PASTOR'S REPORT

Dear Members and Parishioners:

As directed by Diocesan Primate Archbishop Torkom Manoogian, through his official communication of July 18, 1972, I assumed the pastoral ministry at St. Leon's Church on Sept. 14. With former pastor Der Carnig Hallájian, I attended the regular meeting of the Parish Council on Sept. 13 and was made aware of certain procedures. I wish to thank Der Carnig and his wife Yeretzgin Rose for the help they have given me and my family on the eve of our moving into the parish house which they vacated on Sept. 15. I also express my thanks to the Parish Council for their cooperation in assuming the expenses of my moving from San Francisco, and for the repairs and additions done on the parish house and the garage since last September.

The seemingly endless job of getting settled in the Parish House, particularly in the midst of repair work, has caused delays in the performance of my pastoral duties. From the very outset, I became aware of the fact that St. Leon's Church members and parishioners are scattered in many towns in Bergen and Passaic Counties. Communicating with them as pastor, either through personal visits or through the printed word would be a challenge, considering the distances to be covered and the lack of secretarial help. My difficulties have been accentuated by the fact that St. Leon's does not have a full time on premises custodial or maintenance help. With a large property, three buildings and--since September--a trailer for the use of which we are responsible, the pastor who occupies one of these buildings as his home faces countless interruptions, emergencies, and is called upon to do certain work which would normally be accomplished by an on premises building caretaker.

RELIGIOUS SERVICES: Der Carnig Hallajian performed his final Divine Liturgy on Sept. 10, my first one being offered on Sept. 17. Since then, Sunday morning services have been performed regularly with the help of our protodeacons Charles Pinajian, Sarkis Soultanian, deacons Shavarsh Torosian and Hagop Demirdjian, and censers Wayne Kehishian, Bill Amerkanian, and Steve Kachigian. Their cooperation is commend-The choir is singing well under the dedicated leadership of able. organist-conductor Mrs. Lucy Dabagian. During her illness, Mrs. Arline Dadekian graciously played the organ for five consecutive Sundays. George Marootian has also substituted as organist once. As superintendent of the Sunday School secondary department, George Marootian arranged the administration of Holy Communion to one class of students each Sunday up to the Thanksgiving Holiday weekend. I am glad to note that Mrs. Lucy Dabagian is willing to teach the choir more of the variables of the Divine Liturgy. About 16 of the Sunday School boys have volunteered to be trained as acolytes under the supervision of Yeretzgin Mary Ashjian.

RITUALS: Between January and August, 10 baptisms have been performed. 7 couples have been married between April and December. 12 funerals were performed, the last 5 since October 1st. I have performed grave blessing on four memorial occasions, and a home blessing upon request. I also participated in funerals held in sister churches on four occasions.

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January 23 will be a memorable date for our Choir and altar servers, for on that day the Primate elevated the rank of our four deacons and ordained twelve boys as acolytes.

VISITATIONS: My dated record which includes sick and sympathy calls, administrative and educational errands and visitations on other occasions, shows a total of 116 visitations. Through these I have contacted 32 families (out of a potential 265) in their homes, and 17 patients in 8 hospitals. Special thanks are due to Mrs. Agnes Kapoian, the "Sunshine" volunteer, whose list of cards mailed during 1972 appears at the end of this report.

EDUCATIONAL: As founder of the parish newsletter LRADOO during my former pastorate in 1951, I am anxious that the LRADOO be not only informative, but also educational. Its format and appearance needs to be improved. Four issues have been edited and published by me, with a great deal of time devoted to the successive steps. Yeretzgin Mary has taken care of the English typing. The mailing list has increased by 13 during the last quarter and now stands at 605.

As of October 1st, announcements of special prayer requests, altar flower and candle donations and forthcoming events are typed on the eve of Sunday services, with one copy made available to the Parish Council. Eventually this weekly bulletin should be made available to every worshipper with the addition of pertinent information on the day's significance and the listing of the Scripture readings.

THE CHURCH SCHOOLS: St. Leon's has a Sunday School with about 150 pupils, and an Armenian School with about 40 students. The staff and teachers in both schools are volunteers. Because Armenian School classes are held on Saturday, I have closer contact with the students and the teachers, the latter being mostly parents of some of the pupils, or recent graduates. The Sunday School teachers have not had a meeting with me yet, with the exception of three or four staff members, with whom I have met twice. The Sunday School needs a responsible administrative head or superintendent, to coordinate the work of the three departments, and to make the ties between the school and the pastor more meaningful than what it is now. The obvious difficulty of both schools is the lack of adequate physical privacy for each individual class. All the textbooks and other teaching materials will not compensate for this basic inadequacy, which results in constant distraction and irritation. The trailer which was acquired in September and was put to use the end of November, is only a partial solution to the problem faced by both schools. Fortunately in our case the parish has space on its church property where a structure can be built to provide a sufficient number of individual classrooms to our children.

AUXILIARY ORGANIZATIONS:

a. The LADIES AID is the heart of the Parish and the right-arm of the Parish Council. As under the capable leadership of Mrs. Agnes Voskian, in 1973 the Ladies Aid will continue to work for the prosperity of St. Leon's Church, with out-of-state resident Mrs. Varsen Torosian as new chairman. To all members of the Executive and Standing Committees, and specially the committee in charge of <u>mahs</u> preparation and the newly formed Altar Guild, my sincere appreciation. b. The A.C.Y.O.A. is a closely knit group of teenagers whose adult advisor is the congenial and dedicated Mrs. Dovie Tilbian. Their activities, mainly recreational and sports-oriented, include help at major parish functions such as the annual bazaar. Gradual awareness of our Armenian ethnic, religious and cultural heritage should also be the goal of the St. Leon's A.C.Y.O.A.

DIOCESAN AFFAIRS: With Mr. Vahram Varjabedian, Superintendent of the Armenian School and Mr. Shavarsh Torosian, teacher, I attended the conference of Armenian School superintendents held at the Diocesan Center. I participated in the clergy seminar held for three days at the Diocese in October, and had group meetings with the Primate, Mr. Jack Antreasian, the heads of the Armenian School and Council for Religious Education, and Mr. Steve Zaratzian, psycho-therapist. I attended two cultural programs of the Diocese and a reunion of Diocesan Council members by invitation. I preached at a pre-Thanksgiving service of the Brotherhood of Churches and Synagogues in N.Y.C. and gave a lecture on some aspects of an Armenian pastor's work to the Armenian Theological students at St. Vladimer's Seminary in Tuckahoe, N.Y. The regional conference of the N.J. Armenian Churches was hosted by St. Leon's on Nov. 2.

MEETINGS: With the Parish Council twice a month with one exception; Ladies Aid Executive Board meetings, 2; membership meetings, 2; Choir 2 meetings, 2 rehearsals; A.C.Y.O.A., 2; Armenian School teachers, 1; Sunday School staff, 2; premarital conference with two couples; individual conferences on family and organizational matters, on at least seven occasions.

COMMUNITY AFFAIRS: Attended the Food Festival at the Bergen Mall, where our Ladies Aid had a booth. In Fair Lawn, I attended a meeting of the Fair Lawn Ministerial Association, and attended the dedication of the new wing of the Mental Health Day Treatment Center. I also attended a session of the Fair Lawn Borough Council meeting.

SUGGESTIONS AND RECOMMENDATIONS:

1. At the 1972 Parish Assembly, a report was submitted by the Parish Council and a Committee for the Community Center building proposal. I quote from the summary of the conclusions of that report:

- a. "St. Leon's does urgently need a new Community Center."
- b. "It'is within the financial means of St. Leon's to complete this project."

I heartily endorse the first of these conclusions. I am also concerned that the longer St. Leon's parishioners postpone embarking upon the campaign for the Community Center project, it will prove to be costlier.

2. The generosity of our parishioners is laudable. However, a Parish Church cannot meet its growing financial obligations merely on the income of bazaars, Christmas and Easter offerings, donations for rituals. A systematic STEWARDSHIP program should be launched for fiscal 1974, with the groundwork laid out soon after the new Parish Council begins its term next month. For the success of the steward-

ship program a parish visitation week should be designated in the Fall of 1973, with a trained group of lay visitors volunteering and preparing for it. As Pastor, I will give my wholehearted attention to this vital program.

3. The pastor should be equipped with the necessary help-whether in manpower or machinery--in order for him to devote his full time and attention to his vocation, which is the a) organization of worship, preparation of sermons, training of choir and potential altar servers; b) visiting the parishioners to spread the Good News of Christ, to inform and instruct for the edification of families and individuals; c) to organize the religious education of our youth in the Sunday School, with frequent meetings with the teachers, and to strengthen the Armenian School; d) to be a concerned citizen of Fair Lawn, represent St. Leon's Church in community projects and to participate in them and build up the image of our church in the eyes of the local community.

In order for these to become reality, the lay leaders of St. Leon's Parish should take steps to relieve their present pastor from the time-consuming responsibilities of doing certain routine, mechanical types of work.

A similar problem was faced by the apostles shortly after Christ's Ascension (Read Acts 6:1-7). They called the members of the newly born church--at that time limited to the city of Jerusalemto a meeting and told them: "It is not right for us to neglect the preaching of God's word in order to handle finances." (Today's English version of the New Testament.) The church solved the problem by presenting to the apostles a group of seven helpers "full of the Holy Spirit and wisdom". These were the earliest deacons of the Christian Church.

In the spirit that prevailed in the early Church of the Apostolic age, let us go on to improve our parish life, with better organization and cooperation. May God bless all the servers and benefactors of St. Leon's Armenian Church.

A very significant change in St. Leon's Church organization took place this past year. After sixteen years, our former parish priest, Der Carnig Hallajian left us to assume new responsibilities at Hely Martyrs Church in Long Island. St. Leon's was fortunate in arranging through the Diocese the immediate replacement of its parish priest with Per Arten Ashjian who came to us with an impressive record of previous accomplishment. Just as we can look back with satisfaction and prime at Der Carnig's leadership during the recent critical growth years, we can look forward with confidence to continued growth and progress in the future under the capable and experienced leadership of Der Arten.

In last year's Annual Report a report from the Parish Council Community Center Study Committee was presented. The conclusions of the report were that St. Leon's needed a new Community Center and that it was financially feasible. Perhaps the most pressing need for the Center is the desparate need for more space for our Sunday School. Recognizing the critical nature of this problem your Parish Council took steps to alleviate it to some extent. We were very fortunate in receiving the donation of a trailer for our temporary use by the Franklin Lakes National Bank without cost. This trailer was subsequently adapted as three classrooms for use by our Sunday School. While we may all take satisfaction at this immediate although temporary solution to a pressing problem, we must realize that a critical need for a Community Center still exists. At best we have bought some time. This time, however, has been put to good use. During the year we have substantially reduced our existing mortgage and added to our financial assets.

Your Parish Council thinks that a decision to proceed with the Community Center by the Parish Assembly in January, 1973 would be premature. A subsequent special Parish Assembly can be called for a decision when the time is right. In the meantime our new Der Hayr, whose leadership and guidance is indispensible for the success of the project, can familiarize himself with the Parish and its needs, and most important of all, can meet and know more of the people. This Annual Report summarizes elsewhere the financial details of the Parish and its various organizations. In general, St. Leon's continues in excellent financial health despite a substantial inetime expense associated with moving our new Der Hayr from California. The continued growth of our Parish will inevitably result in the necessity for new and expanded services to the Community which in turn will cost more money. The generous financial support of our parishioners is necessary for the progress of the Church and its continued financial health. The weekly envelope offering system is particularly recommended for participation by all parishioners.

The second five-year pledge has just ended. The thanks and appreciation of all the parishioners is extended to those who participated in and honored their pledges! For those who have not quite completed their pledge obligations, we request they do so as soon as possible.

The following are several accomplishments of major importance in 1972.

1. New shrubs were planted around the Parish House.

2. A tape recorder and player were purchased for use in connection with educational and cultural activities.

3. A young parishioner was sponsored for attendance for a seminar at St. Nersess Seminary.

4. A study course in Armenian history and religion in Armenia was attended by a young parishioner with some financial help from the Parish.

5. The Parish assumed the financial responsibilities of moving Der Arten Ashjian and his family from San Francisco to Fair Lawn.

6. Conversion of the donated trailer to temporary classrooms was accomplished.

7. The cottage exterior was painted.

8. The Parish House interior and the bell tower were painted.

The Parish Council "ishes to thank the parishioners of St. Leon's as well as its old and new Parish priests for their continued support during this past year. We feel confident that the future leadership of the Church can continue to build and progress on the firm foundation already established.

SCHOOL DAY AND HOURS: Saturdays from 10:00 a.m. to 12:00 Noon. Classes are held in the church annex and hall.

CURRICULUM: The students are divided into five classes according to their ages and knowledge of the Armenian language.

"OUR FIRST STEP", a new textbook, prepared by Silva Der Stepanian and approved by the Educational Council of the Diocese of the Armenian Church is being used for the first grade. TUITION: \$10.00 is charged per student to defray the expenses of the school. The students are provided with textbooks, notebooks and necessary school supplies.

MAIN ACTIVITIES: Halloween Party, Parents Visiting Day, Visit to the Home for the Armenian Aged, Emerson, N.J., Hantess with Dinner and Program, Annual Outing.

GIFTS: Special pens engraved with St. Leon's Armenian School was presented to all students at the annual Hantess.

GRADUATES: Linda Dabagian and Sosie Kirian were our first graduates. They received their diplomas and special gifts from their teacher, Vahram Varjabedian, at the annual Hantess. It is very gratifying to see that these two graduates have joined our teaching staff and have been teaching the Primary Grade.

THANKS: We sincerely thank the parents who appreciate the great importance of our wonderful Armenian heritage and bring their children to Armenian School. We ask all parents to please bring their children promptly at 10:00 a.m. every Saturday morning so that we may utilize every minute of the short two-hour period.
