REPORT OF ACTING EXECUTIVE SECRETARY ARMENIAN CHURCH YOUTH ORGANIZATION OF AMERICA

This is a report of my activities as Acting Executive Secretary to the Armenian Church Youth Organization of America (ACYOA) for the month of October.

October 1, 1990 - Visitation to Hartford's St. George ACYOA to discuss plans for 1991 ACYOA General Assembly and Sports Weekend. Meeting was open to all parishioners, with an executive meeting that followed.

October 20, 1990 - New England Regional Conference in Watertown, Massachusetts, St. James ACYOA host chapter. Twenty five ACYOA executive members attended this meeting. Those participating were; Watertown, Cambridge, Hartford, New Britain, Providence, Worcester, and Springfield ACYOA Chapters.

Nominations were accepted for new positions of chairman and vice chairman to replace out-going Chairman, Richard Mardirosian, Hartford, and Vice Chairman, John Mergridichian, Providence. Elections will take place on December 1, 1990 in Providence.

The participants at the bi-monthly regional conferences discussed each chapter's calendar of events, with the purpose of informing sister chapters of activities and avoiding conflicts in scheduling. Other issues discussed consisted of the problems of chapters which are weakening or are becoming inactive. Springfield and Worcester are having some problems and the new regional chairman will make it a priority to visit and assist weak chapters within the New England Region. Inactive chapters include Haverhill, Chelmsford, Lawrence, and Trumbull.

During the month of October, the Hye Hokin ACYOA Publication and a National Anniversary Ball mailing were distributed to our mailing list of approximately three thousand names.

Work is continuing on the ACYOA National Calendar and the next issue of the Hye Hokin. The ACYOA Calendar will be sent during the beginning of December, and will consist of a calendar of national events. The next issue of our publication will be ready for print the second week in November and should also be distributed on the first of December.

Concurrently, the ACYOA Office is working on three Diocesan Young Adult Programs that will be offered to members and will be advertised simultaneously. Pending approval, the Armenian Studies Program, the ACYOA Jerusalem Internship Program, and the Diocesan Summer Research Internship will be sent out together to offer our members and Armenian young adults a variety of summer programs benefiting the individual and our church. Much of the preparation, such as accepting travel agents bids and reviewing proposals, has already begun. These three programs will be announced to the public in mid-November.

Finally, the ACYOA Office will step up its effort to release a greater number of press releases to the Armenian papers. Bi-weekly news releases will appear inn the Armenian Reporter and Mirror Spectator beginning in November.
