PASTOR'S REPORT 1994

One of the major spiritual themes of 1994 was "Reaching Out" to others to share the love of Christ through our actions and prayers. One of the major themes of 1995 will be Christian witness. Witness is simply sharing with others how the Lord helps you, loves you and cares for you. We will continue on our path of growth in Jesus Christ in reaching out, in love and in witness.

I have been here for one and a half years and I consider it a privilege and "godsend" that I am here at St. Mesrob. Thanks to the Lord, previous pastors and our work together, much has been done. However, much is still undone or is still in process. The Church is not yet considered a place to regularly gather in worship by the majority of those who consider themselves parishioners. Much is yet to be done with the various youth age groups. But, together with the newly hired youth coordinator, Meline Grigorian, I know that great strides can be made in youth ministry.

Pastoral Home Visits 4 visits per week (190)

My visits usually have a purpose. I do not simply visit people to make social calls. The purposes, to name a few: Shut ins, bereaved, pre-baptism, illness, home blessings, elderly and many other special pastoral reasons.

Visits to hospitals and nursing homes are of primary importance in the Christian ministry and I hope that you are also considering it important in your Christian discipline. I averaged 2.5 visits a week (ll9), visiting 3 patients (l40) per week.

Teaching Ministry

This has been a real joy for me. I enjoy discussing the Faith, sharing ideas, teaching and learning.

Bible Study met 26 times. My aim in Bible Study is to teach people how simple and straight forward the message in the Bible is. We then enjoy sharing ideas and reactions.

<u>Religious Study</u> met 24 times. This group discusses issues in the Church and in contemporary society.

Bible Fellowship meets monthly from September through June. We discuss the challenge of keeping the faith in an ever changing world.

Acolyte training conducted 29 times. We have a growing and enthusiastic group of young people desiring to serve the altar.

<u>Vacation Bible School</u> was held July 6 and 8, with a presentation on Sunday, July 10. The theme was Noah's Ark and how God loves his creatures, especially us. Alice Hazarian, Pam Kazarian, Amy Burmeister, Claudia Kalinoski and many adult and teen volunteers made these days a real blessing to the children and church.

<u>The Midwest Third Annual Retreat</u> was hosted by St. Mesrob, September 30 and October 1. The 34 participants discussed the Mission of the Armenian Church.

Hve Camp (7 days) Fr. Yeprem was the Religious Director.

<u>Lenten Educational Series - Focus on the Family</u>
Three programs were presented on Sundays of Lent:
Media Literacy; Christian Parenting; Power in Parenting the Young Child.

Wednesdays of Lent- After the services, meditations were given.
