Armenian School.

Our Parish Assembly will be held
this Sunday, February 8, and we need
your answer before then.

Our question is:

Does the newly-formed Armenian
School accept non-parishioners as well?
Or is it just strictly for the
parishioners of the Church?

Our reason for asking this question
is because our Armenian School had

been changed from Sundays to Fridays (6:00-8:00 p.m.), without the knowledge of the parishioners and the former teachers, which resulted in the resignation of 5 dedicated teachers).

Presently, more non-parishioners are attending than parishioners because of this time change.

Many of our parishioners are dissatisfied with this, and we would like to bring this matter up at our Parish Assembly.
