


The Armenian Church Youth Organization of America

The Armenian Church Youth Organization of America of the Diocese of the Armenian Church of America was created on January 12, 1946 in Providence, Rhode Island.

This new Diocesan-wide National Organization, created for the youth of the Armenian Church, emerged from the crumbling foundation of the then many local Junior Leagues and clubs that were formed for the young people of the Armenian Church Parishes.

World War II interrupted the activities of these local groups, many of which were simply inactive during those difficult years. With the termination of the war, a renewed necessity took place of re-organizing the local Parish youth groups. Bishop Tiran Nèrsoyan, the newly elected Diocesan Primate, wholeheartedly took on the challenge of a problem which was causing the elders of the communities to question the future of the Church in America. This challenge was carried by Bishop Tiran to the American - Armenian youth. To all communities he passed on the informing spark, so important to the creating and continuation of activities and work took place at the "Constitutional Assembly" of Church Youth, held in Providence, Rhode Island, January 12, 1946.

In what seemed a short time, the A.C.Y.O.A. had a strong parishbase through the chapters, as well as a strong administration embodied in the Central Council. Throughout the Diocese, A.C.Y.O.A. events and activities took place with growing success. In parishes across the Diocese, an excitement filled the air as young people of all ages were coming to the Churches, participating in programs and sponsoring events season after season.

Throughout the years, the A.C.Y.O.A. has taken on various projects within the parishes as well as on the Diocesan level. Some of these local ectivities have included consistent help with annual events in the parish, sponsoring fund-raisers, planning programs and participatin in building projects.

On the national level, some projects have included raising sizable funds for the restoration of the Mother Cathedral of Holy Etchmiadzin, as well as contributions to the former Youth Camp Fund and the Seminary Fund of the Diocese.

Better known of A.C.Y.O.A. accomplishments is the sponsorship of publications in the Diocese such as: Sacrements and Prayers of the Armenian Church, a Pictoral Guide to Armenian Divine Liturgy, Catechism of Christian Instruction, Home Blessings at Christmas and Easter, The Armenian Church and Her Teachings, Handbook to Armenia, as well as The A.C.Y.O.A. Chapter Handbook. Some of the earliest publications of the present Department of Religious Education found their roots in A.C.Y.O.A

An Armenian Theological School was one of the more cherished dreams of the A.C.Y.O.A. and today it has become a reality. Sunday School Teachers conferences were organized and held by A.C.Y.O.A., and out of these conferences was born the Council for Religious Education (CRE) which now directs the Church Sunday Schools.

The A.C.Y.O.A. has also initiated and developed the **Armenian Studies Program** of overseas trips to Armenia and the Holy Land. The early 1970's found it to be the most worthy of A.CY.O.A. programs, developing into an annual pilgrimage to Armenia

The National Sports Weekend, concerning athletic competition and social activities took over in the 1970's and 1980's where the great General Assemblies of the 1950's and 1960's left off. Attracting an estimated 600-800 members annually in its 17 year history, this is the one event that every member plans for each year. Taking place over the Labor Day holiday weekend, the program has been hosted by various chapters from throughout the Diocese. Offering both sporting events and social events, Sports Weekend is one of the most successful of A.C.Y.O.A. programs.

The A.C.Y.O.A. initiated plans in the late 1970's for a Diocesan Youth Camp. A.C.Y.O.A. organized and started what is now a flourishing program under the direction and sponsorship of the Diocese, entitled "St. Vartan Camp".

For many years, the A.C.Y.O.A. has promoted the observance of commemorative Martyrs Day events for the victims of the Armenian Genocide of 1915.

The Archbishop Torkom Manoogian Basketball Tounament, initiated by His Eminence in 1970, has also become the responsibility of the A.C.Y.O.A.

Through the years, A.C.Y.O.A. has grown into a strong and vigorous organization. Many dedicated young men and women have passed from its ranks into positions of responsibility and leadership in their communities. Many parish council members, diocesan delegates, deacons and Sunday school teachers have been members of the A.C.Y.O.A.



The mission of A.C.Y.O.A. is to create among the younger generation a greater spiritual culture and tradition, and to instill into its members a true spirit of civic mindedness.

The future for the A.C.Y.O.A. can be a glorious one. With continued support, A.C.Y.O.A. can achieve unprecedented heights. This must be our constant aim. The community should realize just as the seed of today is the harvest of tomorrow, so it will be that the future of our beloved Church will rest upon the shoulders of the emmbers of the Armenian Church Youth Organization of America.

CHURCH HISTORY

Our earliest history of the Armenian religious life in the Providence community dates back to 1888 when a small group of 35 people formed the Parish Council and the Armenian National Library Association. Armenians seeking freedom and protection came to this area in large numbers during the 1895-1896 massacre. The first permanent pastor in Providence, Father Vaghinag Sisagian, was appointed in 1897 when the Armenian population had grown to over 500. Under his leadership the church choir, Boy Scout troop and an orchestra were organized. Religious services were held in a rented hall until 1913.

In 1913, the dream of a church became a realization and this church still serves our parishioners. The church was built in 1868 and was formerly occupied by the Jefferson Baptist Congregation. On January 20, 1914, the first Christmas Liturgy was celebrated in the Church by Very Rev. Vagharshag Arshagouni who served as pastor until 1917.

Several clergymen served from 1917-1938. In August, 1938, Very Rev. Sion Manoogian bacame pastor of our church. During his eight year pastorate the church realized a period of spiritual reawakening and growth. The Sunday School was reorganized and the Jr. League and Jr. Ladies Aid formed. Shortly after his elevation to the rank of Bishop, he assumed pastorate of the Detroit community. In January, 1946, our Parish hosted the Constitutional Assembly of the Armenian Church Youth Organization of America. Rev. Shahe Altounian was appointed pastor of our parish in 1950, during this period the younger generation took a greater part in church activities and the Men's Club was organized. Father Altounian left Providence and assumed a pastorate in Oakland, California.

He was succeeded in 1958, by another young and capable clergyman, Rev. Haik Donikian. During this period the Egavian Cultural Center was constructed and through the efforts of the A.C.Y.O.A., air conditioning was installed. Father Donikian left in 1980 to become assistant pastor in Detroit. In June, 1980, Very Rev. Fr. Vazken Keshishian was appointed our Parish Priest. The Women's Guild established the Church Hokejash Committee, which provides memorial dinners during times of sorrow. Fr. Keshishian also formed a Senior Citizens Group. Major renovations within the church and restoration of the stained glass windows took place during this time. Very Rev. Vazken was assigned to the newly-formed Diocese of Canada as Locum Tenens. Later he was consecrated as Bishop and then Archbishop. Very Rev. Shnork Kasparian succeeded Fr. Vazken until May of 1985. He is now pastor of Holy Shoghagat Armenian Church in Belleville, Illinois. During his tenure he instituted Adult Bible Study classes.

Our present Pastor, Very Rev. Baret Yeretzian, assumed his duties in June of 1985. He was appointed Vicar of the New England Region and directed the New England arrangements for the third Pastoral visit to the United States of His Holiness Vazken I, Catholicos of All Armenian in 1987. The renovation of the church stained glass windows was completed. A new church roof and circulating fans were installed in the church proper.

This year, 1988, marks the 75th anniversary of St. Sahag & St. Mesrob Armenian Church. We look forward to expanding our existing facilities and adding new ones. We welcome the A.C.Y.O.A. youth and we wish them much success -- for we know that out youth is our HOPE for the future dreams of our people for generations to come.



THE EMBLEM OF THE ARMENIAN CHURCH YOUTH ORGANIZATION OF AMERICA AND ITS SYMBOLIC MEANING

The emblem of the Armenian Church Youth Organization of America adopted at its inception, is to be interpreted as follows:

The radiations from the center of the cross symbolize the truths of the Christian religion that shine forth through the centuries.

The symbols under the horizontal bar of the cross are:

- a. (right hand side) The double peaks of the Mount Ararat, representing the Armenian people and its destiny. Ararat has been the silent witness of the victories as well as defeats of the Armenians through their existence as a people and a nation. Its representation of the A.C.Y.O.A. emblem means that the members of the Organization make the pledge of standing for the ideals for which the Armenian nation has stood always.
- b. (left hand side) The United States eagle with its wings widespread and star above each wing. The eagle looks proudly into far distances and holds, as usual a batch of arrows. The eagle represents the United States. Its presence on the A.C.Y.O.A. emblem symbolizes the loyalty of the members of the A.C.Y.O.A. to the Constitution of the United States and to its principles of democracy and freedom.

The chain that encircles the cross on the emblem represents solidarity among the members of the A.C.Y.O.A. in their service to God and to people.

These symbols are designed on a shield which stands for the determination with which the objects of the A.C.Y.O.A. are to be carried out. The shield also stands for defense against dangerous encroachments.

It will be noted that the dominating feature of the emblem is the cross. This indicates the fact Christ is our Lord and that to Him we owe obedience above all.

The role of the youth in the preservation of the Armenian Church in America cannot be minimized. The elders of our church have accepted the premise that the "future belongs to those who prepare for it", and thus have seen the wisdom of investing in their youth to the extent of encouraging their Church Youth in every way possible to keep alive the aims and purposes of A.C.Y.O.A.

For generations the A.C.Y.O.A. has endeavored to supply the links that will eventually make transition of responsibility smoother. The young men and women of today have an obvious challenge. As a younger generation, whose ancestors had been transplanted and had roots on alien soil, and who pledged their loyalty to their adopted land, we should continue, as they have to point with pride at our Churches and say "THIS IS OUR HERITAGE AND OUR IDENTITY".

May the Lord give our youth the grace and strength to fulfill this, their mission.

A TRIBUTE

It was during the tenure of Archbishop Tiran Nersoyan as Primate of the Diocese of the Armenian Church (1943-1954) that the Armenian Church Youth Organization of America came into existence.

Tiran Srpazan carried a challenge to the locally organized youth groups and placed a spark in their midst, and as a result of his foresight, the A.C.Y.O.A. was formed in 1946.

The youth of the Armenian church in America hereby extends its gratitude to the founder of the A.C.Y.O.A. for his patience and understanding, for his truly wise counsel and scholarly teaching, and especially for his untiring efforts in nurturing our Organization along each step of its growth.




