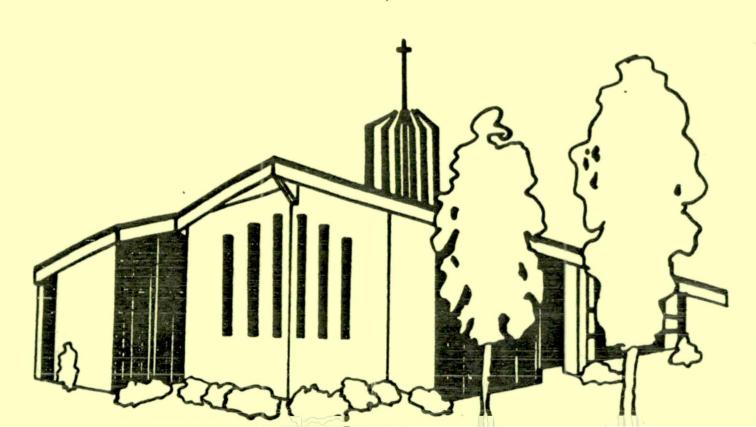

ST. MESROB ARMENIAN CHURCH PARISH ASSEMBLY MINUTES Sunday, November 21, 1993

After the opening prayer led by Father Yeprem Kelegian, Parish Council Chairman George Stevoff called the meeting to order at 11:30 a.m.

Mesag Vidian moved that the number of members present did indeed form a quorum; Ed Kargenian seconded. Motion passed.

The minutes of May 12, 1993, as read by Parish Council Secretary Judy Hachikian were accepted on a motion and second by Mesag Vidian and Sam Paragamian.

The chairman addressed the assembly with comments that the proposals on the agenda for the day were all items which would have to be funded by the Permanent Trust, therefore the parish assembly was called.

Facia: During the course of the repairs on the church roof it was discovered that the facia was in need of repairs due to rotting away of wooden beams beneath the facia. Cost of repair to the facia and some wooden beams would be approximately \$3450. On motion of Shockey Gengozian and second of Mesag Vidian repairs were authorized with expenses not to exceed \$3450; monies to come out of the Permanent Trust. After discussion of the motion, it was further moved by Sam Paragamian and seconded by Perry Paragamian that the motion be tabled until later in the meeting. Passed unanimously.

Parking Lot: Present state of the parking lot surface is poor with large cracks over much of the lot; weeds grow rampant through the cracks, probably even forcing the cracks to widen. The overall appearance is not good. Chairman Stevoff suggested we have four options (1) patch the present surface; (2) apply a top coat only; (3) completely break down/pulverize the current blacktop and resurface it, or (4) do nothing.

Sam Akgulian stated we had received one informal estimate from Oakes which quoted a price of \$20-36,000 to completely resurface the parking lot.

On motion made by Mesag Vidian and seconded by Claire Kadamian, we would authorize the total resurfacing at a price not to exceed \$50,000, monies coming from the Permanent Trust Fund. The motion was defeated (22 for, 25 against).

It was suggested by Perry Paragamian that Projects Committee Chairman Sam Akgulian should obtain an estimate for cleaning out the cracks and filling them in. The estimate and subject should be put on the agenda for the 1994 annual parish assembly.

Removal of trees: It was recommended by Projects Committee Chairman Sam Akgulian that two large trees should be removed from the church property - one immediately to the south and the other to the west (front) of the church. Reason for removal was because of potential damage to the building should the trees fall during a storm.

A motion was made by Mesag Vidian and seconded that we should remove the trees as described by Sam Akgulian not to exceed \$2,000, monies to come from the Permanent Trust Fund. Mike Garoukian moved to table the motion; Alice Hazarian seconded. Motion passed.

Steeple Replacement: As a point of information, Father Yeprem stated that according to the Armenian church (history), the steeple should be mounted on the roof. Paul Tewegian moved to have the topic tabled to the next assembly; motion carried.

Dwelling Repairs: The parish house is in need of maintenance and repairs to the window trim and garage door. Paul Tewegian moved and Mesag Vidian seconded; that the parish house be repaired with aluminum siding trim and a new garage door, cost not to exceed \$5,000, and the money to come from Permanent Trust. Motion passed.

Kitchen Equipment Replacement: The kitchen is in need of a new refrigerator, freezer and oven. Research and pricing will be compiled by members of the Women's Guild and will be presented for action at the February annual parish assembly.

Facia: The motion concerning the facia was re-addressed and put to a vote. Motion passed.

New Business

- No cornerstone memorabilia is available to us from 1326 State Street. (This was investigated by Gary Vidian and Mike Kaprelian.)
- Paul Tewegian will ask Ted Hajinian for the St. Mesrob name sign which came from the State Street church.
- 40 boxes of clothing gathered for Armenia could not be shipped there (no additional vessels were available), so all the clothing was donated to The Purple Heart.

PASTOR'S ANNUAL REPORT 1993

It is with joy and honor that I serve as Pastor of the St. Mesrob Armenian Church. I believe the Lord has called me to St. Mesrob and, thereby, blessed me. My purpose and aim in life is to spread the good news of Jesus Christ. Therefore, it is my aim as the Pastor of St. Mesrob to use all my talents and energy to gather the faithful in a loving relationship with God and with each other. I look to the parishioners to work with me toward knowing, serving and loving the Lord more and more.

I do not look at the Church as an institution or as a compilation of organizations or as a social entity. I look at the Church as a place of Salvation. Salvation has many aspects, but, primarily, it is seeking and finding the Lord in our own lives. This, in turn, leads us to seek out others in order to share our Christian love.

In this coming year, I will be directing the use of my time, talents and efforts to serve the Lord as he continues to work out his Salvation among us. I invite all the parishioners to this same concept. I invite you to share in the joy of learning by coming to one of the numerous religious/educational programs. I invite you to come more often to share the joy of worship on Sundays. I invite you to share this joy with more and more fellow parishioners.

STATISTICS (All statistics are based on five months)

Pastoral Visits

I averaged five home visits per week (181).

The purpose of my visits are numerous. The following are some examples: Pre-Baptism; getting to know the children of St. Mesrob; sickness; bereavement; new parishioners; shut ins; post marriage; to share ideas for serving the Church; to share faith; sacramental (e.g. home blessing); elderly (harkanki hamar). Very seldom are visits purely social.

Hospital Visits

I averaged 2.5 hospitals and nursing homes per week, seeing, on the average, 3 patients a week (58 and 71).

I visit the hospitalized in the Racine and Milwaukee hospitals, as well as our nursing home residents.

Teaching

Bible Study, which meets every other Wednesday (9); Religious Study, which meets Thursdays around noon (II); Bible Fellowship, primarily for those in their 20's and 30's, meets once a month (2).

The purposes of the above programs (and more to come) are to share the faith, to gather in love and to learn from each other. The entire rationale of the church is built upon this.

Acolytes, Kushotz and Altar Servers (14)

Recolytes - I am teaching the eight acolytes the basics of serving the altar, the Bible and Church history. We also go on social outings, e.g. skiing, pizza, movies.....The purpose of training acolytes in this fashion is to instill serving God and to have a social bond with each other. This enforces the concept of Church as a "family".

Kushotz - I am training two young men in the Kushotz and serving.

**Ritar Servers - I also teach two young men who wish to learn the deacons parts more proficiently.

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Other Educational programs

- Explanation of the Divine Liturgy (November 3 and 18). This will be offered again in the Fall with a different format.
- Aids and the Response of the Church (December 3 in Chicago and December 8 in Racine)

WORSHIP

Everything we do at St. Mesrob must come together around the Worship of the Lord. If not, then something is not quite right. Thus far, actual numbers of worshipers is increasing, but no where near representative of the number of faithful associated with St. Mesrob.

Divine Liturgy is conducted every Sunday, preceded by a one hour morning service. I have been attempting to make the service more understandable through periodic explanations during the Liturgy and through the Family Liturgy. The purpose of having Families together during Liturgy, once a month, is to put the children in the midst of the people who will teach them to pray: Parents, the rest of the worshiping community and God.

Christmas Eve Service, December 24, was attended by 165 people.

I will be offering Liturgy in Waukegan every other month, at the request of the Primate. On these Sundays, Rev. Fr. Vahram Hazarian will perform Liturgy at St. Mesrob.

Meetings

I presided over 58 St. Mesrob related meetings. I attended six Midwest Regional meetings.

Functions

I attended eleven Church related functions and three Regional functions.

<u>Varak and Messenger</u>: These publications are the main sources of our printed outreach. The <u>Varak</u> is eight times a year; the <u>Messenger</u>, weekly.

<u>Ecumenical</u>: Racine Clergy Association and various ecumenical services and activities.

Vacation Days

Out of the 9 days (based on 5 months) possible, I took 3 days.

Office Hours

I am in the Office, generally, in the morning. The office staff always knows where I am at other times.

Regarding the general concern of the youth:

The Sunday School is bringing youth of all ages together for learning and service to the church. The Acolyte and Kushotz programs are important elements also. The ACYOA Juniors are a fine group of teens serving and socializing. Tony Ferraro has been helping me with them.

Bible Fellowship is a successful attempt to bring older "youth" together around the Gospel. Sunday night Basketball will be helping bring more together. I keep in touch with all the youth through college age by calls, letters or visits. There is much more to do and in 1994 we will be much more effective in our efforts.

PARISH COUNCIL REPORT for 1993

The Parish Council took office while we were without a permanently assigned parish pastor and, at the same time, a severely leaking roof. The two were not related and corrections were well under way thanks to the previous parish council. The leaky roof has been replaced, and as you are aware, we have a permanent parish pastor, Fr. Yeprem Kelegian, as our spiritual leader.

Our parish has always been a very active parish with great organizations directing its activities. We have and continue to be financially sound as is evident by the financial statements accompanying this report. In spite of all the positive aspects of our parish, we must find a solution to the retention of our youth in parish life. In all of our activities, which we have done so well for so many years, we must now put additional emphasis on our youth and young adults. We must incorporate their activities in our organizations, teach them to be leaders and allow them the opportunities to grow.

Parish members have become acutely aware of our need to review the future of this parish and question how best to retain our youth active in the church. We felt the importance of addressing this issue and are very gratified that Fr. Yeprem is taking it up as one of his highest priorities. The Parish Council has discussed various ideas that have come to us and with Fr. Yeprem's vigor and commitment are now exploring these avenues.

Currently, we are not aware of a more pressing concern and will continue with our commitment.

A review of our finances will show minor adjustments in our budget which reflect fund raising activities relatively unchanged from what they have been in the past. Our financial dependence on the revenues generated from the Festival Committee and Women's Guild are greatly appreciated, as they represent approximately 30% of our total annual income. A historical review of our finances will show that we have perennially generated approximately \$100,000 of income, year in and year out, for many, many years. The increases in all of the services that we purchase and other expenses incurred have slowly crept up for us as they have for all businesses. We are seeking a modest increase in membership dues starting in 1995, which will be on the agenda. With this modest increase in dues, we hope to offset the modest increases that we have.

The Parish Council has also undertaken a program to have individuals increase their voluntary weekly pledge. The results of our calls have been positive and are reflected in the amount of pledge income estimated for 1994. Once again, if you haven't been contacted and have not yet returned your pledge card, <u>please</u> make your commitment now which will help us achieve the goal we have established.

It would appear that when we have major expenditures in repair or maintenance of our facilities, our budget will not be able to accommodate them. As these extraordinary needs arise, they will have to be separate considerations by the Parish Assembly to either be funded by the Permanent Trust or through other special fund raising. The resurfacing of the parking lot is one of the needs that will have to be considered at this Parish Assembly.

We have been honored to serve you for this past year and feel fortunate to have so many people willing to volunteer their time for the benefit of our parish. Those of you that have not had an opportunity to serve on a volunteer basis, please contact the Parish Council, as we have many projects that will require your assistance.
