



ARCHBISHOP MANOOGIAN

Church Primate Expected Sunday

Archbishop Torkom Manoogian, primate of the Armenian Church of North America, will celebrate the Divine Liturgy at 11 a. m. Sunday in St. Paul's Armenian Church, 310 N. Geddes st.

He will also be principal speaker at the 15th anniversary dinner at 2:30 p. m. Sunday at Liverpool Country Club. Following the dinner there will be awarding of St. Vartan's Medal to four church laymen.

Born in Baghdad, Iraq, Archbishop Manoogian entered the

Seminary of the Armenian Patriarchate in Jerusalem in 1931. From 1957 to 1960 he served as dean of that school. Among his writings is a guide book and history concerning the Holy Places in Bethlehem and Jerusalem.

He was elected as primate of the Diocese of the Armenian Church of America on April 30, 1966. In 1968 he was elected to the rank of archbishop and last May was re-elected to his third four-year term as primate.
