#### ST. LEON'S ARMENIAN CHURCH

#### PARISH COUNCIL REPORT

The year 1966 marks the first full year in our new church. It is an important year in our history because it gives us an indication of our future. The questions we asked ourselves at the beginning of this year were: would we be able to handle our church budget and our mortgage payments; would we continue to grow in membership; could we improve our organizations and services; and most important could we become more of a religious and moral force in our community.

My feeling and that of the Parish Council is that the year 1966 has been a successful one and has shown that we can meet all of our obligations.

Our church attendance and membership has grown. We now have 137 families who have envelopes and support our church on a weekly basis.

Our church attendance is up, averaging close to 85 parishioners in church each Sunday, and more important, when members of the choir, Sunday School, teachers, and deacons are totaled, we have a very impressive 300 people in church each Sunday.

As you will note from the attached budget, we have met all of our church operating expenses, and have had enough funds available to do the following essential items: paint the interior of the Parish House (which had not been done since we bought this property); placed a covering over the rear entrance of the church, install a public address system in the church hall, carpet the church annex through the generosity of John Nakashian, renovate the church kitchen to make it more workable, and many other smaller items.

One of our most important projects was the renovating of the small house on our property at a cost of \$1,666.00 and which is now rented at \$125.00 per month plus utilities. In a little over a year's time the cost of renovating the house will be paid off and the church will be provided with a small but steady source of income.

Our parishioners were most generous in their building fund pledges. By December 31, 1966, \$54,327 had been paid against the total outstanding pledges of \$76,466. Of our original \$135,000 mortgage we prepaid \$23,000 by December 31, 1966, and this January will prepay another \$7,000. At that point the number of years left for paying off our mortgage will be reduced from 20 years to 12 years five months. The balance of the mortgage still left to be paid will be \$98,644. In addition to the pledge payments, monies for the building fund have also come from the Memorial Committee, lieu of flowers, and from other donations. It should be noted that our five year pledges run out this year and a new collection will have to be made.

Several projects that were held over on the church building were also completed during the year. These included the additional lighting in the church hall, parking lot and cupola, and the correcting of the heating system in the narthex.

Our church organizations have been strengthened. Our Sunday School enrollment now is 156 pupils. In addition your Parish Council formed two new organizations late last year, the Men's Club, and the Armenian Church Youth Organization and both have become valuable additions to the church.

Our Ladies Aid had a particularly strong year and should be highly complimented for their successful meetings, activities, and growth in membership, and most important for their donation to the church in December of \$4,000 -- the largest donation in their history.

The Parish Council ran several profitable functions during the year, such as the annual picnic, the Blessing of the Grapes, the First Anniversary Dinner of the Church Consecration, and the New Year's Eve affair.

The Parish Council met regularly twice a month and also held special work meetings as necessary. While all members of the Council contributed their time and efforts, I would like to give special mention to John Azarian and John Voskian, our treasurer and assistant treasurer, for handling a difficult job extremely well.

It has been said before but I wish to say again that our Der Carnig Hallajian and Yeretzgin Rose have been an inspiration to us and the efforts of Der Carnig in contributing to the strength of the church is deeply appreciated.

In closing, I would like to give special thanks to our Executive Building Committee and its chairman E. George Dabagian. The building fund still remains, of course, but the Executive Building Committee was terminated by the Parish Council this fall. The Executive Building Committee was formed in 1963 and for almost three years they labored long and hard in planning, financing and having our church built. One of the most important decisions they carried out was to build a church that would be within the financial means of those parishioners then belonging to the church in Paterson. The result has been a church that we can afford.
