RULES AND REGULATIONS CONCERNING CHURCH MEMBERSHIP

- "5. All persons who have been baptized and confirmed in the Armenian Church, who accept its doctrine, canons and rites, and who fulfill their obligations to the church and community, shall be members in good standing of the Parish Church and shall constitute the Parish Assembly.
- 6. Every member of the Parish, 18 years of age or over, shall pay to his (or her) church an annual due, the amount of which shall be determined by the Diocesan Assembly. Such amount may be increased, but not decreased by the Parish Assembly.
- 7. Members in good standing of a Parish Church, who are 18 years of age or over, may participate in the assemblies of the same parish and may vote, provided that at least six months have elapsed since the date of their registration as members of the parish and their dues have been paid. They may be eligible for office one year after becoming members, provided they have attained the age of 21.
- 8. Members who fail their dues for one or more years, automatically forfeit their right to vote at Parish Assemblies or to hold elective office within the parish. Such members may reinstate these rights by payment of their dues in arrears for at least the previous two years.
- 9. No one may be a voting member in more than one parish at the same time."

Excerpted from the BY-LAWS OF THE ARMENIAN CHURCH OF AMERICA (Eastern Diocese)

RULES AND REGULATIONS GOVERNING PARISH ASSEMBLY

- "16. The Agenda of the Parish Assembly shall be prepared by the Parish Priest and the Parish Council. Other matters of new business may be added by majority vote of the Parish Assembly.
- 17. At Parish Assemblies the presence of a minimum of one-third of the eligible voting membership or fifty members shall constitute a quorum, and decisions shall be rendered by majority vote of members present and voting.
- 22. In a Parish Assembly each member shall be entitled to one vote which is not transferable and must be cast in person. In case of a tie vote the presiding officer shall cast the deciding vote or he shall authorize a second balloting upon the same question.
- 43. The Parish Priest shall preside over the meeting of the Parish Council and the Parish Assembly."

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PASTOR'S REPORT & MESSAGE

Dear Parishioners:

With the grace and mercy of God, we the members of St. John's Armenian Church Community, have spent another year under the shadow of our Holy Mother Church. During 1996, I declare that, to the best of my ability, I provided pastoral care and guidance to St. John's and her members, without sparing the graces which the Lord God has bestowed on me. WORSHIP SERVICES

Divine Liturgy was celebrated and Armenian and English sermons were delivered every Sunday. I am happy to inform you that the services for Armenian Christmas, Vartanantz, Hampartzoom, and Ascencion were celebrated during the week in accordance with our Church traditions. Also thank you to our children for participating in the Feet Washing and Bible readings during the Tre-Ore service, Jarakalouytz or Easter Eve service.

SACRAMENTS AND RITES

During 1996, the following Sacraments and Rites were officiated: Baptism and Confirmation of infants and adults, 59; Holy Matrimony, 21; Funeral Services, 51.

PASTORAL VISITATIONS

Hospital visitations, nursing home visitation to the sick and elderly, home visitations for consolation, home blessings, visitations with families of the Parish in connection with Sacraments and for various other reasons have been attended to by myself. Twice a year, our Church visits the Manoogian Manor where we celebrate Church services at which time we offer Holy Communion and a program along with gifts from our Women's Guild.

MERCY MISSION TO ARMENIA

In March of 1996, I had the privilege and opportunity, while in Armenia to represent our Diocese on behalf of the Relief Fund in order to discuss and to explore the issues and plans raised by St. John's Armenian Church in regards to the \$900,000 donation made to the Diocese for a specific project to be built in Armenia. So far, our efforts have been without any result. At the same time, we continue our Mercy Mission to help the needy in Armenia. Approximately \$27,000 was distributed, on which a report was published in the Torch Bearer.

VISIT OF HIS HOLINESS KAREKIN I TO DETROIT

On January 19 & 20, 1996 the greater Detroit Armenian Parish was blessed with the Pontifical visit of His Holiness Karekin I. This was his first Pontifical visit as Catholicos of all Armenians. On Friday evening, there was a special Harashapar service participated by many clergy and attended by dignitaries, parishioners and well wishers followed by a banquet attended by over 650 people. On Saturday morning, our primate celebrated the divine liturgy and His Holiness delivered an inspiring sermon. Following badarak, His Holiness met privately with our Church School students and children from our community. Afterwards there was an elaborate tea followed by a private luncheon hosted by Mr. Alex & Richard Manoogian. The entourage preceded to Detroit's Mayor Archer's home where His Holiness was received very warmly and then to Cardinal Maida's residence. Saturday evening, a special Youth gathering was organized which was attended by over 300 young adults to listen and to ask questions to His Holiness. Afterwards, His Holiness departed for Chicago.

VISIT OF THE PRESIDENT OF KARABAGH-ARTZAKH

On February 2, 1996, President Robert Kocharian of Karabagh-Artzakh, visited Detroit where we honored him with a private luncheon. He visited our Museum

and attended a rally held at the Alex and Marie Manoogian School where he was received by a large crowd.

ACTIVITIES - SOCIAL, RELIGIOUS, AND CULTURAL

1996 was a year of interesting activities at St. John's Armenian Church. In March, we held a spiritually gratifying retreat. On April 24, a special program was presented by Dr. Jean Ford and Rev. Stuart Windsor, director for Christian Solidarity International, UK. Successful family bingo and dance social activities were organized by the Fun Raisers Committee. On July 22, a concert by Babig Boghosian. St. John's sponsored a dinner for the members of the Armenia Symphony Orchestra who were visiting Detroit. I was also happy to be part of the successful celebration of the 50th Anniversary of our A.C.Y.O.A. and the 75th Anniversary of our Ladies Auxiliary. Due to circumstances beyond their control, the Ladies Auxiliary requested to join the Women's Guild to which we agreed.

FUNERAL SERVICES FOR MR. ALEX MANOOGIAN

July 10 was a very sad day in the history of our parish. We lost our beloved patriarch, benefactor, friend and parishioner Mr. Alex Manoogian. On this occasion, His Holiness Karekin I attended and presided over the Funeral Services. Many dignitaries, both lay and clergy, as well as a multitude of guests and parishioners paid their respects. At this time, I would like to express, on behalf of our Parish Assembly, our deepest sympathy to Richard Manoogian and Louise Simone, his brothers, and the entire Manoogian family for their great loss.

30TH ANNIVERSARY OF MY ORDINATION

PARISH COUNCIL MEETINGS

The Parish Council had 26 regular meetings. Throughout the year special meetings were held for the election of the Parish Council Executive Body, building policies and combined Parish Council and Diocesan Delegates.

The Parish Council also chaired a number of functions during the year.

PLEDGE REPORT

In accordance with the decision of the 1993 Parish Assembly, the minimum pledge of \$175.00 per individual member and \$350 per couple was in effect during 1996. As of December 31, 1996, St. John's had 681 members paying the minimum pledge or over.

SPECIAL PARISH ASSEMBLY

As the result of a survey of the Parishes within the Diocese, St. John's was advised that although our parish was generally exempt from taxes on our own income, it could be questionable that our donors would be entitled to deduct Church donations on individual tax returns unless the parish has a determination letter from the Internal Revenue Service under 501(c)3 of the IRS code.

As a result of the review of our application for the determination letter from the IRS we were advised that our Articles of Incorporation would have to be amended to insure that if our corporation were to be liquidated our assets could not be given to any organization that is not recognized by the IRS as 501(c)3 legal entity.

Accordingly the Parish Priest, following the Church Bylaws and the recommendation of our attorney, called a special assembly to be held Tuesday, September 24, 1996 to consider a resolution to amend our Articles of Incorporation to meet the requirement of IRS Department.

After due notice of the meeting was sent to all members, the meeting was held on that date. The presentation of the issue was made by our attorney and after discussion of the required change, a motion was passed to comply with the IRS request.

Subsequently after the Certificate of Amendment was filed with the Michigan Corporation and Securities Bureau, on September 25, 1996, and the legal notice was submitted to the IRS, the IRS granted St. John's the determination letter, dated October 8, 1996.

CHURCH OWNED PROPERTY

The Winora Avenue home which was sold to a parishioner on a 10 year land contract in 1990, continued to bring revenues to the Church according to the contract.

ST. JOHN'S ARMENIAN CHURCH EDWARD & HELEN MARDIGIAN LIBRARY

Researchers and the general public have regularly utilized the facilities offered by the Edward and Helen Mardigian Library throughout 1996. The library currently houses over 6,000 books in Armenian, English, and French. Since there is available shelving for 50,000 titles, parishioners have been encouraged to donate books on Armenian subjects. During 1996, the Mardigian Family donated 560 books, including several rare editions, in memory of their beloved husband and father, Edward Mardigian. In addition, 150 books in the Armenian and English languages were donated during the past year by parishioners and friends. Our thanks to everyone who donated books and periodicals.

Although books cannot be checked out of the library at the present time, comfortable reading areas are provided for the convenience of those who wish to conduct research or read books or Armenian newspapers for pleasure.

Computers in the library have also been in constant use throughout the year for desktop publishing and publicity.

BINGO COMMITTEE

In 1996, the Bingo Committee generated \$26,432.00 for St. John's Armenian Church. The Bingo Committee operates under the chairmanship of Paul Yousoufian.

We greatly appreciate our core workers: Sara Andonian, Onnig Boyajian, Charlotte Boshnakian, Carmen D'Adrien, Queenie Hazergian, Armen Hovnanian, George Kudanian, George and Alice Kouzoujian, Nicole Matoian, June Mekjian, and Diane Merigian. These volunteers managed to be here on a regular basis giving up their personal time and other commitments knowing of the importance to help fulfill the needs of our Church.

Other volunteers, George Alexanian, Helen Armoudlian, Rosette Bagdasarian, Mike Blakian, Alex Chavdarian, Sue Hovnanian, Mary and Harry Keoleian, Edward H. Korkoian, Sam Malkasian, Phillip Sarkissian and Margie Simonian have also come to help from time to time and we appreciate their efforts. We also would like to thank the Woman's Guild workers at the Bingo food concession who have assisted us at Bingo when we've been short handed on many occasions. The Bingo Committee remembers Sam Argnian and Lucille Sherman, two very dedicated volunteers, who passed away during the past year. We thank Mardiros Hatcherian for his many years of service who due to health reasons is no longer able to work at Bingo.

It is through this dwindling group of dedicated volunteers that we have managed to keep this fund raising project going. This committee has worked hard but also has had fun and enjoyed working with each other. As for volunteer Committees, Bingo continues to be the third largest contributor to the Church. We do need and would appreciate additional volunteers to make it easier for everyone as well as more profitable.

BAZAAR '96

St. John's annual two-day Bazaar took place during the weekend of October 12 & 13 and created an exciting atmosphere for our parishioners and the entire community.

Hundreds of items were offered for sale headed by the Armenian culinary treats, scrumptious kebob dinners, specialty foods and spices. Armenian live music was featured throughout the weekend for the listening and dancing pleasure of those who attended, and a variety of activities were featured for the entire family.

A new highlight to the Bazaar was the Las Vegas Night, chaired by Sarkis Aglamishian with the assistance of Paul Yousoufian, Krikor Oknayan and Kim Manavdjian. The Multipurpose room was transformed into a casino on Saturday evening which proved to be very successful.

The success of the Bazaar was again the result of the efforts of many volunteers and months of preparation by St. John's Church organizations. St. John's realized a net profit of \$31,613 from Bazaar '96.

The Pastors and Parish Council extend their appreciation to Bazaar chairman, Edward Haic Korkoian, committee members, the many volunteers, and all those who supported this major fund-raising event.

CHURCH PICNIC

Our 37th Annual Church Picnic took place on Sunday, August 18, 1996 on the Church grounds with over 700 parishioners and friends in attendance.

The Women's Guild handled the Bakery Booth, and members of the Ladies' Auxiliary, Women's Guild, Men's Society, and ACYO Seniors and Juniors Project Youth contributed their efforts for this event. A profit of \$1,567 was realized from the Picnic.

The Pastors and Parish Council extend their appreciation to Picnic Chairman, Edward Haic Korkojan and to all who assisted.

SENIOR CITIZENS' LUNCHEONS

St. John's continued to sponsor Senior Citizens' Luncheons every Tuesday of the month. The Senior Citizens' Program, since its inception in 1975, has been subsidized in part by St. John's. Mrs. Helen Mardigian, again this year, has graciously offered to subsidize two to three Senior Citizens Luncheons per month, creating additional opportunities for the Senior Citizens of our community to gather and socialize.

The Pastor and Parish Council extend their sincere gratitude to Mrs. Helen Mardigian for her thoughtfulness and generosity, to Mr. Leo Zamanigian who is present at the luncheons assisting our Senior Citizens in every way possible and to Edward Jizmejian for his dedicated services.

BUILDING REPORT

During 1996, the Church Cultural Building continued to be used by the Church, and Church Organizations as well as for rental purposes by individual parishioners, Armenian Organizations and non-Church members.

Major renovations in the Cultural Building and Church in 1996 was limited to the purchase of opaque drapes for the Banquet Hall as well as tabletop service replenishment in preparation of Vehapar's visit.

Church Organizations used the Hall 19.12% of the total weekend days used in 1996 and contributed 9.91% of the weekend income. Armenian Organizations used the Hall 2.94% of the weekend days used, while contributing 1.29% of the weekend income. The parishioners used the Hall 8.82% of the weekend days used, while contributing 9.60% of weekend income. Outsiders rented the Hall 69.12% of the weekend days used and contributed 79.20% of the total income. Our 1996 building operations net was 206,269.00, an increase of \$16,242.00 over 1995.

In 1996 we continue to put aside \$1.50 per plate from the rental income of the Cultural Hall in a Kitchen Maintenance Provision which totaled \$22,083. Hokejashes and Recreation Center rentals do not contribute to this fund. In 1996 no hall charges were allocated to picnic or bazaar.

Confirmed weekend rental bookings at the present time for 1997 are 22.22% higher than last year at this same time.

All of our mechanical systems, furnaces, air conditioners, building structures, roofs and parking lot surfaces have been in service for over thirty years. The Future Maintenance Provision provides for the repairs and replacement of the building mechanical and structural systems. To help meet the on-going maintenance costs and future repairs and building systems replacement, we encourage our parishioners and friends to designate St. John's Armenian Church as the beneficiary for In Lieu of Flowers donations for loved ones.

We thank all parishioners and friends who have designated St. John's Armenian Church as the beneficiary for In Lieu of Flowers donations. Their thoughtfulness have aided us in the on-going maintenance of our Church and Cultural Complex.

FINE ARTS COMMITTEE

St. John's Fine Arts Committee sponsored two exhibitions and sales of paintings by various Armenian artists during 1996.

The works of Seeroon Yeretzian were featured on the weekend of April 26-28. In conjunction with the Bazaar, the Fine Arts Committee exhibited the works of Zubel Khachadoorian, Kegham Tazian, Martin Barooshian, Paul Zenian, Zabel Belian, and Armand Moumjian on the weekend of October, 11-13. On December 1, 1996 a panel discussion on the life of Sarkis Sarkisian was sponsored by the Fine Arts Committee.

Dr. Gary Belian is Chairman of the Fine Arts Committee. Board members are: Edmond and Nora Azadian, Zabel Belian, Jack and Vera Kazanjian, and Mrs. Ruby Yagoobian.

The Pastor and Parish Council extend their appreciation to the Fine Arts Committee for their efforts for the introduction and promotion of Armenian Artists.

ST. JOHN'S ARMENIAN RELIEF FUND

In 1996, St. John's continued to receive voluntary donations to help needy Armenians. No major fund-raising took place in accordance with a directive from the Primate. Voluntary donations to assist individuals and families in Armenia will continue to be accepted by St. John's and dispersed according to the wishes of the donors. As it has become a tradition we solicited contributions for Armenian Relief on the occasion of the 81th Anniversary of the Armenian Genocide and the Eighth Annual Walk-a-thon. Also during 1996, parishioners and friends responded to the needs of Armenian people by designating In Lieu of Gifts and In Lieu of Flowers donations.

YOUTH COORDINATOR

St. John's Youth Coordinator, Lisa Mardigian, continued her responsibilities in 1996 by assisting the Church School, ACYO Juniors, ACYOA Seniors, Torch Bearer and other Church Organizations.

Lisa coordinated the assemblies for the Youth and Young Adults during the visit of His Holiness Kareken I, the 8th Annual Armenia Earthquake Walk-a-thon, and a Family Ski Day. She helped organize the ACYO Project Youth efforts in sponsoring the Lenten Fish Dinners and a finale Lobster Dinner, and also arranged the Juniors Ski, Chicago, and Cedar Pointe trips along with other local activities. She coordinated the ACYO Juniors active participation in the operation of the Bazaar Snackshop, Church Picnic and Paregentan beverage stand. She assisted the ACYOA Seniors in their 50th Anniversary November Dance, Christmas Eve Tea, Palm Sunday A.C.Y.O.A. Day and a Chicago Weekend Trip. She coordinated the Church School Halloween Celebration and Christmas Observance. She coordinated the A.C.Y.O.A. Seniors and Juniors service for the April 24 Madagh Dinner. She helped organize and coordinate the Youth Basketball Program and was responsible for the concessions stand during O.Y.A.A. Basketball Games on each Sunday from December through March. Lisa also organized and supervised the 6 week summer day camp, and transported and assisted 32 campers and counselors to the week long stay at the Diocesan Midwest Hye Camp, and also served in various other capacities for the benefit of St. John's. St. John's continued the tradition of an Easter Sunday Tea. Following Church Services, a Tea featuring Armenian Easter eggs, bread and cheese was sponsored by our Church in the Church Cultural Hall. Hundreds of parishioners and friends gathered to exchange Easter greetings with friends and acquaintances. The Women's Guild coordinated the Tea.

On the occasions of the Transfiguration of Jesus Christ and the Exhaltation of the Holy Cross, Teas were sponsored by St. John's and coordinated by the Women's Guild.

The Pastors and Parish Council extend their appreciation to the Women's Guild for assuming this additional responsibility for the benefit of our parishioners.

ARMENIAN ARTIFACTS

In 1996, additional artifacts enriched our Museum which houses the largest collection of Armenian artifacts in this country. One painting was acquired through the St. John's Artifacts Fund. Three paintings were purchased by Mr. Alex Manoogian and one by the Alex and Marie Manoogian Foundation.

81st ANNIVERSARY OF ARMENIAN GENOCIDE

On Sunday, April 28, 1996 St. John's observed the 81st Anniversary of the Armenian Genocide during the Divine Liturgy. Following the services over 500 people attended the memorial meal and program coordinated by the Parish Council and sponsored by Mr. Alex Manoogian in memory of his beloved wife Marie, on the occasion of the third year her of passing. Rev. Stuart Windsor, Director of Christian Solidarity International (CSI) in the United Kingdom was the keynote speaker, and was introduced during the program by Dr. Jean Ford, personal envoy to Baroness Cox, Deputy Speaker of the House of Lords.

ST. JOHN'S ARMENIAN CHURCH ALEX AND MARIE MANOOGIAN MUSEUM

During 1996, hundreds of visitors from throughout the United States, Canada, Europe & South America toured the eight galleries of the Alex and Marie Manoogian Museum. North America's largest Armenian Museum is known to international art patrons and historians as well as to our local universities and schools. The Museum was open on a regular basis during the entire year.

In 1996, the Museum was honored with a visit from His Holiness, Karekin I, Supreme Patriarch and Catholicos of All Armenians. A host of other dignitaries visited throughout the year including Karabagh's President Robert Kocharian and internationally known photographer, Yousef Karsh.

Guided group tours were arranged for the A.G.B.U. Alex & Marie Manoogian School, DIA Founders Society, DIA Art to the Schools, University of Michigan-Ann Arbor, Macomb Community College, Oakland Community College, Wayne State University, Henry Ford Community College, Plymouth-Salem High School, Southfield High School, Stevenson High School, Derby Middle School, St. John's Church School, A.C.Y.O.A., Summer Day Camp and dozens of area church organizations of various denominations.

Comprehensive individual tours were also provided for representatives of the Detroit Institute of Arts, Detroit Historical Museum, Toledo Art Museum, Wayne State University, and the University of Michigan as well as for the community at large.

Featured articles of interest and ancient relics from Armenia's past provide a unique glimpse of our history and create a sense of pride in our heritage.

SOCIAL CONCERN FUND

During 1996, St. John's Social Concern Fund helped thirty-five families and individuals who either sought assistance from the Church or of whose predicaments the Church was made aware. Financial assistance to these families through St. John's Social Concern Fund amounted to approximately \$10,830.00.

Again this year the funds in the Social Concern Fund were generated from the following sources: Special contributions by concerned parishioners, contributions from parishioners as a response to our appeals in the weekly Sunday Bulletins, In Lieu of Cards contributions made to send Christmas and New Year's greetings to friends and parishioners through a special Christmas Bulletin, interest from an Endowment Fund at St. John's. Funds needed to supplement these sources of income were direct contributions from St. John's Armenian Church as reflected on the line item "Social Concern" on the Expense side of our Budget. In addition, funds at the personal disposal of the pastor were dispersed to the needy.

We thank all who contributed directly or indirectly to the Social Concern Fund of St. John's.

NEIGHBORHOOD DEVELOPMENT

As of December 31, 1996, we have six parishioners who have outstanding balances totaling approximately \$23,000 principal. Interest accrued will be assessed to each account. Through the years a total of twenty parishioners have repaid the Church the full amount of financial assistance they have received. A temporary moratorium has been placed on neighborhood development loans due to lack of repayment and funds.
