PASTOR'S REPORT 1972

My first visit to the Holy Resurrection Armenian Parish was August, 1972. On my return trip from California, I celebrated my first Divine Liturgy in South Milwaukee. The following day, I returned to my former parish of St. Gregory of Narek Armenian Church of Cleveland, Ohio, where I served almost six years to settle all my personal matters.

On September 14, 1972, I officially assumed the responsibilities of the pastorate of Holy Resurrection Armenian Church. This appointment was designated by His Grace, Archbishop Torkom Manoogian, the Primate of the Eastern Diocese of the Armenian Church of North America.

During my first meeting with the Parish Council members, plans were executed to meet with the Church affiliated organizations. This was accomplished. Home and hospital visitations were planned. To date, sixty to seventy percent of the Armenian families have been visited by me with the following people: Mr. Peter Sahagian, chairman of our Parish Council, Mr. Manoog Panosian, Parish Council member and Mr. Kerovpe Balian.

Church services and the Divine Liturgy were held with the Morning Service from 9:30 to 10:00 A.M. and the Divine Liturgy conducted from 10:00 A.M. to 12 noon with appropriate spiritual sermons given in both English and Armenian. The Holy Communion participation every Sunday was approximately 25 to 30 people. There were not any Sacraments of Baptism or Holy Matrimony during the past four months. However, there was one wedding conducted in our Church during my absence, on October 22, 1972, by Father Parea Metjian, the pastor of St. John's Armenian Church, for one of their parishioners. There has been one funeral. Requiem Services were conducted upon request.

The Divine Liturgy was not celebrated on October 22, 1972, due to the Choir Convention, which was held at my former parish. Also, I was out of town on November 13th to the 18th to attend two different activities. The first occasion was for a clergy program conducted in our New York Diocese. The title was "Sensitivity Session." The second occasion was for the Armenian Church Choir Association Central Council Meeting, which was held in Providence, Rhode Island, in which I acted as Vice-Chairman.

I joined the South Milwaukee Kiwanis Club with Peter Sahagian on September 25, 1972, having Mr. John Schweda, the president of the South Milwaukee Marine Bank, as our sponsor.

American and Armenian Christmas Services were conducted as usual.

To introduce our own Church and culture, I have given three lectures at the following places:

1. South Milwaukee Public Library
2. South Milwaukee Lions Club
3. Oak Creek Kiwanis Club

A television program was taped for three separate three-minute "After Midnight Closing Prayers" to be televised on Channel 6 on the following dates:

Thursday, January 18, 1973

Thursday, February 1, 1973

Sunday, February 11, 1973

The subjects were "Loneliness," "Restoration of Peace," and "Faith in Mankind."

PROPOSED FUTURE PLANS

1. To achieve a healthy communication between the parish priest and parishioners, I have decided besides the regular home visitations to have home blessings, according to a pre-planned program.
2. A plan is being studied by me to start an official Armenian School for two hours on Saturdays. In order to fulfill this idea, I feel that immediate care and professional supervision is needed. A budget must be compiled and an Armenian School Board should be organized locally.
3. I proposed that an Armenian style, four-pillared, dome-type chapel be erected on the cemetery grounds as well as the installation of washroom facilities.
4. I had suggested at one of our Parish Council meetings that we need a soundproof facility for our Church balcony for educational purposes, i.e., instruction of the Armenian Liturgy to the English speaking children and also to those who are interested in the process of learning the various parts of the Church Service.

Heavenly King, preserve Thy Church unshaken
and keep the worshipers of Thy Name in peace.

May God the Lover of mankind have mercy on us and show His compassion and favor on our works in order to be able to glorify His great name. Amen.

1972 PARISH COUNCIL ANNUAL REPORT

The Parish Council is pleased to announce that following tradition, we can proudly point to another financially successful year for 1972. There were unusual obstacles facing this Parish Council this year, but with true Armenian spirit and perserverance, and with the help of God and our beloved Primate, many of the situations have been resolved.

The Parish Council would like to thank its parishioners for their continued moral and monetary support and especially to Deacon Parsegh Vahradian, who, in the absence of a clergy, devoted many hours, helping both in administrative areas and on the Altar.

In April, 1972, Very Rev. Vazken Keshishtian resigned, leaving our parish without a full time priest until September 14, 1972. During this time, through arrangements with our Primate and excellent cooperation from neighboring sister churches, we were able to celebrate Holy Badarak at least once a month and sometimes twice a month. The Sundays when there was no Holy Badarak, Morning Services were held by our Deacon Parsegh Vahradian and Joseph Turgurian, so that every Sunday there was a Service in our Church (excepting the weekend of the Diocesan Assembly in May).

Through continuing effort and close contact with the Diocese, within a short time, in September, 1972, we were blessed with a most devoted priest, Father Arshag Khatchadourian, who has unique talents and very high ideals. We pray that under his leadership and guidance, our Church will soar to even greater accomplishments than have taken place in the past.

Some of the projects undertaken and completed by the 1972 Parish Council are:

1. The installation of a new hot water tank.
2. The repair of the front stoop, which was a potential dangerous situation.
3. Martyrs Day Program with Father Paree and Judge Victor Manian as our main speaker, which was very well attended.
4. Increased our Liability coverage and reduced our premiums by \$300 over a three-year period. Entire insurance program was revamped.
5. Farewell party was given for Very Rev. Vazken Keshishian.
6. We hosted a regional meeting with the neighboring Armenian priests, presided by Archbishop Torkom Manoogian, in preparation for the 75th Anniversary of the Diocese.
7. A very successful Madagh.
8. Two clerical robes (Verargoos) were made.
9. Acquired an electric typewriter through kind donation of South Milwaukee Marine Bank.

Recommended Projects for 1973

1. Repair back of Altar.
2. Kitchen remodeling (new counters, sinks, disposal, dishwasher and new lighting).
3. Roof repairs (side wings)
4. Exhaust fan for Altar ventilation during the summer months.
5. Redecoration of the hall.
6. Waterproofing washroom walls.
7. Book racks on the back of pews.

The Parish Council would like to thank everyone for their cooperation and many words of encouragement during this past year.

The Choir, after the loss of several of its members has begun to reorganize under the direction and guidance of our new pastor, Fr. Arshag. With his vast knowledge of Armenian Church music, Fr. Arshag has been teaching the choir members many new songs and has brought the choir into participating in the morning service, previously done only by the Celebrant and Deacons.

New books have now been purchased by the Choir with music designed for special occasions such as feast days, holidays, and special services. Hayr Soorp has begun to instruct the choir on these new songs.

New members are always welcome, especially male voices. Some of the men in our parish have voiced interest in joining, but to date none have come forward.

The soda machine, which was purchased by the choir, is now fully paid for, and is beginning to pay off. So far this year, from May thru December a profit of \$45.00 has been realized. This is the only real source of income of the choir.
