


Special Parish Assembly Church Roof and Search Team Report October 11,1992 11:35am

Chairman Murad Gengozian opened the meeting and Deacon Chuck Hardy led the parish in the opening prayer.

Elsie Garoukian moved that a quorum is represented. Pat McConnel seconded the motion. Approved.

The secretary's report was given. Mel Hagopian moved that the report be accepted as read. Mesag Vidian seconded the motion. Approved.

The agenda was accepted as written.

1. Roof Repair -- Sam Akgulian read a report on the condition and repair of the church and annex roof. The projects committee has not decided the best course of action at this time but would like authorization to repair the roof.

Mel Hagopian moved that the parish council be authorized to spend up to \$40,000 from the Permanent Trust Fund for the repair of the church and annex roof. Mesag Vidian seconded the motion. Approved.

2. Search Committee -- Murad Gengozian updated the parish on the process for selection of a new priest for St. Mesrob. He listed candidates who have visited or were being considered:

Fr. Samuel Aghoyan

Fr. Ashen Aivazian

Fr. Arsen Barsamian

He also stated there is another candidate who may be interviewed in the near future; discussed some of the questions asked; and listed the members of the committee.

Murad also stated that in the 21 Sundays since the departure of Der Garabed, we have had Badarak 12 times and commended the parish and especially Chuck Hardy and the Choir for working hard to keep things going. Murad also reviewed the schedule of visiting pastors through November.

Mel Hagopian moved that the meeting be adjourned. Mesag Vidian seconded the motion. Meeting Approved. Chuck Hardy led the parish in a closing prayer.

PARISH COUNCIL CHAIRMAN'S REPORT FOR 1992

The 1992 Parish Council was faced with an unexpected challenge, when in March, **Fr. Garabed Kochakian**, resigned as our **Pastor** to become **Chancellor of our Diocese**. His last official day as Pastor of St. Mesrob was May 15th.

The Parish Council responsibilities and duties were greatly expanded, as were the responsibilities of the other church organizations and the church staff people.

On Sunday, June 21st, a **Farewell Dinner and Program** was given to honor **Fr. Garabed and Yeretzgin Roberta** as they depart from Racine. The Parish Council Farewell Dinner Committee through their planning, afforded St. Mesrob Parishioners, the community and friends, the opportunity to express thanks for ten years of service and for best wishes in the future.

We thank and must recognize the cooperation of all Parish Organizations, who worked toward a successful year. **Arch-Deacon Charles Hardy** is to be commended for being instrumental in keeping the Sunday Services going. He assisted the visiting clergy. When there was no Badarak, he conducted Jashou Services and gave very inspiring sermons. Our other Deacons and altar servers did their duties faithfully.

The **Choir** fulfilled their role beautifully even under difficult circumstances and we sincerely thank them. They will grow in number and the parish must encourage and assist them.

We are grateful for having a dedicated **Sunday School Superintendent and teachers** to teach our children the Word of God. The students learn the significance of different parts of the Badarak from the Deacon. Parent involvement is necessary for Sunday School success. If you parents can do more - the staff will appreciate it.

The **Women's Guild** service to the Parish Council is very helpful. They have been called on to organize dinners, to have fellowships, to prepare foods for Armenian Fest and to visit the sick and shut-ins in the name of the Church. They have many of their own successful projects such as the Armenian Christmas Fair, the Parish Christmas Card, serving dinners to the needy and Food Pantry collector. Their financial contribution to the church operation is a credit to their hard work and ingenuity.

We thank the **Armenian Heritage Committee** for an interesting program and dinner during Armenian Cultural Month. Their innovative idea of promoting Armenian Fest nationally through the use of the Racine Convention & Visitors Bureau was effective advertising.

The **Retiree's Club** is our largest church organization and have tremendous work experience. Their services to the church are appre ciated and they will be called on to volunteer to serve our Church.

The **A.C.Y.O.A. Jrs.** are growing in number. We are proud of their quick learning and the activities they support. These young people are the future of the Church. May God bless them.

The **Armenian Fest Committee**, with their planning and the organ ization of our church members and friends into a hard-working team, has financially contributed to the economic support of St. Mesrob.

The **Projects Committee** has been instrumental in keeping the church building and grounds in A-l condition. Their members have donated many hours of work to this end. Without this group, a paid caretaker would be necessary.

We thank the **Auditing Committee and Permanent Trust Committee** for the professionalism that they have shown in carrying out their duties in a timely manner.

The **Nominating Committee** also receives our thanks for finding candidates to run for the church offices. We thank all nominees for accepting.

We want to acknowledge and thank all those members who served as ushers, arranged for altar flowers, provided for a clean altar, cleaned the church each week and performed other duties that are necessary for a beautiful church.

A **Search Committee**, consisting of all Parish Council Members and Diocesan Delegates and Alternate, have approached and interviewed a number of clergymen of the Eastern and Western Dioceses for the position of Pastor for St. Mesrob Church. We have had one

Special Parish Assembly Meeting and one meeting of all organization chairpersons to inform and to get suggestions from them. We have kept in touch with Srpazan Hayr Khajag with our progress. We are near to announcing our selection, but can not name him until the final details are worked our. Srpazan Hayr will make the appointment.

Parish Council meetings are scheduled for every other week, but it was often necessary to meet every week.

We have kept a close watch on spending - anticipating a large 1993 expenditure for building and parking-lot maintenance. The Projects Committee, after much study and consultation with roofing engineers will oversee contracting for a new roof.

The parking-lot also needs to be sealed and striped. The Special Parish Assembly authorized the Council to withdraw up to \$40,000.00 from the Permanent Trust Fund for this building maintenance project. Our budget reflects that we may only need to withdraw \$25,000.00 from the Permanent Trust Fund.

We have a new line item in the budget. It is called, 'The Adopt-A-Child Fund'. This is for the care of a boy and girl orphan in Armenia. We hope future councils will show their love for these children and continue this support.

We were fortunate to have visiting clergymen to celebrate Badarak more than 50% of the Sundays since Fr. Garabed's departure. Jashou Services were held on the remaining Sundays. All requests for baptisms and marriages were arranged for and completed. Several funerals were conducted.

Archbishop Khajag Barsamian visited our community twice. His first visit was to Armenian Fest in August. He was surprised and pleased at the size and scope of this event. Srpazan Hayr was introduced to many individual midwestern members of his flock, who were attending the Festival.

Srpazan Hayr again visited St. Mesrob for Armenian Christmas on January 9, 1993. He gave the children Communion in the morning, attended a special afternoon children's party and distributed gifts. Later in the evening, following Badarak Service, Srpazan Hayr presided at an informal dinner hosted by the Diocese. Only young adults (18 to 36) from the four northern midwestern churches were invited to attend. After dinner they asked questions, told of their concerns and suggested changes for the Armenian Church. Srpazan Hayr gave answers to the questions and concerns. He used the term, "Contemporizing the Church", when giving his answers. After Srpazan departed, the young adults discussed theevening. They were pleased by Srpazan's genuine interest in them and their concerns. We are looking forward to his returning to our parish.

At the request of the Diocese on January 17th, Parish Council implemented the Racine area participation in , "Operation Winter Rescue" for the Republic of Armenia. Humanitarian aid supplies will be shipped by the United States Government. The co-ordinating group is the Diocese DARF.

In conclusion, we are indebted to our office staff for carrying out their assigned tasks and for their skills in communicating needs and requests of anyone calling St. Mesrob Church. They are an asset that all of our church organizations use. We, of the Parish Council, are aware of their excellent work and gratefully thank them. Your Parish Council feels that we have met the challenges of this past year. Once again we thank you our parishioners for your help and trust.

ST. MESROB SUNDAY SCHOOL 1991 - 1992 REPORT

February 1992, Community Profile:

Two AHC members met and worked on the Wisconsin Armenian Community Profile, concerning which our Church had been contacted by Sonia D. Harlan of Chicago.

Sunday, August 8, 1992, Armenian Fest '92:

As in the past, the AHC had the responsibility of organizing and developing cultural activities and manning the culture booth in which Armenian name buttons were made andeducational brochures handed out. Other activities included arranging for the Minneapolis Dance Troupe to perform, decorating the Green Room, contacting persons for the cooking demonstration and presenting the video-tape program.

In conjunction with year's Fest, an innovative approach called 'Armenian Heritage Holiday' was put into action for the first time to draw greater attendance to the Fest. This 'Holiday' consisted of:

- 1. By working through the Racine Convention and Visitors' Bureau, a brochure was drawn up to announce and promote the Fest, as well as other attractions in the Racine area, and mailed out.
- 2. Blocks of motel rooms were reserved for the convenience of potential visitors.

- 3. A hospitality room was made available at one of the motels, and was manned by RCVB.
- 4. RCVB had a welcome-to-Racine exhibit at the Fest, at which they also conducted a survey.

Sunday, October 25, 1992, Buffet and Cultural Program:

A buffet was prepared and served in the St. Mesrob Cultural Hall, followed by a program of musical selections and a speaker, **Professor Kevork Bardakjian of the Ann Arbor Campus of the University of Michigan,** who spoke on the topic, 'The Armenian Identity: Yesterday and Today'. The number of persons in attendance was 78.

Some potential activities planned for 1992 include:

- 1. Armenian Language Classes (March May) will be offered.
- 2. AHC will again sponsor the culture booth and other cultural activities at Armenian Fest '93.
- 3. Other cultural programs are in the works.
- * Parish Council Chairman, Murad Gengozian became ex-officio President on March 15, 1993.

We are presently working with a consultant for finalizing this reconstruction: We have already received approval for the money on the roof and other areas such as the hall and etc. As soon we get our priorities in order and feel conformity in our opinions we will then proceed with the repairs.

After many years of occupancy our tenants decided to make a move from our Parish House. Thanks to the handy work of Harry Akgulian he has already updated the interior in various areas requiring immediate attention. The exterior however requires painting and the possibility of some siding on the garage and house trim.

Our success depends on parishioners who are actively involved and committed. We will continue to try as always to get additional members so we work more efficiently. As I stated earlier your helping hands are needed more in the summer months. We have the equipment now all we need are the bodies.

We feel if we are determined St. Mesrob members and consider our responsible we can fulfill our promise for a better future.
