#### PASTOR'S REPORT

#### Dear Parishioners.

With the grace and mercy of God, we, the members of St. John's Armenian Church Community, have spent another year under the shadow of our Holy Mother Church. While preparing this brief Pastoral Report I look back to the past year and I see causes for happiness and disappointment, fortunately the latter are much smaller in number. I stand before God, before you and myself in judgment, and with a clear conscience I declare that I did my human utmost in providing pastoral care and guidance to this Church and her members. I am grateful to God for the opportunity to serve the St. John's Church for another year without sparing the graces which He has bestowed upon me.

#### Increase of the Pastoral Staff

On Sunday, September 22, 1974, two clergymen officially assumed duties on our Pastoral Staff. The Rev. Fr. Michael Buttero was assigned to St. John's as Assistant Pastor by the Primate, The Most Rev. Archbishop Torkom Manoogian. The Very Rev. Fr. Baret Yeretzian took residence here in Detroit by the arrangement of His Beatitude, Archbishop Yeghishe Derderian, Patriarch of Jerusalem, and Mr. Alex Manoogian, as a graduate student at Wayne State University, and with the consent of our Diocesan Primate, has joined our Pastoral Staff with limited weekend responsibilities and functions. With these capable additions to our Pastoral Staff we hope to better serve the needs of our Church and community.

#### Acknowledgements of Services

During the past year The Most Reverend Archbishop Sion Manoogian has continued to enhance the solemnity of our Church by celebrating the Divine Liturgy and by preaching on the Major Feast Days of our Church, by his monthly sermons, as well as by presiding at various ceremonies and church functions. Deacon Levon N. Zenian, unfortunately due to illness, has not been able to preach as often as in the past. He gave two sermons during the past year, one on Sunday, March 3rd and another on Sunday, September 1st. The following church dignitaries celebrated the Divine Liturgy, and/or preached, or presided at our Services in connection with their visits to Detroit: His Beatitude Archbishop Yeghishe Derderian, Patriarch of Jerusalem, on Sunday, June 30th, during his surprise visit to our city in connection with the celebration of the Twentieth Anniversary of Mr. Alex Manoogian's Presidency of the Armenian General Benevolent Union, and on that same occasion our Church was fortunate to also receive the visits of our Primate. The Most Rev. Archbishop Torkom Manoogian, and The Most Rev. Archbishop Shahe Aiemian. Chancelor of the Patriarchate of Jerusalem; His Beatitude Archbishop Shnork Kaloustian, Patriarch of Istanbul, accompanied by the Rev. Fr. Hovan Istambolian, Staffbearer, on the occasion of his visit to our Parish on Sunday, October 27, during his tour of the country to raise funds for the needy Armenians of Turkey: The Very Rev. Guregh Ds. Vartabed Kapigian of Jerusalem, The Very Rev. Kevork Ds. Vartabed Garbisian of Beirut, The Rev. Fr. Sarkis Tashjian, Pastor of St. Sarkis Church of Yerevan, Armenia, and The Rev. Fr. Karekin Kasparian of New York. On behalf of our Church I extend my gratitude and appreciation to our Church dignitaries and her dedicated servants for the opportunity of praying and exalting God together.

In connection with the worship services conducted in our Church, it is my duty and privilege to thank each and every member of our Komitas Choir, including the Deacons of our Church, for their dedication and service to our Church and her worshipping congregation. Unfortunately, the record of our Choir's rendition of the Divine Liturgy has not yet been cut, it is my hope that in the very near future our Choir will make this record available to the public both locally and nationwide; I know there is a need for it. At this time I would like to acknowledge specifically three individuals from our Choir who worked diligently during the past year to make our services dignified and inspiring; Deacon Ara Haig, Choirmaster, Miss Michele Menoian, official Assistant Organist since April, and Mrs. Louise Yardumian. Unfortunately since June, 1974, we lost Louise because she moved away to Florida, we regret her departure deeply, she has had a great share in forming the character of our Choir. In connection with our Church Services I feel a deep gratitude towards Deacon Harry Ekizian for his capable assistance during the officiation of the sacraments of our Church.

#### **Worship Services**

Divine Liturgy was celebrated, and Armenian and English sermons were delivered every Sunday and at all other occasions of the Church calendar. Services were also offered during the week according to the requirements of our Church traditions. Since November, Saturday afternoon Vespers have also been added to our Church Services.

#### Sacraments and Rites

During 1974 the following Sacraments and Rites were officiated: Baptisms and confirmations for infants and adults, 59; Engagement Services, 5; Holy Matrimony, 42; Funeral Services, 54.

#### Pastoral Visitations and Related Matters

Hospital visitations, Nursing Home visitations to the sick and the elderly, Home visitations to the shut-ins, Home visitations for consolation and counseling; Home Blessings; Visitations with the families of the Parish, in connection with Sacraments and for various other reasons, have been attended to by myself until October of this year conscientiously and to the utmost of my ability. Since October the Rev. Fr. Michael Buttero, the Assistant Pastor, and myself have been taking care of these responsibilities jointly. I hope that our parishioners do not expect the visit of both clergymen at a given occasion; we must economize our time so that others in the parish also may be visited. In connection with this I would like to ask our parishioners not to make a habit of requiring the presence of both or more clergymen at a given Service, each clergyman has his assignment.

#### **Administrative Duties**

Office work and management, Parish Council and Church Auxiliary Organizations' general body and committee meetings, attendance and participation in organizational functions, promotion of cultural and educational programs, coordination of Church organizations, involvement and direction in renovational, fund raising and social concern projects, have been my administrative responsibilities this year.

#### **Publications and Public Relations**

During the past year I have continued to offer my time and advice to the Editorial Staff of our Church monthly publication. I take this opportunity to thank the Editorial Staff and particularly the Editor of the Torch Bearer, Miss Thelma Astourian, for the commendable

work they did in connection with this publication. I am sorry to see Miss Astourian's retirement from her position, I wish her success in her future endeavors.

My public relations during the past year was confined to occasional presence at, and offering of invocations and giving lectures to various religious, civic and fraternal Armenian and non-Armenian organizations, conducting Church tours for religious, educational and youth groups to introduce the Armenian Church, history and cultural heritage. Time has not yet been available for other types of public relations and involvement. In due time I will re-evaluate our deliberate isolation from the local scene and make appropriate recommendations, always giving priority first to the needs of our parish and our own community.

#### Recommendations and Acknowledgements

In connection with the promotion of Armenian Heritage and Culture our Church again took part in the Southfield Arts Festival and the Detroit Riverfront Ethnic Festival. The Chairpersons and Committees working on these projects on behalf of our Church deserve high praise and gratitude. Yet both of these intercommunity affairs leave a lot to be desired because of administrative neglect on the part of the organizers. If positive steps could not be taken to improve these projects for the safety and benefit of the general community and the participants, I recommend not to support these projects and to find new avenues to promote the Armenian Culture and to secure needed financial gains. One of these avenues could be an Annual Church Bazaar on the proportion and scale of Bazaars 1973 and 1974, during which our Church and Community were more than adequately introduced to the American public through various promotional devices. At this time I would like to express my personal gratitude to Mr. Martin Cholakian, General Chairman of Bazaar 1974, and his Committee for heading a resoundingly successful Bazaar.

I will fail in my responsibility as Pastor not to acknowledge one other Committee because of the reservation of some of our members regarding the project it sponsors. Mr. & Mrs. Vahe Papelian, Mr. & Mrs. Art Boudakian and Mr. & Mrs. Tom Hanesian, and their assistants, deserve our thanks for supervising and managing the Bingo Project of our Church faithfully every Thursday, which has proven to be a financial success.

As we all know this year marks the 60th Anniversary of the Armenian Genocide. The supreme sacrifice of our ancestors must be observed reverently and with dignity by every Armenian. The St. John's Parish has already started to formulate an appropriate commemoration within the guidelines set by our Diocese. I urge our parishioners to follow the development of events in Armenian and American news media and to heed the directions and advice of our Diocesan Primate.

#### **Appreciation and Conclusion**

I take this opportunity to express my sincere gratitude and appreciation to each and every one of our Church Bodies, Organizations, Standing Committees, as well as to individual parishioners for their cooperation, services and sacrifices which enabled our Church to conclude another fruitful year. The accomplishments and successes of our Church is their pride and fulfillment. I pray that God bless each and every one abundantly both in their homes and their businesses. And may He also give us the perseverance to continue our good works.

#### PARISH COUNCIL REPORT

#### Dear Parishioners,

This past year has been one of progress and innovations for St. John's Armenian Church. The Parish Council has proceeded with a theme of unity and has sought to increase involvement of parishioners in Church activities. With your cooperation and assistance we have had an active and fruitful year.

We are fortunate to have two additional clergy to assist our Pastor, Very Rev. Fr. Paren Avedikian in meeting the needs of our large community. Rev. Fr. Michael Buttero has joined us as Assistant Pastor and Very Rev. Fr. Baret Yeretzian is with us as Student

Priest in Residence to assist on weekends and during his school holidays.

The year 1974 has been one of substantial improvements to our Cultural Building. The Apostolic Society and Parish Council jointly funded redecoration of the interior of the hall such as carpeting, dance floor, new stage curtains, new drapes and chandeliers. As directed by previous assemblies the Parish Council appointed a Building Study Committee to investigate methods of improving operation of the building. The implementation of many of the recommendations of the Committee has allowed us to reduce the huge building operation deficits that we experienced in prior years. With additional improvements to our operational techniques and management we will be able to reduce the deficit even further.

The Parish Council involved more parishioners in the various affairs it sponsored during the year. The guiding policy was to seek chairmen who were not Council members. Previously many such functions had been headed by Council members. This method has

proved to be successful.

Through the donations of many parishioners we have been able to complete the Vestry Confessional Chapel. The Altar was consecrated in April and since the addition of our new clergy, confession has been heard in the Vestry Confessional Chapel, which also houses the vestments, and the vessels of our Church.

This past year was the first time that the Parish Council Chairmen of the parishes participated in the Diocesan Assembly as delegates with vote. It was a wise decision on the part of the Diocesan Assembly to have incorporated this policy into the By Laws of our Church. The experience of participating in this meeting was very beneficial and pointed out to our Parish Council the need to become more aware of and involved in the extensive activities and concerns of our Diocese. Among the many subjects discussed was the question of unity with our separated brethren. Although this goal should be a prime objective for all, utmost caution must be exercised to reach a final agreement without sacrificing Church canon and principles.

Without cooperation and assistance from all concerned parishioners the Parish Council could not have performed effectively. Special thanks to Very Rev. Fr. Paren Avedikian for his untiring efforts in offering guidance to us through the year. Thanks are due to the many parishioners who have given their time and talents to aid us in the accomplishment of our task. Thanks also to our Church organizations who play a vital role in the life of our Church.

As we embark upon a new year we have new goals. Yet in order to attain these goals we will need your assistance. We ask of you to adopt with us a theme, the theme of sacrifice, giving our time, our talents, our money, giving ourselves. We can never do enough in our service to God and our people.

#### **BUILDING REPORT FOR 1974**

The Cultural Building continued to receive increased utilization in 1974. Meetings were held in the building by the Parish Council, Ladies' Auxiliary, Women's Guild, ACYOA Seniors, ACYOA Project Youth, Men's Society, Church School, Nursery School, Armenian School, AGBU Men, AGBU Women, K of V Shavarshan Lodge, K of V Nareg Lodge, D of V Zabelle Otyag, and the Detroit Bible Students which met every Monday and Wednesday. Nursery School is held in the building three days a week from October through May. Church School classes were held every Sunday from September through June. The AGBU Manoogian School used the building for a few school programs. Coffee hour was held occasionally. Easter and Christmas breakfasts were held for the children. ACYOA Project Youth served Lenten Dinners every Wednesday evening during Lent. The kitchen received extensive use by the ladies for preparation of food for the Southfield Festival, and the Church Bazaar.

Hall rentals were increased as indicated by the Financial Report.

Some of the major improvements to the facilities for the year 1974 were:

Church Doors were rehung.

Church Dome Lights replaced.

Church roof repaired.

Church Hall renovated with new curtains, lighting, carpeting and parquet floor under the guidance of the Apostolic Society, the project chair-person being Mrs. Louise Simone.

The Parish Council would like to express its appreciation to Mr. Frank Bartholomew and his staff for their fine performance in maintaining the building and equipment in excellent condition.

Immediately following last year's Parish Assembly a Building Advisory Committee was appointed consisting of Mr. Harry Kezelian, Mr. Martin Manoogian, and Mr. Vahe

Papelian. According to the direction of Parish Assembly the Parish Council Building Management Committee met with the Building Advisory Committee from February through April to study the hall operations. As a result of these studies the following changes were implemented in Hall Rental in May 1974:

- 1. The practice of renting the hall on a fee basis plus extra charges was changed to a total per plate rate. The rate arrived at was based on an actual cost, plus basis.
- 2. A corkage charge on a per person basis was implemented to cover cost of Bar Service.
- 3. Catering service was limited to caterers approved by Parish Council.
- 4. A special rental structure on a per plate basis was set up at lower rates for off hours such as breakfast and luncheon meetings.
- 5. To encourage and actively pursue new and additional rentals, advertising has been contracted with one of the caterers for the suburban Yellow Pages.

This program will be implemented with the publication of the North Woodward

edition, which will begin distribution in April.

- Bell Telephone Company will supply us with 1,500 reprints of the above ad for our own personal distribution to private groups and organizations soliciting their hall rental.
- 6. Special preferential rental structure was set up for Parishioners and Armenian Organizations.
- 7. A charge assessing the caterer for each affair catered to cover use of kitchen linen was implemented.
- 8. All expenditures and income attributable to Hall Rental Operation is now passed through Parish Council representatives and Church Books so that we will be able to continue to monitor the true cost and income of the Hall Rental Operations, and to adjust the rate structure as may be required, based on cost increases.
- 9. A new deposit rate and terms of cancellation was implemented.

In closing we would like to thank Mrs. Louise Simone for the countless hours she devoted to the renovation of the hall. The new image of the hall has made it more attractive to prospective rentors. We would also like to thank the Building Advisory Committee for successfully accomplishing their duty, and assisting the Parish Council to improve the management of our Church complex.

#### PLEDGE AND MEMBERSHIP

Due to the continually changing numbers of our pledge members it is difficult to arrive at a definite church membership number. However, during the year 1974 the figure was approximately 1000 pledges.

The minimum annual pledge remained \$130.00 per couple and \$65.00 per individual member.

Of the total pledges 452 were \$130.00 minimum or more, and 202 were \$65.00 the minimum per individual. The remaining members have pledged varying amounts below the minimum as their income allows.

Through the diligent efforts of the Pledge and Membership Committee only 24 pledges remain delinquent from 1973.

#### ANNUAL CHURCH PICNIC

The Fifteenth Annual Picnic of the St. John Armenian Church was held on the 21st of July, 1974, under the chairmanship of Mr. Dicron Tafralian. The picnic was held for the first time on the Church grounds and appeared to be a huge success. Shish kebab and pilaf were served from 12 noon until everyone was served. The highlights of entertainment included an Armenian band, and games for the children. The parishioners were able to mingle with one another and socialize within our own familiar surroundings. Hopefully we will be able to continue to have the picnic on our Church grounds year after year.

#### NEW YEAR'S EVE DINNER DANCE

The New Year's Eve gala celebration, under the chairmanship of Mitchell Choukourian, was a huge success with 449 people in attendance.

The cooperative spirit of the various committee members and Mrs. Helen Armoudlian, made this event the "super-party" that it was.

#### **CHURCH BAZAAR**

St. John's Church Bazaar was held on Friday, Saturday and Sunday, November 15, 16 and 17, 1974. Mr. Martin Cholakian was General Chairman.

Many Church organizations and individuals from the parish worked unselfishly to provide manpower and leadership to the numerous Bazaar projects.

Some of the special events of the weekend were, Paklava Tasting Contest, Car Raffle, and Photographic Exhibits featuring the works of Mr. Arthur Tcholakian.

The financial report is not completed yet but our Church treasury has already received the sum of \$23,990.08 as partial payment of the total profits.

The Pastors and Parish Council wish to extend their congratulations and appreciation to Mr. Martin Cholakian, General Chairman, and to each and every person on his committee who worked so diligently to make the Bazaar such a huge success.

#### ARMENIAN RIVERFRONT FESTIVAL

St. John's Armenian Church was invited by the City of Detroit for the fourth year to participate in the Riverfront Festival, on August 23, 24, 25, 1974. Armenian entertainment throughout the weekend coupled with the many booths featuring Armenian food, pastries, culture and handcraft items provided the formula to make this huge undertaking a rewarding experience. The Pastors and Parish Council wish to express their sincere appreciation to Mr. Leo Zamanigian, St. John's General Chairman, and to his entire committee who worked diligently throughout the summer to make the Festival a financial success.

#### SOUTHFIELD ARTS FESTIVAL

The Women's Guild participated in the Southfield Arts Festival which was held on May 17-19, 1974. Under the chairmanship of Mrs. Margaret Derderian and leader Mrs. Silva Sahakian, the Guild members prepared and sold a variety of delicious Armenian baked goods.

The women are to be commended for their dedication. They remained in their open-air, outdoor booth despite the discomforts of the cold, rainy weather, demonstrating our Church's steadfast presence in the community.

#### WAYNE STATE UNIVERSITY ARMENIAN STUDIES PROGRAM

On June 6, 1974, President George Gullen of Wayne State University hosted a dinner reception for representatives of the various ethnic groups interested in decorating a room in the Language and Speech Building according to their National tradition. President Gullen informed the guests in detail about the progress made thus far.

During the past year, Wayne State University renamed the new Language and Speech Building the Alex Manoogian Language and Speech Building. Through Mr. Manoogian's generosity, moreover, a large auditorium-room will be decorated as the Armenian ethnic room.

Invited from Armenia, Dr. Kevork Kherlopian will serve as a visiting professor on the Armenian Studies Program. Adjunct-Professor R. P. Rubyan will continue to serve as an instructor of the Program.

St. John's Church is one of the organizations which support the Armenian Studies Program at Wayne State University.

#### MARTYRS' DAY OBSERVANCE

The 59th Anniversary of the Armenian Genocide was appropriately observed at St. John's on Sunday, April 21, 1974, with a dinner and solemn program immediately following the Church Services.

The dinner was prepared by the Ladies' Auxiliary and the Women's Guild, and was served by the ACYOA Seniors and Juniors.

Mr. Richard Norsigian was the Master of Ceremonies and the speakers were The Very Rev. Fr. Paren Avedikian and Mr. Yervant Azadian.

The musical portion of the program was presented by the Komitas Choir of St. John's. At the conclusion of the program many of those attending sent pre-prepared letters to appropriate dignitaries of the United Nations urging them to adopt the findings of Human Rights Commission regarding genocide.

#### YOUTH SPORTS ACTIVITIES

Our sports activities covered all phases of our youth last year. The Basketball program covered boys from 9 to 18 years and girls 12 to 18 years in our own Basketball League. The ACYOA also participated in various sports activities under the direction of the Diocese.

We have established an Athletic Fund which will subsidize all areas of sports. The Pastors and Parish Council wish to express their appreciation to all devout parishioners who so generously donated their time to make our Youth Sports Activities Program a success. Our special thanks to the Armenian-American Veterans for the unlimited use of

their facilities.

#### THE TORCH BEARER, CHAHAGIR

Eleven issues of The Torch Bearer, Chahagir were published during 1974 (combined July-August issue). Activities and special events of both church and non-church affiliated organizations were reported.

Thanks to the cooperation of the reporters, we were able to maintain the monthly publication deadline which enabled us to report news and coming events on a current basis.

Effective December 31, 1974, the Editor of the Torch Bearer Miss Thelma Astourian has retired. Miss Astourian has been the Editor of our Church publication for the last three and a half years. Along with her Editorial Staff she has worked diligently to put forth an up to date and respectable Church publication. The Pastors and Parish Council extend their grateful appreciation to Miss Astourian and her Editorial Staff.

#### SENIOR CITIZEN'S BENEFITS

The Ladies' Auxiliary and the Parish Council held a special luncheon meeting to discuss benefits that are available to Senior Citizens. Mrs. Nvart Alexanian chaired the meeting and introduced experts from the Veterans Administration, Michigan Department of Treasury, Social Security, and Michigan Department of Social Services.

The subjects included food stamps, property tax credits, widow benefits and social security. The words of the experts were translated into Armenian by Father Paren. Questions from the floor were translated by Nerses Serkaian and Edward Korkoian.

The area of senior benefits is one which the Church hopes to expand in the future. The coordinator of the program was Mr. Carl Varadian.

#### ST. NERSESS SEMINARIANS VISIT TO DETROIT

The Pastors and the Parish Council express their gratitude to Mr. Arthur Tcholakian and our Diocese for providing our community the pleasure of this Exhibit.



We have many things to report, which took place during the past year. The redecorating of the Cultural Hall has been completed. Contracts have been let for the air conditioning of the church, which is now being installed, with the project being handled by Daniel Shahan.

The history of the Apostolic Society has been completed and is now in the possession of George Keurajian for printing.

Also during 1974, we received the amount of \$12,000.00 in final payment for our Oakman Boulevard properties. The balance of our land contract with the State of Michigan for the property we purchased at the north end of the church, about one and one-half acres, has been completely paid off. At the end of the year, we had a balance in our bank account of approximately \$70,000.00.

Under the heading of new business, the following proposals were made and discussed:

- 1. The purchase of a suitable home for the Very Rev. Paren Avedikian. The assignment of finding a suitable home for him was given to the Parish Council.
- 2. Now that the interior of our Cultural Building has been redecorated, we decided that the outside of the building must be repaired and repainted. This project will be done in the spring.
- 3. The library will be redecorated, and new draperies will be installed in all classrooms, as well as in the library. The Parish Council was assigned this project.
- 4. The need for additional trees on our property for shade and beauty was recommended and very favorably accepted.
- 5. Suggestions were proposed for changes in the office of the secretary, as she cannot see people as they enter, and there also is a need for a reception room for guests. This requires substantial revisions, however, and is being carefully studied.
- 6. It was recommended that the Apostolic Society take over the responsibility for the design and installation of a commemorative statue.
- 7. Suggestions were made to buy or build an apartment building for our senior citizens. This, of course, is a major project and will be given serious consideration.

Your President was very pleased with the fine attendance at the meeting, the interest and enthusiasm of all the members, and their many ideas and suggestions.

#### IMPORTANT NOTICE

#### RULES AND REGULATIONS CONCERNING CHURCH MEMBERSHIP

- "5. All persons who have been baptized and confirmed in the Armenian Church, who accept its doctrine, canons and rites, and who fulfill their obligations to the church and community, shall be members in good standing of the Parish Church and shall constitute the Parish Assembly.
- "6. Every member of the Parish, 18 years of age or over, shall pay to his (or her) church an annual due, the amount of which shall be determined by the Diocesan Assembly. Such amount may be increased, but not decreased, by the Parish Assembly.
- "7. Members in good standing of a Parish Church, who are 18 years of age or over, may participate in the assemblies of the same parish and may vote, provided that at least six months have elapsed since the date of their registration as members of the parish and their dues have been paid. They may be eligible for office one year after becoming members.
- "8. Members who fail to pay their dues for one or more years, automatically forfeit their right to vote at Parish Assemblies or to hold elective office within the parish. Such members may reinstate these rights by payment of their dues in arrears for at least the previous two years."

#### RULES AND REGULATIONS GOVERNING PARISH ASSEMBLY

- "16..... The Agenda of the Parish Assembly shall be prepared by the Parish Priest and the Parish Council. Other matters of new business may be added by majority vote of the Parish Assembly.
- "17. At Parish Assemblies the presence of a minimum of one-third of the eligible voting membership or fifty members shall constitute a quorum, and decisions shall be rendered by majority vote of members present and voting.
- "22. In a Parish Assembly each member shall be entitled to one vote which is not transferable and must be cast in person. In case of a tie vote the presiding officer shall cast the deciding vote or he shall authorize a second balloting upon the same question."
