RULES AND REGULATIONS CONCERNING CHURCH MEMBERSHIP

- "5. All persons who have been baptized and confirmed in the Armenian Church, who accept its doctrine, canons and rites, and who fullfill their obligations to the church and community, shall be members in good standing of the Parish Church and shall constitute the Parish Assembly.
- 6. Every member of the Parish, 18 years of age or over, shall pay to his(or her) church an annual due, the amount of which shall be determined by the Diocesan Assembly. Such amount may be increased, but not decreased by the Parish Assembly.
- 7. Members in good standing of a Parish Church, who are 18 years of age or over, may participate in the assemblies of the same parish and may vote, provided that at least six months have elapsed since the date of their registration as members of the parish and their dues have been paid. They may be eligible for office one year after becoming members, provided they have attained the age of 21.
- 8. Members who fail their dues for one or more years, automatically forfeit their right to vote at Parish Assemblies or to hold elective office within the parish. Such members may reinstate these rights by payment of their dues in arrears for at least the previous two years.
- 9. No one may be a voting member in more than one parish at the same time."

Excerpted from the BY-LAWS
OF THE ARMENIAN CHURCH OF AMERICA
(Eastern Diocese)

RULES AND REGULATIONS GOVERNING PARISH ASSEMBLY

- "16. The Agenda of the Parish Assembly shall be prepared by the Parish Priest and the Parish Council. Other matters of new business may be added by majority vote of the Parish Assembly.
- 17. At Parish Assemblies the presence of a minimum of one-third of the eligible voting membership or fifty members shall constitute a quorum, and decisions shall be rendered by majority vote of members present and voting.
- 22. In a Parish Assembly each member shall be entitled to one vote which is not transferable and must be cast in person. In case of a tie vote the presiding officer shall cast the deciding vote or he shall authorize a second balloting upon the same question.
- 43. The Parish Priest shall preside over the meeting of the Parish Council and the Parish Assembly."

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PASTOR'S REPORT & MESSAGE

Dear Parishioners:

WORSHIP SERVICES

Divine Liturgy was celebrated and Armenian and English sermons were delivered every Sunday. Services were also offered during the week in accordance with our Church traditions.

During 1995, the following Sacraments and Rites were officiated: Baptism and Confirmation of infants and adults, 56; Holy Matrimony, 26; Funeral Services, 52.

Hospital visitations, nursing home visitation to the sick and elderly, home visitations for consolation, home blessings, visitations with families of the Parish in connection with Sacraments and for various other reasons have been attended to by myself, the former Pastor and clergymen.

My administrative responsibilities during the past months have included office work and management, Parish Council and Church Auxiliary Organizational functions, coordination of Church organizations, and fund-raising.

Haig Donikian, and Rev. Fr. Garabed Kochakian. I extend my appreciation to our Church hierarchs and her servants for the opportunity of praying and exalting the Lord together at St. John's.

In connection with the worship services of our Church, it is my duty to thank the members of the Komitas Choir of St. John's, the Deacons, the acolytes, Choir Director and the Organists who worked during the past year to make our services dignified and inspiring. I also extend my appreciation to Mardiros Hatcherian and Onnig Boyajian for conscientiously carrying out their duties as the church sacristan. ELECTION OF HIS HOLINESS KAREKIN I

The National Ecclesiastical Meeting convened for the election of the new Catholicos was held in Etchmiadzin from April 3 - 6. I had the honor and privilege to be elected as a delegate from the Eastern Diocese of America. In addition, two of St. John's parishioners, Dr. Dennis Papazian and Harry Terzian were elected as delegates and participated in the election. Indeed, it was a joyous occasion for us to witness the rejuvenation of the Armenian Church as well as the free and independent republic. I remained in Armenia for the enthronement of His Holiness Karekin I, Supreme Patriarch and Catholicos of All Armenians which took place on Palm Sunday.

ORDINATION OF DEACONS AND ACOLYTES

On December 9 and 10, His Grace, Archbishop Khajag Barsamian visited our parish specifically to ordain the Deacons and Acolytes. On Saturday, December 9, twenty young boys of our Church became acolytes and twelve young girls received their veils to join the Junior Choir.

On Sunday, His Grace ordained Mihran Hoplamazian, Richard Norsigian and Onnig Boyajian as full deacons and bestowed ourar (a stole) on Mihran Toumajan.

MERCY MISSION TO ARMENIA

In March and April of 1995, I had the privilege and opportunity while in Armenia as the representative of St. John's to distribute funds raised in our parish specifically to help Armenians in Armenia. Approximately \$50,000 was distributed on which a report was published in the Torch Bearer.

PARISH COUNCIL MEETINGS

The Parish Council had 26 regular meetings. Throughout the year special meetings were held for the election of the Parish Council Executive Body, building policies and combined Parish Council and Diocesan Delegates.

The Parish Council also chaired a number of functions during the year.

PLEDGE REPORT

In accordance with the decision of the 1993 Parish Assembly, the minimum pledge of \$175.00 per individual member and \$350 per couple was in effect during 1995. As of December 31, 1995, St. John's had 711 members paying the minimum pledge or over.

SENIOR CITIZENS' LUNCHEONS

St. John's continued to sponsor Senior Citizens' Luncheons every Tuesday of the month. The Senior Citizens' Program, since its inception in 1975, has been subsidized in part by St. John's. Mrs. Helen Mardigian, again this year, has graciously offered to subsidize two to three Senior Citizens Luncheons per month, creating additional opportunities for the Senior Citizens of our community to gather and socialize.

The Pastors and Parish Council extend their sincere gratitude to Mrs. Helen Mardigian for her thoughtfulness and generosity, and to Mr. Leo Zamanigian who is present at the luncheons assisting our Senior Citizens in every way possible.

ST. JOHN'S ARMENIAN CHURCH EDWARD & HELEN MARDIGIAN LIBRARY

Researchers and the general public have regularly utilized the facilities offered by the Edward and Helen Mardigian Library throughout 1995. The library currently houses 6,000 books in Armenian, English, and French. Since there is available shelving for 50,000 titles, parishioners have been encourage to donate books on Armenian subjects. Over 200 books in the Armenian and English Languages were donated during the past year. Our thanks to all those individuals who donated books during 1995.

Although books cannot be checked out of the library at the present time, comfortable reading areas are provided for the convenience of those who wish to conduct research or read books or Armenian newspapers for pleasure.

Computers in the library have also been in constant use throughout the year for desktop publishing and publicity.

CHURCH OWNED PROPERTY

The Winora Avenue home which was sold to a parishioner on a 10 year land contract in 1990, continued to bring revenues to the Church according to the contract.

BINGO COMMITTEE

The Bingo Committee has generated \$23,065 for St. John's during the 1995 year. The Bingo Committee operated under the Chairmanship of Mr. Paul Yousoufian.

The Pastors and Parish Council would like to thank the volunteers who offer their services on a weekly and monthly basis. The core volunteers are Sara Andonian, Sam Argnian, Dr. Vincent Baylerian, Onnig Boyajian, Alex Chavdarian, Carman D'Adrien, Mardiros Hatcherian, Edward Korkoian, George & Alice Kouzoujian, George Kudanian, George Laktzian, Sam Malkasian, Nicole Matoian, Dianne Merigian, John & Alice Semizian, Lucille Sherman, Blanche Swidersky, Mihran Toumajan and many others who helped occasionally.

It is through the efforts of the above that we are able to continue this program which is a large source of revenue among the fund-raising projects of St. John's

It takes enormous amount of team effort to maintain our bingo at its best. We encourage everyone to assist in any way possible.

BAZAAR '95

St. John's annual two-day Bazaar took place during the weekend of October 14 & 15 and created an exciting atmosphere for our parishioners and the entire community.

Hundreds of items were offered for sale headed by the Armenian culinary treats, scrumptious kebab dinners, specialty foods and spices. Armenian live music was featured throughout the weekend for the listening and dancing pleasure of those who attended, and a variety of activities were featured for the entire family.

The success of the Bazaar was again the result of the efforts of many volunteers and months of preparation by St. John's Church organizations. St. John's realized a net profit of \$35,292 from Bazaar '95.

The Pastors and Parish Council extend their appreciation to Bazaar chairman Gary Gozmanian, committee members, the many volunteers, and all those who supported this major fund-raising event.

CHURCH PICNIC

Our 36th Annual Church Picnic took place on Sunday, August 13, 1995 at the Church Cultural Hall.

The Women's Guild handled the Bakery Booth, and members of the Ladies' Auxiliary, Women's Guild, Men's Society, and ACYO Seniors and Juniors Project Youth contributed their efforts for this event. A profit of \$926 was realized from the Picnic.

The Pastors and Parish Council extend their appreciation to Picnic Chairman, Onnig Boyajian and to all who assisted.

BUILDING REPORT

During 1994, the Church Cultural Building continued to be used by the Church, and Church Organizations as well as for rental purposes by individual parishioners, Armenian Organizations and non-Church members.

Renovations in the Cultural Building and Church in 1995 include major re-roofing of the chapel, lobby, and the hallway areas as well as repairing the main Banquet Hall roof. We added a mew mirror in the banquet room and purchased new folding chairs for the cultural center building. The sound system of the banquet hall was completely renovated including new microphones, speakers, wiring, and amplifier equipment. A new network of state of the art computer hardware and printers were purchased and delivered for our offices, the Church School and the Torchbearer office. As he has so often in the past, our great benefactor, Mr. Alex Manoogian, again came forward and completely underwrote this very important project.

Church Organizations used the Hall 15.49% of the total weekend days used in 1995 and contributed 4.78% of the weekend income. Armenian Organizations used the Hall 9.68% of the weekend days used, while contributing 7.24% of the weekend income. The parishioners used the Hall 8.45% of the weekend days used, while contributing 9.30% of weekend income. Outsiders rented the Hall 66.20% of the weekend days used and contributed 78.67% of the total income. The decrease in hall rental income of 0.9% in 1995 was directly attributable to the decrease in usage of 26.67% by the Church organizations

In 1995 we continue to put aside \$1.50 per plate from the rental income of the Cultural Hall in a Kitchen Maintenance Provision which totaled \$24,187.50, as reflected on our balance sheet. Hokejashes and Recreation Center rentals do not contribute to this fund. In 1995 no hall charges were allocated to picnic, bazaar, or 1994 New Year's Eve Dinner Dance.

Confirmed rental bookings at the present time for 1996 are 42.58% higher than last year at this same time.

We thank all parishioners and friends who have designated St. John's Armenian Church as the beneficiary for In Lieu of Flowers donations. Their thoughtfulness have aided us in the on-going maintenance of our Church and Cultural Complex.

FINE ARTS COMMITTEE

St. John's Fine Arts Committee sponsored three exhibitions and sales of paintings by various Armenian artist during 1995.

The Elibekian Family Show was held in April, Garin Bedrosian and Ara Shiraz exhibition took place in conjunction with the Bazaar in October and Style Gallery of Armenia exhibition took place in December.

Dr. Gary Belian is Chairman of the Fine Arts Committee. Board members are: Edmond and Nora Azadian, Zabel Belian, Jack and Vera Kazanjian, and Mrs. Ruby Yagoobian and the late Dr. Jack Yagoobian.

The Pastors and Parish Council extend their appreciation to the Fine Arts Committee for their efforts for the introduction and promotion of Armenian Artists.

ST. JOHN'S ARMENIA RELIEF FUND

In 1995, St. John's continued to receive voluntary donations to help Armenia. No major fund-raising took place in accordance with a directive from the Primate. Voluntary donations to assist individuals and families in Armenia will continue to be accepted by St. John's and dispersed according to the wishes of the donors. As it has become a tradition we solicited contributions for Armenia Relief on the occasion of the 80th Anniversary

of the Armenian Genocide and the Seventh Annual Walk-a-thon. Also during 1995, parishioners and friends responded to the needs of Armenian people by designating In Lieu of Gifts and In Lieu of Flowers donations.

YOUTH COORDINATOR

St. John's Youth Coordinator, Lisa Mardigian, continued her responsibilities in 1995 by assisting the Church School, ACYO Juniors, ACYOA Seniors, Torch Bearer and other Church Organizations.

Lisa coordinated a Diocesan Workshop, the 7th Annual Armenia Earthquake Walk-a-thon, and a Family Ski Day. She helped organize the ACYO Project Youth efforts in sponsoring the Lenten Fish Dinners and a finale Lobster Dinner, and also arranged the Juniors Ski, Toronto, and Cedar Pointe trips along with other local activities. She coordinated the ACYO Juniors active participation in the operation of the Bazaar Snackshop, the Church Picnic beverage stand, and the Diocesan sponsored youth workshop. She assisted the ACYOA Seniors in their annual November Dance, Christmas Eve Tea, Palm Sunday A.C.Y.O.A. Day, and the Church sponsored political symposium. She coordinated the Church School Halloween Celebration and Christmas Observance. She helped organize and coordinate the Youth Basketball Program and was responsible for the concessions stand during O.Y.A.A. Basketball Games on each Sunday from December through March. Lisa also organized and supervised the 6 week summer day camp, and transported and assisted 24 campers and counselors to the week long stay at the Diocesan Midwest Hye Camp, and also served in various other capacities for the benefit of St. John's.

TEAS

In 1995, St. John's continued the tradition of an Easter Sunday Tea. Following Church Services, a Tea featuring Armenian Easter eggs, bread and cheese was sponsored by our Church in the Church Cultural Hall. Hundreds of parishioners and friends gathered to exchange Easter greetings with friends and acquaintances. The Women's Guild coordinated the Tea.

On Sunday, April 23, 1995 St. John's observed the 80th Anniversary of the Armenian Genocide during the Divine Liturgy. Following the services over 500 people attended the memorial meal and program coordinated by the Parish Council and sponsored by Mr. Alex Manoogian in memory of his beloved wife Marie, on the occasion of her second year of passing. Expenses for the cultural portion of the Commemoration were subsidized by interest accrued from the Fr. Paren Avedikian Cultural & Educational Fund. Keynote speaker was Galina V. Starovoitova, distinguished visiting professor and head of Brown University Ethno-Political Studies. The musical interlude was provided by a String Quartet, coordinated by Brooke Hoplamazian.

NEW YEARS'S EVE DINNER DANCE

The December 31, 1994 New Year's Eve Dinner Dance was under the cochairmanship of Kathy Mekjian and Kazar Terterian was attended by approximately 300 people. The evening featured a mezza table, a lavish dinner, and breakfast. The musical entertainment for the evening was provided by the Hachig Kazarian Ensemble and Henry Ford Community College Big Band.

A profit of approximately \$947.00 was realized.

ST. JOHN'S ARMENIAN CHURCH ALEX AND MARIE MANOOGIAN MUSEUM

During 1995, hundreds of visitors from throughout the United States, Canada, Europe & South America toured the eight galleries of the Alex and Marie Manoogian Museum. North America's largest Armenian Museum is known to international art patrons and historians as well as to our local universities and schools. The Museum was open on a regular basis during the entire year.

Guided group tours were arranged for the A.G.B.U. Alex & Marie Manoogian School, DIA Founders Society, DIA Art to the Schools, University of Michigan-Ann Arbor, Macomb Community College, Oakland Community College, Wayne State University, Henry Ford Community College, Evereg-Fenesse Convention, Plymouth-Salem High School, Southfield High School, Stevenson High School, St. John's Church School, A.C.Y.O.A., Summer Day Camp and dozens of area church organizations of various denominations.

Comprehensive individual tours were also provided for representatives of the D.I.A., Toledo Art Museum, Walters Art Gallery, Wayne State University, and the University of Michigan as well as for the community at large.

Featured articles of interest and ancient relics from Armenia's past provide a unique glimpse of our history and create a sense of pride in our heritage.

SOCIAL CONCERN FUND

During 1995, St. John's Social Concern Fund helped more than thirty families who either sought assistance from the Church or of whose predicaments the Church was made aware. Financial assistance to these families through St. John's Social Concern Fund amounted to approximately \$11,321.00.

Again this year the funds in the Social Concern Fund were generated from the following sources: Special contributions by concerned parishioners, contributions from parishioners as a response to our appeals in the weekly Sunday Bulletins, In Lieu of Cards contributions made to send Christmas and New Year's greetings to friends and parishioners through a special Christmas Bulletin, interest from an Endowment Fund at St. John's. Funds needed to supplement these sources of income were direct contributions from St. John's Armenian Church as reflected on the line item "Social Concern" on the Expense side of our Budget. In addition, funds at the personal disposal of the pastor were dispersed to the needy.

We thank all who contributed directly or indirectly to the Social Concern Fund of St. John's.

NEIGHBORHOOD DEVELOPMENT

As of December 31, 1995, we have six parishioners who have outstanding balances totaling approximately \$25,000. Through the years a total of twenty parishioners have repaid the Church the full amount of financial assistance they have received. A temporary moratorium has been placed on neighborhood development loans due to lack of funds. Thanks to the efforts of parish council member, John Semizian for his perserverence in this matter.
