A sample reading from the lectionary

The lector should first introduce the lections of the day with the proper psalm verse, by saying aloud and in a clear and projected voice......

* Alleluia, Alleluia Praise is due to Thee, O God in Sion and unto Thee prayers shall be offered in Jerusalem. (Psalm 65, verses 1-2)

[You should announce the particular lection in the following way-]

1. The First Reading is from-

the Old Testament Prophecy of Isaiah or the Prophet Isaiah

[the chapter and verse need not be stated]

... Begin the reading as follows...

Behold the Lord will lay waste the earth and make it desolate, and he will twist its surface and scatter its inhabitants.

And it shall be as with the people, so with the priest; as with the slave, so with his master; as with the maid, so with her mistress, as with the buyer, so with the seller; as with the lender, so with the borrower; as with the creditor, so with the debtor.

The earth shall be utterly laid waste and utterly despoiled; for the Lord has spoken this word. [You should announce the next lection in the following way-]

2. The Second reading is from

The letter of Saint Paul the Apostle to

THE EPHESIANS

or

The Christians living in Ephesus

... Continue the readings, as follows...

Look carefully then how you walk, not as unwise men but as wise, making the most of the time, because the days are evil. Therefore do not be foolish, but understand what the will of the Lord is.

And do not get drunk with wine, for that is debauchery; but be filled with the Spirit, addressing one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing and making melody to the Lord with all your heart, always and for every thing giving thanks in the name of Jesus Christ to God the Father.

At the conclusion of the Old and New Testament lections the person who has offered the readings of the day should indicate to the congregation that this portion of the holy scriptures is completed by saying...

This is the word of the Lord, Here end the readings !

...meanwhile the choir shall be prepared to intone the proper **Alleluia Psalm** of the day; either according to the mode or the special festal psalm that is prescribed....

The intoning of the ALLELUIA psalm in the Divine Liturgy is done before the chanting of the Holy Gospel. In older manuals of the Armenian Liturgy, the Alleluia is written to elaborate music to be sung by the choir.

The psalm-chants used today in the Armenian Church are found in the liturgical books called the "Kirk Jashotz" in which the yearly cycle of readings are arranged in their daily order and in the "Donatsouyts", a lectionary guide for major feasts. While the Gradual psalm remains much the same at each Sunday Liturgy, the Alleluia psalm-chant which is intoned before the chanting of the Holy Gospel always follows the prescribed mode or 'Tsayn' of the day. There are eight modes of the Alleluias that are sung on the regular Resurrection (Harootiun) Sundays and additional variables sung on certain feast days and at special services and commemorations.

The following Feasts have special GRADUALS AND ALLELUIAS.

They are - Feasts of the Holy Cross and Lent

Easter

Pentecost

Theophany

The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary

The following "Alleluias" are sung according to the mode of the day before the reading of the Holy Gospel.

For: The 8 modes of Resurrection Sundays.

Christmas

Easter

Pentecost

Transfiguration

Assumption

Vartanantz

Exaltation

Also there are "Alleluia" chants for:

Hokehankisd Hayrabedagan Maghtank Khaghoghee Orhnootiun Ch'rorhnék Vodunlya When introducing the Prophecy, the usual **Gradual (Jashou Psalm)** for regular **RESURRECTION SUNDAYS** and **GREAT LENT** is the following:

Alleluia, Alleluia. Praise is due to Thee, O God, in Sion and to Thee prayers shall be offered in Jerusalem. (Psalm 65, verses 1-2)

For other special feast days, there are special Jashou Psalms that should be read. They are:

For Christmas and Theophany

Alleluia, Alleluia. The Lord hath said unto me: Thou art my Son, this day I have begotten thee. (Psalm 2, verses 7 and 1)

For Easter

Alleluia, Alleluia. Blessed is the man that walketh not in the council of the ungodly, nor standeth in the way of the sinner, nor sitteth at the seat of the scornful. (Psalm 1, verse 1)

For Palm Sunday

Alleluia, Alleluia. Let the hills be joyful together before the Lord, for he hath come to judge the earth. (Psalm 98, verses 8-9)

For Pentecost

Alleluia, Alleluia. The good spirit shall lead me into the land of uprightness. Hear my prayer 0 Lord, give ear to my supplications in thy faithfulness. (Psalm 14, verses 10 and 1)

For Tranfiguration

Alleluia, Alleluia. Lord who shall abide in Thy tabernacle? Or who shall dwell on thy Holy Hill? (Psalm 15, verses 1 and 2)

For Assumption of the Blessed Virgin

Alleluia, Alleluia. Arise O Lord into Thy rest; thou and the Ark of thy holiness. Lord remember David and all his meekness. (Psalm 132, verses 8 and 1)

For The Exaltation of the Holy Cross

Alleluia, Alleluia. The light of thy countenance was a token unto us and thou hast put gladness into our hearts. (Psalm 4 verses 6 and 7)

For the Feast of St. Vartan

Alleluia, Alleluia. Thou hast given us a sheep to be slain, and has scattered us among the heathens. (Psalm 44, verses 11 and 1)

The Alleluias which are sung prior to the Holy Gospel according to the eight modes of the regular **Resurrection** Sundays are:

Mode I. (Psalm 102, 13)

Alleluia, Alleluia. Too harootsial Kutastsis Ee Vera Sionee, Jamanag Kutalo Nora Hasial Eh Jam.

Thou shalt arise and have mercy upon Sion; for the time to have pity on her, yea the set time has come.

Mode II. (Psalm 149, 1)

Orhnetsek Uzder Horhnootiun Ee Nor, Orhnootiun, Numa Hegeghetsis Srpots.

Praise ye the Lord with a new song; praise be unto him in the congregation of saints.

Mode III. (Psalm 47, 1)

Dzaps Harek Amenayn Hetanosk, Aghaghagetzek Ar Asdvadz Ee Tsayn Tsundzootian.

O clap your hands all ye nations; shout unto God with a voice of joy.

Mode IV. (Psalm 8, 6-7)

Ari Der Asdvadz Eem Ee Hramanus Ko Zor Badviretser, Yev Joghovk, Joghovurtots, Shoortch Yegheetsin Uzkev.

Awake, O Lord my God, to the judgement that thou hast commanded; and the congregation of the peoples shall compass thee about.

Mode V. (Psalm 149, 2)

Oorakh Yeghev Israyel Hararich Yiour Vortik Sionee Tsundzastsen Ee Takavorn Yiuryants.

Israel rejoiced in him that made him; the children of Sion shall be joyful in their king.

Mode VI. (Psalm 46, 8)

Yegayk Yev Desek Uzkordzus Asdoodzoh, Vorbes Zee Ahegh Yen Khorhurtov Kan Zamenayn Vortis Martgan.

Come and see the works of God, how they are terrible in thought, more than the thought of all the sons of men.

Mode VII. (Psalm 85, 1)

Hadjetsar Der Unt Yergir Ko, Yev Tartsootser Uzkerootiun Hagopah.

Lord thou hast been well pleased unto thy land; thou hast brought back the captivity of Jacob.

Mode VIII. (Psalm 68, 2)

Haryav Asdvadz Yev Tsurvetsan Amenayn Tushnameek Nora, Pakhyan Adeleek Nora, Heresats Nora.

God arose and all his enemies scattered; they that hate him fled from his face.

THE ALLELUIAS FOR THE MAJOR FEASTS

For Theophany and Epiphany (Luke 2, 11)

For this day the Son, who is from the Father before all ages, was born, which is the anointed Lord, in the city of David.

For Easter (Psalm 147, 12-20)

For Pentecost (Psalm 33, 5-6)

Alleluia, Alleluia. The Lord had sworn, and will not repent, thou art a priest forever after the order of Melchiz'edek.

For the Blessing of Grapes

Alleluia, Alleluia. Asdvadz voghormia mez yev orhnia uzmez yerevetzoh zeresus ko ee mez yev voghormia mez.

Alleluia, Alleluia. O God, have mercy upon us and bless us; let thy countenance shine upon us and pity us.

For the Blessing of Water (Psalm 96, 11-12)

Alleluia, Alleluia. Ooorakh yeghitsin yergink yev tzundzastseh yergir zuvarjastsi dzov luriv yioorov, tsundzastsen tashdk yev amenayn vor eh ee nosa.

Alleluia, Alleluia. Let the Heavens be glad, and let the earth rejoice; let the sea roar, and all that fills it; let the field exult and everything in it!


