# SPECIAL PARISH ASSEMBLY MEETING Diocesan Delegates Report

June 9, 1991

Parish Council Chairperson Jack Kazarian called the meeting to order. Der Garabed led the opening prayer.

Chairperson Jack Kazarian stated that 44 members were present and that represented a quorum.

Jack Kazarian informed the meeting attendees that Tom Gengozian was in Watertown attending an ACYOA reorganization meeting concerning the new Department of Youth Ministry. He mentioned that Tom has agreed to work toward revitalizing the youth situation in the parish.

Also, Mesag Vidian has stepped down as parish custodian and will be replaced with Mike Kadamian.

Sam Akgulian moved that the agenda be adopted. Martha Kargenian seconded the motion. Approved.

# Clergy Conference.

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Der Garabed reported on the Clergy Conference which was held at the Don Bosco Retreat Center just prior to the Diocesan Assembly. Issues raised at the conference include:

- Spiritual revival of the church in Armenia. There is a need for printed material in the eastern Armenian dialect to help with this spiritual renewal. This would include the Sunday School curriculum developed in the Eastern Diocese of America.

Various cults such as the Hari Crishnas have been converting the people in Armenia. Also, other Christian churches have been establishing themselves in the country and attracting Armenians away from the Orthodox Mother Church.

A committee has been established to develop ways of evangelizing the country. Two clergymen from America each month will go to Armenia to establish churches, organizations, organize youth groups, etc. This development has also created a shortage of priests in the country.

- Political problems in Armenia still exist and were addressed.

# Unity.

Efforts to unify the church are not going well. Some parishes participated in joint commemorations of April 24th in defiance of the cannons and rules of the church. The Bishop made it clear that clergy would be suspended if they don't obey the rules.

- Restructuring of Sunday morning worship. A pilot program for a new service would include a I hr. Badarak after a I hr. Christian family session on Sunday mornings.
  - Reform of liturgical rights.

### Youth.

Meaning of the liturgy to youth was discussed.

# **Delegates Report.**

Murad Gengozian reported on the Diocesan Assembly in Tenefly, NJ. 119 delegates were present with Martin Cholakian chairing the meeting with co-chair George Sarafian. Kai Kazarian served as a parliamentarian and Murad Gengozian served on the Courtesies Committee. In addition, Father Garabed and Kai Kazarian were elected to the nominating committee. Proposals. Two proposal were addressed.

- I. Proposal to allow Diocesan churches to participate with non-diocesan churches in commemoration of April 24th was defeated.
  - 2. Proposal to require Primate to report on progress of the Unity committee on a quarterly basis was passed.

St. Mesrob has presented a proposal to the Diocesan Council to establish a Youth Ministry in Racine. Will be discussed later.

Budget -- Diocese in running at a deficit of \$365,000 for 1991 and a total deficit of \$928,000 for the past 3 years.

The ACEF reported \$14 million in restricted funds.

Since our Parish Council Chairman was unable to attend the Diocesan Assembly, delegate Murad Gengozian attended a special session for Council Chairpersons on fund-raising.

Due to the situation in Karabagh, the Saturday afternoon session was suspended to allow delegates and clergy to participate in a demonstration in front of the Russian Consulate in New York.

Kai Kazarian reported that the theme of the Assembly was the Youth in the Armenian church. A great deal of frustration was expressed at the lack of involvement in the church by Armenian youth. It was revealed that the Bishop has been working on a plan to work on this problem which includes the establishment of a Family Ministry Department at the Diocese. Details are to come.

The unity committee report was endorsed by the assembly which stated that no further meetings will be planned with the Prelacy Committee unless the Diocesan Committee can be assured that the Prelacy is prepared and willing to work toward a final By-laws for a re-unified Diocese.

Lauren Chalekian reported on the DRE convocation. This was the first annual superintendent's gathering.

Dr. Gloria Thomas addressed the group. Among other things she stated that Sunday School is the duty of the entire parish, it belongs to everyone, not just the teachers. She suggested that we learn to live with secularism and look for ways to utilize outside influences to our advantage. The use of video as an educational medium is one example of this.

Lack of parental participation in Sunday worship is a problem in many parishes. Lauren stated that St.Mesrob is already doing some of the things suggested at the convocation, such as involving a church deacon and taking field trips.

A group of mid-west superintendents will work on kicking off the new year with a program that will encourage more parental involvement.

# Youth Ministry.

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Murad Gengozian informed the parish of the proposal to establish a youth ministry in the mid-west that would be housed at St. Mesrob. He was asking for parish approval for using church facilities for this purpose. Elsie Garoukian pointed out the need for the youth director to be accountable to someone. Yeretzgin Roberta suggested that the youth director report to the MRC and work out of his or her own home.

Sam Akgulian moved that the proposal to establish a youth director for the mid-west who would report to the diocesan council and utilize facilities at St. Mesrob to the extent that this activity is not taxing on the parish priest and secretary, be accepted. Peter Kazarian seconded the motion. Approved.

5. Family Ministry was discussed in Watertown - Tom Gengozian was in attendance and will report to the Council.

An example of the changes in the ACYOA is the return to separate General Assembly and Sports Weekend Events.

6. Building.

Roof Leaks - - The projects committee has worked on the church roof and feels the problem has been solved. If the repair works it can save the cost of a new roof, which is \$40,000.

Parking Lot -- The dip in the parking lot will need to be attended to in the future. Est. Costs: \$1000-\$1600.

Block Wall -- Will need to be attended to.

Jack Kazarian pointed out that these building requirements will come up in the future and funding for repairs will be needed.

Secretary's Report.

The minutes were read by the Secretary. Murad Gengozian moved that the Secretary's report be accepted. Claire Kadamian seconded the motion. Approved.

Murad Gengozian moved that the meeting be adjourned. Dan Korakian seconded the motion. The meeting was adjourned at 1:15 p.m. Der Garabed led the assembly in the closing prayer.

### PASTOR'S ANNUAL REPORT 1991

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But sanctify the Lord Christ in your hearts; and be ready to give an answer in meekness and reverence to everyone who seeks from you a word concerning the hope of your faith.

(I Peter 3:15)

Through these words from scripture, we are all summoned to be signs of hope to each other, sparking and igniting the flame of Christ in our hearts, to draw all those who are near to us closer to God and closer to understanding the identities and roles we play in his great design of our salvation.

As the Pastor of this faithful flock, known unto God as the Church of St. Mesrob, I have always placed before me, the image of Christ Our Lord as my hope which continually guides me in ministering to the spiritual needs of his faithful servants. Being your shepherd has been a gift from God and a blessing to me personally. The privilege of celebrating the Holy Eucharist and sharing the real presence of Christ Our Lord and the images of His Kingdom have become our common reward that gives us together but a foretaste of life in heaven.

With the conclusion of another year of life here in this parish, I enter into my tenth year as Parish Priest of the St. Mesrob Armenian Church of Racine and ponder upon the successes and failures of my work in your midst. It has been a rewarding decade in many respects, in which vast changes in the complexion of the community and the spirit of the congregation have occured. I am now just beginning to see the passage of a generation of infants, whom I have baptized move on to a generation of children and young adults and in the same movement; the passage of the middle-aged to senior status, and yes, the passage of the elders unto the realm of eternity.

This is the life of this family of God; one of movement, going forward in the Glory of Christ. And, I thank God for the years wherein I have moved onward with you.

It is my hope that the Divine Energy of Christ and His Holy Spirit remain and even strengthen our journey together in the year to come, greeting every new challenge of faith with confidence and courage. We must, "together" improve the quality of our spiritual lives so that the fruits born from our efforts will not only please ourselves, but most importantly remain "God Pleasing".

It will not be easy; but then Christ said to us, "the world will persecute you", in other words, it will never be easy. In that persecution, our test of faith, compassion, hope and love, despite the struggles we encounter, will become that dominion and power in our lives on this earth that will open the gates of Heaven at the end of our journey here.

With the winds of change, that hover over the face of the earth, we too have been caught up in them this past year, globally, nationally and locally. 1991 ushered in an historic milestone in the life of the Armenian Church and people. In September of 1991, the independent Republic of Armenia emerged from the collapse of the Soviet Union. The Catholicate in Armenia was now able to preach the Gospel of Christ without fear or governmental interference. New seminaries have been opened and old ones renovated for the training of priests and the evangelization of the Christian message of Salvation in the motherland.

Our Diocese has responded to and continually assists Armenia in the recovery of the 1988 earthquake that devastated one third of the country. President Levon Der Bedrosian has stated that until the United States government officially acknowledges and establishes diplomatic relations with Armenia, the Diocese of The Armenian Church is the official representative of our people in this country. At the end of December, a shipment of foods worth 15 million dollars was shipped to Armenia by the U. S. Government. Gradually life in Armenia is moving ahead with the many rebuilding programs that continue, particularly the American project of rebuilding Stepanavan. Over half of the housing units have been completed and inhabited.

His Holiness Vasken I, has solidly established warm, cordial and secure relations with the new Armenian government. The prospects are bright for the future; spiritually, economically and sociologically; but only as bright as our continued help and support to Armenia continue from the diaspora.

With the agreement of H.H. Lord Vasken I, our Supreme Patriarch and Catholicos, and our Diocesan Primate, His Grace Bishop Khajag, a program of Christian Evangelism has begun, in which our diocesan clergymen will take part. Already, the Rev. Fr. Krikor Hairabedian has been in Armenia for several months to set up the office and plan the programs. Beginning this March and every month thereafter, two priests will spend one entire month in an Armenian village planting the seedlings of Faith and preaching the Gospel of "Good News" to the thousands, who thirst for it daily.

Locally, we at St. Mesrob have contributed in many ways to this "Renaissance of Faith and Renewal" in the motherland. By special arrangement with

Western Publishers and their former President, Mr. William Nahikian and a California business-man, Mr. Steven Lazarian, a shipment of 1300 Golden Book Bibles and Story Books was sent on the United Armenian Relief Plane to Kumayri(Leninakan) to the Lord Byron School. These Bibles will be used for both religious education and the instruction of the English language.

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Also in response to an appeal for aid in clothing and food, by the Diocese, a shipment of approximately \$6,000.00 worth of new clothing was sent by arrangement with our own Sam Kaprelian and his former place of employment, The Jockey Factory. Sweaters and jogging suits were sent to clothe the needy. In addition, monetary collections were made through the mail, as well as in the church, in order to aid the many Armenians who are still displaced as a result of the 1988 earthquake and live in tents and temporary shelters.

Saint Mesrob Parishioners have, indeed, responded well to these appeals and we pray that the goodwill and charity of Christian giving continues.

But, charity begins at home as well. Giving to, for and in the parish, of oneself, is as equally as important as monetary gifts, donations and pledges. Time, talent, ingenuity, creativity and above all "leadership" to guide and assure the good works of all, is of paramount importance. Yes - Service to God, Service to the Church, Service to One's People goes hand in hand with faith, hope and love.

In these times, when there are multiple activities that dominate family life, such as education, self-improvement, leisure, rest, sporting events, etc., the church community has to continually struggle and even sometimes compete to win the appeal of her congregants. All Christian churches suffer this same malayse of attitude, complacency of initiative and lack of commitment from the flock. And, all shepherds and pastors experience similar frustrations, moments of despair and defeat, when attempting to build the Glory of God and the spiritual strength of Christ's Church in a sea and ocean of a seemingly infectious indifference. This continues to be our cross here in our community. We, as a church, are no exception from the effects of apathy and indifference, and this is why it is important to talk and speak of such. realities that hamper and retard our efforts, rather than spurring and moving them forward as we hope. And, it is hope, my hope that you heed our words of concern. I pray that the Holy Spirit touch you, give you courage and charge you to come forward to serve the church, work with me, follow me and together with me come to that Glory which Our Saviour has waiting for us, Glory in the fruits borne from our work.

In retrospect to our works in the vineyard of the Lord, I share with you some of the highlights of the 1991 ministry here at St. Mesrob. But before enumerating the activities of my pastorate here at St. Mesrob, I wish, firstly, to thank all of you in our congregation, who have willingly worked with me, lessening the burdens placed upon my shoulders; transforming our anxieties to celebrations of gratitude and thanks to God for the blessings He has collectively bestowed upon us.

I offer my words of deepest gratitude and continued prayers for their Health and Spiritual Growth in the year ahead.

We begin our review of parish life with worship.

Each week on Sundays, as well as ferial days (when prescribed), we have celebrated the celebration of The Holy Badarak (Divine Liturgy). In addition, other offices of prayer have been offered in accordance with the liturgical calendar. Our unity, as a family, only becomes stronger when we gather at worship, are fed by the Lord's Precious Body and Blood and are inspired by the messages of Sacred Scripture. We can continue great deeds only when we come to the Lord and execute them in his All Holy Name. Without prayer, without Communion, without the Words of Eternal Life, there is no church.

Plus a Divine Liturgy in Greenfield on September 30, 1991, a Divine Liturgy in Minneapolis on April 20, 1991, weekly Vigil Services during Great Lent and many Home Blessings throughout the year.

### **Pastoral Visitations**

We continue to reach out to the faithful members of our congregation, who are infirm and unable to attend worship or activities at our church. For them we offer our prayers, administer the Sacrament of Holy Communion as they request it and extend our moral and spiritual support, guidance and charity to them, each to their own needs.

We continue to assist our sister-parishes in the Wisconsin area, who do not have full-tme pastors, by responding to their sacramental needs, as our schedule allows. This intracommunal collaboration has been regulated by our Diocesan Primate. It is our fervant prayer that soon these communities will have their own pastors.

# **Educational**

Our efforts to teach the gospel message to all levels and ages in our parish is one of our primary focuses. It is only with knowledge and understanding that we can begin to practice the mysteries that God has deigned for us.

We are extremely fortunate to have a well organized Sunday Church School with dedicated leadership and a concerned staff of teachers, who have themselves received professional training at the Mardigian Institute Seminars

offered every year at our Diocese. We are greatly encouraged also by the increase of parental participation in all our programs for the children of our church.

The Diocesan Curriculum is the official text and material used to instruct the young about the Orthodox Faith and its unique Armenian expression. The parish is indebted to these volunteers, who offer their many talents for the spiritual edification of the young church. This past fall we embarked on a **New Family Worship** experience once a month and have been encouraged that more and more families are sharing the Eucharist of Our Lord together with their children.

Bi-monthly we continue our Bible Study sessions. Our lively and sometimes overly loquatious dialogues reveal much of the knowledge about our church tradition, customs and piety that has been hidden from us because it was never properly discussed. Bible Study is perhaps one of the best educational encounters our parish offers. All are welcome to attend and join in this search for faith and understanding in the Orthodox Tradition.

### St. Nersess Conferences

This year, as part of our ministry to our youth, we sponsored five youth, who attended the St. Nersess Summer Conference at the Seminary in New Rochelle, New York. They were indeed shining examples of well-mannered, educated and spirited adolescents, who represented our parish from the Mid-West. All of them are actively involved in our ACYOA Jr. group or serving at the Holy Altar on Sundays. Their parents are, likewise, to be commended for nuturing these young people in **The Armenian Christian Tradition.** 

This year, through the good-will of Helen and Edward Mardigian of Detroit, a special Armenian Studies Program was offered at our Diocese during the semester college break. Three young girls, who are enrolled beyond the freshman year in college or university were accepted into this one week program of intensified Armenian Education.

Finally, a note on re-organization. Through the help of our Parish Council and older youths, the ACYOA Srs. was reorganized with hopes that new activity of diversified interest will grow from this group, as they become responsible young adults in our parish.

### **Special Events**

On April 21, 1991, our annual Madagh Dinner was held in our church hall. A special program and speaker was organized, in remembrance of the

occasion. Following the Special Requiem Liturgy for the victims of the 1915 Genocide, a love-meal and blessing of madagh took place in the church hall with the participation of the deacons and altar-servers.

Speaker of the day was Ms. Claire Mangasarian of Madison, who recently published her grandfather's biography. She spoke of the need to document history in the light of the Genocide of 1915 and record events, as relayed by the seniors of our community, so that this painful but important part of our history does not become forgotten.

### Primate's Visit

The weekend of May 25th and 26th was a memorable one in the life of our parish. Our Primate, His Grace Bishop Khajag made his first Pastoral Visit to Racine since his election to office.

On that weekend, he presided at worship on Saturday evening and ordained to the Order of Sub-deacon, Daniel Eghia Korakian. At the banquet that followed in our church hall, he presented The Saint Mesrob Mashdotz Award to Mikael Garoukian for years of dedicated service to our beloved parish. Also His Grace gave the Diocesan St. Vartan Award to George Stevoff for his exemplary work, not only in our parish, but on the Diocesan level. Presently George serves on the Diocesan Council.

Finally, on Sunday morning, His Grace celebrated The Divine Liturgy and award diplomas to four of our young adults, who graduated from Sunday School. He addressed the entire church school and parents encouraging them to serve God and our church and remain ever-faithful to the call of Christ.

# Worship

We were blessed this past year to have had other Armenian clergy visit St. Mesrob and celebrate for us, the Holy Eucharist and speak at our church:

In the Spring of 1991, the Orthodox-Catholic Dialogue of Southeastern Wisconsin presented a program at St. Mesrob. The evening began with Vespers in the Armenian Orthodox tradition. Participating were: Fr. Steven Sarafian, Fr. Thomas Hughson, Fr. Alexander Golitzin and Rev. Fr. Paul Frachette. A program on Orthodox-Catholic relations was presented following worship.

In May, Our Diocesan Primate, His Grace Bishop Khajag Barsamian visited our parish, ordained Daniel Korakian as Sub-deacon and celebrated the Soorp Badarak.

In August, Rev. Fr. Dajad Davidian, a former pastor of St. Mesrob, presently pastor of St. James Armenian Church of Watertown, celebrated the Holy Liturgy on The Feast of the Assumption of The Mother-of-God, The Ever Virgin Mary.

In December, Rev. Fr. Mardiros Chevian, the Director of The Diocesan Department of Youth Ministry celebrated the Divine Liturgy.

# **Ecumenical Programs**

We are thankful that our community actively responds to the North Side Food Pantry, housed at Trinity Methodist Church, by continually supplying foods for the poor and needy. This is an Ecumenical Collaboration of the Northside Parishes.

On the Sunday before Thanksgiving, we joined the Faith Methodist Church and the Trinity Methodist Church for a special prayer service to thank God for our blessings on this occasion of Thanksgiving. We offered the homily that evening in the Trinity Sanctuary. It was encouraging to see many of our parishioners join the other two congregations for this service.

We continue to take part in ecumenical dialogues with clergy from other churches. We have lectured in various non-Armenian parishes about our church and continue to represent our Diocese nationally on the Board of Governors of the National Council of Churches of Christ and the Oriental Orthodox-Roman Catholic Dialogue Bilateral.

### **IN CONCLUSION**

These are but some of the host of activities we have enjoyed in 1991. We thank God Our Father for the opportunity to glorify His Name through these works of the Spirit.

And now, 1992 has begun. What will happen this year? Will we do as well, or will we weaken? It all depends upon our willingness to serve, give time, give talent and the creativity needed to move us onward. Christ has called you all to follow Him and his shining light. Without Service, the Light weakens and Hope is lost.

Through your contined service to your church, **YOU** will provide the answers to those great mysteries and with Divine Blessing, as God-pleasing servants, **YOU** will keep alive that flame of faith, ignited by Christ in 301 A.D. in the land 'Armenia' and passed down to us today from the Hand of Our Illustrious Sainted Gregory, the Enlightener.

There are many struggles still ahead of us; the fears and anxieties of survival; yet through our collective efforts and work for our community of St. Mesrob, we all, in some measure can become the sparks that keep the flame of faith alive by aspiring to be God-pleasing servants and builders of hope for the future.

I continue to pray for openness, honesty and mutual respect between us. As your Parish Priest, I hope that whatever your physical and spiritual ills are, you yourselves share them with me directly, so that justly we together, through prayer and love, can witness the healing power of God to whatever wounds you bear. May the love of Christ Our Saviour be with you all and I pray that your future as a parish in the year ahead, be bright, productive and fruit-ful and that the future clergy of our church, who shepherd and guide you, will do so with the Grace of The Holy Spirit.

Over the years many problems arise and with the help of Biblical optimism they are all solved. However, let me present one problem which might be typical of the new era that our church's physical facilities are in - the roof of the sanctuary. It typifies the need for large expenditures for the maintenance of our building. Some of the other expenses might be repairs to the block walls of our annex, repairing the parking lot, a gravel roof here, and some rugs there. The point is that in 5 years we will be spending much more on building maintenance than we are now, and the question arises, how shall we pay for it? Discuss amongst yourselves in a Christian manner what some of the financing methods might be, whether they be fund raisers, permanent trust, or some compromise in between. We need agreement amongst ourselves that looks forward to the future.

As regards the break-in this past summer, the theft of electronic items and vandalism to doors and such totaled around \$3600. The sanctuary was not touched. Because we have adequate insurance and the volunteer spirit, we were protected from any loss.

In closing, I can not name you all, all of you who are filled with the sprit of contribution who by effort and volunteerism keep our church facilities up and who provide service of one form or another to members of our community. Be amply rewarded by having assisted with the forging of another link. God bless you all.

# ST. MESROB ARMENIAN APOSTOLIC CHURCH PERMANENT TRUST STATEMENT OF CONDITION FOR THE YEAR ENDING DECEMBER 31, 1991.

Since our report of a year ago, we've seen a reversal in the economy. This down-trend has hampered our growth, due to lower interest rates. Even though we continue to grow, our capital increases were not as aggressive as in prior years. They were, however, good enough to keep pace with the inflationary spiral. In 1990, our combined total assets from all sources were \$290,256. The 1991 report shows a total of \$315,101 which is a moderate increase of 8%. Let us remember that only \$258,578 is accessible to St. Mesrob Permanent Trust Fund, because approximately \$56,523 is classified as "Restricted Funds". These funds, known as **The Ardis and Ann Cherkinian Armenian Cultural Endowment Fund** and **The Sahag Akgulian Memorial Fund**, plus other church organizations which are carried as separate accounts.

One area which was encouraging was our stock holdings in the market place. In a business climate characterized by uncertain economic conditions, the stockmarket reached an all time high. Our stock holdings increased by 14% over 1990, and had an average dividend yield of 5%. From a base of \$17,447 in 1985, we now have a book value \$34,828, which is a 100% gain. This combined with an average dividend yield of 5% over this 6 year period has turned into a very profitable investment. Because the church is tax exempt from dividends, a study may be in order to increase our stock holdings, and diversify into other areas. This look into other avenues of investment could enhance our total financial position. Some thought should also be given to obtaining expert financial counselling on future investments.

Due to wear and tear on our complex over the past 18 years, we are now seeing signs of deterioration. Some major capital expenditures could be forth-coming over the near term. It may be necessary to keep shorter C. D. notes or a higher cash reserve in the event corrective action repairs become a necessity.

Finally, we must prepare ourselves to react rapidly to changes to create profitable growth. We must identify and find new investment opportunities, outside of traditional methods. Therefore, we must focus on our goals, so that what we're doing is really in the best interest of St. Mesrob Church.

Sunday, March 10, 1991 - Field Trip to the Spertus Jewish Museum in Chicago. A group of 42 teachers, chaperones and students were bussed to Chicago where we toured the Student Artifact Center. Groups participated in age appropriate activities, which included an archeological "dig" on the Tell (gathering place), art activities and a visit to an ancient Israelite home. Parents were invited to our first assembly program and the response was phenomenal. We had a group of over 100 students, teachers and parents in attendance. Our Kick-Off Breakfast served approximately 125 people. This may become an annual event.

The Armenian Heritage Committee was organized in August 1989 for the promotion, preservation and programming of Armenian educational and cultural events within the St. Mesrob Armenian Church Parish.

In 1991 we had 6 active members, including our Executive Board. Our officers were:

Our 1991 activities included the following:

February 28, 1991 - Teaching about the Armenian Genocide in Schools. Our committee of three met with Mr. Jeff Blaga, Head of Social Studies for Racine Unified School District #l. A videotape, (Everyone's Not Here: Families of the Armenian Genocide), as well as 2 study guides, 1 teacher's manual and 1 resource guide to the Armenian Genocide were donated by the Committee to the School District for use in the Racine schools. A follow-up will be made in 8 months. We also have submitted a list of resource persons to speak about Armenian Culture or History.

March 1991 - Same as above, this time donating to Kenosha Unified School District.

Sunday, July 7, 1991 - Armenian Fest '91. We were responsible for organizing and developing, as well as manning the culture booth and activities, which included a crash course in Armenian language. We also arranged for the Hamazkain Sardarabad Dance Ensemble from Glenview, IL to perform. This year Noah's Ark was featured as background for the taking of Polaroid group photographs. This was a full day for us all.

September 17th thru December 4th, 1991 - Armenian Language Classes for Children. A ten week session of classes on Tuesdays from 4:00 to 5:00 p.m. was taught by Hourig Tcheurekdjian. 4 students attended regularly.

Sunday, October 13, 1991 - Luncheon and Program. Lunch was served in St. Mesrob Cultural Hall followed by the Program, <u>Treasured Images: Armenians Through the Eye of the Camera</u>, with Ms. Ruth Thomasian, (Director of Project SAVE). Sister churches, as well as other public communities, had been invited. There were 84 persons attending. Ms. Thomasian also visited homes in the community, as well as met with individual at church.

Sunday, December 8, 1991 - An Audiovisual Presentation and Lecture by Rev. Joseph and Esther Alexanian (from Kenosha) on their trip to Soviet Armenia. A total of 40 persons attended this excellent program which ended with refreshments being served.

### ST. MESROB PROJECT COMMITTEE 1991 REPORT

Like other church organizations, the St. Merob's Project Committee entered 1991 with many concerns. It is still unclear how these prime concerns can be resolved, unless more of our parishioners get directly involved. Our numbers are comprised of a few senior citizens, and sometimes our tasks seem impossible, due to this limited help.

During 1991 some major steps were launched to curtail some of the deteriorating conditions after 18 years in the complex. One concern was the facial siding on the Church. Some of the trim lumber under the siding was water-logged, causing a rotting condition in some sections. With the help of **Mark Akgulian** and members, **Sam and Harry Akgulian**, the reconstruction phase was completed within three weeks at nominal costs.

Urgency is now a key word regarding the roof leak. Last year we made an attempt to resolve the problem, but it now seems our efforts weren't extensive enough. It now appears that another attempt will have to be made on a larger portion on the north section. This must be done in early spring. This will take a large group of voluntary help to prevent a much greater expenditure of adding a new roof.

Reworking the block walls on the hall still requires completion. We feel that this may have to contracted out, as we do not have the knowledge or tools to tackle this project.

In reference to the vandalism we had the past year, we felt the contractor's bid of \$1,100.00 was excessive, thus the repair was completed at a fraction of that figure, by a few members of the committee.

Another item that has plaqued us for many years, was rust in our hot water lines. This has finally been resolved. The entire hot water tank was cleared of pails of sand and other minerals and two anode rods installed.

Projects, such as the re-surfacing of the asphalt on the entrance drive, roofing the storage garage and various repairs to the parish house, constitute other areas that must be addressed. These will require additional financial commitments.

Other items, which require regular service periodically, are the freezer, water coolers, light fixtures, plumbing fixtures, cleaning kitchen reservoir, filter cleaning, oiling equipment and other numerous items, too many to mention, are on-going projects.

The new Jacobsen Tractor was a welcome addition in the weekly chore of grass cutting.

Your Projects Committee recognizes its responsibilities, which are conducted without any fanfare. However, as I've stated before, our numbers are small. Our successes provide a taste of what individuals can accomplish by working together. Why not take the opportunity to benefit St. Mesrob by joining us? We are equally committed to our properties and look forward to meeting these challenges with you.
