SACRAMENTS

<u>Badaraks:-</u> During 1990, I was able to celebrate Divine Liturgy at least every Sunday of the year except on a few occasions when I was away or on duty.

<u>Special Services</u>:- During the past year, we did schedule church services during Lent Season and Special Feast Days. However, I am not happy to report that the attendance to these church services were very poor. I must to remind you that as Armenians we have different church calendar than other church denominations, therefore, in order to preserve our identity and learn more about our faith, church and heritage we must keep the interest alive and make an extra effort to attend church services especially on these special days. We also celebrated the service of the Presentation of The Lord to the Temple (Diarentarach).

I am optimistic that in the coming year we will improve in this area.

<u>Baptisms:-</u> During 1990, I have performed six (6) baptisms and Chrismation. One baptism in Maryland, and I assisted one baptism in the Lebanese Church in Richmond.

<u>Weddings:</u>- During 1990, I performed two (2) wedding services, in total, one of which was in Maryland and the other was in Richmond Episcopalian Church.

<u>Funerals:-</u> During 1990, I performed (5) five funeral services at St. James Armenian Church.

To my report will be attached all the names of the above services.

MEETING AND INITIATIVES

<u>Board Meetings:-</u> For the records, I would like to state that during the past I presided over 12 Parish Council meetings, about (24) Ladies Guild Executive and General Meetings, ACYOA meetings, Sunday and Armenian School meetings. We organized one PTA meeting however, only three (3) mothers showed interest. We held two other special meetings one for April 24 Committee and one for Victims of Karabagh.

<u>Home Visitation:</u> During the past year, I managed to make home visitation. Some repeated visitation and some first-time visitation. Some at special occasions and family gatherings and sometimes just informal socializing. Most of my visitation were prearranged by the families that I visited. I would like to continue to keep it in that way. I would appreciate it if you would get in touch with me and make arrangements that would help me keep some order in my every day schedule.

<u>Home and Cemetery Blessings:-</u> During the past Christmas and Easter I have blessed homes and cemeteries. I will be glad if you will let me know ahead of time if you want to bless your home and your relatives graves.

<u>Hospital Visitation:-</u> Bringing God's healing ministry to the ill and to patients is one of my most cherished Pastoral duties. During last year I have done numerous hospital visitation. I love visiting the hospitals and talking to the patients. It gives me a sense of spiritual accomplishments. Therefore, I ask you to let me know as soon as possible if you hear of anyone who is in the hospital, so that I can be able to bring God's healing ministry to the sick.

<u>Armenian Adult Language Program:</u>- We were able to start the past year the Armenian Adult Language class on Monday evening, I took the responsibility to teach the Armenian Language to the adults. There were (12) Twelve adults at the beginning of the program.

ORGANIZING

During the past year, with the blessing of Almighty God, cooperation with the Parish Council and youth of our Community, we were able to reorganize the Armenian Church Youth Organization of American, Richmond Chapter.

During the past year I was able to supervise our Church choir rehearsals and organize the Choir Committee.

Organized Archives room and work room area. Sent letters to area youth for ACYOA reorganization and also sent letters to all Armenian newspapers and magazine's in the U.S. and Canada to increase our library service. Travelled to Durham, North Carolina to speak to their Armenian Group to organize a new community. With the help of Parish Council, we organized three (3) educational lectures, two with Dr. George Bournoutian and one with Mr. Hemayag Bedeian from Armenia.

Participated in Vartanantz celebration organized by the Knights of Vartan of Richmond, Virginia.

DIOCESAN AND REGIONAL ACTIVITIES

As the acting Pastor of St. James Armenian Apostolic Church of Richmond, Virginia, and member of the Eastern Diocese Clergy, I was invited to participated in the Diocesan and Regional activities and programs, but I was not able to attend most of the Diocesan activities since I am so far from the New York area.
