An outstanding Sunday program including Badarak, followed by a dinner at Liverpool Country Club has been planned. Diocesan Delegate's Report 72nd Assembly

St. Vartan Cathedral - N.Y.

May 3 - 5, 1974

Highlights of the Assembly

1 - Election of Primate:

Archbishop Torkom Manoogian was re-elected for another four-year term. Fathers Arzoomanian and Gezirian were also dandidates for election.

2 - Separated Brethren:

No progress from last year was reported by the committee. Talks are continuing.

3 - Proposal for Archdiocese in U.S.

A proposal setting up regional diocese within one Archdiocese was presented to the Assembly. In order to implement the plan, additional priests would be needed. Because of the acute shortage of priests at this time, further study was recommended.

4 - Priest Stipend:

A complete schedule of stipends for priests was presented. This plan set up a minimum salary of \$7,000 a year. In addition, housing and auto expenses would also be paid by the church. The Diocese would provide a pension and insurance plan. The Assembly accepted this plan.

5 - Budget:

The Diocesan budget increased by \$43,000 in 1974. The total budget passed was \$357,000. In 1975 an increase of \$105,000 is proposed.

6 - 800th Anniversary - St. Nerses Shnorhali:

A special service was observed in St. Patrick's Cathedral on Friday, May 3rd. It was presided over by Archbiship Torkom Manoogian and Trenece Cardinal Cooke. Over 3,000 Armenians attended the beautiful and inspiring service. Lili Chookasian, Mezzo-Soprano, and the Gomidas Choir also performed.

NERSES SHNORHALI-A Giant in Literature

Nerses Shnorhali, one of the most illustrious figures of medieval Armenian literature, was born in 1098 in the Cilician fortress of Dzovk, the domain of his father Apirat Pahlavouni. He received an all-round education in the monasteries of the Black Mountains or Amanos. In 1121 he was ordained a priest. He became a bishop in 1130 and in 1166 was elected Catholicos. From 1147 to his death (he passed away on August 13, 1173) Nerses Shnorhali lived and carried on his creative activities in Hromglah, hence his surname Klayetsi. To foreign chroniclers, he is specially known by this name.

Nerses Shnorhali is also known to us by another name - "Yerketsogh", being the greatest Armenian musician of the Middle Ages.

Thanks to Shnorhali's creative work, Armenian literature and musical culture were modernized and revitalized. He rejected the old poetic patterns, raising to new heights the sacred art. The sharagan "Norahrash Bsagavor", the prayer "Havadov Khosdovanim", the song "Aravot Lousso" and many others have beein hgihly regarded not only by Armenian, but also foreign scholars.

Nerses Shnorhali made a remarkable contribution to the development of certain genres of medieval Armenian literature, especially in the genre of poems he made considerable chievements. He wrote the "Vibassanoutyoun", a versification of Armenian history primarily of a fictional nature, a renovation at the times. By coordinating fictional and lyrical elements, he wrote his longest poem beginning with the words "Jesus

the Son", which eventually became the title of the poem. The first work he wrote when he was still a young man, while the second one was written in 1152.

The poet has embodied his noble patriotic and humanistic ideas in a rather refined form. He brought about a fundamental change in Armenian poetry that conditioned the great charm of Armenian medieval poetry. Besides rendering poetry accessiable and dear, Shnorhali made it fluent and terse, worked out various forms of versification, introduced the use of rhymes. He held verse in high esteem, appreciated its influence.

If a lie is put to shape, This makes it so beautiful. How exquisite will become Works of truth therein.

Nerses Shnorhali's influence has been prevalent on posterity (Grigor Oegha, Arakel Sunetsi, Mgrditch Naghash, Simon Abarantsi, etc.).

The development of Armenian literature in general and the verse in particular were most decisively influenced by "this most clever, most refined and most saintly versifier of the nation". (Father Ghevont Allishan).

Nerses Shnorhali was the singer of patriotism, the good, the beautiful and the true, and as he has writeen in the "Vibassanoutyoun", characterizing another public figure.

As mortal he entered the world With an immortal memory he left it.

THE ARMENIAN SCHOOL OF SYRACUSE

The Armenian School of Syracuse consists of approximately 30 students and six faculty members. The students are grouped according to age and/or knowledge of the Armenain Language.

A safe and pleasant journey is wished for Ara Djamboulian who is moving to California to continue his graduate study at the San Diego Campus of the State University of California.


A prayer for good health is extended to Mrs. A. Kazanjian who has recently been ill. May she have a speedy recovery and be back among us soon.
