1993 ANNUAL PARISH ASSEMBLY MEETING FEBRUARY 6, 1994

The Annual Parish Assembly Meeting was convened immediately following Church Services in the Church at 12:15PM.

The Chairman of the Parish Council, Zaven Hovsepian, asked for nominations for Chairman of the Parish Assembly and Secretary. Mr. Nubar Dorian and Philip Arpiarian were unanimously elected Chairman and Secretary, respectively.

The meeting was adjourned to the Church Center and reconvened at 1:20PM. Our pastor, the Very Rev. Vazken Karayan, presided as President.

The Chairman requested a motion to close the ballot box. Motion was made and passed to close the balloting at 1:30 PM.

The Chairman dispensed with the reading of the minutes from the last year's Annual Meeting and proceeded to the presentation of the Parish Council report.

The Parish Council Chairman, Zaven Hovsepian, reviewed the minutes highlighting the acknowledgements. He then asked if there were any questions. There being none, Mr. Dorian then asked our Parish Priest, the very Rev. Vazken Karayan for his report.

Hayr Soorp began by expressing that he was glad to be our new pastor. He then proceeded to outline his objectives:

- plans to conduct visitations to familiarize himself with the parishioners.
- •Sunday and Armenian Schools commented on the dedication of the teachers. His goals are to increase enrollment. He is introducing Christian education into the Armenian School curriculum and will also include social activities.
- within the next six to eight months he will try to reorganize the ACYOA.
- train acolytes to read scriptures during church services.
- made requests to Fr. Chevian, Diocesan Youth Coordinator, for materials and videos
- Senior Citizens will attend meetings, use videos for education on various topics relating to seniors.
- Expand the VISION inclusion of monthly message from the parish priest and encourage input from parishioners.
- organization of a junior choir.
- establishment of a membership committee

Mr. Dorian invited the various Church organizations to present their reports.

<u>WOMEN'S GUILD</u>: Ms. Arpena Sbarbaro pointed out the highlights of the Guild activities, making special mention of the work that Mrs. Lucy Ganguzza and Ms. Mary Shalakian did in raising \$2,100 for the Armenian Missionary Fund. Finally, Ms. Sbarbaro presented a \$5,000 check to the Parish Council Treasurer.

ARMENIAN SCHOOL: Mrs. Alice Yigitkurt presented the report. She advised the assembly that Hayr Soorp was teaching the graduating class and has also introduced religious education.

SUNDAY SCHOOL: Mr. Dorian invited those assembled to read the report.

<u>SENIOR CITIZENS</u>: Mr. Dorian informed the Assembly that the Senior Citizens donated \$500 to the Parish Treasury.

CHOIR: Mr. Dorian invited those assembled to read the report.

TREASURER'S REPORT: Mr. Harold Azmelian reviewed the Receipts and Disbursements, pointing out reductions in our Dues/Pledges/Plate Collections. Last year, the Parish Assembly voted to donate \$15,000 to the Armenian Missionary Fund. Unfortunately, only \$11,368 was collected -- the shortfall resulted in an unexpected disbursement. In summary, cash position has been reduced to \$7,142, the lowest in our recent history.

ENDOWMENT FUND: Mr. Azmelian presented the latest status of the Fund. The interest realized was 8-1/2% for the year 1993 making the current market value of the fund \$1,323,064.

Mr. Dorian commended all the organizations for their efforts during the past year.

Mrs. Dawn Donofrio, the Audit Committee chairperson, reported that all the Treasurer's Reports were in order. She commented on the diligence of the treasurers in performing their duties.

Motion was made and passed expressing the appreciation and gratitude of the Parishioners for the work done by the members of the various Parish Organizations.

<u>NEW BUSINESS</u>: Mr. Dorian introduced the following recommendations from the Parish Council:

1. Membership Dues - increase the dues from \$25 to \$50. Following a discussion, a motion was made and passed to increase the dues to \$50.

Motion was made to require a separate donation specifically designated as membership dues. During the discussions Hayr Soorp advised the Assembly that this matter would be resolved by the membership committee. Accordingly, the motion was withdrawn.

- 2. Donation to Seminary In the past, \$3,000 was donated to the St. Nersess Seminary. This year, it is recommended that \$1,500 and \$1,000 be donated to St. Nersess and St. James (Jerusalem) respectively. Motion was made and passed approving donations.
- 3. Renovation and office equipment Recommendations to renovate a) the rest rooms in the Church; b) the Parish Office; and c) purchase of new computer. Motion was made and passed approving these expenditures.
- Armenian Missionary Fund Recommendation to have a goal of \$15,000 to be raised through special projects. However, donation to Fund to be limited to the amount raised. Motion was made and passed accordingly.
- 5. Recommendation made by Armen Kalbian to reduce the number of members on the Parish Council because of the decrease in parish membership and lack of interest on the part of parishioners. Motion made and passed to have the Parish Council discuss the question.

There being no other New Business, Mr. Dorian invited Mr. Azmelian to review the proposed 1994 Budget (copy attached.) Mr. Azmelian pointed out that the budget included the costs for the items approved during the new business discussions. Furthermore, the shortfall of Receipts is to be made up by withdrawing interest from the Endowment Fund. Motion made and passed accepting the Budget and authorizing the use of money from the Endowment Fund.

ELECTION RESULTS

Mr. Dorian asked the Nominating Committee Chairman, Mr. Kalbian, for the results of the elections. Mr. Kalbian reported there were 55 ballots cast and the results were as follows:

PASTOR'S REPORT

Some see the glass half empty and others see it is half full. However, from day one, we wanted to be optimistic and tried to see the light at the end of the tunnel and to put the church on the map.

We had several goals. 1) Conduct services and sacraments. 2) Meet spiritual and pastoral needs of parishioners. 3) Get aquatinted with parishioners in order to get to know them gradually, and tried to create and cement a strong bond and relationship between church and parishioners. 4) Increase Church membership. 5) Improve and strengthen Sunday and Saturday Schools. 6) Reestablish A.C.Y.O.A.. 7) Urge parishioners to get involved in organizations, activities and to attend services. 8) Take care of the needs of the church and office in order to make it a more appealing place to worship, pray and work.

Hospital and cemetery visitations were made upon request or voluntary. On Tuesdays we visited Senior Citizens periodically at their social gatherings and shared good and bad news together. We acknowledge and appreciate the deacons', choir members' and organists' dedication, devotion and commitment by participating in the Divine Liturgy every Sunday.

We attended Clergy meetings monthly to discuss current pastoral, spiritual, doctrinal and canonical issues. In December our Church hosted a Clergy meeting in our Center. With His Eminence archbishop Khajag Barsamian we extended our pastoral visitations and had the privilege and joy to visit the Hovnanian Armenian School on Christmas, Easter and various special occasions

Our pastoral visitations were uplifting, encouraging and fruitful. We provided our pastoral spiritual care and counseling for those who were willing to seek help and guidance. We graciously acknowledge those who expressed their appreciation and made positive comments in person and by phone.

LECTURE SERIES

We reserved the first Sunday of each month for the lecture series which take place in the Annex after Divine Liturgy. The lectures were on History of Armenia, Armenian Culture, and Current Issues in Armenia and Karabagh etc. Currently we are in the process of inviting doctors, lawyers and brokers who will discuss various topics.

1993 PARISH ASSEMBLY - The minutes of the Parish Assembly held on February 6, 1994 are included in the Annual Report. Four business issues discussed at the Assembly requiring action by Parish Council were carried out as follows:

a. <u>Endowment Fund Prayers for Donors</u> - Hokehankisd prayers for the deceased donors and prayers of thanksgiving for the living donors were offered as usual during a Sunday following the Annual Assembly.

- b. <u>Armenian School</u> In line with the Assembly decision Parish Council as a whole acted as the administrator of the Armenian School and has appointed Alice Yigitkurt to act as liaison in addition to being appointed superintendent.
- c. <u>Annual Christmas Party</u> Following the dictates of the Parish Assembly, Parish Council re-inaugurated the Christmas Party in memory of Mrs. Betty Nalband. Satenig Karagosian acted as Chairperson and did a magnificent job. This party was held on Friday, December 16,1994.
- d. <u>Armenian Missionary Fund</u> Parish Council, in line with the motion passed at the 1992 Parish Assembly, began a campaign headed by Phil Arpiarian to raise funds for Armenia Mission Work. Unlike past years, there was no specific amount that our Church would be obligated to raise but would do its best to meet the \$15,000. target. We are happy to report due to Mr. Arpiarian's dedicated efforts, we were able to collect \$10,610.

<u>CHURCH PROPERTIES</u> - Harold Azmelian and Pablo Taura, caretaker, continually monitored the condition of the Church, the Church Center, and the Parish House. During the year the following repairs were made:

1. Church - stain glass window

2. Church Annex - heating and cooling systems

3. Church Office - new ceiling

4. Church Center - the ceiling damaged by fire was repaired

<u>PICNIC</u> - Due to circumstances and our inability to have a joint picnic with St. Leon's Church, Parish Council decided not to have a picnic especially when St. Leon's decided to hold its picnic on the same traditional Sunday our Church use to hold its picnic on their grounds. It will be up to the new Parish Council to decide if and when to hold future picnics.

<u>BAZAAR</u> - Once again the Bazaar, held on October 28 and 29, was successful socially as well as financially. The parishioners owe a debt of gratitude to the Chairpersons, Gary Burggraf and Ed Sahagian and all those who contributed to help make the Bazaar both enjoyable and profitable.

<u>VISION</u> - Our pastor, Very Rev. Fr. Vazken Karayan, as editor with Ann Dadaian and Arpena Sbarbaro as co-editors of the VISION once again sacrified a great deal of time and effort to ensure the printing of the VISION on a regular basis with much more interesting contents and photographs.

<u>SUNDAY BULLETIN</u> - As in former years, the Sunday Bulletin was distributed every Sunday to those attending Church services. Each issue was replete with current information on Church activities, simple explanation of the meaning of each Sunday and other pertinent matters of interest such as listings of hokehankisd to our Church members. Our pastor, Very Rev. Fr. Vazken Karayan and Ann Dadaian deserve special thanks for undertaking this important task.

<u>ARMENIAN SCHOOL</u> - The same Superintendent, teachers, and assistant teacher made this year's Armenian School a truly a successful one. Parish Council continued to underwrite the expenses of salaries and the weekly bus service cost. More details are available under the Armenian School report.

<u>SUNDAY SCHOOL</u> - Very Rev. Fr. Vazken Karayan and Sylvia Bozoyan, our superintendent, made it a priority to have a viable Sunday School. Fortunately their efforts succeeded in increasing the total enrollment to 26 students. In addition to Sylvia Bozoyan, the present teaching staff consists of Phil Arpiarian and Nubar Dorian. Deacon Hamlet Mehrabian was a guest teacher during the Fall.

<u>RAFFLE</u> - Following last year's success, Parish Council decided to have a 50/50 Raffle this year too and was thankful to Phil Arpiarian who once again accepted the responsibility of acting as chairman. As usual with great effort, all tickets were sold and the Church made approximatedly \$15,000. The drawing of the raffle was held during our annual bazaar instead of the usual raffle drawing reception we had in prior years.

<u>ENDOWMENT FUND</u> - As the annual report of the Endowment Fund indicates, we had excellent results with our Endowment Fund. This is due to the Endowment Fund committee and specially to the efforts of Harold Azmelian who as usual is acting as chairman.
