## PASTORAL REPORT

Dear Parishioners,

By the grace and will of God, St. John's Armenian Church of Detroit, has had a year filled with many good works and blessings as the annual reports of Church organizations will suggest.

MEMBERSHIP During 1961, the Church membership reached 1,207. This number includes fifty-three additional families as new members of the Church. In keeping with the decision made at the General Membership Meeting last year, the minimum dues of annual church membership was raised from \$10.00 to \$15.00. In 1959, \$7.00 out of the \$10.00 per member was sent to the Diocese. This has been slightly lowered since the Diocesan assembly accepted the proposal of our delegates and we no longer pay per member but by proportionately dividing the Diocesan budget among the parishes. Nevertheless, our local budget has increased to such an extent in view of our new obligations and challenges that it is recommended that the minimum be raised to \$1.00 per week for each family (husband and wife).

The Detroit Parish is one of the largest in number and size if not the largest in our Diocese. The majority of our membership lies within a thirty mile radius. This is one of the most heavily populated Armenian centers. At least 10,000 of the Armenians in metropolitan Detroit expect to be ministered to by our Church. At present, we have 1,700 names on our mailing list. The potential Church membership is obvious and it is recommended that an organized, vigorous, membership campaign be launched.

CLERGY The Pastor, Father Arnak Kasparian, and the Associate-Pastor, Father Diran Papazian, worked harmoniously together for the benefit of the Church in discharging their pastoral duties here. Due to the shortage of priests in our Diocese, by arrangement with the Primate, Father Arnak also became Visiting-Pastor of Cleveland. He spent a week-end there each month. Father Diran became Visiting-Pastor of St. Louis, spending one week out of each month there. In addition, Father Arnak, in accordance with his elective office, attended monthly Diocesan Council meetings in New York.

WORSHIP Divine Liturgy was celebrated every Sunday and also on major feast days such as St. Stephen's Day (December 25) Nativity and Epiphany (January 6), Vartanantz (February 9), and Maundy Thursday (March 30). Special services were offered on different occasions such as Sunrise Services on Sundays during Lent, Vigil Services on Wednesday nights during Lent, American Christmas Eve service in English, Holy Week observances and Church School Worship program and mid-day services prior to monthly meetings of the Ladies' Auxiliary. Services were conducted and sermons delivered by the Pastors, alternately. Occasionally, for the benefit of the young people, sermons were delivered in English. 2nd Annual Outdoor Badarak and Grape Blessing on the Feast of the Holy Virgin was celebrated at the State Fair Grounds followed by the picnic. Also Annual Madagh and Requiem services were held for the Armenian Veterans of Detroit. Guest clergymen who participated in services throughout the year included our Primate, Archbishop Sion Manoogian, Archbishop Tiran Nersoyan, Hajaaser Vartabed Bayramian, and Shahe Vartabed Ajemian.

#### SERVICES AND SACRAMENTS

During 1961, 108 Baptisms were performed, which included one adult Baptism. Seven singular Confirmations were performed, several engagements were blessed and twenty-two marriage ceremonies were conducted. Fifty funeral services were performed, of which all or part of the "in lieu of flower contributions" were donated to the Church Building Fund. Graves were blessed on Memorial Day and upon request at different times.

On the occasion of the Feast of Nativity and Easter, Holy Communion was administered with a special devotional service to the Church School children. Newly elected officers of Church affiliated groups were officially initiated, blessed, and given Holy Communion.

A general Requiem service was held on February 12, for all those who were deceased in 1960.

#### PASTORAL VISITATIONS AND CALLS

Included under pastoral visitations and calls are visiting patients at the hospitals, visiting bereaved families for consolation, home blessings, calls to help solve family and marital problems, and calls on festive, social, sympathy and other occasions. Calls were also made to business places.

All calls and visits were made upon notification formally or by hearsay and as time permitted.

Special visits were also made to the Home Of The Armenian Aged and to Elois e State Hospital to perform services for infirmed Armenians.

EDUCATIONAL The Pastors took as active a role as time permitted in teaching in the Armenian Language and Church School.

Upon request, the Pastors lectured to Church affiliated groups. In the Fall, Father Arnak began a series of lectures on Divine Liturgy to the Women's Guild.

Both Pastors participated in the 7th Annual Religious Conference at Kellogg Center in East Lansing, which in 1961 was under the sponsorship of the Parish Council. Archbishop Tiran Nersoyan was the main guest speaker.

We had two public lectures from noted persons on Armenian Culture under the sponsorship of the Church. Dr. Kelekian, physician from Chicago and Dr. E. Varandyan from Ohio State University were the speakers.

Father Diran Papazian gave several messages over the Armenian Radio Hour upon the invitation of the director, Mrs. A. Der Vartanian.

A cultural program about Armenians was presented by Father Diran to the Detroit Cosmopolitan Women's Group. A TV dramatization on Sts. Mesrob and Vartan was also directed by Father Diran on Channel 56. Both of these were arranged by Mrs. A. Attarian.

Father Arnak performed a service of worship on TV by arrangement of Detroit Council of Churches.

Father Diran assisted by Mr. E. Korkoian demonstrated in Armenian the home blessing ceremony at the International Institute. The significance of this ceremony was also explained by Father Diran.

On the occasion of the 1,600th Anniversary of St. Mesrob's birth, a dramatic presentation of the founding of the Armenian letters was written and directed by Father Diran. This was done with the cooperation of the Church Choir and the Armenian Language School.

#### CHURCH ORGANIZATIONS

The Pastors shared the responsibility of presiding over and directing the various Church organizations.

Realizing the need, Father Arnak and Mr. M. Apkarian, Parish Council Chairman, organized a Men's Group.

All of the Church organizations accomplished a great deal in their support of the work of the Church and special mention should be given to the success of the Bazaar through their combined efforts under the able chairmanship of Mrs. 4. Manoogian and co-chairmanship of Mrs. E. Mardigian. Our thanks go also to our fellow Armenian groups for their help in this project.

#### INTER-CHURCH AND CIVIC RELATIONS

We represented our Church at the Detroit Council Of Churches, serving on the Board. We were guests at the Episcopal Michigan Diocesan Conferences at Cranbrook. We were also guests at the Annual Thanksgiving Dinner of the Armenian Congregational Church. We participated in other non-Armenian Church groups. Father Diran was invited to speak on the "I am an American Day" program in Highland Park on behalf of new citizens. The arrangement for the speaking engagement was made by Mrs. N. Parseghian, English teacher of candidates for citizenship.

PAPER WORK The weekly bulletin and the monthly Parish paper, "Torchbearer," were published along with announcements and flyers. Official correspondence was maintained with the Diocesan office and other Parishes of our Diocese. Upon request, letters pertaining to citizenship, Social Security, reccomendations and birth certificates were also written. When necessary, court visits were made to speak on behalf of those in need. Files, ledgers and lists were kept by our Church Secretary, Mrs. Helen Armoudlian, who has worked tirelessly to keep up with the ever increasing work of the Church office. New Forms were devised by the Pastors to facilitate the Church work.

#### TRANSFER TO NEW BUILDING

The successful Dedication Banquet presided over by the Primate marked the beginning of the use of our new building in Southfield.

By October 1, Church services were being conducted in the Chapel and all Church functions had been transferred to this New Center.

#### PONTIFICAL RECOGNITION

At the Dedication Banquet, our community leaders, Mr. Alex Manoogian and Mr. Edward Mardigian were presented encyclicals from His Holiness Lord Lord Vasken I, the Catholicos of All Armenians, in reference to the Medals of the Insignia of St. Gregory the Illuminator, First Order, which they had received during the historical visit of His Holiness to Detroit in 1960.

The Pastors, in the presence of members of the Parish Council, at the home of Deacon Levon N. Zenian, presented to him an encyclical from the Catholicos in recognition of his outstanding contributions in the field of religious education.

Father Arnak was also honored for faithful service with an encyclical from the Catholicos which gave him the right to wear The Pectoral-Cross-For Priests. Father Arnak received the Cross from the Primate who had brought it from Holy Etchmiadzin recently.

Our Parish rejoiced with our honored parishioners on these memorable occasions.

PILGRIMAGE Both Father Arnak and Father Diran, respectively, organized pilgrimages to the Holy See of Etchmiadzin in the summer of 1960 and 1961. Upon his return, Father Arnak showed his rich collection of interesting slides to various church and civic groups; one of which was at the International Institute.

The highlights of his trip abroad were first and foremost that Father Diran had the opporutnity of celebrating Divine Liturgy and delivering the sermon at the Monastery of Holy Etchmiadzin in the presence of the Catholicos and Members Of The Brotherhood.

Father Diran was priviledged in receiving as a personal gift from His Holiness, a lovely gold Hand-Cross, with precious stones embedded in it, as a sign of appreciation and encouragement. He participated in the historical funeral of Patriarch Archbishop Karekin Khachadourian in Istanbul, presided over by the Catholicos. In Jerusalem, he celebrated Divine Liturgy and delivered the sermon at the Holy Sepulchre in the presence of the Members of the Brotherhood of St. James Monastery.

Upon his return, Father Diran showed slides of his trip to several church and civic groups, including International Institute.

#### PASTORAL CHANGE

Father Arnak was appointed in late December by the Primate as Pastor of the newly organized Bergen County, New Jersey Parish.

Father Diran at the same time was made, by the Primate, the responsible Pastor of our Detroit Parish.

APPRECIATIONS Our Lord has called all of His faithful to work in His vineyard, His Church. We have been especially blessed in our Parish with many devoted and able Christian Souls. There are many unsung laborers who are not thanked formally but whose work is indispensable for the growth of the Church. May God give them the strength and dedication to continue their good works.

We would like to acknowledge the outstanding service which has been given by all the Church affiliated groups under the direction of their capable chairmen. Their reports which are herein attached speak for themselves and should be read carefully.

Special mention should be given to the progress of the work of the Apostolic Society under the most able leadership of Mr. Mardigian and Mr. Manoogian. The completion of new Cultural Center is a source of inspiration to all of us.

The Parish Council is to be commended for their fine harmonious teamwork under the enthusiastic chairmanship of Mr. Martin Apkarian.

1962 will be the year of the construction of our new Church by the Grace of God. Everyone's prayers and zealous effort will be necessary for the fruition of this great endeavor.

I pray that God will fill the hearts and minds of our congregation with the deep faith, charity, grace and devotion of our forefathers, thereby bringing about more fully the Kingdom Of God within our Church.

I ask for your continual prayers so that God will pour His graces and wisdom upon your humble servant to guide him in the right way in fulfilling his pastoral duties for the greater glory of God and our Holy Mother Church.

#### ELECTION OF THE EXECUTIVE BODY:

Immediately after the General Membership Meeting on February 26, 1961, the Parish Council members met at the Old Cultural Building and elected the executive body for 1961. The officers elected were as follows:

It was decided unanimously to hold the regular Parish Council meetings on the second and fourth Tuesday of each month, unless notified otherwise.

#### REGULAR MEETINGS OF THE PARISH COUNCIL DURING 1961:

A total of 21 regular Parish Council meetings were held. Three of which were with the Diocesan Delegates. Three quarterly meetings with the executive bodies of the church affiliated groups, one special meeting and one combined meeting with the ACYOA were held. 1961 became an eventful year in the history of our church, because it marked the beginning of our cultural enterprise, the largest in the North American Diocese of the Armenian Church.

#### ARMENIAN CEMETERY AT WOODLAWN:

Mr. Karl Sarafian was reappointed as Chairman of this committee which consisted of Mr. Edward Korkoian and Mr. Howard Atesian. The Armenian Memorial Section was blessed on April 6, 1961, by Rev. Arnak Kasparian, assisted by Deacon Harry Ekizian. The Cemetery Committee and a group of parishoners were present at these rites.

In accordance with the agreement signed with Wendorph Associates, Woodlawn Cemetery agrees to construct a \$7,500.00 Shrine; grant 20 spaces for church use, and gives us an option on 1,000 spaces to be reserved exclusively for Armenians, – if 1,200 spaces are sold during a designated period of time. Hence to abide by the agreement, the Parish Council unanimously decided to recommend to the Apostolic Society the purchase of the remaining unsold spaces. The purchase price was \$36,000.00, with 10% down and \$500.00 monthly payment without interest. This program was adopted by the Apostolic Society and carried out as recommended.

#### SUND AY SCHOOL:

Mr. Garbis Ohanian was appointed as Superintendent of Sunday School as of September, 1961, succeeding Rev. Fr. Diran, who being fully occupied with his extensive parish duties was released from this post. On September 17, 1961, the Sunday School was transferred to their new classrooms in the New Cultural Building.

#### ARMENIAN SCHOOL:

With the unanimous approval of the Parish Council members, the name of the Armenian School was changed to the Calouste Gulbenkian School of St. John's Armenian Church, in recognition of the contribution made by the Gulbenkian Foundation.

#### DIOCESAN CONVENTION IN BOSTON, MAY, 1961:

Representing our Parish at the Diocesan Convention in Boston, were Messrs.

Martin Apkarian, Edward Korkoian, Edward Mardigian and Howard Atesian. The highlights of the convention were as follows:

- A record \$80,000.00 budget was adopted for the Diocese, for the ensuing fiscal year. On the recommendation of our Diocesan Delegates, acting according to a directive given to them by the Parish Council, the \$7.00 per parish member diocesan dues was changed to a lump sum assessment on each parish. Under this new system, the assessment for St. John's Armenian Church of Detroit is \$7,000.00, which resulted in a yearly saving of \$2,000.00 for our Parish.
- Construction of a Cultural Building in the Diocese of New York will be a reality soon, due to a \$500,000.00 gift by the Calouste Gulbenkian Foundation.
- 3. Founding of an Armenian Theological Seminary in Evanston, Illinois, as a joint project of our Diocese and the California Diocese.

#### MEN'S SOCIETY:

This new organization was formed under the auspices of our church with the vigorous backing of the Parish Council. At their first meeting on May 31, 1961, Mr. Albert Semonian was appointed as Chairman and Mr. Mike Kaysserian as Secretary, and Mr. Sooren Gozmanian as Treasurer. This group will have all the potentialities to assist the Parish Council particularly and the church generally with their various activities.

#### INSURANCE:

The Parish Council formed a committee of insurance brokers. The committee members are Messrs. Harry Ekizian, Noubar Dourjalian, Harry Mardirosian and Harry Terzagian. They are designated to assume the responsibility to look after all of the insurance requirements of the church buildings.

#### PICNIC:

Under the able chairmanship of Mr. Jack Kavlakian, the annual picnic and the "Outdoor Holy Mass and Blessing of the grapes" took place on August 13, 1961, at the Michigan State Fair Grounds. The picnic was a great success. Due to the uncertainty of the weather conditions, a motion was adopted by the Parish Council to forego the outdoor Mass; and have only the picnic which will be highlighted by the Blessing of the Grapes.

#### OFFICIAL OPENING & DEDICATION BANQUET:

On September 10, 1961, the Dedication Banquet and the official opening of the New Cultural Building took place. The dedication ceremonies were presided over by the Primate, Archbishop Sion Manoogian, assisted by our pastors and visiting clergymen. Also in attendance were local government dignitaries and out of town Armenian Civic Leaders. A record crowd of 1,000 persons attended the banquet, which was highlighted by a fund raising campaign. A sum of \$99,154.00 was raised that evening and a \$9,000.00 profit was realized from the dinner. A gold key to the new building was presented to Mr. Martin Apkarian,

Chairman of the Parish Council, by Mr. Edward Mardigian, Chairman of Apostolic Society, marking the official transfer of our New Building to the Parish Council.

Beginning on October 1, 1961, schools and all other activities were transferred to the New Building, with religious services being held in the chapel. The Oakman Blvd. Church is reserved exclusively for funerals and for weddings upon request, until such time as we are able to dispose of the Oakman Blvd. properties. Mr. George Mashlakjian was designated as temporary manager of both new and old buildings and assisted by two helpers to work under his supervision.

#### CHUR CH BAZAAR:

The first church bazaar, under the able chairmanship of Mrs. Alex Manoogian and co-chairmanship of Mrs. Edward Mardigian took place on September 22 - 24 at the New Cultural Building. The affair was highly successful and netted a sum of \$10,660.00. All church organizations participated fully in all phases of the bazaar.

#### QUARTERLY MEETINGS:

Three quarterly meetings were held during 1961 with the executive bodies of all church affiliated organizations. The purpose of these meetings was to create a better understanding, interest, and harmonious working relationship in all church activities.

#### ARMENIAN CULTURAL CELEBRATION:

A program to commemorate the 1600th anniversary of the discovery of the Armenian Alphabet was given by the Parish Council on December 10, 1961. His Holiness Vasken I had sent a patriarchal Encyclical to this effect. A tableau depicting the vision of St. Mesrob Mashdotz, prepared by Rev. Fr. Diran Papazian was presented.

In conjunction with this celebration, a dinner was tendered to honor the faculty of the Armenian and Sunday Schools and all the members of the church choir for their devoted service to their church. Chairman for this affair was Edward Korkojan.

#### PATRIARCHAL HONORS:

Our Parish was singularly honored by Vasken I, Catholicos of All Armenians, by the awarding of a "Pectoral Cross" for Priests to Rev. Fr. Arnak Kasparian, and a Patriarchal Encyclical bestowing his blessings upon Deacon Levon Zenian, for his devoted efforts in Church School Activities.

#### HOUSE COMMITTEE:

The House Committee was appointed by the Parish Council under the Chairmanship of Haigas Yagoobian. The function of this committee is to oversee and implement the proper maintenance of the New Cultural Building. Their actions and recommendations are subject to approval by the Parish Council.

#### NEW YEARS EVE CELEBRATION:

The first New Years Eve Celebration held in our New Building was an outstanding success - financially and artistically. It was a joyous evening for all in attendance. The committee for this affair, under the Chairmanship of Mr. John Semizian, must be complimented for their wonderful organization and presentation of this gala event.

#### **ACKNOWLEDGMENTS:**

The Parish Council acknowledges and expresses deep appreciation on behalf of our community to the following groups and individuals for their untiring efforts in assisting them during the year 1961.

Mr. Edward Mardigian and Mr. Alex Manoogian and all the members of the Apostolic Society for the successful completion of the first phase of the Armenian Cultural project.

Mrs. Alex Manoogian and Mrs. Edward Mardigian for their very successful church bazaar.

Mr. Jack Kavlakian for his able chairmanship of the annual church picnic.

Mr. John Semizian for the spectacular New Years Eve Affair.
