#### MINUTES OF THE NOVEMBER 2, 1996 WOMEN'S GUILD CENTRAL COUNCIL MEETING 2 3 The second meeting of the 1996-97 Central Council was held at the Diocese on November 2, 1996. 4 Present were Yeretzgin Patricia Buttero, Chairman; Yeretzgin Violet Kasparian, Vice-Chairman; 5 Yeretzgin Aurora Jebejian, Recording Secretary; Araxy Gokberk, Corresponding Secretary; Ann 6 Ajemian, Treasurer; Yeretzgin Anahid Kalayjian, Assistant Treasurer; and Claire Bardakian, Advisor. 7 Absent were Lilly Bouroujian Thomas and Nevart Marashlian, Advisors. Also present was Julie 8 Ashekian, Coordinator of CASP and Father Garabed Kochakian, Chancellor of the Diocese. Fr. Garabed 9 read from the Gospel of St. Luke and offered prayers at 10:40 a.m. 10 11 Yeretzgin Aurora Jebejian read the minutes of July 20, 1996. The following corrections were made: 12 13 page 2 - Under Corresponding Secretary's Report - The last sentence should read 14 "Yeretzgin Violet will send Nancy Basmajian a letter of appreciation for the Assembly 15 program she presented." 16 17 page 4 - Under Pilgrimage - The sentence should read "an additional \$150.00 was collected for 18 each person." 19 20 page 4 - Under Saints Day-Altar Paintings - The sentence should read: 21 "Yeretzgin Aurora suggested that mission parishes be visited by some of the W.G.C.C. 22 members, especially since next year's theme throughout the Diocese is Mission Outreach. 24 A motion was made and seconded and passed to accept the minutes as corrected. 26 Yeretzgin Patricia Buttero welcomed the Central Council and Father Garabed Kochakian. She asked 27 that we add the following items to our agenda: Old and New Business, Assembly, Proposals, and 28 Pilgrimage. The Central Council congratulated Father Kochakian on the occasion of the twentieth 29 Anniversary of his Ordination to the priesthood and his receiving the right to wear the flowered 30 pheloneon. The Council extended its good wishes to Father Michael Buttero on his recent 31 retirement. Condolences were expressed to Yeretzgin Violet Kasparian on the passing of her mother. 33 A discussion was held on the proper procedure to gain entrance into the Diocesan complex for 34 meetings. Father Garabed suggested that the 34th Street entrance is the most direct when all other 35 doors are locked. Yeretzgin Buttero presented the Council with a bill from the Diocesan office for 36 coffee and doorman. Yeretzgin Violet will write a letter to Mr. Frank Stoneson, Director of Facilities, 37 asking why we are being charged for the doorman. Father Garabed said he would also speak to 38 Frank Stoneson regarding this matter. 39 40 41 TREASURER'S REPORT 42 43 Ann Ajemian submitted the Treasurer's report (See Appendix A). She received a letter from 44 Guy Pontillo, Chief Financial Officer of the Diocese outlining Diocesan Guidelines and questions to 45 follow for all auxiliary organizations. The report is due December 31, 1996. After some discussion a 46 motion was made by Yeretzgin Violet Kasparian to have all special accounts separate from our 47 working capital; for example, School Bag Project. Ann Ajemian seconded the motion, it passed. 48 The School Bag CD is to be rolled over; the dates are November 15, 1996 to February 14, 1997. 49 50 Ann Ajemian will again contact the Hotel we stayed at last spring to delete the tax charged to us by 51 mistake. 52 A bank charge of \$96.05 will be explained at our next meeting in January. 53 A correction on the Treasurer's report was made; Camp Noubar should read "St. Vartan Camp". Also 54 Saints Day account is the same as the report given at the June meeting. 55

56 Transportation mileage is thirty cents a mile.

#### ASSISTANT TREASURER'S REPORT 1 2 3 Yeretzgin Anahid Kalayijan presented her report (See Appendix B). She reported that eleven 4 Guilds have not paid their dues, she has sent reminders. Yeretzgin Anahid questioned the status of all the mission parishes to whether they are capable of remitting dues. It was explained that at this time they are not. Yeretzgin Violet will call the Diocese and send Diocesan Directories 7 to the Council members that do not have one. 8 9 10 SAINTS DAY 12 Araxy Gokberk, Chairman of Saints Day reported that she, Yeretzgin Violet, and Nevart Marashlian 13 sent a letter to Chairmen to help evaluate Saints Day. She had three guilds respond to her request, 14 the comments were of a general type of suggestions. Araxy read the three letters, she will 15 write a general letter to the Guilds thanking them for their input in evaluating Saints Day. She 16 will give them more guidelines. Araxy will respond to St. David in Boca Raton, Fl. reminding 17 them that Saints Days are not celebrated on Sunday. We were also reminded that during Lent 18 Saints are not commemorated during the week. We are asked to encourage the Guilds to plan 19 Saints Day on Saturdays during Lent. Also to have an appropriate program which is designated 20 according to the Saint chosen by the Primate. Father Garabed presented the letter dated November 7, 1996 21 which designates the Saints Nooneh and Maneh, holy women who have borne witness to the 22 missionary work and zeal in the early days of the formation of the Armenian Church. Saints Day will 23 be on March 1, 1997, the theme will be Mission and Outreach. Father Garabed felt that 24 resource material is lacking at the local level. The Saints Day Committee names should be the 25 contact names if a parish needs help in planning a program. The speakers expenses should be 26 covered by the local Guild. 28 Araxy will mail a copy of the Saints Day guideline to the new members of the Central Council. 29 30 31 CELEBRATORY BANQUET FOR THE PRIMATE 32 33 Father Garabed announced that a banquet honoring the Primate, Archbishop Khajag 34 Barsamian on the occasion of the 25th Anniversary of His Ordination into the Priesthood of the 35 Armenian Church. It will be held on Saturday, November 23, 1996 in Kavookjian Auditorium. 36 It was suggested by Father Garabed that a congratulatory letter on behalf of W.G.C.C. be sent. Proceeds 37 from this event will be dedicated to Mission and Outreach programs in our Diocese. A motion was 38 made by Yeretzgin Violet Kasparian to send a check for \$250.00 on the occasion of the 25th 39 Anniversary of the Primate as a donation to the Mission and Outreach Endowment Fund. 40 The motion was seconded by Ann Ajemian. The motion passed. Yeretzgin Violet will write the 41 letter to the Primate. 42 43 At this point Patriarch Torkom Manoogian and the Primate entered our meeting. We welcomed the 44 Patriarch and invited him to take a picture with us. The meeting recessed for a short period. 45 The meeting resumed with Yeretzgin Violet Kasparian presiding until Yeretzgin Patricia Buttero returned. 46 47 Yeretzgin Aurora Jebejian will send a set of address labels of the Chairmen of the Guilds to Father Garabed 48 for a Saints Day mailing. 49 50 51 CASP 52 53 Yeretzgin Patricia reported that the Coordinator of CASP, Julie Ashekian and her husband, Clement 54 will be presented the St. Nersess Shnorhali Medal by the Primate, Archbishop Khajag Barsamian, 55 on behalf of His Holiness, Karekin I, Catholicos of All Armenians in recognition and appreciation 56 for their assistance to Armenia and the Mother See of Etchmiadzin through the Children of Armenia 57 Sponsorship Program on Friday, November 15, 1996 in Hartford, CT. Vespers will be at 7:30 PM and a 58 reception will follow. Yeretzgin Violet Kasparian will send a letter of congratulations on behalf of the 59 Central Council.

- 1 Julie Ashekian, the CASP Coordinator reported that the \$77,000 from Christopher Djihanian of 2 California has been delivered to Armenia. She also reported that the accounts have enough money 3 through March. The donation money is supporting the administrative expenses. Sponsors are notified 4 at the beginning of the month and then around the 15th of the month. Donation monies are mainly 5 used for the four orphanages. Father Garabed referred George Steiner to Julie. Mr. Steiner is director 6 of Children's Hope Chest. Children's Hope Chest focuses on children over 18, they provide camps, 7 health aid and establish half-way homes for children of orphanages. The Children's Hope Chest is 8 going to Armenia to explore and investigate the possibilities of helping. Julie will contact Mr. Steiner 9 and help as needed. 10 11 She applied for a grant through the John Garabedian Foundation in Fresno, California. This grant is 12 for children's educational programs. 14 Through FAR, Julie has sent 35,000 Children's aspirins to Armenia. One of the sponsors is going to 15 donate hair dyes and hair removal products. 17 A discussion followed as to the future of the CASP program. We need to study how to obtain grants. 18 19 At our January meeting, a Penny Campaign will be discussed. 20 21 22 MISSION AND OUTREACH 23 24 Yeretzgin Aurora spoke about the possibility of holding our Central Council meeting in parishes 25 where there are weak Guilds or no Guilds at all. We would interact with the Guild, hold vesper 26 services, have meetings, and present "Guilds in motion". It was suggested that we have one a year. 27 Some Guilds were suggested. If one were held in Richmond then the mission parishes in that area 28 could be invited. ChemIsford and Haverhill were also mentioned. Father Garabed asked that a 29 committee bring a time schedule to the January meeting with suggestions for a pilot program. Claire 30 Bardakian and Yeretzgin Aurora Jebejian will serve on the committee and plan the agenda. Each will 31 outline the day, and then compare the two outlines. 32 Father Garabed announced that regional meetings are being planned, the first to be held in the 33 New England area on November 15. Father Garabed suggested that somehow we bridge the 34 established parishes and Guilds to mission parishes and their Guilds. A parish Guild would adopt a 35 weak or mission parish Guild. The program would be called "Traveling Women of Faith". 36 37 38 PILGRIMAGE 39 40 Julie Ashekian presented the financial report of the 1996 Pilgrimage to Armenia. (See Appendix C) 41 It was suggested that we plan another pilgrimage in either June or September of 1997. 42 Yeretzgin Violet made a motion that the W.G.C.C. plan another Pilgrimage to Armenia in 1997. 43 Also that the \$650.00 in the Pilgrimage Fund be left in the present account and that it be used as seed 44 money. Yeretzgin Anahid seconded the motion. It passed. 45 Seven people have already indicated their desire to be on the trip. Julie will check on the date of the 46 Young Professionals and then announce the trip in the our Newsletter. 47 48 49 GUILD PINS 50 51 Nevart Marashlian sold 40 pins and has 36 pins out on consignment. 52 53 GUILDS IN MOTION 54
- 55 Claire Bardakian rewrote a new cover letter for the Guilds in Motion which was sent to Chairmen 56 and Priests. Marilyn Larkin will include something on the Guilds in Motion for the Newsletter.
- 57 Claire will call Nancy Basmajian to see if there is a follow-up session for the 1997 Assembly.

### 1 DIOCESAN ASSEMBLY 2 3 The 1998 Diocesan Assembly in New York City will be held a week later than previously announced. 6 ANNUAL REPORTS FROM THE GUILDS 8 Yeretzgin Aurora Jebejian suggested that the Annual Report submitted to the local parish councils be 9 submitted to the W.G.C.C. in lieu of our Annual Trophy Award Report. It would be due on February 15, 1997. 10 11 12 BYLAWS 13 14 Rose Mekenian, Chairman of the Bylaws Committee was present. She reported that she had not received any 15 comments from the Guilds regarding the August Draft sent to everyone. Rose thanked Yeretzgin Aurora 16 for re-typing the entire Bylaws. We were reminded that the final draft must be sent out with the "Proposals 17 Letter" on March 1, 1997. 18 19 Yeretzgin Aurora Jebejian will send the Proposals Committee a proposal concerning Article IX, Section 2. 20 The proposal as it stands does not state how long a guild member must be a church member before serving on 21 the executive committee. In Article 7 of the Diocesan Bylaws it does read: " Members in good 22 standing of a Parish Church, who are 18 years of age or over, may participate in the Assemblies of the same 23 Parish and may vote, provided that at least six months have elapsed since they have registered and paid dues 24 at the time of registration as members of the Parish. They may be eligible for office one year after becoming 25 members, provided they have attained the age of 21." 26 27 All proposals must be submitted by January 15, 1997. 28 29 **30 LIAISON REPORTS** 32 Yeretzgin Patricia reported that the mission parish in Ann Arbor, Michigan is becoming active and some 33 materials were sent. 34 35 It was reported that St. David, Boca Raton, Florida has three members serving on the Executive Board that 36 are not Church dues-paying members. Article IX, Section 2 was discussed at some length. 37 38 Yeretzgin Violet Kasparian made a motion to pay expenses of up to \$100.00 for Yeretzgin Aurora Jebejian to 39 visit Houston, TX to help re-organize the Guild. It was seconded by Araxy Gokberk. It passed. 41 Liaisons should remind their Guilds to send in names of newly elected officers. 42 43 44 SCHOOL BAGS 45 46 Yeretzgin Violet reported money is still coming in for the school bags.
