






May He fill you with continuing strength for the new challenges of the Armenian Church in America and may He give us all the grace and wisdom to be inspired by the same quiet power of faith.



A TRIBUTE TO THE WOMAN'S GUILD OF ST. MARY ARMENIAN CHURCH ON THEIR 60th ANNIVERSARY

HISTORICAL BACKGROUND

The first known Armenian to arrive in the Metropolitan area was Christopher Der Serapian in 1843. Graduating from Yale University he introduced the yearbook custom and developed the green and black colors in United States paper currency that is still in use to this day. He was followed by a small number of Armenians who had come from Armenia to pursue an academic education. The date of the earliest entry of Armenians into the State of New Jersey is shrouded in mystery, but by the early 1850's a large passenger liner regularly plied its way between Raritan Bay in New Jersey and upper New York State; it was called the "Armenia" and suggested the presence of Armenians in the area. A painting of this ship hangs in the Bourne Museum, Bourne, Vermont and can be seen today. Scattered Armenians arrived in the metropolitan locality thereafter but no serious influx of newcomers occurred until the Turkish massacre of 1884-85. By 1907, the first Armenian Church in the area was established in Union City.

The silk weaving industry centered in Jersey City and many of these early immigrants were not scholars but skilled artisans of weaving. Marco Polo spent many months in Armenia on his way to and from Venice to China. On his return he introduced the art of silk raising and weaving to the Armenians. As the silk industry waned, Armenians turned to related fields of oriental rugs and rug cleaning and dry cleaning; they moved out to the suburbs including Newark and its environs.

The second wave of Armenians to arrive in America followed the massacre of 30,000 Armenians in Cilicia by the 'young turks' in 1909: By 1910 the women in the Newark area had formed a branch of the Armenian Red Cross Society dedicated to providing food, shelter and clothing to these victims. By then there were approximately 3000 Armenians in Essex County.

The Armenian Genocide of 1914 brought the third and largest influx of Armenians to America. The newcomers were mostly farmers or simple artisans. The cream of Armenian Intelligensia: the writers, poets, philosophers, lawyers and generals had all been methodically annihilated by the Turks as the first stage of their master plan to wipe out the Armenian race.

Almost all refugees regardless of their nationality came to America to seek a new life. They were close knit, hardworking, God-loving people. But the Armenians were unique among them. First, they were the only peoples who had suffered confiscation, torture and death at the hands of their own government to which they had been loyal. Second, they were all strongly united under the only protective shield they had ever known, the Armenian Church and third, they were virtually all literate men and women alike and capable of reading the Bible. This then was the background which gave birth to St. Mary Armenian Church. A devout group of men and women each scarred with unspeakable indignities, in a foreign land, poor but intent on pursuing a new life.

On May 16, 1926, 1000 of these people gathered in Newark to hold their very own Armenian Apostolic Church Service. It was held at St. Barnabas Episcopal Church in the pouring rain. They were to be known thereafter as members of the Newark Diocese, although they came from over a dozen surrounding towns and communities.

THE WOMEN'S GUILD

The Ladies Auxiliary was born in March 1928 at a meeting of a small group of women at the home of Takouhy Essayan. The name was officially changed to the Women's Guild in the 1970's to keep in harmony with similar chapters throughout the Diocese. By November, an executive committee chaired by Haiganoush Zotian had been established; other members were Perouz Mouroukian, Vice Chairman, Meroubeh Haigazian, Secretary, Takouhi Essayan, Treasurer, Haiganoush Gulezian and Lousarpy Bedikian, Advisors. That was sixty years ago. Since then the history of St. Mary Parish is so intertwined with the Women's Guild that one cannot be discussed without the other. For approximately the first twenty years (late 1920's to mid 1940's), the main thrust of energy and fund raising was directed towards helping orphans and displaced persons throughout the world. Later it assumed responsibility for keeping the Armenian culture and language alive by fostering the Armenian

Language Schools as well as all of the cultural programs. Additionally, it raised funds for Holy Etchmiadzin, the Patriarchate of the Armenian Church of Jerusalem, the Armenian Old Age Home in Emerson, and other charities too numerous to mention. Life was not easy, there was a terrible depression on in the world and little money for such charities.

It was not until 1943 that the community began thinking of establishing a home for the Church. Until that time church services were held on every other Sunday afternoon at the House of Prayer in Newark (today, an historic landmark); there were no facilities available for morning services. Toward that end the Guild began the Annual Bazaar. Their first effort yielded \$131.65 a princely sum for those years when five cents was all it cost to ride the ferry to Manhattan. It was to become the largest single income producer until the 1970's, far exceeding the plate and pledge collections.

The end of World War II in 1945 brought great joy to the Armenian community. Having raised their children in this new land, mothers watched them enter the various military services, but this war would end happily. For the first time in Armenian history most of the men who went to war would return home safely. But that also brought urgency and need for a church.

By 1948 the first Armenian Church in the community was purchased in Irvington, New Jersey under the shadow of what was then the Hoffman Soda Bottle. It had previously been a German speaking Presbyterian Church, empty for years and in need of serious repair. The entire complex of church, church hall, parish house and yard was to measure ¼ of an acre, 100 x 100 feet. It was a Godsend to the tiny community which was to grow to over one hundred families at its greatest membership and all just in time, for it was to provide a place for the second generation of Armenians to court, marry and baptize their children. No group worked harder than the Woman's Guild in those years. They washed and cleaned and cooked. The image of the women toiling all day is still clear to those of us old enough to remember. Who would not be impressed by their hard work, charity and utter honesty. After working all day, they would reach into their pocketbooks to pay for the very food they were donating and preparing.

Of all the legacies the Women's Guild has left us, it is the philosophy that the Church is built not only for the Glory of God, but for man, who needs a place to worship, be married, baptized and enter God's kingdom.

The Church therefore needs love, sacrifice and the finances to meet its budget. How sad if that devotion and their cultural arts and skills are lost to the coming generations. But all things occur in cycles. When the time comes we shall see that old-fashioned Armenian atmosphere in the Church again.

This is the year of the Women's Guild. We all rejoice in their glory. We especially honor those women of the first generation who are still with us:

Now the Church is in Livingston; the site is sixteen times larger and its value more than a hundred times greater than the old. The fund raising duties have passed to the shoulders of the second generation and now the third generation of Armenians has entered into the care of St. Mary Armenian Church by keeping the Women's Guild alive.

If the Church can be compared to a mighty oak tree, then the Women's Guild can be proud that it planted and nourished the seed.


