PARISH COUNCIL MEETING
WEDNESDAY, FEBRUARY 7, 1973

The meeting was called to order at 7:45 p.m. with all members present:

The minutes of the previous meeting were read by Harry Armaganian. This was followed by the Treasurer's Report.

The first topic discussed was the refusal of Harry Armaganian to accept the position of Council Secretary. Chairman Stevoff then proposed that Hunaz Hazarian handle the task of Parish Council Recorder and also handle the general clerical functions of typing the minutes and recording them weekly and also performing other functions of a clerical nature. Harry Armaganian, therefore, agreed to accept the position of Secretary only if the before stated conditions were met by Miss Hazarian.

Der Hyre then gave his weekly report on his church duties for the period February 1 thru February 8, 1973. Attached is the outline of his schedule followed. X

Next, Chairman Stevoff appointed certain duties for each council member:

Harry Akgulian	Liaison between Building Committee and Parish Council
Chuck Garbedian	Liaison between Parish Council and other committees and groups
Harry Boranian	Make up of church bulletin board and assignment of keys
John Esayian	Charge of regular church calendar

Harry Boranian and Harry Armaganian were given responsibility to purchase necessary office furniture.

The secretary was instructed to contact all organizational heads to set up individual meetings with the parish council.

Next the subject of membership for Sunday School teaching eligibility was discussed. No definite conclusions were finalized.

Next Saturday's ACYOA dance was discussed. It was unanimously agreed that should an issue be made of nationalistic displays at the dance, this would be a cause for dismissal of any participant.

John Esayian followed with his church maintenance report. After thorough discussion it was agreed to hire a professional maintenance man - Roger Strawnsky. His rate would

be \$20 per week, with the possibility of the job expanded to other duties, such as regular nightly security checks, light checks and inspection of thermostats. The council agreed that the extra services would require \$5 - \$10 additional pay. All church maintenance and clean-up functions are jointly under the control of Harry Akgulian, John Esayian and Chuck Garbedian. Chairman Stevoff then asked that one member of the above three contact Nishan Caderci to accept duties as chief consultant of the boiler and heating units.

The subject of student conduct after Sunday School class dismissal was then brought up. Two proposals were made:

1. Rearrange class hours (10:30 a.m. - 11:30 a.m.)
2. Discuss with Sam Kaprelian alternatives to handle problem

Harry Boranian was appointed as liaison between the council and Sunday School to assist in working out a jointly acceptable solution.

Next, the following subjects were discussed.

Ticket Sales areas - nothing definite was decided except that for the time being tickets would have to be sold at the north entrance and definitely not the south.

Harry Cherkinian then asked to address the parish council on reorganization of the Building Committee. Chairman Stevoff stated that for now there will not be any restructuring. The council did advise Harry that the Building Committee must still continue to exist and follow through with the following commitments to completion.

1. Church Steeple
2. Parking Lot
3. Landscaping

Other church building considerations must be undertaken with parish council approval only.

Chairman Stevoff then asked Harry Boranian and Harry Armaganian to contact Perry Paragamian to obtain the names of member donors who have not as yet received their formal "Thank You" letters.

The next date for Der Hyre's Waukegan ministerial trip was firmed up to be March 4.

Harry Boranian was next asked to contact Sam Kaprelian to draw up a list of necessary items for the Sunday School. Harry agreed to handle this matter as soon as possible.

The meeting was adjourned at 10:10 p.m. by Chairman Stevoff and seconded by Chuck Garbedian

PARISH COUNCIL MEETING
WEDNESDAY, FEBRUARY 14, 1973

The meeting called to order at 7:40 p.m. by Chairman, George Stevoff, opened with a prayer by Der Hyre.

Minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved with one correction. In the previous notes it was mentioned Sam Kaprelian would be looking into purchasing items for the Sunday School; such as desks, tables, bulletin boards, etc. However, this should read "Sam Kaprelian would form a committee to draw up a list of items for the Sunday School, price them and submit the list to the Board of Trustees".

TREASURER'S REPORT

Harry Armaganian reported that as of February 14, 1973 there was a balance of \$67,087.66 in the check book.

Harry Armaganian and Harry Boranian will meet with Ron Busarow this Friday, February 16, 1973 to lock in the mortgage at \$77,000. Harry Boranian reported that actually the mortgage would be locked in at \$77,000, plus another \$10,000 if it should be needed. Mention was also made that the landscaping estimate of \$18,000 was included in the mortgage.

REPORT OF PARISH PRIEST

The report as read by Der Hyre was submitted to the parish council (copy attached).

George Stevoff commented to Der Hyre that many people had stopped him the evening of the ACYOA Dance on February 10 and asked why Der Hyre was not in attendance. The parish priests from South Milwaukee and Greenfield were in attendance and it did not look good when our own parish priest was not present. Mr. Stevoff did comment that the dance was a huge success -- attendance was in excess of 300 people and that the net profit is expected to come to approximately \$800.

Der Hyre's explanation as to why he was not in attendance was attributed to the fact that he thought liquor would be served or consumed at the dance; therefore, he did not see fit to attend. However, comment was made that no liquor was served or consumed and it is expected it will not be served or consumed at any future functions as outlined and voted upon at the Annual Parish Meeting in January.

It was also requested of Der Hyre that he must attend every ACYOA meeting and he mark his calendar that a meeting would be held Sunday, February 18 at 6:30 p.m. in the church hall. It was suggested he compliment the youth on their successful dance and that he also have a good explanation as to why he was not in attendance at the dance as many of the young people did question this.

CHURCH MANNERS

The matter of people coming to the church to view the new facilities and then proceed to walk on the altar was discussed. An incident took place on Tuesday, February 13 when one of our older women took two Catholic nuns on a tour of the new church and all three walked across the altar. George Stevoff instructed each trustee that no one is to be on the altar, except the parish priest or deacon or acolyte. It is "off limits" to anyone else and the parish council has the authority to ask unqualified personnel to leave the area of the altar.

MAINTENANCE

Roger Strawnsky has been hired as a janitor for the church hall, classrooms, wash rooms and kitchen. He will also check the doors and windows each evening at approximately 10:00 p.m. Total fee for the janitor would be \$30 a week or on a monthly basis of \$130 (this would absorb the months with 5 weeks). He will also check the thermostats and set them at 65°. Tuesday's will be the day for heavy cleaning by the janitor.

A question was raised by Der Hyre as to who would clean the facilities after weddings, funerals, etc. George Stevoff commented the parish council or members of the church would do this type of cleaning lightly and then on Tuesday's the janitor would do the heavy cleaning.

The question of cleaning the church was brought up. John Esayan mentioned the Maintenance Committee would get together and assign the responsibility to various people in the parish on a rotating basis.

It was also mentioned that no contract would be drawn up with the janitor as there is a possibility he may not want to continue working for us after a few months and/or we may not be satisfied with his work.

BULLETIN BOARDS

The Sunday School has asked where they could put up a bulletin board. After some discussion it was suggested that the bulletin board be put up near the entrance to the hall. The old bulletin board would have to be stripped and cleaned. Harry Armaganian also asked where other signs could be posted in the hall.

MEETING WITH VARIOUS HEADS OF ORGANIZATIONS

A letter written by Harry Armaganian will be directed to all organization heads asking them to attend a parish council meeting on Wednesday, February 28 at 7:30 p.m. in the church hall. The purpose of the meeting is to see if any problems exist and if there is anything in particular they themselves wish to discuss with the parish council.

A comment was made by Harry Boranian that this type of meeting should be held possibly every six months or quarterly.

In the future Chuck Garbedian will act as liaison in case any organization should want to meet with the parish council and Der Hyre.

OFFICE EQUIPMENT

Harry Armaganian and Harry Boranian have contacted Office Supply and Jim Bruno will be working with them. They have been offered 20% to 25% off, but it is felt they can still get a better price.

HALL RENTAL

No fees have been established as yet, due to the fact that the kitchen has not been completed. A question was raised as to what fee would be charged to the Andekian's for the use of the hall (without kitchen facilities) for the wedding this Saturday, February 17. After some discussion it was decided the fee would be \$50 and the family would be made aware of this.

George Stevoff will make a study of the hall rental fees and come up with a recommendation of fees that could be put into effect for the rental of the hall, kitchen, meeting rooms -- for members and non-members.

KEYS

Keys will be distributed to authorized personnel this coming Sunday at church. These keys will be charted somehow and when a person's term of office, etc. is finished the key will be returned to the parish council. Only authorized personnel will be allocated keys.

SMOKING AREAS

Ash trays have been put in the main hallway; however, smoking will be discouraged as much as possible.

Another comment was made that people have been loitering in the hallways before going into church -- and carrying on conversations as if they were at a social gathering. This will be discouraged by the trustees and they will attempt to encourage the parishoners to go directly into church. Der Hyre will also make mention of this fact in the next parish bulletin.

TELEPHONES

Comment was made that many people use the parish phone and several unauthorized long distance calls have been made. A pay phone will be installed at the south end of the hallway. Also, phone jacks will be installed in several locations - two large conference rooms, hall way, kitchen - thus another phone will be available outside of the phone in the trustee's room.

The pay phone will be utilized during the week; however, on Sundays the school children may use the parish phone if necessary to contact their parents.

Comment was also made that the trustee's room is another place where some of the parishoners congregate on Sundays. It was suggested that this room be locked and the trustees utilize the use of the window for anyone who wishes to contact the trustees during Badarak.

ANNEXATION OF LAND IN CALEDONIA TO WIND POINT

Chuck Garbedian will attend any public meetings with regard to the above annexation possibility. The Parish Council as a whole will keep their eyes on any notices in the newspapers regarding this matter and will contact Chuck, who will attend and take notes on behalf of the trustees. If Chuck is unable to attend any particular meeting, he will contact George Stevoff, who in turn will ask someone else to attend.

SUNDAY SCHOOL

The problem of keeping the children occupied after Sunday School was brought up. Sam Kaprelian, superintendent, was unable to attend the meeting because of personal reasons. However, he will be in attendance at the next parish council meeting. It was mentioned, however, that it is not the small children who are a problem, but the 8-9-10 year olds.

One alternative was to have Sunday School start at 10:30 a.m. through 11:30 a.m., rather than the schedule now followed of 10:00 a.m. through 11:00 a.m. This matter will have to be discussed.

Marge Mikaelian has volunteered to assist the Sunday School with the music originally instructed by Margaret Dadian. Mrs. Dadian, who has assumed the responsibility of Choir Director, is unable to continue her work with the Sunday School.

MAILING LIST

Harry Armaganian, Perry Paragamian, with the assistance of Harry Boranian, will be compiling a complete up-to-date mailing list. These will be keyed on the plates for "members" and "Non-members".

AGBU

A letter has been received from the AGBU stating they would like to establish a library in one of the meeting rooms consisting of books in English regarding Armenian history, etc.

However, clarification is needed as to who is going to maintain the library, who is going to furnish the books, etc. Mrs. Rose Akgulian will attend the next meeting of the parish council for any clarification needed.

CHURCH HISTORIAN OR REPORTER

George Stevoff presented an article written by Mary Kamakian on our Church Consecration. Mrs. Kamakian is the church historian or reporter for the parish. Although, Mrs. Kamakian has done an excellent job, the clarification of having all articles submitted and approved by the parish council has to be emphasized to her.

Articles have been known to appear in newspapers without the knowledge of the parish council and this must be corrected. As a matter of policy "ALL ARTICLES (NEWS) MUST HAVE THE APPROVAL OF THE PARISH COUNCIL BEFORE THEY ARE SUBMITTED TO ANY NEWSPAPERS, ETC." Harry Boranian will act as liaison between the parish council and Mrs. Kamakian to see that this policy is carried out.

CONSECRATION BOOKLET

An ample supply of Consecration Booklets are still available. A suggestion was made that a mailing be sent to out-of-towners (former Racine parishoners) who might be interested in purchasing this booklet. These would be sold at the price of \$3.00 each.

These books will also be made available as gifts to visiting clergymen or visiting dignataries from various parishes.

Harry Boranian requested that the Consecration Booklet Committee get together for one last meeting to make up a closing report on the book.

SHELVES - STORE ROOM

Harry Boranian is working on the shelves in the store room. These will be made available to the Sunday School, athletic equipment, anyone else who has need for extra shelf space - some with closed drawers.

MAIL BOXES

Mail boxes for individual organizations will be set up. One suggestion was to have the boxes at the south end of the hallway - in this way when the mail arrives, it is only a matter of slipping the individual piece of mail for a particular organization into that particular slot. This would be handled on a daily basis.

BEHAVIOR OF ACOLYTES

The problem of uncalled for behavior by one of the acolytes and a friend during Badarak last Sunday was discussed. During the sermon the two young men filled the pulvar with an excessive amount of incense and left the priest's room filled with smoke. This was discovered by the Deacon during the sermon. This problem will be discussed with this particular acolyte by Der Hyre at the acolyte meeting on Saturday, February 17.

George Stevoff brought up the fact that many appointed offices in the church have not been changed for years and possibly these appointments should be reaffirmed on a yearly basis. This would include:

- Sunday School Superintendent
- Choir Director
- Athletic Director

This will be discussed at a later date.

The request of Mrs. Reitskettal to become a member of our parish will be handled by Der Hyre and the Parish Council.

ACYOA

George Stevoff brought up a critical situation which occurred the previous week with regard to the ACYOA.

While our ACYOA was decorating the church hall for their dance, a member of the dissident church approached the ACYOA, with the full knowledge of the chairman of the ACYOA, in an attempt to make a speech to the group. The advisor, Alice Hazarian, diplomatically asked this person why he was in attendance . He stated he was going to make an announcement to the group and told the advisor he wanted to ask the ACYOA to participate in a protest march in Chicago against the Turks. The advisor at this point

asked this person to leave the premises. It was noted that the ACYOA is a church affiliated organization and is not involved in politics and, therefore, we could not allow him to make his speech. A short time after his dismissal a phone call was received by the advisor at the church from one of the mother's of the dissident church criticizing the advisor for her actions. A call was also received by our parish council chairman, who was not available at the time of the call. The chairman returned the call to the mother the next evening, at which time she immediately backed off with regard to this incident.

This all evolved because of the unreliable actions of the chairman of the ACYOA. The parish priest and parish council chairman will take this matter up with him and he will be firmly, but diplomatically reprimanded for his actions. The church in no way is to become involved in political activities.

Der Hyre and the chairman of the parish council will attend the next ACYOA meeting on Sunday, February 18 at 6:30 p.m. in the church hall. Mr. Stevoff will address the group as chairman of the parish council and compliment them on their successful dance. At the same time he will also bring to them the feelings of the church and parish council with regard to participation in political activities.

A suggestion was made that a letter be drafted and sent to the attention of all organizations taking a stand on this particular point of view. This will be taken under advisement by the parish council.

BUILDING COMMITTEE

Harry Akgulian, who is liaison between the Building Committee and the Parish Council, listed the various items which are being handled at the present time by this committee:

- Colored glass for church windows
- Moving of garage to church property
- Basketball backboards
- Church steeple - possibility of donation by Mr. Jansouzian -
- Kitchen cabinets

Sam Akgulian, a member of the committee dropped in and addressed the council. The steeple as designed by Mr. Jansouzian did not meet the qualifications of the Building Committee; therefore, some redrawing will have to be done.

A request was also made that a sign stating "CLEAN FILL DIRT WANTED" be put up on the church property.

Harry Akgulian will contact the members of the Building Committee and advise them that the Parish Council would like to meet with them on Wednesday, February 21 at 7:00 p.m. in the church hall to discuss their duties and clarify any questions they may have.

ACYOA

Alice Hazarian, advisor to the ACYOA approached the parish council for assistance in working with the group. Two projects of major concern are the Summer Study Group to Armenia and the St. Nersess Summer Study Session. A request for an additional male advisor was also made - this will be taken under advisement by the Parish Council.

THANK YOU LETTERS

Thank you letters will be written to Mr. Ed Jozwik, thanking him for letting Kay Mikaelian use the equipment and materials from Modines to make the chair rack for our church.

A thank you letter will also be sent to Mr. & Mrs. John Esayian of South Milwaukee who donated 4 pair of slippers to the church.

The Women's Auxiliary will continue making the Maas for the Divine Liturgy. Mr. Toros Koroghlianian will also continue preparing it on Sundays.


George Stevoff asked Der Hyre whether acolyte rehearsals were being held. Der Hyre announced he would be starting Saturday, February 17.



PARISH COUNCIL MEETING
MAY 9, 1973

Meeting was called to order at 8:05 p.m. by the Parish Council Chairman, George Stevoff.

Two sets of minutes were read - the April 25 regular Parish Council Meeting and the April 11, Parish Assembly meeting.

The Treasurer's Report showed a balance of \$41,424.59.

Der Hyre submitted the last two weekly reports, copies attached.

First order of business was the report given by George Stevoff on his attendance at the Diocesan Assembly in Worcester, Massachusetts. Below are some of the issues and answers.

Membership dues are no longer due by January 1 for that year.

Parish Council Chairmen are now designated as regular Diocesan Convention delegates with full voting rights.

New diocesan delegates will not be requested to be voted on. Current delegates will remain in that capacity.

Budget review - Diocese will operate with a deficit unless St. Vartan's Patrons listing becomes successful. Our church assessment will be increased \$1,000 next year unless we can obtain ten (10) or more patrons.

Report on relations with Separated Brethren - all optimistic with the following conditions as MUSTS before discussion on merger can begin.

1. Adhere to one (1) Church
 2. With one (1) Primate and one (1) Diocese
- By consent of the Catholicos this movement will be started only in North America.

St. Mesrob had a total of 12 members attend the Diocesan Assembly.

Next order of business - individual progress reports.

Harry Akgulian brought up the possibility of purchasing a letter folding machine - also buying tools for church was brought up. Both ideas were rejected; however, at some date a notice may be circulated requesting church members to donate tools.

Harry Akgulian stated that the only real need for phones was in the kitchen and the Priest's room. This was agreeable to the Parish Council.

Motion was made to set a flat fee for the nine monthly Knights of Vartan Meetings at \$100 (rather than the normal \$180). Harry Boranian seconded the motion - motion carried with one desenting vote.

Meeting adjourned at 10:05 p.m.




