We need mere k neeling and praying people; we need more volunteers to become associated with the life of the church, we need more people in the choir, more children in the Sunday Echeel, more boys and girls in the Youth Group; more women in the Guild. We need dreamors and people of vision to remind us that we are one world and one people, and remind a us of the different areas that need an investment of time, talent and treasure.

As a family of werk and worship, we need to be aware that pews without people is sadness to God, the classrooms without children is a score which is dispersed to our martyred forefathers - just the fantasy of having a beautiful church and surroundings only breeds vanity.

Always and forever we need to be aware of the purpose for which this parish was gathered and established 50 years ago. We exist to wership God, to be a friend to each other, to be axartranxxxx virtuous and charitable, to be faithful to our national heritage and to be one under God. To mothis is the strangest criteria of success, progress and achievents.

We have cone a long way physically. How much ground we have covered spiritually - that wuestion remains unanswered.

We must be aware of these and resolve to meet the challenges ahead with determination, confidence and faith. Hereon is our challenges will not be physical as they were in the past years. What is all behind us now.

The new challenges will be more apiritual and enotional ones. I am referring to our resolve to rise to the occasion and relate to 300 Armanian families in our area who must be won to the church and made part of the on going life and leadership of this church.

I am referrint to more than 150 children and youth who must be won to the church, given identity and help them to find their roots and be proud of it.

- 1. A ferfeful nevement to spread "The Word" and make our community conscious of regular church attendance, as well as manyable church-related functions.
- 2. A renewal of committments concerning our first priority that of educating our children in the faith of our forefathers and subscribing to the ideals and obligations of the Sunday School.
- 3. Once youth is lest it can rarely be recevered! And to mourn the less of our children once it is too late is uscless. As parents we must do our utmost to acquaint and encourage our offsprings to participate in youth activities. Ultimately it will be to the benefit of both the children as well as you their parents.
- 4. It is abvious that mixed marriages have exceeded all previous records to an alarming degrees. With due respect to all our "edar harsuss and possah"s, this has to be a public relations issue to ind ectrinate and educate our youth that the best way is the Armenian way.
- 5. An awakening to the truth that a family who prays and work s together in the church is a healthy, happy family. We strongly impress upon you to tak e active part in all organizations, support their affa irs and their endeavors for the good of all concerned.
- 6. This magnificent church and property cannot be sensidered ours, yet! The bank owns it! Special effort and f plans must be formulated to raise funds and at least partially pay the remaining \$235,000.00 nortgage.
- 7. Premise the condition is which all our churches are struggling for survival I have come to the conclusion that we should seriously think about catablishing an endew ment fund for future support and sustenance of our church.
- 8, It is imperative that we subscribe to the weekly please system for the sound support of the budget as a main and steadly source of income. The yearly bazzar and please has system should almost cover the budgets set for coming years.

We now look forward to the year ahead with the anticipation that God has even greater blessings in stere for us in 1981. Let us all be realistic and optimistic and continue to worship, serve, leve and sacrifice faithfully and regularly.

Cherious prespects and great challenges are ahead, and we shall evercone. Remember, there is nothing that Ged, you, and us tegether, cannot accomplish.
