAT HAS COME FROM VERY STRICT BUDGET SAVINGS. IN 1997 PLEASE RECONSIDER YOUR OPPORTUNITIES FOR GREATER SHARING OF YOUR FINANCIAL BLESSINGS WITH THE CHURCH.

I CAME TO THE PARISH COUNCIL CHAIRMANSHIP WITH THREE (3) GOALS IN MIND (IT'S A HOLY NUMBER) FOR US AS A CHURCH COMMUNITY. THEY WERE AS FOLLOWS: INCREASE THE FINANCIAL BASE OF OUR CHURCH, PROMOTE A FEELING OF GREATER HARMONY BETWEEN OUR MEMBERS, AND BRING INTO THE COUNCIL A YOUNGER GENERATION OF LEADERS FOR OUR FUTURE! I FEEL I HAVE FULFILLED THOSE REQUIREMENTS OF MYSELF. WITH THAT, I WILL STEP DOWN FROM THE CHAIRMANSHIP IN MY FINAL YEAR. IN THIS WAY I CAN WORK WITH A NEW YOUNGER CHAIRMAN (AS A MENTOR) WHO WILL TAKE US TO EVEN GREATER HEIGHTS AS A CHURCH. MY DEEPEST THANK YOU TO EVERYONE AND ESPECIALLY EVERYONE ON THE PARISH COUNCIL WITH WHOM I HAVE WORKED. IT HAS BEEN MY PLEASURE TO WORK WITH YOU ALL.
