# **PASTOR'S REPORT**

It has been a pleasure and privilege for me to have served as Pastor of St. Thomas Armenian Church for more than two and a half years now. Ours is one of the largest parishes in the Diocese, with a multitude of programs and endeavors. As your shepherd, I have welcomed the tremendous challenge presented by such a growing and diversified flock, and thank God for the strength He has given me to carry out my pastoral and leadership duties.

My heartfelt thanks go to our Parish Council Chairman Dr. Levon Capan, the Parish Council members, Board of Trustees and Diocesan Delegates, as well as all our organization and event chairpeople for their devoted service to St. Thomas this past year. Also, I wish to express deep appreciation to the countless volunteers who assisted in all areas and made such a special contribution to our success.

Listed below are highlights of the activities, projects and efforts in which I was involved in 1993:

**WORSHIP SERVICES**: The Divine Liturgy was conducted regularly every Sunday, according to the traditions and canons of the Armenian Church. I am pleased to report that our deacons, altar servers and choir also participated weekly with me in Morning Services prior to the Divine Liturgy and have steadily been increasing their knowledge of church rituals. In addition, I am conducting Deacons' Training.

<u>SACRAMENTAL SERVICES</u>: All sacramental services were performed in accordance with the rites, rituals and cannons of the Armenian Church. During this past year 22 baptisms, 18 marriages and 13 funerals took place.

<u>SPECIAL SERVICES</u>: Special services and feast days for the Nativity and Revelation of Christ our Lord (Armenian Christmas Eve and Day), Palm Sunday, Holy Week, Easter Eve and Day, Transfiguration, Assumption and Exaltation of the Holy Cross were all properly and conscientiously conducted as per our Church Calendar. For the Feast of the Exaltation, this year again I obtained a fragment of Christ's True Cross and brought it to St. Thomas for the faithful to revere. On this occasion, as on Easter Sunday, the services were <u>attended by overflow crowds</u>. I am <u>delighted that a capacity congregation filled the</u> <u>church</u> on all the other feast days as well. HOSPITAL & OLD AGE/NURSING HOME VISITATIONS: Hospital visitations to the sick were done regularly, whenever we had knowledge that someone was ill. I also visited the sick and elderly at the Emerson Old Age/Nursing Home a minimum of once a month. Services were held and Holy Communion was given there on Armenian Christmas (January 7th) and Holy Thursday (April 8th).

<u>CHILDREN'S CHOIR</u>: The Children's/Junior Choir that I organized for youngsters ages 9-13 continued its rehearsals in 1993. Susan Shamamian, our Senior choir Director/Organist, has assisted me with teaching these children the Divine Liturgy.

<u>PUBLICATIONS</u>: The NOR TAR, our monthly St. Thomas publication, has been well received and contains parish news as well as educational and cultural material. Many thanks to all our writers for their contributions, and special appreciation to my capable Editorial Board: Madlen E. Setian, Managing Editor; and Seta Yavru-Sakuk, Graphic Arts/Illustrator. This year we realized approximately \$3,260 in income from the solicitation of advertisements in the NOR TAR, through the efforts of Seta Yavru-Sakuk. My heartfelt thanks to her for her dedicated service to our church newspaper, which partially offset its publication cost since 1992.

THE SUNDAY BULLETIN has been published weekly to inform our faithful of important events, meaningful scriptures and liturgical information.

<u>SUNDAY SCHOOL</u>: Our Sunday School continues to thrive under the leadership of Mrs. Shnorig Bashian, Director, and her dedicated staff of teachers. Their time and effort are truly appreciated. I was the lecturer at the Sunday School's religious education program on several occasions, and attend and support all their special events.

**KIRIKIAN ARMENIAN SCHOOL**: The Armenian School also continues to flourish under the leadership of Mrs. Ani Capan, Superintendent, and her excellent faculty members. Their time and effort are truly appreciated. I support and attend all their programs and also teach religion.

**ECUMENICAL:** I also serve as a member of the Tenafly Clergy Council, representing St. Thomas Armenian Church.

<u>COMMUNITY RELATIONS</u>: I continue to promote and maintain good relations between government and our church. We invited N.J. Senator Frank Lautenberg and Tenafly Mayor Walter Hemberger and Mrs. Hemberger as special guests at our 28th Anniversary Dinner on Palm Sunday. Because of their busy schedule they could not come. However, they sent congratulatory messages to our parish. **HOME BLESSINGS:** I have personally blessed 100 homes, thus getting to know my wonderful parishioners and their families.

<u>COUNSELLING & RELIGIOUS EDUCATION</u>: My pastoral activities this year have included family counselling and religious education. I am always eager and available to be of assistance to all members of our flock in times of personal need or misfortune.

<u>CHURCH CLUBS & ORGANIZATIONS</u>: All our church clubs and organizations are very important to St. Thomas. They have my unequivocal support, and I have attended their special functions. The Women's Guild, Men's Club, ACYOA, Avak Society, Choir, New Directions, Sunday School and Kirikian Armenian School are the pillars of our parish, and they are the key to uniting us all into one family. I applaud them and all their wonderful members.

**YOUTH PROGRAMS:** I am especially grateful for the sincere and hardworking young people we have in our parish. Our Sunday School and Armenian School students, Junior Choir and ACYOA members are our future church leaders, so it is imperative that we provide them with the best possible Christian-Armenian training and foundation at St Thomas. During the past year our youth have been a true credit to us, serving on the altar assisting at important parish events such as the Anniversary Dinner, Memorial Day Picnic and Bazaar, participating in religious services at Easter and Christmas, and enthusiastically "pitching in" whenever called upon. How inspiring it was to see young people of all ages and from all our church groups participating together on December 24th, when we celebrated American Christmas Eve with special all-English church services! I have made it a priority to support and encourage them in every way possible and truly appreciate the enthusiasm with which they have responded. I am committed to promoting and expanding our youth programs in the future, both religious and recreational.

In conclusion, my past year at St. Thomas has been most gratifying. And I believe that there is tremendous potential here, as evidenced by the <u>record-breaking crowds</u> that have been present at our religious services and events the past year. Our 1993 fundraisers surpassed previous years' events in profits and attendance. Our Bookstore has also been reorganized and expanded and has paid its debts under its conscientious Director, Dikris Malool, whose sales speak for themselves.

<u>SPECIAL PROGRAMS</u>: This year has been an especially successful year for St. Thomas Armenian Church both financially and morally.

**KEF NIGHT:** The two Kef Nights which took place on May 7, 1993, and October 8, 1993, respectively, were very successful fundraisers for St. Thomas. My heartfelt thanks to Mr. & Mrs. Aram & Madlen Setian and their committee for the May event and to Mr. & Mrs. Manuk & Mari Camcikyan and their committee for the October event.

**WINTER RESCUE:** In response to the Diocesan request St. Thomas Armenian Church participated wholeheartedly in the Winter Rescue Drive for Armenia. During the months of February, March and April of 1993, three 30 feet containers filled with clothing, medical supplies and food left St. Thomas for Armenia. In addition, 17 tons of lentils were sent through donations which I solicited from our parishioners. Special thanks to Mrs. Madlen Setian for chairing the drive and to all the volunteers who helped in the sorting and packing, and those who donated food, medical supplies, clothes and money.

<u>ARMENIAN HISTORY CLASSES</u>: During this past year several lectures on the subject of Armenian history were presented at St. Thomas by Prof. Bournoutian. Special thanks to Mrs. Virginia Victoria for chairing this worthwhile program.

**DZAYRAKOOYN VARTABEDOOTYOON CELEBRATION COMMITTEE:** I would like to offer my very special thanks to Mrs. Ani Capan, Chairman, and her committee for organizing the celebration following the services of my elevation in rank to Dzayrakooyn Vartabed.

**NEW YEAR'S EVE:** 1993 came to a grand finale with a gala New Year's Eve Dinner-Dance on December 31st that glowed with fellowship and good cheer. What a magnificent occasion it was for our church family to usher in the New Year! Heartfelt thanks to Dr. & Mrs. Levon & Ani Capan, Dr. & Mrs. Bedros & Seta Yavru-Sakuk and their Committees.

<u>CULTURAL ARTS COMMITTEE:</u> During the past year I have formed a Cultural Arts Committee chaired by Mrs. Lucy Piligian. I am pleased that the committee had already planned and carried out two such cultural events during the past year. The first was a lecture, film and slide presentation about the life and work of famous artist Arshile Gorky, and the second was a piano recital featuring the young and gifted Tamar Asadourian. Both events were very successful drawing large crowds. Special thanks to Mrs. Lucy Piligian, Chairman for her wonderful work.

**FR. PAPKEN SPECIAL PROJECT/CHURCH ARTIFACTS:** The Fr. Papken Special Project/Church Artifacts Program involves obtaining donations from the faithful in our parish to be used towards the maintenance and replacement of worn vestments, altar cloths or obtaining artifacts and other items which the church has lacked in its sacristy and other activities. Toward this end, a group of ladies has been formed for sewing and constructing the vestments, altar cloths etc., under the direction of Mrs. Ani Capan. Mrs. Capan and all the ladies serve voluntarily and I thank them wholeheartedly for their dedication and love for our church. I encourage our parishioners to contribute toward this program since there are still many items we need.

# **MORTGAGE BURNING CELEBRATION/**

<u>HAIG MARKARIAN MEMORIAL</u>: I am very glad to report that St. Thomas has paid off its final mortgage during 1993. A Mortgage Burning Celebration was held in June and at the same time Haig Markarian was honored, posthumously, as one of the original founders of St. Thomas Armenian Church. My special thanks to Mrs. Virginia Victoria for chairing the Mortgage Burning Celebration and to Mr. Jack Charshafian for chairing the Haig Markarian Memorial and Booklet.

## PARISH COUNCIL REPORT

1993 was another successful year for the St. Thomas Church. We believe that the absolute harmony and genuine fellowship among Parish Council Members set a positive tone and provided a paradigm for the entire Parish as well as its organizations. With a total of 635 dues paying members, we are now eligible to send seven delegates to the Diocesan Assembly, an increase of four delegates over the previous period.

Financially we did extremely well. The surplus last year was \$17,000 and we started with an operating fund of \$56,245. This year the surplus was \$37,000 and we are beginning 1994 with an operating fund of \$93,776. This success is a direct result of the genuine interest, dedication and hard work of our members, who not only made generous donations but also organized very successful events with immeasurable energy and patience. Despite a depressed national economy, St. Thomas came through with flying colors!

Although we will note some of these members and organizations in the forthcoming sections of this report, the Parish Council would like to express its special appreciation for the hard work and efforts of all those who have helped our Church during the past year.

# GOD BLESS YOU ALL!

We did well in other areas too. As we will discuss in detail below, our Pastor and very worthy Hayr Sourp, Very Rev. Fr. Papken Anoushian, was elevated to the rank of Dzairakooyn Vartabed, the only promotion of its kind in 52 Diocesan Parishes in 1993.

Our choir, along with the choir of St. John's Armenian Church of Detroit, Michigan, received the prestigious Gomidas Vartabed Award from the Association of Armenian Church Choirs of our Diocese. Thanks to our Choir Director and Organist Susan Shamamian for her dedicated efforts.

# **REPORT OF FUNCTIONS:**

<u>Anniversary Dinner</u>: The traditional Anniversary Dinner was held on Sunday, April 4th (Palm Sunday). We were honored by the presence of our Primate, His Eminence Archbishop Khajag Barsamian. St. Thomas Award recipients were Dr. & Mrs. Haroutune & Shake Mekhjian, who are well known to the St. Thomas Parish for their continued support of the church in every possible way. This Anniversary Dinner was superbly organized by Dr. & Mrs. Bedros & Seta Yavru- Sakuk. A.C.Y.O A. Juniors were the servers and commended by everyone present. The event raised nearly \$13,000. Thanks to Seta and Bedros and everyone on their committee.

<u>Memorial Day Picnic</u>: The Memorial Day Picnic was chaired by Dr. & Mrs. Haroutune & Shake Mekhjian and took place on May 31. A concerted effort by the Chairmen and the members of the Picnic committee, made this affair a very enjoyable and successful event. The total profit, that including the cash and non-cash donations, was nearly \$12,000. Thanks to Mekhjians and all those who helped them.

Mortgage Burning & Haig Markarian Tribute: With Mr. & Mrs. Nazar Nazarian's initiative and their sizeable donation (\$16,000), the issue of paying off the existing mortgage (approximately \$103,000) was brought up at the last Parish Assembly meeting. Another donation from Mr. & Mrs. Varoujan & Linda Arslanyan (\$5,000) and the idea of combining available funds from the Building Committee and Board of Trustees led to the decision to pay off the mortgage and set aside the \$24,000 annual mortgage payment for Building Repairs by the Architectural and Building Committee.

On June 6th, the evening for our Mortgage Burning event was combined with the tribute organized to honor the late Haig Markarian, who was instrumental in the establishment of St. Thomas Church some 35 years ago. We thank Mr. Al Victoria, Mr. Jack Charshafian and their committees for organizing such a meaningful evening. We also express our gratitude to the Nazar Nazarians for initiating the mortgage payment. Of course, we thank them and the Varoujan Arslanians for their contributions as well.

Booklet donations for the Haig Markarian Tribute reached \$6,000 and with expenses deducted, the net profit for the church was \$4,500.

**Bazaar:** November 12th and 13th, 1993, marked an important traditional event for St. Thomas. The Bazaar this year was chaired by Mr. & Mrs. Hagop & Silva Torosian. Their hard work coupled with the cooperation and efforts of their committee members provided a phenomenal net profit of \$45,550! Our sincere gratitude to the Torosians and their committee members.

**Kef Night:** Two very successful Kef Nights were held. The Kef Night in May was chaired by Mr. & Mrs. Aram & Madlen Setian, and the one in October was chaired by Mr. & Mrs. Manoug & Mari Camcikyan. Like last year's Kef Night, these events were sell-outs and provided a profit of more than \$20,000 to the Church. Our heartfelt thanks to all involved in these fundraisers.

New Year's Eve: New Year's Eve was a major success with more than 450 attendees. The evening was organized by sisters Ani Capan and Seta Yavru-Sakuk. The net profit for the Church was more than \$17,000. Thanks to Ani and Seta for their continued support.

## **CHURCH EVENTS:**

On April 3rd our Pastor, Very Rev. Fr. Papken Anoushian, was elevated to the rank of Dzairakouyn Vartabed by the Primate, His Eminence Archbishop Khajag Barsamian. After an impressive church ceremony attended by more than 500 parishioners, a reception was given in Mekhjian Atrium, where several speeches praising Hayr Sourp and emphasizing the importance of the event were delivered. Of the 52 Diocesan parishes, our Fr. Papken was the only pastor of being elevated to the Dzairakooyn Vartabed rank in 1993. We wish him many more advances in his vocation.

# **ADMINISTRATIVE EVENTS:**

Accounting: Much effort has been spent to computerize our accounting system during the past 2 years. As a continuation of this effort, a group from the Parish Council met with Mr. Michael Halajian, C.P.A. and discussed the ways to perfect our system. Thanks to the hard work and patience of Mr. Halajian, Mrs. Grace Hagopian (Treasurer) and Mrs. Mary Tashjian (Secretary), we are now very close to having a workable computer program that will give us the potential for accurate and easy-to-obtain accounting data. Our sincere thanks to Mr. Michael Halajian.

<u>Custodian Salary</u>: As decided in the 1992 Parish Assembly meeting, the salary of our custodian was raised by \$1,500 effective September 1, 1993. The time interval between February to September was used to sort out some important employment procedures, since the hiring of the custodian several years ago was made without adequate documentation of employment conditions. A Parish Council Sub-Committee consisting of Mr. Frank Stoneson and Mr. Hagop Torosian met with the custodian and clarified some of the employment policies. We thank Yang and Aziza for their responsible work in our Church.

<u>Copy Machine</u>: Bulk rate photo-copying at a local store (Staples) is much cheaper than that provided by our machine. Thus we have established a policy that more than 200 copies of photocopying by any Church organization should be done at Staples.

**Facility Rentals:** A facility rental committee consisting of Seta Yavru-Sakuk, Madlen Setian and Silva Torosian has been formed. The main objective of this committee is to promote rental of our facilities and thus increase church income. In addition, a subcommittee of the Parish Council (Mrs. Virginia Victoria, Mrs. Grace Hagopian and Mr. Frank Stoneson) reviewed and revised our existing rental policies. **Building Improvement:** The Parish Council, through its liaison Mr. Hagop Torosian to the Architectural and the Building Committee, assessed the need for repair of certain church areas. Of these, the church roof and Kindergarten class rooms were repaired. The heating system of the Mekhjian Atrium classrooms has been repaired. Specifications for the repair of the roof between Saddler and Mekhjian Atrium have been prepared by Mr. Ouzoonian and are being reviewed by the Architectural and Building Committee. This project, which is long overdue, will be completed in the spring.

A financial reserve for Building Maintenance and improvement has been accumulated through: a) saving of monthly mortgage payments for 12 months (\$2,000/month) and b) payment from Board of Trustees to the Parish Council (\$7,350). After all building expenses we now have \$19,200 accumulated for building repairs.

# **MEMORIALS:**

Stained-glass window (Mt. Ararat) donated by Eileen Barsamian and her children Donna and Eric in memory of Vahan Barsamian was installed and blessed in September 1993. Our Choir's stained-glass window depicting Gomidas Vartabed was dedicated in October 1993. A stained-glass memorial window (St. Peter) donated by Ann Ajemian and her family in memory of Peter Ajemian will be designed and prepared in the near future. The proposed site of this window is the middle door of the church entrance.

<u>Memorial Funds</u>: A new fund (approximately \$5,000) in memory of the late Peter Ajemian was established and deposited in the Armenian Church Endowment Fund (ACEF).

. The Board of Directors for this Fund is made up of the same lay individuals as that of the Kasparian, Tashjian, Barsamian and Shahinian Memorial Funds. The Ajemian Fund, the charter of which is not prepared yet, will be directed with similar principles and Board of Directors constituents.

#### **OTHER BUSINESS:**

**Diocesan Assembly 1993:** This year the Diocesan Assembly was held in Chicago, Illinois. Delegates in attendance were: Col. Victor Arzoumanian, Mr. George Mekenian, Mrs. Shakee Shahinian, and Dr. Levon Capan (P.C. Chairman). This year special workshop sessions were arranged. One of these sessions was conducted by Mr. Mekenian.

**The Rev. Arnak and Yeretzgin Violet Kasparian Library:** Diligent efforts were made to locate and determine financial records of the Original Library Committee. According to the information given to us the Original Library Committee, had approximately \$30,000 at its inception. There are, however, no funds or financial records available from the Original Library Committee. Thus, the Parish Council requests: a) a resolution to accept that there

is no available accounting records for this establishment from the Original Library Committee; and b) Parish Assembly recognizes that Current Library Committee bears no responsibility for any Original Library Committee financial activities.

Landscaping: It has been agreed by the Parish Council that a selected outdoor area will be planted every year by its members. This year more than 70 mums were underwritten and planted by the PC members. Among other areas planting was also done in the section designated as a Memorial to Mrs. Michael Fuhrmann. Mr. Fuhrmann donated \$900 for this purpose.

<u>Capital Purchases (1993)</u>: Tables, trays, plates, silverware, flower pots and other items were purchased during 1993. Church chairs were reupholstered for a nominal fee. Thanks to Al and Virginia Victoria for working on these projects.

In conclusion, we look forward to another prosperous year of spiritual and parish growth. Bravo and Encore to our dedicate flock!



# **BUILDING COMMITTEE**

The following projects were undertaken by the Committee:

1. Evidence of termite infestation was found on an initial inspection. Therefore, termite treatment was followed by Western Termite & Pest Control Co. This job was done on the North & South sides of the main church, and this project cost us \$900.00 with a 5 year guarantee.

2. Repair was done on the Southwestern side of the main roof by replacing the 40' x 3' section. This repair was done by Hackensack Roofing Co. and the cost was \$900.00.

3. The Slate steps at the side entrance were reinstalled and repointed. No charge, compliments of "Class A Cons. Co."

4. The long time heating problem of the 6 classrooms and the library was solved by disconnecting the underground pipes and rerouting the pipes above ground. This prevented the underground pipes from freezing. Plumbing cost \$1900.00.00. carpentry \$750.00. Total \$2650.00

5. Replaced 2 circulator pumps, 2 pressure relief valves and corroded pipes in two heating units. The cost of labor and material was \$2,100.00.

6. Due to a severe winter storm in February of 1993, various damage was reported to the insurance company In June of 1993 a settlement of \$16,185.67 was reached between the insurance company and St. Thomas Armenian Church.

The following are some projects that the committee feels should be completed in 1994:

- Complete the roof at Atrium skylights and repairs to the entire church complex.
- Repair of cracks in the plaster ceiling of the church and the lobby.
- Complete the repairs of the Atrium marble floor and repolish entire floor.
- Treat the exterior wood surfaces of the complex
- Add a new light pole at the end of the parking lot.

Thanks to the Parish Council Chairman, Dr. Levon Capan, and all members of the Parish Council for putting aside \$25,350 in 1993 for building maintenance reserve and their promise to continue to do so in 1994.

# **CASPAR M. KASPARIAN MEMORIAL FUND**

The St. Thomas Armenian Church Caspar M. Kasparian Memorial Fund was established in 1979. The Charter approved by the Annual Parish Assembly stated that the purpose of this fund is "To provide full or partial scholarships to primarily further the religious education for the youth of St. Thomas, and in exceptional cases full time seminary students of the Diocese of the Armenian Church or youth of Holy Cross Parish of New York and St. Mary Parish of Washington, D.C. In addition the Fund also provides financial assistance to the St. Thomas Christian Education Department, sponsors retreats for Sunday School teachers and provides full or partial scholarships for St. Thomas children to attend the Diocesan St. Vartan Summer Camp.

During the Summer of 1993, eight St. Thomas Sunday School students were awarded scholarship assistance to St. Vartan Camp and St. Nersess Seminars.

The Fund financially supported sub-deacon Gregory Doudoukjian for the expenses incurred toward the writing of his Master Thesis. Upon his graduation in 1993 from St. Nersess, he was given a gift for the occasion.

The Sunday School requested and received 200 schoolbags from the Fund.

Through activities and projects such as St. Vartan Camp, St. Nersess Seminars, support of Seminarians and the Sunday School, the Fund seeks to encourage the religious education of St. Thomas youngsters and encourage them to grow in the Armenian Christian faith.

# MARTIN SONNY TASHJIAN MEMORIAL FUND

Upon the death of Martin Sonny Tashjian on August 11, 1981, donations in the amount of \$5,624 in lieu of flowers were given to St. Thomas to be set up into an endowment fund with the Armenian Church Endowment Fund of our Diocese. - 1. Advertising for a failed Ski Weekend that was scheduled for January. The final cost to the treasury was \$400.

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#### **KIRIKIAN ARMENIAN SCHOOL**

A vital and growing part of the parish, the Kirikian Armenian School serves in teaching our children their language and instilling pride and knowledge of their ethnic heritage.

The enrollment this year is 105 students with classes ranging from nursery to seventh grade. Due to a growing need there are now bilingual classes, one for English speaking students and another for bi-lingual students, in the 2nd, 3rd, 4th, 5th and 6th grades. All children must take a reading and spelling test at the end of each year. The seventh grade students have to pass a comprehensive 3 hour test to graduate. Every grade must also take a standardized test from the Diocese to go on to the next level. Also, an incentive gift is given to encourage promptness.

Trophies or certificates are given at the annual Hantes and Graduation for the following achievements: George Shahinian Award for Perfect Attendance, the Edward Bashian Award for Armenian History, the Rupen Saddler Award for Armenian Reading and the Dr. Harout and Shake Mekhjian Armenian Spelling Award.

The Kirikian Armenian School has a paid faculty and other expenses are as noted in our financial report. Funds are raised by the School largely through tuition. The Mothers' Committee is responsible for the Bazaar Booth, Annual Armenian Christmas Dinner, Luncheons, end of year Hantes, the publication of our cookbook (750 cookbooks have already been printed with a 3rd printing ordered), and many other events. We are also deeply grateful for the help our benefactors continually give us.

The special events of the past year included: 1) Commemoration of Holy Translators Day (Soorp Tarkmantchatz) 2) A Paregentan Fair in February. 3) Hokehankist and fellowship commemorating the Anniversary of the earthquake in Armenia. 4) Commemoration of Armenian Martyrs day.



#### 28TH ANNUAL PARISH ASSEMBLY ST. THOMAS ARMENIAN CHURCH SESSION I - SUNDAY, JANUARY 31, 1993

Assembly Chairman Antranig Ouzoonian asked for verification of the membership in order to establish a quorum of 50 so as to begin the meeting. Gregory Tenbekjian from the Parish Council verified that a quorum was present.

The meeting was opened at 12:45 p.m. when Hayr Soorp Anoushian led us in prayer. Chairman Ouzoonian introduced Hayr Soorp as Preseident of the Assembly, Martha Saraydarian as Secretary and himself as Chairman/ Moderator and welcomed all.

Mr. Ouzoonian explained that the meeting will be governed by the Armenian Church of America Eastern Diocesan by-laws and Robert's Rules of Order and went on to clarify the Diocesan Council's interpretation of by-law #7 which reads: New members are eligible to vote provided they have been registered for 6 months and their dues are fully paid by the date of the Parish Assembly. Dues may be paid at any time during the 6 month period. Therefore, dues may be paid by pre-registered voters up until the Parish Assembly on February 7, 1993.

A second point of clarification was made in reference to the Parish Assembly invitation: Those who have been members for less than 6 months will not be able to vote, either by hand or voice at the Assembly as well as not being eligible to cast ballots.

Hagop Jebejian made a motion to dispense with the reading of the minutes from 1992 as they are attached to the annual report, seconded by Adrienne Tenbekjian, motion carried. Corrections can still be made at next week's meeting.

Shake Mekhjian, chairperson of the Nominating Committee, introduced the nominees for Parish Council: Eileen Cnarig Barsamian, Jack Charshafian, Paul Kahaumjian, Seta Kantardjian, Ara Martaian, Leon Nigohosian, Richard Saraydarian, Madlen Evkine Setian, Jack Torosian, Virginia Victoria.

Nominated from the floor by Queenie Varjian were Frank Avakian-Stoneson and Edward Parseghian. George Mekenian seconded. Chairman Ouzoonian explained that a second is not necessary but would be noted. Further nominations made by Arthur Azarik are Ara Babigian, Richard Keurajian and Gregory Tenbekjian.

Violet Kasparian asked that biographies of the additional nominees be printed and mailed. Chairman Ouzoonian so instructed the Nominating Committee.

Haig Varjian made a motion that the candidates presented will fulfill the by-laws for the number of candidates required. Seconded by Violet Kasparian. The slate of candidates was accepted by a two-thirds vote.

For Nominating Committee: Jeannie Amerkanian, Verken Berberian, Alicia Demirjian, Rose Garjian, Hagop Jebejian, Karen Saraydarian, Aram Setian Albert Victoria, Bedros Yavru-Sakuk. Nominated from the floor by Jerry Keosayan were: Rose Mekenian, Albert Papazian, Shake Shahinian and Margaret Varbedian.

Haig Varjian motioned and Adrienne Tenbekjian seconded that the Assembly accept the additional nominations to fulfill the double slate. Motion carried.

For Auditing Committee: Sandra Alpino, Gregory Amerkanian, Seta Izmirly, Dikris Malool, Araxie Pichigian, Mary Sanossian. There were no nominations from the floor.

Officers for the 1993 Assembly: Chairman, Antranig Ouzoonian, Albert Victoria. John Vaniskian nominated George Mekenian from the floor. For Secretary: Mary Ann Saraydarian, Sylva Torosian. There were no nominations from the floor.

The Chairman thanked Shake and her committee and asked Parish Council candidates to join Aram Setian for pictures after the meeting.

Mr. Edward Bashian asked that the confirmation to the Board of Trustees of Michael Halebian, Arthur Azarik and Mary Ann Saraydarian be placed on next weeks Agenda. Violet Kasparian requested that the duties of the Board of Trustees be written and passed out next week.

Ara Martaian questioned why there would be no elections for Diocesan Delegates. The reason is their term has not yet expired. Puzant Torigian questioned the ratio of delegates and church members. George Mekenian explained that the number of delegates and church members is increased or decreased according to the membership at the time when new delegates are elected.

AGENDA: The Chairman asked for approval of the Agenda for next week's meeting: commence meeting right after Divine Liturgy, establish a quorum of at least 50 paid members, recess for lunch and voting.

Edward Parseghian motioned that elections begin at 11:30 a.m. and close at 1:30 p.m. Chairman Ouzoonian responded that according to the by-laws, voting must take place during the meeting.

Jack Charshafian made a motion that balloting begin at 12:30p.m. and close at 2 p.m. George Mekenian seconded. Leon Nigohosian ammended Mr. Charshafian's motion to extend voting till 3 p.m. Susan Shamamian seconded. The ammendment to the motion was defeated.

Chairman Ouzoonian clarified that the starting time for balloting will be upon completion of Badarak and that anyone already on line to register or to cast their ballot at 2 p.m. will be allowed to vote. Mr. Charshafian's motion was called and accpted by the Assembly.

George Mekenian stated that the vacancies on the Nominating Commettee due to members running for office should be filled by the alternated. Haig Varjian made a motion to close the meeting, seconded by Arthur Azarik at 1:50 p.m.

#### 28th ANNUAL PARISH ASSEMBLY ST THOMAS ARMENIAN CHURCH SESSION II - SUNDAY, FEBRUARY 7, 1993

Immediately after the Divine Liturgy, the meeting was called to order at 11:40 a.m. A quorum of 50 paid members was ascertained by Secretary Martha Saraydarian. Hayr Soorp then led the Assembly in an opening prayer. Chairman Ouzoonian opened Session II, announced that Hayr Soorp would preside over the meeting. He introduced Vicar General Haigazoon Najarian from the Diocese and Diocesan Council member Dr. Edward Onanian as observers and to witness the proceedings and the counting of ballots. He stated voting would take place in Mekhjian Atrium and explained the voting procedures. Deacon Bedros Sarkissian explained the voting procedure in Armenian. Chairman. Ouzoonian announced that motions would also be translated into Armenian. It was stated that members who had not yet paid their dues to date must first do so in order to be eligible to cast their ballots for the elections and also to be eligible to vote during the Assembly. Upon voter qualification a "voting card" will be given to the member which will be used as an indication of eligibility when raising their hands with the card when a vote in called. He reminded everyone that if you are a member of two parishes within the same Diocese, you may only vote in one parish.

Leon Nigohosian moved that balloting open within the next 15 minutes and be closed at 3 p.m. Chairman Ouzoonian asked if that was a reconsideration of the vote (taken at Session I at the Assembly last Sunday) to which Mr. Nigohosian responded that last weeks vote on the opening and closing times is null and void as Robert's Rules of Order say you need a two-thirds vote. Chairman Ouzoonian's interpretation is you do not need a two-thirds note. Mr. Nigohosian asked for an appeal. The Assembly noted in favor of the Chair making the decision. The motion stands as voted last week.

Chairman Ouzoonian explained the elections are governed by the Nominating and Auditing Committees. As there are three combined vacancies due to members of these committees running for office, he selected alternates Arthur Azarik, Alin Papazian and Jerry Keosayan to fill the vacancies.

Steve Jarahian made a motion to reconvene at 2 p.m. Puzant Torigian seconded. Virginia Victoria amended the motion to reconvene at 2:30p.m. Susan Shamamian seconded, motion carried.

The meeting reconvened at 2:30 p.m. and a quorum was re-established. Chairman Ouzoonian introduced Vicar General Haigazoon Najarian who offered a prayer and read a message sent by Sirpazan Barsamian.

Hayr Papken offered a prayer for the deceased members of St. Thomas Church. He spoke about the parish and offered to meet with those parishoners who have concerns about St. Thomas Church.

Chairman Ouzoonian announced that the meeting would be run according to the Armenian Church of America Eastern Diocesan By-Laws and Robert's Rules of Order. He then referred to the tabled motion from Session I waiving the reading of the 1992 Parish Assembly Minutes and asked for any additions or corrections to the minutes.

It was noted that on page 9, after Mary Ann Saraydarian's name, the year should be 1992. Rose Mekenian referred to page 4 section 4 that Judge Gurahian is Chairman not president of the Diocesan Council, that on page 5 third line from the bottom the sentence "Rose Mekenian again appealed to Chairman Ouzoonian to read her statement" is incomplete and thus unclear and requested adding 'addressing misunderstanding in the parish.' Yeretzkin Violet Kasparian noted that the Parish Council decision regarding the establishment of in-lieu-of flower donations into a memorial fund was omitted from the Assembly Report and requested it be included in the 1993 minutes. A correction was made page 7, last line last paragraph to include 'up to \$10,000.'.

Joseph Kalemkerian noted that on page 5 the word 'majority' should be added in reference to Parish Council report which 8 of 11 members signed. He also requested on page 5 next to last paragraph adding the word 'majority' before Parish Council report.

Ara Babigian questioned the validity of the sentence 'The Chairperson of the Parish Council responded.', page 4 second paragraph. Chairman Ouzoonian explained that the response need not be recorded, only that one was made.

Steve Jarahian motioned and Celia Martaian seconded that the minutes be accepted as corrected. Motion carried.

Bedros Yavru-Sakuk made a motion that Agenda item 18, 19, and 20, Approval of Proposed Budget for 1993, Old Business and New Business respectively be moved to after item 5 and then proceed in order. Edward Bashian seconded. The purpose of the motion was to insure ample time to discuss important issues. Chairman Ouzoonian appointed Henry Hagopian, Greg Papazian, Levon Altiparmakian and Peter Babigian as counters and instructed them to count "voting cards" (blue) row by row to avoid confusion. The question was called and defeatedby atwo-thirds vote. The Agenda remains as previously approved at Parish Assembly Session I, January 31, 1993.

Joanne Torigian then gave the Parish Council Chairman's report. She said she was remiss in not including Samuel and Alicia Demirjian as chairpersons and Alice and Edward Parseghian award recipients under the heading Anniversary Dinner. The date of the Diocesan Assembly should read April 30 to May 3 not April 22. Also, figures stated under Building Contractor Settlement were those given at the time she compiled her report. Puzant Torigian felt that under Bazaar, contributors should have been thanked.

Edward Bashian, on behalf of the Board of Trustees, announced the addition of three new members, Arthur Azarik, Mary Ann Saraydarian and Michael Halebian. There ensued some discussion concerning the manner in which Board of Trustee members are designated. George Mekenian read from the by-laws stating that after consultation between the Board of Trustees and the Parish Council, the Parish Council shall present to the Parish Assembly names of new members for confirmation by the Assembly. During Session I, the Assembly had confirmed the new members. For the record, Chairman Ouzoonian asked Parish Council Chairperson Joanne Torigian to second Edward Bashian's confirmation of the aforementioned new members. Mrs. Torigian seconded.

Hayr Soorp felt it was unnecessary to read his report as everyone had a copy. There were no questions.

Albert Victoria asked if any sums listed under Memorial Donors are specifically earmarked. The response was as follows: Michael Fuhrman donation for his wife's memorial garden, Araxie Pichigian donation for final payment on the front doors and the remaining amounts for carpeting for the Parish House.

There were no questions for Albert Victoria concerning the Building Committee Report.

Moses Kazanjian, reporting on The Facilities and Management Committee, a new title under Building Committee, corrected the \$25,000 amount on page 15. It should read \$22,500. No questions were asked.

Virginia Victoria reported that a new landscaper has been hired who will also provide snow removal as his bid was the lowest. John Vaniskian commented that with the increased number of members, perhaps we can have volunteers do some of the ground work.

There were no questions on the Armenian History report.

Dr. Levon Capan reported that officers of the Kasparian Fund had been changed. Edward Parseghian asked why the original trustees had been taken off. Parish Council Chairperson responded that the charter says the terms of office had long expired, therefore, a new committee was elected. George Mekenian read a letter in response to a Nor Tar Ed. Note clarifying his and Joseph Kalemkerian's length of terms of office on the Kasparian Fund. Violet Kasparian and Edward Parseghian requested that the letter be included in the 1993 minutes. After obtaining permission from George Mekenian, Chairman Ouzoonian so moved.

In Shake Shahinian's absence, Joanne Torigian noted that the Shahinian Fund should read \$250.00 to A.C.Y.O.A. Jrs.

Sonia Tashjian requested that one of her four sons be included as a permanent member of the Martin Sonny Tashjian Fund. Dr. Capan responded that a letter of confirmation from the Parish Council would be forthcoming.

Levon Altiparmakian from A.C.Y.O.A., Srs. reported that the \$1,400 profit from their dance has been donated to the church and another charitable organization and the accounts have been settled. Joseph Kalemkerian asked why the Christmas Eve collection is being used for a dance without Parish Council approval. Chairman Ouzoonian responded that an answer would be forthcoming.

There were no questions for the A.C.Y.O.A. Jrs., the Avaks, The Senior Choir nor The Junior Choir. Shnorig Bashian added that \$415.00 was collected by Sunday School from a crop walk on Oct. 18 and an Emerson Home visitation will take place.

There were no questions for Kirikian Armenian School nor for Mens Club.

Adrienne Tenbekjian added to the Women's Guild report that the Women's Guild Assembly was held at St. Davids, Boca Raton, Florida on May 1 and 2. Delegates were Susan Avakian Stoneson, Violet Kasparian and Rose Mekenian.

As the Auditing Committee was still out counting ballots, a statement from them was read by Chairman Ouzoonian stating that all books and records of the church and its organizations had been examined and were in good order. They recommend that all organizations use our church tax exempt number when making purchases and when possible, checks should be made out to corporations not individuals.

Grace Hagopian thanked Laureen Karanfilian for helping in the preparation of the 1993 Budget. Seta Izmirly updated the final figure for the bazaar, \$44,772. The correct figure for income from Kef Night is \$10,541. The bookstore deficit figure will be looked into and corrected by Dikris Malool. The correct 1992 Surplus figure is \$17,629. Chairman Ouzoonian recommended that the item listed as Father Papken Project be changed to read Religious Items so as to avoid confusion.

Under Expenses, Violet Kasparian noted that the increase in the Choir Directors and Director of Christian Education's salaries were decided upon at last years Assembly and should be listed as such under 1992 Budget.

After some discussion concerning mileage expenses for the clergy auto, Chairman Ouzoonian directed Grace Hagopian to check on the Diocesan guider- lines.

Joanne Torigian made a motion for the outside accounting firms audit report and letter be printed and sent to all parishoners and made a part of these minutes. Seconded by Steve Jarahian. Thomas Kasparian amended the motion to print a limited number of copies and give a copy to each organization of the church and have some copies available for anyone who wants it. The amended motion carried.

Albert Victoria made a motion, seconded by Richard Saraydarian, that \$5,000 be added to the Capital Improvement Budget. Motion carried.

Leon Nigohosian made a motion based on the treasurer's recommendation to increase the rental line item amount to balance the budget, that the 1993 Budget be adopted. Seconded by Bedros Yavru-Sakuk. Budget was adopted. Concerning Old Business, Edward Bashian brought forth the question of paying off the existing mortgage of approximately \$103,000. The monies would come from Board of Trustees, 356,000, Building Committee, 334,203, Mr. & Mrs. Nazar Nazarian Donation, \$11,000. Mr Nazar Nazarian donated an additional \$5,000 in order to be able to comfortably pay off the mortgage. Leon Nigohosian expressed concern that paying off the mortgage will leave us with nothing. Virginia Victoria countered that by placing the monthly \$2,000 plus mortgage payment aside, a reserve will quickly build up.

Edward Bashian made a motion to pay off the mortgage with the combined monies from the Board of Trustees, Building Committee and the Nazarian donation and recommended that the 324,000 plus budgeted for mortgage payments be allocated to the Facilities and Management Committee Nazar Nazarian seconded. Motion carried unanimously.

Mr. Varoujan Aslanian donated \$5,000 for the maintainence of the building.

Violet Kasparian expressed her displeasure at not being asked to be on the Library Committee. Extensive discussion ensued. Marion Kahaumjian made a motion to add Violet Kasparian as a professional to the Library Committee. Edward Parseghian seconded. The motion was called and defeated. Hayr Papken announced that he will seriously reconsider the defeat of the motion as he has the authority to appoint members.

Virginia Victoria made a motion to close Old Business. Richard Saraydarian seconded. Motion carried.

Peter Kalemkerian suggested that in the future a Seargent at Arms be appointed to maintain order.

George Ajemian recommended that in the future four wireless microphones be available and that the Parish Council Chairperson sit at the dais.

Charles Amerkanian made a motion that in the interest of fiscal responsibility, the cut-off date for payment of dues be December 31 provided it is permitted by the Diocesan By-Laws at its Assembly May 1993. Bedros Yavru-Sakuk seconded. Motion called and carried.

Henry Hagopian made a motion to vote to elect Hayr Soorp for a 5 year term. Chairman Cuzoonian stated that Hayr Soorp had been appointed by the Primate and only the Primate can extend or recind the appointment Further, the issue should have been proposed at Session I when he asked if there were any additions to the Agenda.

New Business' was closed.

Under Unfinished Business, as the Auditing Committee had returned to the Assembly, The Chair asked them to officially give their report.

Election Results: Hermine Ajemian announced the election results. She thanked Dr. Onanian and the Vicar General for their help in counting the ballots. 471 ballots were cast.

For Parish Council: Frank Avakian-Stoneson, Eileen Barsamian, Leon Nigohosian, Richard Saraydarian, Jack Torosian, Virginia Victoria. Alternates are Seta Kantarjian, Edward Parseghian and Paul Kahaumjian.

For Auditing Committee: Jeannie Amerkanian, Verkin Berberian, Aram Setian, Albert Victoria, Bedros Yavru-Sakuk. First alternate, Rose Mekenian, second alternate, Shake Shahinian, third alternate, Alicia Demirjian.

For Auditing Committee: Sandra Alpino, Gregory Amerkanian, Araxie Pichigian with alternates Seta Izmirly and Mary Sanossian.

For the 1993 Assembly: Antranig Ouzoonian as Chairman and Mary Ann Saraydarian as Secretary.

Dr. Levon Capan made a motion to adjourn at 7 p.m., seconded by Bedros Yavru-Sakuk.

The meeting concluded with a prayer by Rev. Father Anoushian.

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#### **AUDITING COMMITTEE REPORT**

We, the auditing committee of St. Thomas Armenian Church observed the financial records of the following organizations and find them to be accurate and consistent to their outside financial accounts for the year 1993.

However, we would like to take this opportunity to address some important issues facing an auditing committee. A recognizable accounting procedure should be followed by all organizations. Furthermore, if an organization has difficulty due to lack of time or man power in the upkeep of its books, it should set aside the time or people to do so on a regular basis. The end result would be a more efficient organization and a more comprehensive audit.

The following suggestions are taken from the church auditing committee and an outside auditor a few years back. The relevance of these suggestions remain, as they have yet to be taken fully into effect.

- 1. You must have two separate ledgers for the cash receipts and cash disbursements.
- 2. The cash receipt ledger should record all incoming monies and should clearly indicate the following:
  - a. The receipt number, date, and amount.
  - b. The name of the payer.
  - c. The category in which it belongs (i.e.donations, affairs, dues, etc.)
- 3. The cash disbursements ledger should have the same corresponding information.
- 4. At the end of the month, a formal bank reconciliation has to be prepared to check the bank balance. This balance should not be compared to the checkbook balance but to the ledger. The checkbook running balance has to be adjusted to the true book balance.


