#### Dear Parishioners:

"He who cherishes a beautiful vision, will one day realize." "Dream lofty dreams, and as you dream, so shall you become."

These thoughts were expressed on Sunday, November 15, during the Dedication of St. Leon Community Center. Who would ever think that our community had the resources to build such a beautiful edifice. Who knows what other accomplishments are in store for us. We have every reason to be proud of it and look forward to the future of our church and community.

Our parish continued carrying out the spiritual, cultural, educational, and various social activities during the year. In every aspect of our parish life we have experienced added enthusiasm and participation, all known to you. One can sense a renewed vitality in the life of our parish.

The Divine Liturgy was celebrated every Sunday in a fitting and orderly manner. George Paroonagian, Director of the Choir, Sirvart Galstian, organist and the choir members must be thanked for their loyal service during the year. Our appreciation to the Deacons, Sub-Deacons, Incensors, and the Acoyltes. They served on the altar with zeal and dedication.

I am happy to report that our Sunday and Armenian Schools are functioning very well. Our thanks to Barbara Hovsepian, Superintendent of Sunday Church School in doing an admirable job in planning, organizing, and supervising the teaching staff and assistants. We have close to 100 registered students in our Sunday School. Mrs. Hermine Menakian, School Principal, and Rose Najarian, Board Chairman of the Armenian School are doing a wonderful job in keeping our culture alive. I am happy to report that we have close to 70 enrolled youngsters attending. Our thanks to the teachers and the committee for their diligence and dedication.

The new Educational Wing, with classroom facilities, has truly enhanced learning among the students. Youngsters can now enjoy the privacy with less distraction. Now the challenge lies ahead---to prepare a generation that will assimiliate our spiritual and cultural knowledge into their life-style.

As part of my pastoral callings, I visit Valley Hospital and St. Joseph's Hospital on a regular basis. When informed of emergencies, I have made special visits. I have also maintained regular visits to the homes of our parishioners year round, but especially during the Christmas and Easter seasons. I have made close to 70 visits within the course of the year.

The following sacraments are recorded in our Parish Registry:
Baptisms-10 Weddings-15 Funerals-9

On Wednesdays, I provided transportation for the Seniors and on Sunday, when needed, Alfred Ferraro and Jim Soojian provided transportation. Our appreciation to both of them. As of February 1, 1982, the Van registered 31.500 safe miles.

I have kept regular office hours carrying out administrative duties of the office and the parish. Our church secretary, Alice Yazmajian, assisted me in my correspondence, in the preparation of Lradoo, Sunday Bulletin and news releases. She also helps the parish in bookeeping and other secretarial duties, when called upon. I wish to express my heartfelt appreciation to her.

Church organizations continue to be an integral part of our parish life by serving a variety of purposes and needs. They truly promote the best interests of our parish in every way. To the chairman of each organization, their committees and members, I extend my appreciation.

Of particular interest are the youths of the parish. They too are active through various social, religious and fund-raising activities. In the absence of adult advisiors, the ACYOA, Jrs. seem to be traveling on their own steam. I sincerely regret that no adult couple has volunteered to act as advisors. I hope the situation can be remedied this year.

In planning for 1982 and beyond, it is necessary to look further into the future and see what challenges lie ahead. Here is a summary of future expectations:

- (a) With the completion of the Community Center we have to endeavor to reduce the mortgage indebtedness and address ourselves to utilize the Community Center to the fullest potential. We will take steps to form a Fine Arts Committee to provide musicals, and cultural and noteworthy events.
- (b) I am sure we are all excited about the remodeling that is going on and the intended usuage of the second floor of the Community Center. Our youth will have a place to gather and socialize. We hope to organize "St. Leon Pioneers" for boys and girls, ages 8-13, with clear aims for future organizations. In other words it will be a stepping stone for the ACYOA, Jrs. We are hoping that the ACYOA, Srs. will be organized on a regional basis, whereby 18 years and older will be a part of our group.

- In the years ahead we must continue to focus our attention on our youth in the educational, social, and most importantly their religious aspects. Such activities include: Retreats, Vacation Bible School, Sports and church involvements. It was this concern that led me to start the St. Vartan ACYOA Camp I am happy to report that it has become viable institution for our youth. I wish to express my appreciation to the Parish Council for allowing me to get involved.
- The most important issue facing the church is the question of spiritual maturity. This should be the goal of all Christians. As members grow so must their sense of duty, discipline, and the ability to integrate the Word of God into life experiences. All should desire to be like Jesus Christ, our leader, to be conformed to His image, to reach the measure of His fullness. (Eph. 4:13b).
- (e) We, the members of St. Leon, will be privileged to observe the Church's 50th Golden Anniversary -- a record to be proud of. We hope to use this occasion to give ourselves a lift. Let us begin to dream of bigger things and attract wonderful people to help us fulfill these dreams. When a Christian begins to dream big they are actually beginning to think the way God intended them to think.

I would like to take this opportunity to express my appreciation to Sarkis Soultanian, Chairman of the Parish Council, for his able leadership and to the members of the Parish Council for their advice and consent.

I also would like to thank Zaven Dadekian. Chairman of the Building Committee, and to all the numerous committees who worked so hard and diligently towards the completion of the Community Center. My personal thanks to Sarkis Gabrellian, who spent many many hours overseeing the construction. I would be amiss if I didn't thank many unsung heroes that do so much for our church and the Diocese.

Yerezgin Angel, my children and I, truly love what St. Leon stands for. We believe that it is the best place in the world to raise children and we look forward to many years of happy relationships. We are like one big happy family and a family that prays together.
