#### PROGRESS REPORT - FUND RAISING (March-June, 1984)

#### DEPT. OF FINANCE

1. The department is presently developing a volunteer organization for the Archbishop's Fund Campaign in the New England region with Boston as its base.

The Boston area was visited on May 9-11, 1984 for the following;

- A. To meet with Fr. Mampre and Fr. Dajad to discuss the campaign and to gain their support of this project.
- B. To meet with Mr. Robert Hagopian, Director of Corporate Relations of M.I.T. for his professional expertise on fund raising.
- C. To meet with Barbara Tellalian, a professional fund raiser and public relations consultant, who is our key support person in Boston. We discussed project strategies and the New England region prospect list.
- D. To meet with Fr. Mampre, Barbara Tellalian, Gerald Ajemian and Dr. Greg Adamian to discuss the campaign, its structure and the imperative need for its success.

Mr. Ajemian was selected by our support team as a candidate for the chairmanship of the New England Campaign and has graciously accepted with the probability of Dr. Greg Adamian assisting him.

In a recent discussion with Mr. Ajemian, it was stated that a group of potential organization members will be assembled within the next two-three weeks for a campaign meeting and presentation hosted by Mr. Ajemian, and planned by this department.

These members will be the cadre to visit prospects and also make their own pledge. (meeting agenda and materials attached).

- In addition to the above, we are seeking out candidates for the chairmanship of the New Jersey campaign which is planned for August/September.
- 3. A special letter was sent in May to the 30 donors who contributed \$1000.00 and more as Pacesetters during 1983. We have received 8 responses totaling \$7500.00 which is being credited to the Archbishop's Fund. (copy attached).

#### MEETING AGENDA

## I. The Diocesan Need

In order to ensure the financial obligations of the Diocese, a two phase program must be implemented as follows:

Short Range - To help meet the 1984 Annual Diocesan budget of \$1.5 Million as approved by the Annual Diocesan Assembly, the Department of Finance shall utilize the following techniques.

- A. 3rd Annual Diocesan Appeal Mail Campaign to Diocesan mailing list of 30,000 families requesting contributions in any denomination for the support of St. Vartan Armenian Cathedral and the Diocese.
- B. 1984 Stewards' Program Mail campaign to Diocesan mailing list of 30,000 families requesting a Stewards' contribution of \$500.00 for the support of St. Vartan Cathedral and the Diocese. Stewards shall be recognized by a special lapel pin and the inscription of their names in a permanent register to be located in the Cathedral. Since this is a new program, the mass mailing technique is being utilized in order to develop new prospects for this donor category (\$500.00).
- C. Merchandise Sales These are sales of merchandise such as furs, oriental rugs, etc., sponsored by the Diocese both at its NYC headquarters and through its parishes in the Diocese.

Long Range - To guarantee the future annual expenses of the expanding needs and programs of the Diocese, a plan has been developed to raise Five Million dollars over five (5) years whereby only the interest income would be used for these expenses.

## II. Structure of New England Effort

The organization shall consist of 21 persons:

- 1 Chairman
- 4 Team Captains
- 16 Team Members
- 21 Persons-Total

Each shall visit approximately 5 prospects = 105 plus the 21 members = 126 prospects (minimum).

#### GOAL = TO VISIT 150 PROSPECTS INCLUDING ORGANIZATION MEMBERS

#### III. Campaign Method

To call on all prospects, and ask each to consider becoming a PACESETTER by a minimum pledge of \$1,000.00 per year for the next 5
years.

If a prospect pledges less than \$5,000 over the 5 year period he shall be classified as a <u>PARTAKER</u> and hopefully he will agree to payments of at least \$1,000.00 annually. (eg. in the case of a \$2,500 pledge, \$1,000 would be given for each of the 1st and 2nd years and \$500.00 for the 3rd). If a donor <u>insists</u> on payment of \$500 per year for 5 years toward his pledge of \$2,500 the gift will be accepted willingly.

#### IV. Job of Team Captain

- A) Make own personal commitment to the effort,
- B) Recruit four (4) team members,
- C) Bring team members to the Kickoff meeting,
- D) Assist team members in the selection of five (5) prospects, and also select five (5) as the Team Captain.
- E) Be certain team members contact prospects within the time schedule established.

4. A Stewardship campaign has been developed by a mailing to the entire Diocesan mailing list of 30,000 sent out on May 31, 1984. The mailing requested individuals to become Stewards of St. Vartan Armenian Cathedral and the Diocese through their pledge of \$500.00 during 1984 for support of various programs.

This is the first attempt for a mailing of this nature to be made on a mass level; hopefully it may accomplish new donor potential in this category of pledges which we have a definite need for. (mailing material attached).

- 5. The 3rd Annual Diocesan Appeal, which is for any donation amount, is ready and shall also be sent to the entire mailing list at the end of June in order not to conflict with the Stewardship Program mailing.
- 6. Fur Sales have been considered as a potential fund raiser for the Diocese. Five firms have been contacted with four refusals and awaiting response from the fifth.
- 7. Oriental rug sales have been scheduled for 7 parishes and the Diocese for the latter part of 1984. The Detroit parish completed a sale in mid May which according to current figures may net the Diocese approximately \$4000.00
- 8. A donor plaque shall be fabricated and installed in the lobby of Kavookjian Auditorium for the names of donors participating in the Archbishop's Fund during its 5 year campaign period. (1984-1989).

The plaque designed by an interior designer shall be approximately  $14 \frac{1}{2}$  long x 5' high.

It shall have space for 456 Pacesetter names (donors of \$5,000. and over) and 1200 Partakers names (donors of \$4999-\$1000.).

It shall be made of a gloss black plexiglass backplate with bronze trim at the top and bottom.

Names shall be engraved on satin black anodized aluminum and letters will appear in an aluminum color.

The cost of this plaque shall be \$9300.00 and will be ready for installation during early September in time for the One World Festival.

We feel the installation of this donor plaque will give the Archbishop's Fund Campaign visibility and will help to increase our donor potential both in numbers and pledge amounts.

By virtue of the location of its headquarters in New York City, the Diocese with its St. Vartan Cathedral is a symbol of the conspicuous and distinctive position Armenians have achieved in American society. Moreover, as a national and international entity, the Diocese links the 600,000 faithful in a fellowship with the more than 5,000,000 other Armenians in the world. Through its work, the Diocese is also the source for programs and services that are unique. For instance, the Diocese provides and directs our priests -- who are the heart of the parish. The Diocese also helps to provide Armenians with the strength needed to perpetuate our heritage. Diocesan representatives maintain a constant exchange of ideas with the priests and their parishioners and direct the resources of the Church to their needs. Through its diversity of functions, which are not available from any other source, the Diocese ministers daily to the spiritual needs of the faithful and through its parishes is the focal point for our cultural and religious values.

A profile, including 1984 budgeted expenses, on some of the current and proposed Diocesan services and their impact on the Armenian community are as follows:

## 1. St. Vartan Cathedral - \$100,000

The Armenian Cathedral beloved of the faithful as well as the non-Armenian community affirms an ancient and hardy faith. As a living symbol of our people and their beliefs, this edifice must be meticulously maintained and properly adorned at all times for the many visitors who pass through its threshhold daily to experience the wealth and beauty of our being.

## 2. Clergy Recruitment and Education - \$60,000

In order to alleviate the immediate need of a lack of clergy in our Diocese a department must be developed which shall enable us to seek out candidates who may be trained and educated to fill the clerical positions readily available in our parishes now and in the future.

# 3. Armenian Church Youth Organizations and Ministry - \$80,000
