In reviewing the past twelve months, we can best assess our
performance and that of the parish by the things accomplished
as well as those things left undone. Fortunately, with the
wholehearted support of the Project Committee, we were able
to complete the majority of our building projects. The few
tasks remaining can be completed in 1975 without imposing any
undue burden on our budget.

With respect to the spiritual and administrative life in the parish, it is my belief we have made no headway. Spiritually, we are fortunate in having dedicated people serving at the altar and in the choir. Without their contribution, it would be difficult to maintain and nourish our spiritual interests.

Our greatest enemy seems to be apathy on the part of many to pitch in and assume responsible roles of leadership. Many organizations report indifference on the part of members to accept elective positions or committee assignments. As a result we seem to function as organizations, yet have no direction and no apparent goals to achieve. We lack leadership, both spiritually and administratively.

Spiritually, of course, we need a full time spiritual leader. When we will get a suitable clergyman, I cannot venture. I can only say that the clergymen available are generally unsuitable or not compatible to the needs of our community. Your Parish Council and its Search Committee have taken the position not to accept anyone without a thorough investigation. We feel the parish cannot afford to go through another Yetenekian period. As a result of our attitude and the indifference of the Diocese to our needs, we can only foresee 1975 to be generally a repeat of 1974. We will, however, continue to explore all possibilities and hope for better results this year.

Administratively, I can only repeat that your Parish Council is aware of our needs and has tried to fill them whenever possible. With few exceptions we have met in regular meetings most every week. Last year approximately 50 meetings were held.

Our new facilities impose many different and often time-consuming problems. The work of the Council, therefore, is vastly different than the problems faced at the old church.

There were certain projects proposed last year that we were unable to get off the ground for lack of volunteer help and interest by parishioners.

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It should be readily apparent to all that we cannot function efficiently by expecting the Parish Council to spearhead and provide all of the leadership. In vital areas as Financial, Membership, Cultural and Social, there is dire need for standing committees to initiate, activate and implement needed projects. Unless we wholeheartedly accept the "Committee Concept," our parish will not show progress and may, through apathy, become a sick parish, unable to fit into the social and economic life of

The picture I've painted is not pleasant. I've tried to put things into perspective to help you visualize where we are and where we are headed. Even in brief, I hope you find it useful.

Unless there is a general re-awakening, a new spirit of interest and much more desire by all to get you to become more active in parish affairs, then there is no bright future for St. Mesrob Church. You alone can decide its fate as it has always been now till the blow to us, nothing can prevent it. We who are left are the ones who have to do our best.
