

The Annual Meeting of the Holy Cross Armenian Church of Union City, New Jersey was called to order by Mr. John Hovsepian, Chairman of the Parish Council, at 1:45 PM on Sunday, January 27, 1974 in the Church Center in the presence of 71 parishioners. Rev. Fr. Vartan Megherian, Pastor, opened the meeting with a prayer.

Mr. Hovsepian thanked the members of the Food Committee for the preparation of the dinner for the members of the Parish Assembly.

AGENDA:

1. ELECTION OF OFFICERS - Mr. Philip Arpiarian and Mrs. Mary Chertaf were elected Chairman and Secretary of the Assembly, respectively.

A motion followed and was seconded and carried that the balloting for election of Parish Council members be closed at 2 PM.

Chairman suggested first order of business to be the reading of Minutes of the previous meeting. Motion made to limit said reading to commence on page 7, beginning with the annual report. Motion seconded and carried.

2. MINUTES OF LAST ASSEMBLY - The Chairman asked the Secretary of the Parish Council, Mr. Richard Kalbian to partially read minutes of the 1973 Parish Assembly. Motion was made, seconded and carried that the minutes be accepted as read.

3. REPORT OF PASTOR - Father Vartan Megherian read his report to the Assembly.

4. REPORT OF PARISH COUNCIL - Mr. Kalbian was called upon again to read the Annual Report of the Parish Council.

5. AUDITING COMMITTEE REPORT - Mr. Armen Kalbian presented the report of the Auditing Committee.

6. LADIES AID REPORT - Mrs. Tukmanian was called upon and presented the Annual Report of the Ladies Aid.

7. LADIES EDUCATIONAL SOCIETY - Motion was made and carried to waive reading of report and accepted.

8. MEN'S CLUB - The Chairman read the report of the Men's Club.

9. ANNUAL BUDGET FOR 1974 - Mr. Armen Kalbian read the Annual Budget for 1974.

10. SUNDAY SCHOOL - Yeretzgin reported on the Sunday School - its progress and success.

11. CHOIR ANNUAL REPORT - Motion carried to waive reading of Choir Annual Report.

12. Charles Sarajian submitted the following figures, which were incorporated in the Minutes:

13. CONSIDERATION OF PROPOSALS -

A. Motion made and carried requesting that a proposal be submitted from the Holy Cross Armenian Church to the Diocesan Assembly that Bingo be permitted as a means of raising funds for the Church property.

B. Motion made to increase ANTICIPATED INCOME by adding to the same thereto, a line labeled "Stewardship" \$2,000, as additional income.

C. On last year's motion to spend up to but not to exceed 3,000, motion made to increase repair and paint to interior of church from 1,500 to 3,000, to take care of repairs and any other requirements necessary for repairs to be completed. Motion carried.

14. ELECTIONS - The Nominating Committee consisted of Richard Assoian, Zaven Hovsepian and Paul Takakjian. 95 ballots were cast and the results were reported as follows, each for a two-year term:

During 1974 our parish, as a whole, rounded out another year of productive living. Each of the organs of that body performed its functions in its own way, which is indicative of its health and well-being. Although no spectacular events took place, our church gave spiritual, social and cultural nourishment to our community. The organizations of the parish achieved successful results in every way this year; their annual reports confirm this statement. I am happy to say that your pastor used this year to know his parish more closely, and this became a cause for stronger ties to exist between pastor and parish, hence a feeling of oneness.

In the area of spiritual activities, Divine Liturgy was celebrated and sermon delivered by me every Sunday (with the exception of vacation time) and on various feasts which fell on weekdays; namely, the eves of Theophany and Easter, Theophany (January 6), St. Vartanantz, Maundy Thursday and Ascension Day. Lenten Arevakal services and Wednesday eve peace and rest services were also held. This year, again, Christmas Eve Candlelight service was held in English which was well received and well attended. I would like to take this opportunity to extend my thanks to our Arch-deacon, Dr. Krikor Maksoudian, not only for his participation in the services, but also for his help to me in delivering sermons from time to time. My appreciation goes also to our Choirmaster, Ann Dadaian, her assistant, Arpena Sbarbaro, our organists, Lucy Socvajian, Dawn Foronjy, Vartan Sarkisian, and to all the choir members, as well as to the altar servers, Stolebeareres, Mardiros Katoonagian, Krikor Bendian, Hagop Hovsepian and Tom Dabakian, who, being present every Sunday at the worship services, added to the embellishment thereof. I have words of thanks also to Nubar Dorian, Philip Arpiarian, Zaven Hovsepian and Lud Shahbazian who, according to my request, shared with me and Deacon Maksoudian the devotionals given on consecutive Wednesdays during the Lenten services.

During 1974, I have performed 4 Baptisms, 10 weddings and 29 funerals. It is significant that we have had more baptisms and weddings this year than we had last year. This is gladdening and promising to me, and I am sure, to you also. I have had more occasions for pastoral counseling this year as a result of our parishioners getting to know their pastor more closely. I have been able to assist them in making arrangements for social service. In addition, I have considered it a paramount duty to console our sick and elderly by visiting them and by administering Holy Communion, either at the hospitals, in the homes, or at the Armenian Home for the Aged in Emerson.

In the field of cultural activity, I have considered it part and parcel of my work to give talks to the organizations of the parish, enlightening them on Armenian traditions and church doctrines. I have also been instrumental in in seeing to it that invited guests also gave talks on performances, such as "Arshin Malalan" sponsored by the Ladies Educational Society and The Ani Song and Dance Ensemble at the celebration of the 40th Anniversary of the Women's Guild. During 1974, I assumed the supervision of the Mesrobian Armenian School, as well as serving as teacher of the oldest pupils, and I have given Armenian history lessons to the entire student body.

It is fitting to mention here also that every effort has been made for the progress of the church Sunday School. I take this opportunity to express my thanks to Superintendent Yeretzgin Yefkin Megherian and to the staff of the Sunday School, as well as to the teachers of the Armenian School for their dedication.

In the area of administrative activity, my presence at the meetings of the Parish Council and Parish auxiliaries has been a part of my work. The daily routines of the office work, including record keeping and correspondence have been done regularly. On this occasion, I would like to thank Ann Dadaian, Sylvia Bozoyan and Zarmi Megherian, who willingly and voluntarily carry out the secretarial tasks of the office. In addition, I have taken on the responsibility of editing our church paper, VISION. My thanks goes to Mrs. Anne Hachadoorian for regularly providing Community items. The offset printing and folding jobs have been done gratis, upon my request, by Mr. Ephriam Keurian and Mr. Dominick Capodiferro, who, although not members of the parish, nevertheless deserve our public thanks once again. The English typesetting of the last two issues and as many future ones as possible, is the contribution of Mr. Harold Paragian of our parish whom we thank on this occasion.

It has been a pleasure to work with our Church Organizations whose devotion and sacrifice to our Holy Church deserve our every appreciation. The Women's Guild form the pillar of our church. The Ladies Educational Society is devoted to the Armenian School and takes pride in seeing to it that the school remains always open. The Men's Club had a well-programmed successful activity during 1974, inviting their wives also to their meetings and events. The ACYOA also completed a year full of activities. It is worthy to mention their coffee hour after the Divine Liturgy every Sunday which serves to create a warm fellowship among the parishioners. My appreciation and praise goes to all our parishioners and organizations, especially to our hard-working and devoted ladies as well as to the Parish Council members and Diocesan Delegates; may God reward them all for their efforts and dedication on behalf of our church.

In general, people measure success by monetary income. Thank God we no longer have a financial crisis. However, for me the importance lies in having a spiritual atmosphere in which the children of the church feel brotherly love toward each other. Visitors to our church have expressed to me that, despite the small numbers of our parish, they have seen more faithful worshipping, and they have felt spiritually enriched and inspired everytime they attended our worship services. This testimony I consider my greatest reward.

May the Lord Himself illumine our paths so that we, with full appreciation of our duties, may walk toward the future and toward His glory.

A. ANNUAL CHURCH PICNIC - under the fine leadership of Herbert Takakjian, Leon Boghosian and Gregory Shenloogian the picnic was very successful in spite of the inopportune rain that prevailed.

B. ANNUAL BAZAAR - Thanks to the continued diligence and untiring efforts of Co-Chairmen George Atamian and Charles Apkarian, a record \$9,500. was raised. Imaginative sidewalk sales and unique contributions were instrumental in adding to the magnificent cuisine prepared by the Women's Guild and Ladies Educational Society. Special thanks are in order for each volunteer who worked in merchandise, food and game booths, raffle sellers, ticket. distributors and refreshment booths. Particular remembrance to Mary Ann Baruchian Aram Atamian and Dolores Apkarian who prepared 450 lahmajouns by themselves with the assistance of the Toufayan Bakery. Vay Najarian must be singly cited for his very timely and generous contributions.

C. SACRAMENTS & PRAYERS - The following Sacraments have been celebrated by Father Vartan and have been duly recorded in the 1974 Parish Registry:

- 4. Home blessings were also performed according to the needs and requests of the parishioners.

D. RELIGIOUS AND CULTURAL ACTIVITIES. During the year, Father Vartan presented lectures on the Armenian Church to the auxiliary organizations. During Lent, Wednesday evenings, devotionals were given by our Der Hayr, Dr. Krikor Maksoudian, Nubar Dorian, Zaven Hovsepian, Philip Arpiarian and Lud Shahbazian.

E. PUBLICATIONS & OFFICE WORK. Our Parish Paper, the VISION was published eleven times (11) during the year. The editorial work was done by Der Hayr and Mrs. Anne Hachadoorian who worked cooperatively preparing news items as they became current while Miss Zarmi Megherian did the typing. In addition, many special bulletins, announcements and invitations were mailed to some 600 recipients.

The Parish Council welcomes the assistance of all parishioners who would like to help in the publication work of the church office and urges all church organizations to submit articles for publication in the VISION.

Along with the preparation of all news publications, Der Hayr spent many office hours keeping correspondence in both English and Armenian.

F. VISITATIONS. Throughout the year, Der Hary made an effort to visit parishioners on different occasions and administered to the needs of the sick at the following hospitals: North Hudson Hospital, Christ Hospital, St. Mary's Hospital, Hackensack Hospital, Englewood Hospital, Bergen Pines Hospital, Mountainside Hospital and Holy Name Hospital. Der Hayr also visited the sick at their homes. In addition, he was helpful in finding housing and legal help for parishioners who required such assistance and assisted in handling hospitalization problems.

G. ENVELOPE SYSTEM - There are now 81 parishioners who are making weekly contributions through the Envelope System in 1974. Through this system, the Church has realized the sum of \$1,964.95.

H. PARISH CENSUS - Under the supervision of Richard Hachadoorian, the Census Report was thoroughly and completely prepared, New policy regulations were recommended by the committee and adopted as guide lines by the Parish Council to determine the best methods of servicing our church community.

I. CHURCH ORGANIZATIONS - Throughout the year, the following organizations worked with dedication and in harmony to enrich the life of our Parish: The Women's Guild, Ladies Educational Society, Sunday School, ACYOA, Men's Club and the Choir. We thank all the Executive Officers and their respective memberships for their continuous dedication.

J. DIOCESAN DELEGATES - Together with Der Hayr, our Diocesan Delegates Deran Chopoorian, Nubar Dorian, Richard Hachadoorian, Lud Shahbazian, and Edward Turnamian attended the Annual Diocesan Assembly held May 3 and 4 at the Diocesan Headquarters in New York, N. Y., and reported to the Parish Council. On many occasions, they have also attended Parish Council meetings and have made many useful contributions for which we thank them.

K. BUILDINGS AND MAINTENANCE - Mr. Deran Chopoorian, Chairman of the Building Maintenance Committee, made certain that proper upkeep was maintained on all Parish facilities; our caretaker, Mr. Pablo Taura, has been outstanding in carrying out his duties.

L. WORSHIP - Church Services and Divine Liturgy were held every Sunday. During Lent, Evening Services were conducted on Wednesdays. The sermons were delivered in both Armenian and English. During the absence of our Der Hayr, who was away on vacation, guest clergy, Very Rev. Muron Gurjikian and Rev. Artoon Sempadian, officiated in our church on July 27 and August 4.

Pupil Activities

1. Special attention has been given this year to training and teaching our pupils about participation in and understanding of the Divine Liturgy. It is gratifying to report that progress is being made in this effort.

CENSUS REPORT

A Community Census was taken to establish the membership of our Church. Approximately 600 letters of inquiry were issued to those on our VISION mailing list with 172 responding affirmatively that they were parisioners of Holy Cross Armenian Church, Union City, New Jersey.

This was not considered final after a review was made of the names of those who did not reply to the inquiry. A cursory review of the names revealed that over 50% were active members of our Church. Therefore, it was deemed advisable to use the results of the Community Census as a mucleus in arriving at an equitable membership list.

Statistics were compiled on Church contributions from 1971 through the first half 1974 which covered Christmas, Easter, Holy Cross Week pledges and our Pledge Envelope system.

Parish Council members were in accord that our parishioners should not be assessed an additional \$15.00 for dues but to apply the first \$15.00 of their yearly contributions to be considered a donation.

If a parishioner did not donate \$15.00 over the year then other factors were taken into consideration, such as senior citizens, active or inactive. In addition to the foregoing, case by case factors over and above each category established below, were taken into consideration in arriving at our Church membership.

The following categories were developed and used as a guideline in reviewing the 1971-1974 contribution statistics thereby arriving at a reasonable conclusion as to the membership of our Church.

Categories:

- Parishioners who have donated Christmas, Easter, Holy Cross Week Pledge and Pledge system and have contributed an amount equal to or exceeding their dues. = (257)
- Parishioners who have donated substantial amounts far in excess of their dues which also adequately covers their son and/or daughter (18 or over) membership. = (51)

- Parishioners who have donated less than amount required for dues, however, attend Church occasionally and contribute by means of plate collection. = (19)
- 4. Parishioners who did not donate at anytime but attend Church regularly and contribute by means of plate collection. = (0)
- Parishioners who in the 1972 census responded affirmatively as to their membership in our Church, however, did not contribute at any time, their donations limited to plate collection. = (0)
- 6. (Senior Citizens) Parishioners who have contributed nominally over the years and attend church regularly contributing by means of the plate collection. = (48)
- Parishioners who have donated periodically over the past four (4) years, donations nominal, attend church occasionally and participate in plate collection. = (55)
- Note: Category $\underline{3}$ Parishioners' donations larger than Category $\underline{7}$ and for this reason the separate category.

Total Number Parishioners - 430.

In the event the report, as submitted, is not acceptable, then the only recourse is to stay strictly within the Diocesan By-Laws and assess each member \$15.00 dues if they desire to participate in the Annual Church Assembly with the right to vote.
