### 1990 ANNUAL PARISH ASSEMBLY MEETING FEBRUARY 3, 1991

The Annual Parish Meeting was called to order by Acting President Rev. Fr. Carnig Hallajian at 11:45AM who turned the chair over to the Mr. Nubar Dorian, Chairman of the Parish Council, for the election of Assembly Chairman and Secretary. Mr. Armen Kalbian and Mr. Philip Arpiarian were elected Chairman and Secretary, respectively.

Mr. Kalbian adjourned the meeting which was to be reconvened at the Church Center after lunch.

The meeting was reconvened at 1:05PM by the Chairman. Motion made and passed to close the balloting at 1:30PM.

### PARISH COUNCIL REPORT

Mr. Philip Arpiarian, Secretary of the Parish Council, presented the report and commented specifically on the actions taken by the Parish Council regarding the motions passed at last year's Annual Meeting (refer to Old Business in these minutes) and the Priest Search Committee's activities.

A motion was made and passed to accept the Parish Council Report and the Minutes of the 1989 Parish Assembly.

### **ANCILLARY ORGANIZATION REPORTS**

WOMEN'S GUILD - Ms. Arpena Sbarbaro, Chairperson, reviewed the report and closed by announcing a donation of \$5,000 on behalf of the Guild to the Parish Treasury.

LADIES EDUCATIONAL SOCIETY - Mrs. Alice Najarian, Chairperson, addressed the assembly regarding the inability of the organization to continue to support the Armenian School and that the problem will be discussed as new business.

SUNDAY SCHOOL - Parishioners reviewed the report. There were no comments.

CHOIR - Parishioners reviewed the report. There were no comments.

SENIOR CITIZENS CLUB - Mrs. Mary Kaprielian made a plea for more members.

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Motion made and passed accepting the Ancillary Organization reports.

Being 1:30PM, the Chairman announced that the ballot box was closed and invited the Nominating Committee to count the ballots.

### **AUDITING COMMITTEE REPORT**

Mr. Armen Kalbian as Chairman of the Auditing Committee reported that the books of all organizations were examined and found to be in order. On behalf of the committee he thanked the Treasurers of the organizations for their good work.

### **1991 BUDGET**

Mr. Harold Azmelian, Treasurer of the Parish Council, presented the Proposed Budget, discussing each item line by line. Motion was made and passed approving the Proposed Budget as presented.

### PERMANENT ENDOWMENT FUND

Mr. Harold Azmelian, Chairman of the Endowment Fund, presented the report. He announced that the Fund earned over \$50,000 in interest during the past year. In response to a questions regarding the Betty Nalband Estate, Mr. Azmelian informed the assembly that the house was in the process of being sold. A full report will be made after the will has been fully executed and settled.

### **OLD BUSINESS**

1. Appointment of our Investment Committee to administer the Endowment Fund:

"The Parish Council appointed Armen Kalbian and Philip Arpiarian. Mr. Harold Azmelian was appointed Chairman in accordance with the dictates of the 1989 Assembly."

2. Develop a set of titles which would recognize the donations of donors to the Endowment Fund:

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"Mr. Azmelian presented the titles - Sponsor (\$10,000 or more), Benefactor (\$5,000 to \$9,990), Supporter (\$1,000 to \$4,900) and Patron (\$500 to \$999)."

Following a brief discussion, the Assembly made and passed a motion rescinding the requirement for the recognition titles.

3. Increase the dues-paying membership:

"The Pledge Committee sent letters and made telephone calls. There was no significant increase in membership. Presently 24 families made pledges and 60 parishioners are using the weekly envelopes."

### **NEW BUSINESS**

- 1. ENDOWMENT FUND Mr. Harold Azmelian recommended that an annual hokehankisd be held for all the deceased and prayers for long life for all the donors to the Endowment Fund. Motion made and passed accepting the above recommendation.
- 2. MESROBIAN ARMENIAN SCHOOL Mr. Nubar Dorian reviewed the situation regarding the inability of the Ladies Educational Society to support the Armenian School. Following a short discussion the following motion was made and passed:
- a. Ladies Educational Society funds to be placed in the Endowment Fund.
- b. A new committee within the Parish Council Mesrobian Armenian School Board be formed to
  administer the Armenian School.
- c. The Parish Council will use the interest from the Endowment Fund and Parish funds to support the Armenian School.

Mr. Nubar Dorian asked the Assembly to acknowledge Mrs. Alice Najarian for her dears of dedicated service to the Armenian School.

3. ANNUAL CHRISTMAS PARTY - Motion made and passed to re-instate the annual Christmas Party in the memory of Mrs. Betty Nalband.

- 4. ARMENIAN MISSIONARY WORK Mr. Nubar Dorian and Rev. Fr. Carnig Hallajian informed the Assembly of a new crisis taking place in Armenia --- specifically: with the onset of glasnost and the existing construction as a result of the earthquake, many Christian religious cults and sects are in Armenia trying to win over the Armenian population who are starving for religion. Unfortunately, the Armenian Church was unprepared to satisfy the need for religious education. In response to this need, two committees have been set up; one in Armenia and one by Primate Khajag Barsamian to start immediately in the preparation of literature to be distributed in Armenia. Fr. Carnig is the Chairman of this Committee whose responsibilities include:
  - preparation of literature
  - training of priests in Armenia to function as Parish priest.
  - establishment of summer camps for the Armenian youth where they will receive instruction on the Armenian Church.
  - training of adults to teach religion in Armenian Schools.

Motion was made and passed authorizing a donation of \$15,000 to the Missionary Committee and to underwrite all Father Carnig's air fare expenses to Armenia on missionary business.

1990 PARISH ASSEMBLY - The Minutes of the Parish Assembly held on February 3, 1991 are included in the Annual Report booklet. Two new business issues were discussed at the Assembly which required action by the Parish Council.

- a. Endowment Fund Prayers for donors - Hokehankisd prayers for the deceased donors and prayers of thanksgiving for the living donors were offered on January 27, 1992.
- b. <u>Armenian Schools</u> - Alice Yigitkurt was appointed as the Chairperson of the Armenian School with the Parish Council members acting as the committee. The Ladies Educational Society funds were transferred to the Endowment Fund in September.

<u>PARISH PRIEST</u> - The Search Committee requested that the Primate provide names of candidates for the position of Parish Priest. There were no names submitted.

During the past year the Divine Liturgy was celebrated every Sunday by Rev. Fr. Carnig Halfajian and other visiting clergy.

Until a permanent Parish Priest is available, the Search Committee with the approval of the Parish Council have made the following arrangements to insure that the Holy Badarak is performed every Sunday and that the needs of the parishioners are attended to:

- a. Rev. Fr. Carnig Hallajian has agreed to perform the Holy Badarak for twenty-six weeks of the year and all the special services during Easter and Christmas. Father Carnig will also direct the activities relating to the VISION and the Sunday Bulletin.
- b. Rev. Fr. Arnak Kasparian has agreed to perform the Badarak for twenty-six weeks of the year. Father Arnak, along with Father Carnig, will attend to the needs of the Parish.
- c. Fathers Carnig and Arnak will work out the details of the schedules.

<u>CHURCH PROPERTIES</u> - Harold Azmelian and Pablo Taura, caretaker, continually monitored the condition of the Church, the Church Center, the Parish House and the Church Center. During the year the following repairs were made:

- 1. Church No major expenses. The floor in annex stripped and repainted by Pablo Taura.
- 2. Church Center
  - a. Dishwasher repaired
  - b. Floor stripped and refinished
- 3. Parish House
  - a. Boiler repaired
  - b. new folding machine
  - c. renovations to caretaker's apartment

<u>FATHER CARNIG HALLAJIAN</u> - On June 16, 1991, the Holy Cross Church vert proudly hosted a dinner on the occasion of the elevation of Father Carnig to the rank of Avak Kahana. In attendance were Bishop Khajag Barsamian, Primate, several bishops from throughout the world and all the friends of Father Carnig. Despite the heat, 280 people were in attendance. On this occasion, holy Cross made a gift of \$2,500.00 to Father Carnig.

<u>BAZAAR/PICNIC</u> - Both functions were successful socially as well as financially. The parishioners owe a debt of gratitude to the Chairpersons and all the workers who helped tirelessly to make the events both enjoyable and profitable. Next year's picnic will be conducted jointly with St. Leon Armenian Church in Fair Lawn. Zaven Hovsepian has been appointed the liaison and will work out the details regarding the jobs to be performed by each Parish.

<u>RAFFLE</u> - The 50/50 Raffle was held in September (much cooler weather). As in the past over 95% of the tickets were sold. There were 85 people in attendance at the drawing. We are indeed fortunate to have so many friends and parishioners who so generously support our fund raising activities.

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<u>VISION</u> - Another record year, twelve issues were published and distributed. Our many thanks to the contributors and editors who give of their time to keep us informed of what's happening in our parish.

ARMENIAN SCHOOL - There are currently 23 students enrolled in the Armenian School. The Armenian School operations have been formally transferred to the Parish Council. All funds were received and deposited to the Endowment Fund. Alice Yigitkurt is the Chairman and Superintendent.

<u>SUNDAY SCHOOL</u> - Sylvia Bozoyan continues to teach the four or five students who attend Sunday School. It was with feeling of gratitude that the community recognized Sylvia's contributions with a special ceremony in September at which time a cross was presented to her on behalf of the Parish. Following the ceremony, refreshments were served in the Annex. Ms. Elyse Antreassian, representing the DRE presented a gift to Sylvia on behalf of the Diocese.

ORGAN FUND DRIVE - The Organ Fund Drive has officially ended. Our thanks to Mary Shalakian for her tremendous work in collecting funds. The Parish Council will place a plaque in a suitable location with the names of all those who donated \$100.00 or more to the Fund.
