*According to the decision of the 1993 Parish Assembly, annual dues of \$175.00 per individual and \$350.00 per couple must be paid no later than December 31st in order to vote at the Annual Parish Assembly. The Parish Council requests that only Registered Members of St. John's Armenian Church be present at this meeting.

**By ruling of the 1986 Parish Assembly the balloting will be closed at 9:30p.m.

RULES AND REGULATIONS CONCERNING CHURCH MEMBERSHIP

- "5. All persons who have been baptized and confirmed in the Armenian Church, who accept its doctrine, canons and rites, and who fulfill their obligations to the church and community, shall be members in good standing of the Parish Church and shall constitute the Parish Assembly.
- 6. Every member of the Parish, 18 years of age or over, shall pay to his (or her) church an annual due, the amount of which shall be determined by the Diocesan Assembly. Such amount may be increased, but not decreased by the Parish Assembly.
- 7. Members in good standing of a Parish Church, who are 18 years of age or over, may participate in the assemblies of the same parish and may vote, provided that at least six months have elapsed since the date of their registration as members of the parish and their dues have been paid. They may be eligible for office one year after becoming members, provided they have attained the age of 21.
- 8. Members who fail to pay their dues for one or more years, automatically forfeit their right to vote at Parish Assemblies or to hold elective office within the parish. Such members may reinstate these rights by payment of their dues in arrears for at least the previous two years.
- 9. No one may be a voting member in more than one parish at the same time."

Excerpted from the BY-LAWS OF THE ARMENIAN CHURCH OF AMERICA (Eastern Diocese)

RULES AND REGULATIONS GOVERNING PARISH ASSEMBLY

- "16. The Agenda of the Parish Assembly shall be prepared by the Parish Priest and the Parish Council. Other matters of new business may be added by majority vote of the Parish Assembly.
- 17. At Parish Assemblies the presence of a minimum of one-third of the eligible voting membership or fifty members shall constitute a quorum, and decisions shall be rendered by majority vote of members present and voting.
- 22. In a Parish Assembly each member shall be entitled to one vote which is not transferable and must be cast in person. In case of a tie vote the presiding officer shall cast the deciding vote or he shall authorize a second balloting upon the same question.
- 43. The Parish Priest shall preside over the meeting of the Parish Council and the Parish Assembly."

The Parish Council had 26 regular meetings. Throughout the year special meetings were held for the election of the Parish Council Executive Body, building policies and with the Diocesan Delegates.

The Very Rev. Fr. Baret Yeretzian served St. John's Armenian Church for 4 1/2 years. On Sunday, January 11, 1998, the Parish Council hosted a dinner for Fr. Baret, which coincided with the consecration by His Eminence Archbishop Khajag Barsamian of the two new side altar paintings by Zubel Kachadourian. Fr. Baret has left our Parish to assume a position at the Diocese. He will be working on the Celebration of the 100th Anniversary of the Eastern Diocese.

During this time of transition, the Parish Council will oversee the daily operations of the Church and facilities while we conduct a search for a fulltime pastor. His Eminence Archbishop Barsamian has assured us that our faithful community will not be left without pastoral care and service until we have a pastor. He has appointed Rev. Fr. Diran Papazian, a resident of our community, to take care of the spiritual needs of our Parish.

The Parish Council also chaired a number of functions during the year.

PLEDGE REPORT

In accordance with the decision of the 1993 Parish Assembly, the minimum pledge of \$175.00 per individual member and \$350 per couple was in effect during 1997. As of December 31, 1997, St. John's had 680 members paying the minimum pledge or over.

CHURCH OWNED PROPERTY

The Winora Avenue home which was sold to a parishioner on a 10 year land contract in 1990, has been paid in full in 1997.

SENIOR CITIZENS' LUNCHEONS

St. John's continued to sponsor Senior Citizens' Luncheons every Tuesday of the month as it has since 1975. In 1997, the Church held 52 luncheons, to offer the Senior Citizens of our community the opportunity to gather together with their friends and acquaintances for a relaxed luncheon and to spend the afternoon to socialize with their peers.

Mrs. Helen Mardigian has, again this year, continued to jointly subsidize this program with St. John's, as she has since the programs' inception in 1975.

The Pastor and Parish Council extend their sincere gratitude to Mrs. Helen Mardigian for her thoughtfulness, generosity, and support; to Mr. Leo Zamanigian who is present at the luncheons assisting our Senior Citizens in every way possible and to Edward Jizmejian for his dedicated services.

CHURCH PICNIC

The 38th Annual Picnic was held on Sunday, August 17, 1997 on the Church grounds immediately following Church Services. Even though the weather was inclement, excellent food and Armenian music by the Hachig Kazarian Ensemble provided an enjoyable day of fellowship for the approximate 500 people who attended.

The Women's Guild Bakery Booth prepared an outstanding assortment of Armenian and American delicacies. Women's Guild, Men's Society, and the A.C.Y.O.A. Seniors and Juniors all contributed their efforts in various capacities at the picnic.

This years picnic was chaired by Andrew Tarpinian, a member of our Parish Council. The Parish Council extends their thanks to all who participated and helped to promote the success of this annual event.

BINGO COMMITTEE

In 1997, the Bingo Committee generated \$30,620.00 for St. John's Armenian Church. The Bingo Committee operates under the chairmanship of Paul Yousoufian.

We greatly appreciate our core workers: Sara Andonian, Helen Armoudlian, John Bahadurian, Ruth Blake, Onnig Boyajian, Charlotte Boshnakian, Queenie Hazergian, George Kouzoujian, George Kudanian, Nicole Matoian, June Mekjian, Dianne Merigian, Mary Negosian, and Joyce Obenhoff. These volunteers have managed to be here on a very regular basis giving up their personal time and other commitments knowing the importance this committee has to help fulfill the needs of our community.

Other volunteers such as Rosette Bagdasarian, Dr. Vincnt Baylerian, Armen Hovnanian and Nancy Mechigian have also come to help from time to time. We appreciate their efforts.

It is important to recognize our maintenance staff who has made sure bingo is setup and ready to go every week and has taken care of many of our special needs. Our thanks to building manager Michael Schaefer and staff Phillip Sikora and Ken Greist, along with our setup crew John Draheim and Joe Patterson, Jr.

It is through this dwindling group of dedicated volunteers that we have managed to keep this fund raising project going. As far as Committees go, Bingo is the second largest contributor to the Church. We have worked hard but also have had fun and enjoyed working with each other. We need and would appreciate additional volunteers to make it easier for everyone as well as more profitable.

BAZAAR '97

The Annual Bazaar of St. John's took place during the weekend of October 11 & 12, 1997. This year's "New Wave" Bazaar had something for everyone. There were several new ideas presented for the benefit of our parishioners and the entire Armenian Community. The excitement at this year's bazaar was non-stop during the hours of the scheduled activities. We were pleased to see many new and old friends present at this year's bazaar.

The 1997 Bazaar Committee worked very hard in finalizing their plans and preparations after several meetings and parishioner suggestions to make sure that they had something for everyone.

The food was outstanding, the specialty foods and spices were going fast and there were several items for sale as well as a Silent Auction and raffle opportunities. There was live Armenian music and a variety of activities for all ages.

The success of the "New Wave" Bazaar was the result of the untiring efforts of our Church Organizations, volunteers and a committee that was dedicated to making this bazaar the best ever. A profit of \$35,342 was the result of this outstanding effort.

The Pastor and Parish Council extend their appreciation to Co-Chairmen Souren Keoleian and John Semizian, committee members and volunteers for making this major fund-raising event a success for the operating budget of our parish. ST. JOHN'S ARMENIAN CHURCH EDWARD & HELEN MARDIGIAN LIBRARY

Researchers and the general public have regularly utilized the facilities offered by the Edward and Helen Mardigian Library throughout 1997. The library currently houses over 6,000 books in Armenian, English, French and German. Since there is available shelving for 50,000 titles, parishioners have been encouraged to donate books on Armenian subjects. During 1997, the Edward & Helen Mardigian Endowment Fund has purchased 48 additional books bringing the new total of books purchased since the inception of the endowment plan to 608 volumes. The collection includes many rare and very valuable editions. In addition, 250 books and periodicals in the Armenian and English languages were donated during the past year by parishioners and friends. Our thanks to all donors.

Although books cannot be checked out of the library at the present time, comfortable reading areas are provided for the convenience of those who wish to conduct research or read books or Armenian newspapers for pleasure.

Computers in the library have also been in constant use throughout the year for desktop publishing and publicity.

FUN & FUND RAISING COMMITTEE

The Fund Raising Committee was originally formed in February, 1996 to raise money for the Church. From the beginning the committee members felt it was more important to first get parishioners more active. Therefore, they have made it their mission to sponsor at least 3 activities each year that will foster fellowship in our community by bringing parishioners as well as whole families together to perpetuate our Armenian heritage in a Christian environment. The "Fund" Raising side of this committee is also still actively working on a long range goal to develop at least one new method of raising funds that will assist in insuring the long term financial stability of St. John's Armenian Church.

The Fun Raising Committee followed up after the three very successful events of 1996, by celebrating a second year of equally successful events. The functions held in 1997 were:

On Friday, January 31, 1997, a talent show, STARS OF THE FUTURE, was co-chaired by Marianne Dardarian and Annette Mamassian. There were 350 in the audience with 20 performances by 43 children and 6 adults, as well as the committee participating in the show.

On Friday, April 11, 1997, the COUNTRY WESTERN DANCE was chaired by Lazarus and Connie Surabian. There were 330 adults and children participating in an evening of food, dance, dance instructions, jail lock-up, photographs and party favors.

On Friday, September 12, 1997, the 2nd ANNUAL FAMILY DANCE was chaired by Bob and Kim Simonian. There were 425 adults and children participating in an evening of food, both live Armenian and disc jockey American music, dancing, photographs and party favors.

The Fun and Fund Raising Committee consists of a very creative and active group of 58 diverse parishioners willing to volunteer without being asked and is open to anyone interested in joining.

This year we have transferred \$2,500 to the church.

ST. JOHN'S BASKETBALL PROGRAM

Monday Night Men's Basketball League runs from October to April with Robert Simonian as Coordinator.

St. John's Men's Orthodox Team runs from October to April with Roy Callan as the coach.

Wednesday Night Youth Basketball, a source for St. John's Orthodox League Teams, runs from October to April: Girls team, Junior Boys team and Intermediate Boys team are led by Coaches, Bill Derderian, Lisa Mardigian, Jack Karakashian and David Nolff.

Thursday Night Youth Basketball, a source for St. John's Orthodox League Teams, runs from October to April. Teams are: Biddy A, Biddy B-1, Biddy B-2, led by Coaches, Roy Callan, Tom Banks, and David Dardarian.

Thursday Night Youth Basketball Clinic runs from October to April. Spe-

cial thanks to Tom Banks and Lisa Mardigian for coordinating this enjoyable activity for the children of our community.

The general Coordinator of the Basketball Program is Lisa Mardigian. The Sunday concession stand is coordinated and operated by Lisa Mardigian & Almas Derderian. Thank you to our devoted mothers and fathers who also help out.

The Pastor and the Parish Council extend their appreciation to all who have volunteered to make St. John's Basketball Program a success.

IN LIEU OF FLOWERS FUTURE MAINTENANCE PROVISION OF ST. JOHN'S

As approved by the Parish Assembly of 1997, all the In Lieu of Flowers donations payable to St. John's Armenian Church of Greater Detroit as the beneficiary, are dedicated and designated to the future maintenance provision of the Church as shown on the balance sheet under Building Maintenance Funds.

The policy states: That all checks should be made payable to the Church and that only the donations payable to the Church will be acknowledged in the Torch Bearer.

Checks made payable to St. John's Armenian Church will not be divided among any other charities or funds.

Checks received for "in-lieu-of-flowers" funds, that are not payable to St. John's will be forwarded to the families for delivery to the proper organization. St. John's will not maintain records or acknowledge any donation not payable to St. John's.

Endowments cannot be established with "in-lieu-of-flowers" funds, but families may continue to establish endowments with their own private funds.

All of our mechanical systems, the physical structures, furniture, and our grounds reflect the wear of the over thirty years of usage by our community and now requires constant attention for the repair and replacement to the physical plant.

We thank all our parishioners and friends who designate St. John's Armenian Church as the beneficiary for In Lieu of Flowers donations. Their thoughtfulness assists us in meeting the on-going needs of maintenance and renovation of our Church and Cultural Complex.

NEIGHBORHOOD DEVELOPMENT

As of December 31, 1997, we have two parishioners who have outstanding balances totaling approximately \$10,800 in principal. Through the years, a total of approximately twenty-three parishioners have received financial assistance. The Parish Council has terminated the program of granting new neighborhood development loans as of January, 1998.

BUILDING REPORT

During 1997, the Church Cultural Building continued to be used by the Church and Church Organizations as well as for rental purposes by individual parishioners, Armenian Organizations and non-Church members.

Church Organizations used the Hall 15.38% of the total weekend days used in 1997 and contributed 4.02% of the weekend income. Armenian Organizations used the Hall 2.56% of the weekend days used, while contributing 2.11% of the weekend income. The parishioners used the Hall 8.97% of the weekend days used, while contributing 10.75% of weekend income. Outsiders rented the Hall 73.8% of the weekend days used and contributed 83.13% of the total income. Our 1997 building operations net was 229,169.00, an increase of \$22,995.00 over 1996.

Major renovations in the Church complex included installation of a completely new HVAC (heat, ventilation and air conditioning) system in our main hall. The new system consists of 4 new 25 ton roof top units for both heat and air conditioning. The temporary connection that had been made to the museum and library air conditioner has now been disconnected and that unit has been serviced and restored to its normal operation and function.

The parking lot and road ways which service the church, cultural center, museum, library, recreation center and the A.G.B.U. Alex & Marie Manoogian School have been completed and resurfaced. A new walkway has been installed across the center island leading to the Martyr's Monument in front of the cultural center and some existing sidewalk slabs have been replaced. The above items (parking lot, main hall air conditioner and heating, and walkways) have been underwritten by the Armenian Apostolic Society at a cost of approximately \$400,000.

Our Church main entrance doors were also refinished and weather proofed. In addition, the exterior wood entrance doors to the main museum and library have been refinished.

The Recreation Center dining hall lobby and restrooms will be updated and the ceiling in the lobby, coat room and club room have been repainted as a first step in the refurbishing project of that building.

Parishioners and friends gathered to exchange Easter greetings with friends and acquaintances. The Women's Guild coordinated the Tea.

Teas were also held on the following occasions in 1997- Armenian Christmas Eve and Mrs. Helen Armoudlian's retirement.

In July, on the first anniversary of the passing of Mr. Alex Manoogian, a tea was served following Church Services.

The Pastor and Parish Council extend their appreciation to the Women's Guild for assuming the responsibility of coordinating the teas for the benefit of our parishioners. Also special thanks to our A.C.Y.O.A. Seniors and Juniors for sponsoring our Christmas Eve Tea.

ARMENIAN ARTIFACTS

In 1997, additional artifacts enriched our Museum which houses the largest collection of Armenian artifacts in this country. One 19th century Karabagh rug was donated by Mr. & Mrs. Edgar Hagopian. Four textiles were acquired from anonymous donors.

YOUTH COORDINATOR

St. John's Youth Coordinator, Lisa Mardigian, continued her responsibilities in 1997 by assisting the Pastor, Church School, A.C.Y.O. Juniors, A.C.Y.O.A. Seniors, Torch Bearer and other Church Organizations.

Lisa coordinated the assemblies for the Youth and Young Adults during the visit of Lady Caroline Cox for the 82nd Anniversary of the Genocide and also coordinated the refreshments which followed. She also coordinated the 9th annual Walk for Armenia in which dedicated walkers generated over \$5,000 for our motherland. She helped organize the A.C.Y.O. Project Youth efforts in sponsoring the Lenten Fish Dinners and a Lobster Dinner, and also arranged the Juniors Ski & Cedar Point trips along with other local activities. She coordinated the A.C.Y.O. Juniors and Seniors active participation in the operation of the Bazaar Snackshop, Church Picnic and Paregentan beverage stand. She assisted the A.C.Y.O.A. 


