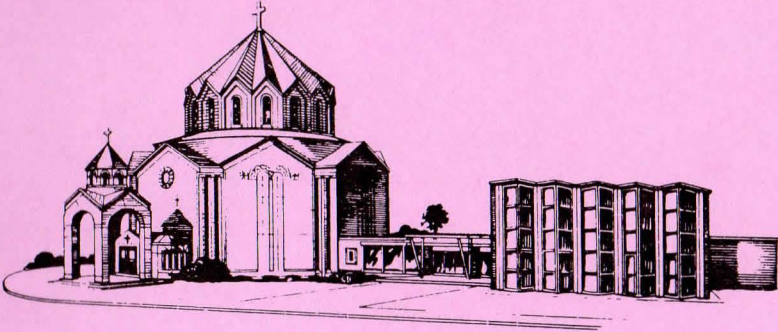

**RULES AND REGULATIONS  
CONCERNING CHURCH MEMBERSHIP**

- “5. All persons who have been baptized and confirmed in the Armenian Church, who accept its doctrine, canons and rites, and who fulfill their obligations to the church and community, shall be members in good standing of the Parish Church and shall constitute the Parish Assembly.
6. Every member of the Parish, 18 years of age or over, shall pay to his (or her) church an annual due, the amount of which shall be determined by the Diocesan Assembly. Such amount may be increased, but not decreased by the Parish Assembly.
7. Members in good standing of a Parish Church, who are 18 years of age or over, may participate in the assemblies of the same parish and may vote, provided that at least six months have elapsed since the date of their registration as members of the parish and their dues have been paid. They may be eligible for office one year after becoming members, provided they have attained the age of 21.
8. Members who fail their dues for one or more years, automatically forfeit their right to vote at Parish Assemblies or to hold elective office within the parish. Such members may reinstate these rights by payment of their dues in arrears for at least the previous two years.
9. No one may be a voting member in more than one parish at the same time.”

**RULES AND REGULATIONS  
GOVERNING PARISH ASSEMBLY**

- “16. The Agenda of the Parish Assembly shall be prepared by the Parish Priest and the Parish Council. Other matters of new business may be added by majority vote of the Parish Assembly.
17. At Parish Assemblies the presence of a minimum of one-third of the eligible voting membership or fifty members shall constitute a quorum, and decisions shall be rendered by majority vote of members present and voting.
22. In a Parish Assembly each member shall be entitled to one vote which is not transferable and must be cast in person. In case of a tie vote the presiding officer shall cast the deciding vote or he shall authorize a second balloting upon the same question.
43. The Parish Priest shall preside over the meeting of the Parish Council and the Parish Assembly.”

## PASTOR'S REPORT

Dear Parishioners:

With the grace and mercy of God, we the members of St. John's Armenian Church Community, have spent another year under the shadow of our Holy Mother Church. With a clear conscience, I declare that I did my human utmost in providing pastoral care and guidance to St. John's and her members, without sparing the graces which the Lord God has bestowed upon me. I am grateful to God for the opportunity to serve St. John's Armenian Church for another year.

### WORSHIP SERVICES

Up until December 3, 1989, the Rev. Fr. Haik Donikian, Assistant Pastor, and since then, the Very Rev. Fr. Samuel Aghoyan, Assistant Pastor have assisted me in the Church Services and in attending to the needs of our Church and Community.

Divine Liturgy was celebrated and Armenian and English sermons were delivered every Sunday. Services were also offered during the week in accordance with the requirements of our Church traditions.

### SACRAMENTS AND RITES

During 1989, the following Sacraments and Rites were officiated: Baptism and Confirmation of infants and adults, 82; Engagement Services, 13; Holy Matrimony, 37; Funeral Services, 58.

### PASTORAL VISITATIONS

Hospital visitations, nursing home visitations to the sick and elderly, home visitations for consolation, home blessings, visitations with families of the Parish in connection with Sacraments and for various other reasons have been attended to by myself and Fr. Haik Donikian and the Very Rev. Fr. Samuel Aghoyan conscientiously and to the utmost of our ability. I would like to remind our parishioners to inform the Church Office directly when the services of a clergyman are needed.

### ADMINISTRATIVE DUTIES

My administrative responsibilities during the past year have included office work and management, Parish Council and Church Auxiliary Organizations' general body and committee meetings, attendance and participation in organizational functions, promotion of educational and cultural programs, identification and description of artifacts for cataloguing purposes, coordination of Church organizations, St. John's Earthquake relief efforts; Armenia Watch Committee of Michigan, and fundraising.

Choirmaster; and Mrs. Michele Medley, Organist, who worked diligently during the past year to make our services dignified and inspiring.

During the officiation of the Sacraments and Rites of our Church, our Deacons and Altar Servers have assisted us as often as possible, and we thank them for their concern for the dignity of our Sacramental Services without expectation of remuneration, as they donate any gifts received to the Komitas Choir of St. John's. I also extend my appreciation to Mr. Mardiros Hatcherian for conscientiously carrying out the duties of the Sacristan, maintaining the beauty and decor of the sanctuary, both for our regular Church Services and for the Sacraments and Rites without remuneration.

We have come to rely upon all of the above annual fundraising projects. It is a concern of mine, as it should be the concern of each and every parishioner, that without the efforts of these committees, the resources of our Church would have fallen short of her needs.

## **SPECIAL FEATURES OF 1989**

St. John's celebrated its 58th Anniversary on Sunday, December 3, 1989, which was also designated as Family Worship Day, a newly established tradition. On this occasion, the Rev. Fr. Haik Donikian, who had served St. John's Armenian Church for almost ten years as Assistant Pastor, officiated his retirement Divine Liturgy, following which a Farewell Banquet was tendered in his honor with a great number of parishioners in attendance. We thank Fr. Haik for his years of service and wish him well in the coming years.

We were pleased to be able to find a new Assistant Pastor in the person of the Very Rev. Fr. Samuel Aghoyan, a dedicated priest with great enthusiasm for service.

As you are aware, St. John's Armenian Church immediately mobilized a number of community organizations and individuals on December 8, 1988 and formed the Armenia Earthquake Fund Committee which launched a massive relief effort for our brothers and sisters in Armenia who were overcome by the devastating earthquake which shattered our homeland.

On Sunday, January 15, we offered the 40th day Hokehankist prayers, culminating the official mourning period for the victims; however to this day we continue to grieve for the thousands who perished; the thousands of injured, and the hundreds of thousands left homeless. Throughout 1989 we strived to assist our people in various ways. St. John's Community raised approximately \$950,000 from December 8, 1988 - December 31, 1989. In addition, we dispatched two semi trailers of clothing, medical supplies and equipment to Pan Aviation in Florida which transported the relief supplies to Armenia. On Saturday, January 29, Governor James Blanchard and his staff sponsored, organized, promoted and entertained at a Caberet Concert for the benefit of the Armenia Earthquake Fund at Greektown's International Banquet Center. All proceeds in the amount of \$24,000.00 were donated to the Fund. Parishioners placed hundreds of Earthquake Fund Canisters in businesses throughout the Metropolitan Detroit area, thus far netting over \$8,000.00. St. John's Church School sponsored the Armenia Earthquake Walk-a-Thon on Sunday, April 9 which netted approximately \$12,000.00. On Wednesday, June 21, 1989, St. John's presented a check for \$900,000.00 to His Eminence, Archbishop Torkom Manoogian, earmarked for a Medical and Dental Clinic in Stepanavan, Armenia.

In view of an Azerbaijani imposed blockade of Armenia since late July, which gradually intensified and left our homeland almost without food, supplies, and fuel, we decided to call a meeting of all Detroit area Armenian Churches and organizations on September 27, 1989 which resulted in the formation of the "Armenia Watch Committee of Michigan" to keep our community abreast of developments in our motherland; to appeal wherever necessary with the objective of seeking assistance in resolving the problems facing our motherland; to pursue the reporting of events in Armenia in the general media; and to make corrections of same when necessary. Since the initial meeting, the Armenia Watch Committee has convened five meetings. Unfortunately, it has been successful only in soliciting 6000 letters to President George Bush with copies sent to Michigan Senators and Congressional delegations and important officers of the House of Representatives and Senate. Also approximately 2000 letters were sent to United Nations Secretary General, Javier Perez DeCuellar. After the initial success of the Committee, we have been bogged down with the issue of structure of the Committee. We are hopeful, however, in view of the new events in our homeland, we will rise above the stagnation and address the real issues facing our people.

## **CHALLENGES FACING US IN THE NEW YEAR**

This year, I've decided to be very brief in this area, simply because the challenges that I see for our community are not considered to be priorities for a good number of our membership. Looking back over the year 1989, I don't see any reason for jubilation in any of the areas which I had designated and noted as challenges at the beginning of 1989. Unfortunately what I see are parishioners whose sole concerns are their homes and their families, outside of which, there is no time to worship, no time for service, no willingness to sacrifice, and no commitment to life of



example. Our Community forgot Armenia, as it was so natural for the general American public to do. I'm tempted to republish my observations under "Challenges" of last year; a page and a half which I'm sure was not even read, let alone being met by parishioners. Let me give you one example. On Thursday, December 7, on the first anniversary of the Earthquake in Armenia, we invited the parish to join us in prayer, meditation, and recollection, without intent of a fundraiser, for those who perished, for those who survived the shattering experience of the earthquake. I was extremely disappointed that including the priests and the choir members, only 300 people took the time to join us. Maybe it would have been better to do away with the observance of the First Anniversary and continue with our weekly Bingo; at least we would have been able to raise \$1000.00 for the benefit of the earthquake survivors.

For whatever it is worth, briefly let me remind parishioners that we are prepared to observe in 1990, the 75th Anniversary of the Genocide of the Armenian People with challenges of denial facing us in the Administration of this country, the United States Congress, the Turkish diplomatic lobby, and scholarly circles. We must tell the story of the suffering and of the almost complete annihilation of our people through genocide; and as we are preparing to meet this challenge, we don't even have the assurance of the support and participation from our parishioners.

Do we dare to dream that in any way our people have the commitment to extend help, not only for the reconstruction of Armenia but also to send much needed supplies for the immediate relief of our compatriots. You see and you feel the pain and suffering which causes me to reflect upon the year past, and it leaves me with very little expectation to look ahead to the new year we have entered. A new prayer that I have come to practice in recent months is not only for the physical well being and prosperity of my parish, but also for guidance from above to recognize the challenge of being God's special people, with a special purpose in life.

## APPRECIATION AND CONCLUSION

I take this opportunity to express my heartfelt gratitude and appreciation to Rev. Fr. Haik Donikian and Very Rev. Fr. Samuel Aghoyan, to the members of the Parish Council, and especially the Chairman of the Parish Council, Mr. Vahram Fantazian, the Armenian Apostolic Society, Church Auxiliary Organizations and their Executive Bodies, Church Standing Committees, as well as to the individual parishioners for their cooperation, services and sacrifices.

At this time, I also extend my sincere gratitude to all those who contributed to the Cultural and Educational Endowment Fund established in my name on the occasion of the 25th anniversary of my ordination to the priesthood in 1985. The total of these contributions is \$69,251.90, for which I am deeply indebted to the donors.

I pray that God will bless each and every one of us abundantly. May the Lord God also give us guidance and perseverance to continue our good works.

Dear Parishioners:

Throughout this past year, the 58th Anniversary of St. John's Armenian Church, our parishioners' thoughts were with our brethren in Armenia who were involved with the tremendous rebuilding effort of the cities in the aftermath of the terrible earthquake that took thousands of lives and left thousands more orphans and homeless. The St. John's Church community, I am proud to say, responded with open hearts contributing material and financial aid. I wish to thank our parishioners who worked untiringly during this period and at the same time remind you that our aid must continue. As you may be aware, \$900,000.00, which was raised by the St. John's Church community, was given to the Diocese for earthquake relief. Because of the earthquake in Armenia, many parish activities were canceled resulting in a loss of substantial revenue; however, our priorities did lie with fund-raising efforts for Armenia.

It was a year that saw the reinstatement of the overnight camp for our youth at Camp Inisfree, located in Howell, Michigan. I believe that we must do all we can to keep our young people interested in our church. We must spend more time and, if necessary, use our financial resources to create programs for them. In this vain, I was elated to see the response of the parents of our church school students who are actively supporting and taking part in the efforts of the church school staff in giving quality CHRISTIAN education to our students. We must also encourage our young people to become active in the A.C.Y.O.A. and the A.C.Y.O. Jrs., and this must be a top priority item in the coming year. The future leaders of our community will come from these young people. We must not let them stray away.

As we start a new decade, we must look towards a renovation program for our church complex. Our facilities must be remodeled to keep up with the changing patterns of use. This must begin immediately. The members of St. John's Church organizations are to be commended for their efforts in supporting the church. It is through their cooperation and talents that keep us a dynamic and thriving parish.

I wish to acknowledge and thank our Deacons; Choirmaster and Choir Members; Church Organists; Church School Personnel; Ladies' Auxiliary; Women's Guild; A.C.Y.O.A. Seniors and Juniors; Men's Society; our secretaries, Mrs. Helen Armoudlian and Mrs. Rose Boudakian; and all the dedicated individuals who chaired our Bingo, Bazaar, Picnic and 1000 Club Raffle. I thank Reverend Father Haik Donikian for nearly ten years of dedicated service to our Parish and wish him many healthy years of retirement. He will be missed. I wish to warmly welcome our new Assistant Pastor, The Very Reverend Father Samuel Aghoyan, and wish him success in his new position. My thanks also to the members of the Parish Council for their support and dedication throughout this past year. Finally, I express to our Pastor, the Very Reverend Father Paren Avedikian, the gratitude of our Parishioners and myself for his guidance through the year and for his spiritual leadership and undaunted devotion to our Parish.

### **PARISH COUNCIL MEETINGS**

The Parish Council held 26 regular meetings. Throughout the year special meetings were held for the election of the Parish Council Executive Body, building policies, combined Parish Council and Diocesan Delegates, and Earthquake Committee.

The Council also held meetings with various other committees concerning Church projects and activities.

### **SPECIAL PARISH ASSEMBLIES**

The Parish Council called for a Pre-Diocesan Assembly on Tuesday, May 2, 1989. The issues of the 1989 Diocesan Assembly were reviewed and discussed.

The Post-Diocesan Assembly parish meeting took place on Tuesday, May 31, 1989, at which time the Diocesan Delegates reported on the decisions of the 87th Diocesan Assembly.

### **PLEDGE REPORT**

In accordance with the decision of the 1984 Parish Assembly, the minimum pledge of \$100.00 per individual member and \$200.00 per couple was in effect during 1989. The year began with 1284 members and ended with a total membership of 1284, in spite of deletions due to deaths or removal from membership due to non-payment of pledges for three consecutive years. Out of the total membership, 793 pay the minimum pledge versus 765 last year, 291 pay under the minimum versus 309 last year; and 200 pay over the minimum versus 210 last year.

We wish to remind our parishioners that it is the privilege of only the limited income senior citizens, students, and the unemployed to make less than the minimum pledge to the Church. All those who are gainfully employed or can afford to, are expected to abide by the minimum pledge decisions of the Parish Assembly, and if they can find it within their means, to raise their yearly pledges. Obviously, the minimum pledge set is not enough to operate our Church. If we could meet our budget through pledges, we would not have to be dependent upon fund-raising events.

St. John's is assessed \$66.00 a year by the Diocese for each pledge member. In addition, the added costs related to membership privileges create an out-of-pocket expense for our Church in the amount of \$25.00 per member.

We hope that these costs are borne in mind when filling out annual pledge cards for the Church.

### **SENIOR CITIZENS' LUNCHEONS**

St. John's continued to sponsor Senior Citizens' Luncheons every Tuesday of the month at the Church Cultural Hall. The Senior Citizens' Program, since its inception in 1975, has been subsidized by St. John's with only a minimal amount charged to those who attend. Again this year, Mr. and Mrs. Edward Mardigian have graciously offered to subsidize two or three Senior Citizens' Luncheons per month creating additional opportunities for the Senior Citizens of our community to gather and socialize.

Leo Zamanigian is present at the luncheons to assist our Senior Citizens in every way possible.

### ALTAR GUILD

We express our appreciation to Mrs. Sylvia Bjornstad of Royalty Cleaners and Mr. Harry Kezelian of Seagle Cleaners who graciously and voluntarily dry cleaned all vestments and altar cloths of our Church throughout the year 1989.

### MATYRS' DAY OBSERVANCE

Six hundred people gathered at St. John's Armenian Church for the 74th Commemoration of the Genocide of the Armenian People on Sunday, April 23, 1989. The day's observance commenced with the Requiem Divine Liturgy celebrated by Fr. Paren Avedikian in memory of the 1½ million martyrs who fell victim to the Turkish massacres during World War I.

Immediately following the solemn service, a memorial meal was served at the Church Cultural Hall. Mrs. Louise Manoogian Simone, Executive Vice-President of the A.G.B.U., who was the first American Armenian to visit Armenia following the devastating Earthquake, delivered an eloquent keynote address. In conjunction with the 74th Anniversary Observance, St. John's continued the campaign, initiated on the occasion of the 73rd observance, to raise funds for the Children's Hospital of Yerevan. Total funds donated in 1989 were \$10,725.00.

The Pastors and Parish Council extend their sincere appreciation to Mary Ryan, Araxie Andonian, Helen Armoudlian for preparing the Madagh Dinner and to the ACYOA Seniors, ACYO Juniors - Project Youth, and the Women's Guild for their assistance on that day.

### TEAS

In 1989, St. John's continued the tradition of an Easter Sunday Tea. Following Church Services, a Tea featuring Armenian Easter eggs, bread, cheese, and sweets was sponsored by our Church in the Church Cultural Hall. Hundreds of parishioners and friends gathered to exchange Easter greetings with friends and acquaintances. Jean Sarkisian coordinated the Tea with assistance from the Women's Guild.

On Sunday, August 13, St. John's A.C.Y.O.A. Seniors sponsored a Tea following Church Services on the occasion of the Feast of the Assumption of the Holy Mother of God; and also on Sunday, September 17 on the occasion of the Exhaltation of the Holy Cross. Both Teas were coordinated by Sara Andonian.

The Pastors and Parish Council extend their appreciation to Mrs. Jean Sarkisian and her Committee from the Women's Guild and to Miss Sara Andonian and her Committee from the A.C.Y.O.A.

### **SOCIAL CONCERN FUND**

During 1989, St. John's Social Concern Fund helped thirty-four individuals or families who either sought assistance from the Church, or of whose predicaments the Church was made aware. Contributions to these individuals totaled \$12, 334.00.

The funds in the Social Concern Account are generated from the following means: Contributions from parishioners as a response to our appeals in the Sunday Bulletins; In-Lieu of Cards contributions made to send Christmas and New Year's greetings to friends and parishioners through a special Christmas Bulletin; and gifts given to Fr. Paren on the occasion of the officiation of sacraments. Funds needed to supplement these sources of income are direct contributions from St. John's Armenian Church which are included in the line item, "Contributions" on the Expense side of our Budget.

We appreciate the donations which were received during the year for the Social Concern Fund.

### **BINGO COMMITTEE**

After 15 years of dedicated service to St. John's Bingo Committee, Sooren and Sona Yavruian resigned from their position as co-chairmen of the Bingo Committee in 1989. Since 1973 Souren and Sona served on the Bingo Executive Committee. In 1984, the Yavruians assumed the responsibility of co-chairmen of the Bingo Committee. Mr. Michael Blakian assumed Bingo Chairmanship in the beginning of 1989.

The Bingo Committee has transferred \$43,569.00 to St. John's Church during the 1989 year. In 1989, the income from the first two sessions of the Bingo Operation, January 1 and 12, were transferred directly to Armenia Earthquake Fund. On December 7, 1989, the first anniversary of the earthquake in Armenia, Bingo Operation was cancelled.

The volunteers who offer their services on a weekly basis are: Sam Argnian, Rosalind Astourian, Michael Blakian, Rose Boudakian, Ohannes Boyajian, Alex Chavdarian, Nick Evarian, Mardiros Hatcherian, Judy Hovnan, George Kouzoujian, George Kudanian, Frank Pulice, Mary Ryan, Lucille Sherman and Blanche Swidersky. We also have volunteers who come to assist on a once or twice a month basis who are as follows: Carmen D'Adrien, Emma & Saznek Betrosian, Hermalene & Archy Kahayian, Carl Karakashian, Andrew Kasper, Jack Kavlakian, Sue Tafraian and Leo Zamanigian.

It is through the efforts of these people that we are able to continue this program which is yet another source of revenue for St. John's.

### **FINE ARTS COMMITTEE**

St. John's Fine Arts Committee sponsored one exhibition and sale during 1989 in conjunction with Bazaar '89 on October 12, 13, 14, 15.

Participating artists were Zabel Belian, Sirvart Fazlian, Giraco, Kegham Tazian, Lucine Tutunjian, and Ruby Yagoobian.

Dr. Gary Belian is Chairman of the Fine Arts Committee. Members are Edmond and Nora Azadian, Zabel Belian, Jack and Vera Kazanjian, and Dr. Jack and Ruby Yagoobian.

## ST. JOHN'S RECREATION BUILDING SPORTS PROGRAMS

Monday night the Men's Basketball League is in competitive league play (3 games a night) during October to April. This program is for 18 year old men and older. Total participants approximately 70. Supervision by vounteer scorekeepers and paid referees.

Wednesday evening the Junior and Intermediate boys and girls, ages 13 to 18 are in competition with each other, October to April to prepare for the Orthodox League play. Supervision by volunteers.

Thursday evening the boys and girls Basketball Clinic is in session with progressive skill instruction and supervised play. This program begins in October to March, for 6 to 11 year old boys and girls. Again, this program consists of volunteer coaches and parents. Total participation 70.

Sunday - St. John's teams compete in the Orthodox Basketball League, which includes playing against orthodox churches. This program runs from October to March. These Sunday teams participate in the annual Orthodox Basketball Tournament held in March.

A new program was initiated during the month of April and May, indoor soccer. Over 60 youngsters ages 5 to 17 participated every Wednesday and Thursday evening.

The Pastors and Parish Council extend their appreciation to the parents and other volunteers who made these programs possible and a success.

## BAZAAR '89

St. John's annual three-day Bazaar took place the weekend of October 13, 14, 15 created an exciting atmosphere for our parishioners and the entire community.

In addition to the hundreds of items offered for sale, Bazaar '89 featured activities for the entire family. Live Armenian music was provided throughout the weekend for the listening and dancing pleasure of those who attended.

The success of this annual event was the result of months of preparation by St. John's Church organizations, and through the dedicated efforts of hundreds of parishioners. St. John's realized a net profit of \$34,825.00 from Bazaar '89.

The Pastors and Parish Council extend their appreciation to General Chairman, Gary Gozmanian and to the entire Committee for their tireless efforts.

## ORIENTAL RUG SALE

St. John's Armenian Church sponsored another very successful four-day Oriental Rug Sale in conjunction with Edward Bashian and Sons, Inc., importers from New York City. The gigantic Rug Sale on the weekend of October 12, 13, 14, 15, coinciding with St. John's Bazaar '89, took place in the Church Recreation Center. St. John's realized a net profit of \$42,273.00 from the Rug Sale.

The Pastors and Parish Council extend their appreciation to General Co-Chairmen, Richard and Isabelle Vahratian along with all those who assisted in various capacities to insure the success of this very profitable project.



### **CHURCH PICNIC**

Our 31st Annual Church Picnic scheduled for Sunday, August 20 was rained out, and subsequently took place in the Church Cultural Hall.

The Women's Guild prepared an outstanding array of delicacies for the Bakery Booth. The Ladies' Auxiliary, Women's Guild, Men's Society and A.C.Y.O.A. Seniors contributed their efforts, and although the weather was gloomy outside, those who were in attendance had a wonderful day of fellowship. As you will note in the financial report, no profit was realized from the event.

The Pastors and Parish Council extend their appreciation to Picnic Chairman, Greg Boyajian and to all who assisted.

### **BANQUET FOR FR. HAIK DONIKIAN**

On Sunday, December 3, 1989, St. John's Armenian Church tendered a farewell banquet on the occasion of Fr. Haik Donikian's retirement after 33 years of service to the Armenian Church and 10 years as Assistant Pastor of St. John's. Approximately 380 parishioners attended to say farewell to Fr. Haik and Yeretzgin Mayireni Donikian.

On behalf of the parish Fr. Haik was presented with a gift of \$3,000.

### **NEW YEAR'S EVE DINNER-DANCE**

The Annual New Year's Eve Dinner-Dance, under the co-chairmanship of Kathy Mekjian and Kazar Terterian, was enjoyed by 260 adults and children.

Guests enjoyed a continuous buffet dinner and danced to Armenian music by the Hachig Kazarian Ensemble and American music by Donna Marie and Motion. The gala event was concluded with breakfast in the early hours of New Year's Day.

Although no profit was realized from the event, the proceeds covered expenses.

The Pastors and Parish Council extend their thanks to Kathy Mekjian and Kazar Terterian and their committee for making this an enjoyable evening for those who attended.

### **SAN FRANCISCO EARTHQUAKE AND CHARLESTON HURRICANE VICTIMS AIDED BY ST. JOHN'S**

During the Fall of 1989, St. John's collected monetary donations for the victims of the San Francisco Earthquake and for the victims of Hurricane Hugo in Charleston, South Carolina. The collected funds were sent to the designated areas.

### **BIBLES FOR ARMENIA**

In 1989, St. John's collected funds to purchase Bibles for distribution in Armenia to help satisfy the urgent requests for them. A number of parishioners and friends donated \$10.00 for each Bible. St. John's will continue to accept donations for Bibles in 1990.

## EARTHQUAKE IN ARMENIA

As parishioners are aware, on December 8, 1988, the day following the disastrous Earthquake which struck Armenia, a meeting was convened with representatives of St. John's Armenian Church of Greater Detroit and a number of community organizations, at which time the Armenia Earthquake Fund Committee was organized and immediately mobilized its efforts to assist our devastated homeland.

The official period of forty days of mourning for the earthquake victims culminated on Sunday, January 15, 1989 with a Requiem Divine Liturgy.

On Saturday, January 29, Governor James Blanchard and his staff sponsored a Cabaret Concert for the benefit of the Armenia Earthquake Fund at Greektown's International Banquet Center. All proceeds in the amount of \$24,000.00 were donated to the Fund.

Parishioners placed hundreds of Earthquake Fund Canisters in businesses throughout the Metropolitan Detroit area, netting \$8,000.00.

St. John's Church School sponsored the Armenia Earthquake Walk-a-Thon on Sunday, April 9. Three hundred students, parishioners and friends walked a six mile route raising approximately \$12,000.00 for the Fund.

St John's also sent forty thousand pounds of relief supplies to Armenia including medical supplies and equipment, new clothing, shoes and blankets.

All expenses in regards to relief and fund-raising efforts have been and are presently being underwritten by St. John's Armenian Church, solely, so that no expenses would be incurred by the Armenia Earthquake Fund Committee.

On Wednesday, June 21, Fr. Paren Avedikian presented His Eminence, Archbishop Torkom Manoogian, Primate with a check in the amount of \$900,000.00 from the Armenia Earthquake Fund for the Diocesan Relief Fund earmarked for a Medical and Dental Clinic in the forty acre complex to be developed by the Diocese in Stepanavan, Armenia.

On Thursday, December 7, 1989, St. John's Armenian Church observed the first anniversary of the Earthquake with a Requiem Divine Liturgy and Hokehankist in memory of the victims of the tragedy. At the conclusion of the services, a Herisa Madagh was served in the Church Cultural Hall under the chairmanship of Mrs. Vartoog Karadolian.

We thank the thousands of donors and hundreds of volunteers through whose donations and efforts, the Armenia Earthquake Fund Committee was enabled, in a small way, to plan to rebuild what nature so mercilessly devastated.

## **IN LIEU OF FLOWERS FUTURE MAINTENANCE PROVISION OF ST. JOHN'S**

For some time now, we have been advising and encouraging friends to designate St. John's as the beneficiary of the In Lieu of Flowers donations for loved ones. After all, the burden of maintenance, improvement, and renovation of St. John's facilities are our responsibilities, and ours alone. No outside organization will come to our aid when, periodically renovations are needed.

We draw the funds from the Major Maintenance Provision as reflected on the balance sheet. This provision is realized solely from the In Lieu of Flowers donations of the last seventeen years. Every ten or twenty years and possibly more often, we will need to renovate various areas of our complex. These funds must be readily available to enable us to respond to the needs as they occur.

We think and hope that these were the factors in the minds of parishioners and friends who had the unfortunate responsibility of making decisions regarding the distribution of funds from the In Lieu of Flowers donations made on behalf of their loved ones.

St. John's received \$88,384.00 as a result of these wise and considerate decisions for which we thank the families of the deceased and the donors. We pray that the Lord will show special mercy on the souls of the departed.

## **THE THOUSAND CLUB RAFFLE**

In 1989, the Thousand Club generated an income of \$10,000.00 for St. John's Armenian Church.

In the beginning of 1989, the committee was without a chairman; however, the Committee comprised of Emma Bedrosian, Judy Hovnan, Ed Jamian, Dyana Kezelian, Harry Kezelian, Mary Ryan, and Margie Simonian continued their efforts and embarked upon ticket sales, as usual.

In October, the Committee and the sponsoring organizations, St. John's and the A.G.B.U. Alex Manoogian School faced the option of canceling the raffle or going forward with this effort since there were not enough tickets sold to cover the financial obligations for the Church and School. Eventually in December, Arthur Apkarian and Richard Apkarian personally assured the Parish Council and the A.G.B.U. School Board of Education that they would oversee the project, and suggested that costs could be covered by accepting a lower than budget return for the effort. The Thousand Club Raffle went ahead as previously scheduled, and donations from the sale of tickets were not returned to the purchasers. It is clearly stated in the financial section of this report, that the Church and School will receive only \$10,000.00 each, since there are other obligations both to the A.G.B.U. School and prizes to be awarded up through September, 1990.

## **CHURCH OWNED PROPERTIES**

In 1989, we received \$10,761.55 as payment for our share of the Romulus property which sold in 1986. We were one-fifth owner of this parcel of land in Romulus that was donated in 1982.

In 1989, we continued to put aside \$1.00 per plate from the operation of the Cultural Hall Kitchen in a Kitchen Major Maintenance Provision which totaled \$17,128.00, as reflected on our balance sheet. Church Organizations, Armenian Organizations and Hokejashes were absolved from contributing to this major maintenance fund.

In 1989, for the second time, the Hall Operations absorbed all costs for linens, as opposed to past practices when the Church budget was imburdened by this expense. The Hall Operations carried the cost of advertising of the availability of the Hall, both in the telephone directory and other publications, thus lightening the Church budget.

We express our sincere appreciation to Mrs. Helen Armoudlian for her total cooperation in the various aspects of the management of the Church Cultural Hall and Recreation Center facilities rentals.

### YOUTH COORDINATOR

St. John's Youth Coordinator, Mr. Jirair Hovsepian participated in the overseeing and management of the Youth Basketball Program and also organized an indoor soccer program. He also supervised the St. John's overnight Camp Project for two weeks at Camp Inisfree and the Day Camp Program at St. John's for two weeks.

In August, 1989, Mr. Hovsepian resigned, and we immediately embarked upon a search for a new Youth Coordinator. At the end of the year we engaged the services of Laura Gononian who will assume her responsibilities in January, 1990.

St. John's is committed to encourage the participation of all the youth of our community in the various aspects in the life of our community.

### FAMILY WORSHIP DAY

St. John's sponsored its second official Family Worship Day on Sunday, December 3. Parents accompanied their children to Church School, and proceeded to the Sanctuary to attend the Divine Liturgy and partook of the Holy Communion together. This newly established tradition coincided with St. John's 58th Anniversary and with the retirement Divine Liturgy celebrated by Fr. Haik Donikian.

### **ARMENIAN ARTIFACTS**

During 1989, St. John's artifacts continued to be systematically catalogued. Many of the artifacts have been installed in the Museum display cases; the remainder are temporarily housed in the Museum Preparation Room. Selected articles of interest and ancient relics from the Armenian past will be on exhibition for the viewing public in the coming year.

In 1989, twenty-seven additional artifacts enriched our Museum which has the largest collection of Armenian artifacts in this country. The following is a list of new acquisitions: three Kutahia ceramic ewers, three rugs, one painting, two silver lanterns, one decorative cross, 1 ring, three Kutahia tiles, one Kutahia dish, one manuscript, ten early print books, and one chalice.

### **NEIGHBORHOOD DEVELOPMENT**

During 1989, there were three requests by parishioners for financial assistance to purchase a home in the Magnolia Subdivision. As of the end of the year, 1989, we have thirteen parishioners who have outstanding balances totaling \$91,480.00. A total of ten have repaid the Church the full amount of the financial assistance that they have received.

We own a home on Winora Avenue immediately adjacent to the Church Complex which is presently rented to a parishioner. As approved by the Parish Assembly, St. John's is committed to purchase all homes on Winora Avenue that go on sale, and in turn, attempt to resell or to rent these homes to our own parishioners in order to preserve our community.

### **BUILDING REPORT**

During 1989, the Church Cultural Building continued to be used by the Church, Church Organizations, non-Church Organizations of the community, and for rental purposes by individual Church members and non-Church members. The Recreation Center was used by the Church, Church Organizations, non-Church Organizations of the community, and by individual Church and non-Church members for rental purposes.

The major improvements for the year 1989 for the Church, Cultural Hall, and parking area include the following: Travertine flooring in the Sanctuary portico was replaced with granite due to pitting and cracks; approximately 200 pieces of limestone on the exterior of the Sanctuary was replaced because of cracks; new drapes were installed on the east side of the Cultural Building; the parking lot was sealed and resurfaced, and delininations for parking areas were painted.

The hall operating income decreased considerably in 1989; in addition to which the Hall incurred the total linen bill for the Church amounting to \$9908.37 and advertising expenses in the yellow pages, \$12,285.00. The accompanying tables indicate that out of 157 Fridays, Saturdays and Sundays, the Hall was not in use 78 days during 1989. The Church Organizations used the Hall 16.46% of the total weekend days used, while paying only 4.98% of the income. The Armenian Organizations used the Hall 11.39% of the total weekend days used, while paying only 7.60% of the weekend income. The parishioners used the Hall 8.86% of the total weekend days used, while paying 9.53% of the total income. The outsiders used the Hall 72.15% of the total weekend days used and paid 77.90% of the total income.

We record with dismay that some of our parishioners and even some organizations of the community, rather than taking advantage of our facilities, are choosing other places to hold their weddings and banquets.

### **ANN ARBOR BADARAKS**

Divine Liturgy was celebrated in Ann Arbor, Michigan under the auspices of St. John's Armenian Church occasionally in 1989. An appeal was made to the Ann Arbor Armenian Community to assist in offering this service to their community, without much success on the four occasions that St. John's visited and offered this service. In the foreseeable future and until such time when the Ann Arbor Community assumes certain responsibilities, we will not be able to extend our services in that community.

We are grateful to our Deacons and members of the Komitas Choir for accompanying the clergy on these visits and to all individuals in Ann Arbor who assisted us in rendering our services to their community.

### **PROFESSIONAL SERVICES**

On a number of occasions during 1989, we called upon parishioners for assistance in their professional fields. We take this opportunity to thank Mr. Alex Jemal, Esquire and Mr. George Mugerian Esquire, for their legal services; Mr. Garabed Hoplamazian, engineer, and Mrs. Cynthia Ohanian, A.S.I.D., all of whom, when called upon rendered service to St. John's without benefit of remuneration.

Mr. Martin Manoogian, C.P.A. became aware that St. John's had engaged the services of a professional accountant for the proper accounting of Church funds and budget, and volunteered his and his firm's services for the love of his Church, for which we are grateful.

### **SPECIAL RECOGNITION**

In August, 1989, parishioner, Mike Kojaian, President of National Construction Co., became aware of the deteriorating condition of the Church Parking Lot and willingly undertook the responsibility of sealing and resurfacing the 152,877 square foot area of parking lot as well as painting 311 parking bays at no cost to St. John's. We express our heartfelt appreciation to Mike and Shirley Kojaian who have donated \$15,865.00 for these repairs during 1989.

### **IN APPRECIATION**

The Pastors and Parish Council extend their appreciation to the Apostolic Society, Diocesan Delegates, Church Auditors, Church Organizations and their Executive and Standing Committee members, the entire staff of the Church School, Church Choir, Deacons, Acolytes, Ushers, Church Staff, Church Office Staff, Church Building Staff, volunteer workers assisting in the Church Office, Church Projects' Committee chairmen and members, and to all the faithful parishioners who, during the past year, gave unselfishly of their time and financial resources for the life, the vitality and the improvement of our Church and Community for the Glory of God.
