RULES AND REGULATIONS CONCERNING CHURCH MEMBERSHIP

- "5. All persons who have been baptized and confirmed in the Armenian Church, who accept its doctrine, canons and rites, and who fulfill their obligations to the church and community, shall be members in good standing of the Parish Church and shall constitute the Parish Assembly.
- 6. Every member of the Parish, 18 years of age or over, shall pay to his (or her) church an annual due, the amount of which shall be determined by the Diocesan Assembly. Such amount may be increased, but not decreased by the Parish Assembly.
- 7. Members in good standing of a Parish Church, who are 18 years of age or over, may participate in the assemblies of the same parish and may vote, provided that at least six months have elapsed since the date of their registration as members of the parish and their dues have been paid. They may be eligible for office one year after becoming members, provided they have attained the age of 21.
- 8. Members who fail to pay their dues for one or more years, automatically forfeit their right to vote at Parish Assemblies or to hold elective office within the parish. Such members may reinstate these rights by payment of their dues in arrears for at least the previous two years."

RULES AND REGULATIONS GOVERNING PARISH ASSEMBLY

- "16. The Agenda of the Parish Assembly shall be prepared by the Parish Priest and the Parish Council. Other matters of new business may be added by majority vote of the Parish Assembly.
 - 17. At Parish Assemblies the presence of a minimum of one-third of the eligible voting membership or fifty members shall constitute a quorum, and decisions shall be rendered by majority vote of members present and voting.
- 22. In a Parish Assembly each member shall be entitled to one vote which is not transferable and must be cast in person. In case of a tie vote the presiding officer shall cast the deciding vote or he shall authorize a second balloting upon the same question."

PASTOR'S REPORT

Dear Parishioners:

With the grace and mercy of God, we, the members of St. John's Armenian Church Community, have spent another year under the shadow of our Holy Mother Church. I am grateful to God for the opportunity to serve St. John's Church for another year. I did my human utmost to serve St. John's without sparing the graces which the Lord God has bestowed upon me.

Worship Service

Divine Liturgy was celebrated, and Armenian and English sermons were delivered every Sunday and at all other occasions of the Church calendar. Services were also offered during the week according to the requirements of our Church traditions.

Addition to Pastoral Staff

Very Rev. Fr. Papken Anoushian arrived in Detroit on March 8, 1979 as an undergraduate student at Wayne State University by arrangement of His Beautitude, Archbishop Yeghishe Derderian, Armenian Patriarch of Jerusalem and Mr. Alex Manoogian. With the consent of our Diocesan Primate, His Eminence, Archbishop Torkom Manoogian, Father Papken has joined our Pastoral Staff with limited responsibilities. Father Papken celebrated his first Divine Liturgy at St. John's on March 18, and was formally introduced to the parishioners following Church Services with a Tea in his honor. Since then, Father Papken has conscientiously attended to his duties at St. John's.

Sacraments and Rites

During 1979, the following Sacraments and Rites were officiated: Baptism and Confirmation of infants and adults (66); Engagement Services (7); Holy Matrimony (40); and Funeral Services (64).

Acknowledgements of Services

The following clergymen celebrated the Divine Liturgy and preached, or were present at our Church Services in connection with their visits to Detroit in 1979: The Most Rev. Archbishop Sion Manoogian, the Chairman of the Supreme Spiritual Council of Holy Etchmiadsin; The Most Rev. Archbishop Shahe Ajemian, the Chancellor of the Armenian Patriarchate of Jerusalem; The Most Rev. Dr. Paulos Mar Gregorius, the Metropolitan of the Malankara (Malabar) Church of Delhi, India; His Grace, Bishop Papken Varjabedian, the Diocesan Legate in Washington, D.C.; His Grace, Bishop Arsen Berberian, the Chancellor of the Holy Mother See of Holy Etchmiadsin; The Very Rev. Fr. Zaven Arzoumanian, the Pastor of St. Sahag and St. Mesrob Church of Wynnewood, Pa.; The Very Rev. Fr. Vosgan Kalpakian, the Primate of the Armenian Church of Damascus, Syria; The Very Rev. Fr. Vartan Dilanian from Holy Etchmiadsin, the Representative of His Holiness to the Diocesan Clergy Conference; The Very Rev. Fr. Khajag Barsamian, the Canon Sacrist of St. Vartan Cathedral in New York; The Very Rev. Father Haigazoun Melkonian, the Pastor of St. Gregory the Illuminator Church of Haverhill, Mass.; The Rev. Fr. Diran Papazian, the Pastor of St. Gregory of Narek Church of Cleveland, Ohio; The Rev. Fr. Khosrof Assadourian, the Pastor of St. George Church of Hartford, Conn.; and The Rev. Fr. Yeghishe Bagramian from Holy Etchmiadsin, the Representative of His Holiness to the Diocesan Clergy Conference.

On behalf of our Church, I extend my appreciation to our Church hierarchs and her dedicated servants for the opportunity of praying and exalting the Lord together at St. John's. It is my duty also, at this time, to thank Deacon Levon Zenian for his sermons on two Sundays during 1979.

In connection with the worship service of our Church, it is my duty and privilege to thank each and every member of our Komitas Choir, and the Deacons of our Church for their dedication and service to our Church and her worshiping congregation. Again, it is my pleasure to acknowledge, specifically, two individuals from our Choir who worked diligently during the past year to make our services dignified and inspiring: Deacon Ara Haig, Choirmaster; and Miss Michele Menoian, Organist. During the officiation of the Sacraments and Rites of our Church, Deacons Harry Ekizian, Ara Haig, Daniel Shahan, John Semizian, Michael Ohanesian, Mihran Hoplamazian, Richard Norsigian, and Hagop Asadurian have assisted us as often as possible and we thank them for their concern for the dignity of our Sacramental Services. Again we must state here that we are in need of a deacon upon whose assistance we can rely regularly for our Sacraments and Rites.

Pastoral Visitations

Hospital visitations, nursing home visitations to the sick and elderly, home visitations to the shut-ins, home visitations for consolation, home blessings, visitations with the families of the Parish in connection with Sacraments and for various other reasons have been attended to by myself and Father Papken Anoushian to the utmost of our ability. I would like, at this time, to remind our parishioners again to inform the Church Office directly when the services of a clergyman are needed.

Religious Educational Programs

In 1979, Mrs. Zabel Atesian has conducted a successful Bible Study Class for interested parishioners. Also, Mr. Martin Cholakian has continued to offer Adult Church School Classes under the sponsorship of St. John's Church School. We express our gratitude both to Mrs. Atesian and Mr. Cholakian for their commendable efforts in these areas, and hope that more of our parishioners will choose to take advantage of these religious educational classes.

Administrative Duties

My administrative responsibilities during the past twelve months have included office work and management, Parish Council and Church Auxiliary Organizations' general body and committee meetings, attendance and participation in organizational functions, promotion of educational and cultural programs, coordination of Church organizations; fund raising, and involvement in the various aspects of the building and expansion program.

Publications

During the past year, I have continued to follow closely and to offer my time and advice to the Editor of our Church monthly publication. I take this opportunity to thank the Editorial Staff and, particularly, the Editor of the Torch Bearer, Mrs. Gloria Mikaelian, for the commendable service she renders to our Church in connection with this publication.

Special Features of 1979

Our parishioners were called upon for the third time in recent years to come to the aid of our brothers and sisters in Lebanon. Realizing the plight of their brethren, our community raised \$118,887.14 adhering to the Appeal of the Joint Committee of St. John's Armenian Church and the Armenian General Benevolent Union. This magnificient response again demonstrates the Christian spirit of giving which is the mark of our wonderful community. I extend my heartfelt appreciation in this regard to Mr. Martin Apkarian who served with me as the Co-Chairman of this Fund-Raising Committee.

In 1979, the Armenian Apostolic Society, under the leadership Mr. Alex Manoogian and Mr. Edward Mardigian, embarked upon the much needed and long-awaited Building Expansion Project. Through the guidance of General Chairman Daniel Shahan, the project will include a magnificent museum, an extensive library, a youth center with a regulation size gymnasium, and renovation of the present facilities of the Church Cultural Building. Pledges of approximately one and a half million dollars made during the first two fundraising banquets demonstrated the tremendous support of our community for this project, proving our willingness to sacrifice for the preservation of our faith and ancestral heritage. At this time, I thank all of the donors who thus far responded to our appeals and made substantial contributions for the success of our goals. But before us still lies the challenge to raise the remaining one million dollars needed to complete the fund-raising for this project. I strongly urge our parishioners and friends who have not yet pledged an amount, to be generous in their donations.

Ackowledgements of Committees

With deep gratitude I would like to extend my appreciation to St. John's Parish Council Building Committee, Chairman Mr. Armen Hovnanian; the Bazaar '79 Diocesan Delegates Committee, Chairman, Arthur Mardigian; Bingo Committee, Chairman Vahe Papelian; and to each and every member of these committees for their dedication and hard labor to improve the financial position of St. John's. Without their imaginative contributions, the resources of our Church would have fallen short of their growing needs.

Recommendations and Acknowledgements

The pledged membership of St. John's Armenian Church increased by 10% during the later months of 1979 as a result of the vigorous campaign launched by the Membership Committee. Although this is a significant increase, I must state my disappointment that a great number of individuals who are members of St. John's family have not yet chosen to make a pledge commitment to our Church. As individuals who have been baptized in the Armenian Church it is their duty to assume their share of responsibility for the Armenian Church through a pledge commitment to St. John's. But I am hopeful that in the next few years through various means, and the support of our present members, we will increase our membership to our Church's maximum potential. In connection with the membership drive, I commend the Membership Committee, Chairman Mr. Arthur Apkarian for pursuing their objective during the past year, and hope that their continuing efforts during the coming years will be as fruitful as the last year.

The Challenge And The Opportunity Facing Us In The New Year

The challenge facing our parishioners in the New Year is the renovation and expansion of St. John's facilities. We know and we hear the reservations that some of our parishioners have regarding the expansion project which we have embarked upon. The concerns of these parishioners were our concerns, as well, and we would not have guided them in the direction we have thus far, had it not been for the trust we have in the leaders of our Parish and their ability to see to it that provisions are made. With confidence, we must face the challenge ahead, and be deserving of the privileges being offered to us, the parishioners of St. John's.

In 1980 our Parish will have the honor to receive a pontifical visitation by His Holiness, Vazken I, Supreme Patriarch and Catholicos of All Armenians. His Holiness will again grace St. John's with His presence in June, 1980. This will be the third visit of His Holiness to America and to Detroit, long overdue, since His last visit took place twelve years ago in 1968. We hope to be able to extend a warm welcome to His Holiness with the help and the participation of our parishioners and be worthy of the blessings of His Holiness and in turn stregnthen His Holiness with the knowledge and trust that His flock in Detroit is alive and well and prospering both spiritually and materially.

Appreciation and Conclusion

I take this opportunity to express my heartfelt gratitude and appreciation to the members of the Parish Council and their Chairman, Richard Apkarian; our Church Bodies; Auxiliary Organizations; Standing Committees; as well as to individual parishioners, for their cooperation, services, and sacrifices which enabled our Church to conclude another fruitful year. The accomplishments and the success of our Church are their pride and fulfillment. I pray that God will bless each and every one abundantly, both in their homes and businesses. May the Lord God also give us guidance and perserverance to continue our good works.

Nineteen seventy-nine ends yet another successful year for St. John's Armenian Church. But, most important, 1979 is also the end of a decade of accomplishments for St. John's. Both throughout the decade and during the year, our Church has endeavored to perpetuate and rekindle the Armenian religion and cultural heritage in the lives of its people. Under the leadership of our Pastor, the Very Rev. Fr. Paren Avedikian, many goals were attained. I would like to take this opportunity to thank our Pastor for his untiring efforts and his motivating qualities which have contributed to the successful accomplishments of our Church. Also, I would like to thank all Parish Council members who have worked toward the goals of our Church in a dedicated manner.

During 1979 we have instituted several new committees which have created new possibilities and new sources of revenue for our Church. The New Membership Committee, under the leadership of Arthur Apkarian, has worked to fulfill our commitment to the Parish Assembly of increasing our pledged membership. St. John's Fund Raising Committee, coordinated by Helen Bagdasarian, was established to assist St. John's in fulfilling its commitment of \$200,000 pledged to the Armenian Apostolic Society for our building expansion project. The Committee is on its way to a meaningful attempt to raise these funds. We extend our heartfelt appreciation to both Committees for their accomplishments.

In 1979 we have successfully computerized an extensive mailing list which includes both pledged members and non-members of our Church and the Church Organizations. We express our thanks to Helen Armoudlian, Rose Boudakian, and Lucy Ardash for their assistance in compiling this expanded list. At this time, we have installed a computer terminal in our Church for more efficient and economical service to the community.

After several months of negotiations between the Armenian-American Veterans, the Armenian Apostolic Society, and St. John's Armenian Church, an agreement was consumated for St. John's Armenian Church to operate the Armenian-American Veterans' facilities. These facilities will be operated with the same care and cleanliness as our Church Cultural Building; the Parish Council has already made provisions for this purpose.

Our neighborhood development program has continued to serve our parishioners. We are happy to announce that two parishioners have received assistance in purchasing homes in our surrounding area.

The new decade should prove even more challenging to our Church due to the upcoming program to expand our facilities. We must join together and accomplish this project with enthusiasm and financial support. Not all of our parishioners are in support of all aspects of this project, but we are certain each of them approve at least some of the phases of the project; for this reason, we must all work together in order to accomplish the total goal for the continued growth and enrichment of our community. We thank the Armenian Apostolic Society for their foresight and dedication to our community, under the leadership of Mr. Alex Manoogian and Mr. Edward Mardigian.

The Parish Council would like to recognize a few individuals and committees who have contributed to the success of our Church throughout the year; Mr. Vahe Papelian and his Bingo Committee, Mr. Armen Hovnanian and Ms. Helen Bagdasarian and the Building committee, Mr. Arthur Mardigian and the Diocesan Delegates for the chairmanship and coordination of Bazaar 1979, the Heritage Collection Committee, Mr. George Mugerian for his legal services, Mr. Dick Simonian for his accounting services, and Mrs. Gloria Mikaelian and her staff of the Torch Bearer. Also at this time, we would like to thank our Church organizations, Church deacons, choir, and Church service organizations for their outstanding dedication throughout the past year.

PARISH COUNCIL MEETINGS

During 1979, the Parish Council held 23 regular meetings and 4 special meetings. The special meetings were held in conjunction with the Nominating Committee, the Diocesan Delegates, the election of the Parish Council executive body, and with the Diocesan Delegates and Alternates regarding the 1979 Diocesan Assembly proposals.

Throughout the year the Council has also held meetings with the auditor, Apostolic Society and various other committees concerning Church matters.

SPECIAL PARISH ASSEMBLIES

The St. John's Parish Council called a Special Parish Assembly on Tuesday, April 30, 1979, which was attended by 43 members. The members gave direction to St. John's delegates regarding issues on the agenda of the 1979 Diocesan Assembly.

Again on Tuesday, June 5, 1979, a Special Parish Assembly convened with 95 members in attendance. Plans for the expansion and renovation of the Church Cultural Center were presented to the members by the Apostolic Society for their approval. A pledge of \$200,000 on behalf of St. John's Armenian Church was voted upon and approved by the members.

PLEDGE REPORT

The minimum pledge per annum remained at \$78.00 per individual member and

\$156.00 per couple in 1979. The year began with a membership of 1011 and ended with 1135 pledged members. Out of the total membership 664 pay the minimum pledge, 295 pay under the minimum, and 176 pay over the minimum.

We would like to bring to the attention of our parishioners that it is the privilege of senior citizens and students to make less than the minimum pledge to the Church. All those who are gainfully employed are expected to abide by the decision of the Parish Assembly. As our Pastor indicated previously St. John's is assessed \$36.00 a year by the Diocese for each pledged member. In addition, the added costs related to membership privileges create an out-of-pocket expense for our Church of \$15.00 a year per member. It is obvious from these figures that it is the duty of each member to pledge no less than the minimum.

We take this opportunity to thank Mrs. Rose Boudakian for her efficient management of the pledge system of our Church and urge our parishioners to consult with her when and if questions or problems arise regarding their pledges.

NEW MEMBERSHIP COMMITTEE

The expanded Membership Committee under the Chairmanship of Arthur Apkarian, presented two receptions and extended nine hundred invitations to potential pledged members of our Church. As a result of these efforts, we have gained 86 pledged members in 1979 and 19 pledged members, thus far, for 1980. Co-ordinators of the on-going committee are Lucy Ardash, Alice Derderian, and Margie Simonian. Members of the committee are the following: Arlene Baylerian, Mary Cholmakjian, Margaret Derderian, Marianne Hovespian, Edward Karamanian, Stephen and Shnorig Karougian, Barbara Norsigian and Robert Simonian.

The Committee intends to pursue recruitment of new pledged members of St. John's in 1980 by trying new methods.

THE TORCH BEARER (CHAHAGIR)

Eleven issues of the Torch Bearer (Chahagir) were published during 1979. (Combined July and August issue.)

We were able to maintain the monthly publication deadline with the cooperation of the reporters who assisted us in reporting the news and coming events on a current basis.

The Pastor and Parish Council extend their gratitude to the Editor, Mrs. Gloria Mikaelian, and the Editorial Staff of the Torch Bearer for their dedicated services enabling us to maintain the quality of our Church publication.

YOUTH SPORTS ACTIVITIES

Our Youth Sports Program was active again in 1979. The Church sponsored Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday evening basketball programs attracted girls and boys ages 9-18 years of age. The evening program introduced the youth to basketball skills, team play and the excitement of competitive sports. This program began in October with a clinic session and proceeded to team play in mid-March. Steming from the Church program a number of boys and girls were put on special teams to compete in the OYAA Orthodox Youth Athletic Association Basketball League. OYAA league games were held on Saturdays and Sundays from December through March. Following the league session our teams competed in the OYAA sponsored tournament on March 5, 6, 7.

Our baseball teams also competed in the OYAA sponsored games and tournament in June and July. This past summer we witnessed what could become an annual event, Track & Field. A.C.Y.O.A. and A.Y.F. decided to participate in track & field competition. The 60 athletes ranging from 12-50 years of age competed in a wide range of events.

The basketball program along with the summer baseball program has historically provided recreational as well as social outlets for our youth. However, in recent years participation has declined. Our present facilities were adequate in the past, but today's youth possess greater ability and resources than ever before, and search for a variety of activities. The Church Community recognizes the need for improved facilities and it is our hope that with parent encouragement our programs will attract a larger segment of our youth in the coming years.

The Sports Committee has done an outstanding job in the overall program of our Youth Sport Activities. The Pastor and Parish Council wish to express their appreciation to all of those who so generously donated their time to make our Youth Sports Activities Program a success.

SENIOR CITIZENS DAY

St. John's continued its program for Senior Citizens during 1979. The second Tuesday of every month is Senior Citizens Day at St. John's Cultural Hall, where lunch is served and an appropriate program for Senior Citizens is presented. Following the program there is ample time for fellowship among those who attend. A special Thanksgiving treat was given the Senior Citizens at their November luncheon, and in December the group was entertained at a Christmas Party on their luncheon day.

St. John's Armenian Church subsidizes the lunch charging only a minimal amount. Mr. Leo Zamanigian, Parish Council member, is present every month at these luncheons to assist our Senior Citizens in every way possible.

Throughout the year Mr. Homer Lafian has voluntarily assumed the responsibility of arranging for speakers for which St. John's and the Senior Citizens are grateful.

SENIOR CITIZENS COMPLEX

In July, 1979, a Senior Citizens Complex Feasibility Study Committee was formed to investigate and study the needs, regulations and possibility of this project. The Committee has already extensively reviewed the situation with noted experts in the community as well as government personnel.

Available parcels of land in Southfield are being analyzed for suitability.

ST. JOHN'S BUILDING FUND RAISING COMMITTEE

A special Fund Raising Committee was established in 1979 by the Parish Council, the purpose of which is to assist the Parish Council in raising funds to meet the Parish Council commitment of \$200,000 for the expansion of the St. John's Cultural Complex. The Committee is enthusiastically working toward their goal. Three projects are in the working: Trip-a-Month, \$75.00 per ticket, first drawing starting in March, 1980; Gourmet Dinner, September 21, 1980; Movie Preview, 1980. The Committee consists of Dr. & Mrs. Michael Armoudlain, Mr. & Mrs. Howard Atesian, Miss Helen Bagdasarian, Mr. & Mrs. Paul Jingozian, Miss Mary Ann Karakashian, Mr. & Mrs. Edward Mardigian, Jr., Mr. & Mrs. Norman Messelian, Mr. & Mrs. Richard Norsigian, Dr. & Mrs. Gary Zamanigian.

THE HERITAGE COLLECTION

During 1979, The Armenian Heritage Collection was presented in Los Angeles in February under the sponsorship of St. James Armenian Church; in Montreal in March, sponsored by the A.G.B.U. School; and on two successive days in Boston sponsored by St. James and Holy Trinity Armenian Churches. The Collection was taken to the three cities by Varsenick Apkarian, Anoush Papelian, and Sona Yavruian. Prior to these presentations, the script was re-edited by the Committee and was rerecorded with the assistance of Ara Berberian, Simon Javizian and Charlene Apigian.

It is difficult to relate in a few words the enthusiasm and new amazement with which the Collection was viewed on each occasion. The Detroit Community was acclaimed for having the inventiveness to develop the Collection.

The Heritage Collection Committee members are: Honorary Chairman, The Very Reverend Father Paren Avedikian; members: Varsenick Apkarian, Margaret Derderian, Rosemary Hoplamazian, Anounsh Papelian, and Sona Yavruian.

ARMENIAN ARTIFACTS

Guided tours of St. John's Museum were provided in 1979 to Church Auxiliary Organizations, community organizations, student groups, visiting groups, and visiting Armenian and non-Armenian dignitaries.

Featured articles of interest and ancient relics from the Armenian past continue to arouse curiosity and create a sense of pride in our heritage.

During the year nine new acquisitions have enriched the Museum which houses the largest collection of Armenian artifacts in this country.

BUILDING REPORT, 1979

During 1979, the Church Cultural Building continued to be used by the Church, Church Organizations, non-Church Organizations of the community, and for rental purposes by individual Church members and the general public. The major improvements for the year 1979 were the installation of a new lighting system in the Church parking lot and new lighting fixutres for the Church dome. During 1979 extensive study of the public address system, both in the Cultural Hall and Church Sanctuary was initiated. Also, an analysis of the condition of the Church portico was conducted and resulted in the decision to repair it completely in 1980. In order to maintain the maximum efficiency of our mechanical equipment, a Building Maintenance Committee was established to recommend a preventive maintenance program to the Parish Council. The Committee was charged with the following responsibilities: (a) To report to the Parish Council on the present condition of the equipment, (b) To prepare a schedule and to designate the method of servicing the equipment by our custodial staff, and (c) To seek and recommend firms for contracting maintenance services including periodic inspection. Normal maintenance will continue to be handled by the custodial staff of the building. On behalf of the Building Committee of the Parish Council, Ashod Torosian is the Co-Ordinator of the Building Maintenance Committee. Members of the Committee are Leo Boodakian, Sooren Gozmanian, Nick Mikaelian, Noray Sarkisian, and Walter Stubenrach.

With the concurrence of the 1979 Parish Assembly, St. John's assumed total responsibility for the Armenian American Veterans Building in 1979. Since then the building has received a thorough cleaning and the Parish Council has hired one additional custodian to insure the proper care of the building. The Veterans Building lighting system also was improved or changed completely where necessary.

We have received repeat and referral customers throughout 1979, and through more efficient cost recovery policies we have increased our hall operating income by 21.1% over 1978.

The Parish Council has continued to pass the bulk of the burden of the Church Cultural Building operation to the outside rentors of the Church Hall in order to be able to provide the Church facilities to our Church Organizations, Church members, and the non-Church Organizations within our community at a minimal rental basis.

The preceding tables indicate that out of 156 weekend days the Hall was not in use for 37 days. In 1979 the Church Organizations used the Hall 12.6% of the total weekend days used while paying, aside from their assessments, only 3.5% of the income; the Armenian Organizations used the Hall for 11.8% of the total weekend days used while paying 4.6% of the income; the parishioners used the Hall 22.7% of the total weekend days used and paid 24.4% of the income; the outsiders used the Hall 52.9% of the total weekend days used days used and paid 67.5% of the total income of the Hall.

We would like to express our appreciation to Mrs. Helen Armoudlian, and Mr. Nerses Markarian for their management of the various aspects of the Church Cultural Building facilities.

BINGO REPORT

For the seventh year a dedicated group of parishioners, under the chairmanship of Vahe Papelian, has continued to work on the Bingo Program. Every Thursday of the year two to three hundred persons attend the excellent Bingo game offered by St. John's. The executive committee of the Bingo consists of: Vahe Papelian, Arthur Boudakian, Tom Hanesian and Sooran Yavruian.

The following people work at Bingo regularly: Paul Bazigian, Rose Boudakian, Emma Hovsepian, Anoush Papelian, Sona Yavruian, and Judy Yousoufian.

The following people work at least once a month: Emma Betrosian, Anjel Brown, Mary Cholmakjian, Nicholas Evarian, Lucy Fundukian, Judy Hovnan, Mary Ann Karakashian, Andrew Kasper, Arthur Mardigian, Donna Mariana, Sarkis Samarian, Lucille Sherman, Dick Tafralian, Sue Tafralian, Harry Tokatlian, Ashod Torosian and Ida Varadian.

The Pastor and Parish Council are grateful to these dedicated parishioners who, year after year, give of their time to make this fund raising program a huge success.

NEIGHBORHOOD DEVELOPMENT

During 1979, a loan amounting to \$10,000 each was provided to two parishioners. A total of five parishioners now have been provided monies to purchase homes in the Magnolia Subdivision. This has been accomplished under the Neighborhood Development Program.

SOCIAL CONCERN FUND

During 1979, St. John's Social Concern Fund has helped various individuals or families who either have sought assistance from the Church or about whose predicament the Church was made aware of. The total contribution of the Church for the year 1979 was \$3,810.00.

RELIEF FUND FOR ARMENIANS OF LEBANON

For the third time in recent years, our Community raised funds for the Armenians of Lebanon. As in the two previous fund raisings, St. John's Armenian Church and A.G.B.U. jointly sponsored the Fund-Raising Drive, under the co-chairmanship of Father Paren Avedikian and Martin Apkarian. In conjunction with the 1979 Drive, two functions were held; the first, was a dinner hosted by Mr. & Mrs. Alex Manoogian at the Renaissance Center which was attended by approximately sixty individuals. The second affair took place at the St. John's Church Cultural Building and was attended by 150 people. Our community known throughout the Diaspora for its charitable spirit, contributed a total of \$118,887.14 through the two fund-raising dinners.

We take this opportunity to thank all those individuals who generously responded to the appeal.

FINE ARTS COMMITTEE

Reuben Nakian, one of the greatest sculptors of our time, was honored at a Champagne Reception on January 10, arranged by the Fine Arts Committee of St. John's Armenian Church, co-hosted by St. John's and the A.G.B.U. Alex Manoogian Cultural Fund.

"New York, Paris, Montreal" entitled the Art Exhibition and Sale of recent works of renowned artists Vava Sarkis Kachdurian, Krikor Norikian, and Arto Chakmakjian presented by the Fine Arts Committee on April 29 and 30.

Paris based artist Shant Avedissian exhibited thirty-two of his paintings in Detroit during a three day showing and sale August 12-14.

Bazaar '79 in November culminated the year's successful activities of the Fine Arts Committee under the Chairmanship of Dr. Garabed Belian, with an exhibition and sale of works by French-American artists. Professor Karlen Mooradian, Journalism Professor at Northwestern University gave a lecture and slide presentation on the life of Arshille Gorky Adoian the greatest American Armenian painter on August 14.

On October 23, St. John's Armenian Church and the A.G.B.U. Alex Manoogian Cultural Fund co-sponsored a program featuring Elvira Ouzounian, Coluratura Soprano and Razmig Tavoyan, Poet, guest artists from Armenia.

TEAS IN HONOR OF CHURCH DIGNITARIES

St. John's was honored to receive a visit from His Grace, The Most Reverend Archbishop Sion Manoogian, Chairman of the Supreme Spiritual Council of Holy Etchmiadsin, on Sunday, December 16, 1979. His Grace delivered the sermon in Church on that day, and shared his thoughts and informative explanations on Holy Etchmiadsin at a Tea tendered in his honor following Church Services. Mrs. Vicki Palaian chaired the Tea on behalf of the Women's Guild.

On Sunday, July 29, His Grace, Dr. Paulos Mar Gregorius, the Metropolitan of the Malankara (Malabar) Church of India, was a guest at our Church and delivered the sermon. Mrs. Julie Couyoumjian and Mrs. Sylvia Sahakian and their committees from the Women's Guild helped to prepare the trimmings of the dinner, co-ordinated the dining room arrangements and supervised the serving. The A.C.Y.O.A. Seniors and A.C.Y.O. Project Youth members served the dinner.

Professor Ronald Suny, a known scholar of Armenian History and presently on the Staff of Oberlin College, Oberlin Ohio, delivered the keynote address.

CHURCH PICNIC

The twentieth Annual Church Picnic was held on Sunday, July 16 on the Church grounds following Worship Services. Over 1000 people gathered to enjoy food, entertainment and fellowship.

Picnic Chairman Edward Korkoian worked diligently along with various Church organizations and individuals to make the event a very successful one.

The Pastor and Parish Council extend their thanks to the Chairman and to all who helped to ensure the success of the picnic.

CHURCH BAZAAR

Bazaar '79 was again a huge social and financial success. By now we are all familiar with the various events, exhibits and booths which make up the three days of hard work creating the opportunity for our parishioners to come together for fellowship, fun and friends.

The Church Bazaar is the largest project to be undertaken by our parish annually and involves a tremendous amount of work and requires the full cooperation of all the members of the Church and various Church Auxiliary Organizations. The rewards of being a part of such an undertaking are inherent in its results. Those who worked towards the success of Bazaar '79 undoubtedly not only reaped these rewards, but also helped to enhance a stronger bond of fellowship among parishioners.

The Pastor and the Parish Council wish to extend their appreciation to the Diocesan Delegates, the General Chairman, Arthur Mardigian and to every individual who gave of their time and talent to make this year's Bazaar a huge success.

AID TO CAMBODIAN REFUGEES

Vartanantz Armenian Church in Chelmsford, Mass. with a total of 100 registered clergy and delegates present. The Assembly was jointly hosted by Sts. Vartanantz Armenian Church, Chelmsford, Mass., St. Gregory the Illuminator Armenian Church, Haverhill, Mass. and Holy Cross Armenian Church, Lawrence, Mass. St. John's Armenian Church was represented by the following delegation:

The Assembly was presided over by His Eminence, Archbishop Torkom Manoogian, Diocesan Primate. Representatives of His Holiness Vazken I to the Assembly were the Very Rev. Fr. Vartan Dilanian and the Rev. Fr. Eghishe Bagramian.

SIGNIFICANT ASSEMBLY ACTIONS

- 1. Mr. Harry Terzian (St. John's, Southfield) was elected as the Chairman of the Assembly.
- 2. Fr. Paren Avedikian was re-elected to a four year term on the Diocesan Council.
- 3. Mrs. Louise Simone (St. John's, Southfield) was elected to a four year term on the Diocesan Council.
- 4. Fr. Mampre Kouzouian (Holy Trinity Church, Cambridge) was re-elected to a four year term on the Diocesan Council.
- 5. Mr. Kachadour Kazarian (St. Sahag & Mesrob Church, Providence) was elected to a four year term on the Diocesan Council.
- 6. Mr. Édward Chapian (Holy Martyrs, Bayside) was re-elected to a ten year term on the Diocesan Board of Trustees.
- 7. Messers Martin Cholakian, Mihran Hoplamazian and Simon Javizian were elected to a one year term on the Diocesan Nominating Committee.
- 8. Mr. Martin Cholakian was appointed as one of the three Parlimentarians for the Assembly.
- 9. Approved for the second time, an amendment to the by-laws (Article 14) submitted by the Church of Our Saviour, Worcester, Mass. limiting a Nominating Committee member's consecutive terms to a maximum of two years, and after the interim of one year, may be eligible for election again to the Nominating Committee.
- 10. Defeated a proposed by-laws amendment (Article 61) submitted by St. John's Armenian Church, Southfield, Michigan, to disenfranchise a Parish at the Diocesan Assembly for failing to pay their previous year's Diocesan assessments.
- 11. Defeated a proposal by-laws amendment (Article 146) submitted by the Church of Our Saviour, Worcester, Mass. limiting the consecutive terms of a Diocesan Delegate to two.
- 12. Referred to the Primate for his consideration, a proposal submitted by St. George Armenian Church, Waukegan, Illinois to add \$5,000.00 to the Diocesan budget for a feasibility study on establishing a correspondence school for the training of part-time priests.
- 13. Approved a proposal submitted by St. James Armenian Church, Watertown, Mass. establishing at least one Regional Conference every year in the various regions of the Diocese.
- 14. Defeated a proposal submitted by St. James Armenian Church, Watertown, Mass. requiring the Diocesan Council to remain within budgetary line items of the budget adopted by the Diocesan Assembly.
- 15. Defeated a proposal submitted by St. James Armenian Church, Watertown, Mass. requiring the Diocesan Council to append its annual financial report listing salaries paid to all persons on the Diocesan Staff.
- 16. Approved a proposal submitted by St. Thomas Armenian Church, Tenafly, N.J. that the Diocesan Assembly approve the current year's budget and a provisional budget for the following calendar year.
- 17. Adopted a budget for calendar year 1979 totaling \$884,000 including a \$150,000 expenditure for the Cathedral mortgage.

The Diocesan Assembly also passed resolutions in support of the Armenians in Lebanon and the Cambodian refugees.



e first time in several years in July, 1979, a special flyer complete with registration forms was sent to every home on our mailing list. The result was a terrible disappointment, as indicated in the statistical report above. Our enrollment is almost nil, particularly in comparison to the vast number of Armenians in our community. Even this enrollment, itself, is misleading since a larger percentage of it represents the number of students enrolled in the Armenian Dance classes. Because of the lack of response by the community, the suspension of the classes was considered. However, reason prevailed.

The number of students at the A.G.B.U. Alex Manoogian School indicates that all youngsters of our community are not being provided with an Armenian education. The potential of the community is obviously much larger. The St. John's Armenian School offers a convenience to parents who have not made a full commitment for an Armenian education. It is apparent that the community is not taking full advantage of the opportunity presented through St. John's Armenian School. We cannot resign ourselves to the conclusion that our community has lost complete interest in Armenian language instruction. We are open to suggestions from concerned parents.
